To Northern customers who desire to lay in stock for the spring trade, we will ship late in the fall, and allow time for payment until May 1st. A note to be given upon receipt of the trees. Prices do not include boxing, which will be charged as follows: Boxes 30 inches square, 7 to 10 feet long, \$2.50

each; 21 to 24 inches square. \$2.00 each; 16 to 20 inches, \$1.50. Bales, 25c to \$1.00. All carefully packed in moss.

All claims for deductions must be made immediately on receipt of goods.

Our packing and shipping season begins about October 1st, and continues until about March 1st.

Our shipping facilities are the best, having seven lines of railroads radiating from Rome. Two Express companies and river navigation.

Purchasers are requested to name the mode of conveyance by which they desire their shipments, OTHERWISE WE WILL DISPATCH TO THE BEST OF OUR JUDGMENT. AFTER DELIVERING TO THE FORWARDERS, ALL ARTICLES ARE ENTIRELY AT THE RISK OF THE PURCHASER; AND SHOULD ANY LOSS OR DELAY OCCUR, THE FORWARDERS ALONE MUST BE HELD RESPONSIBLE.

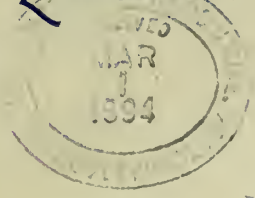

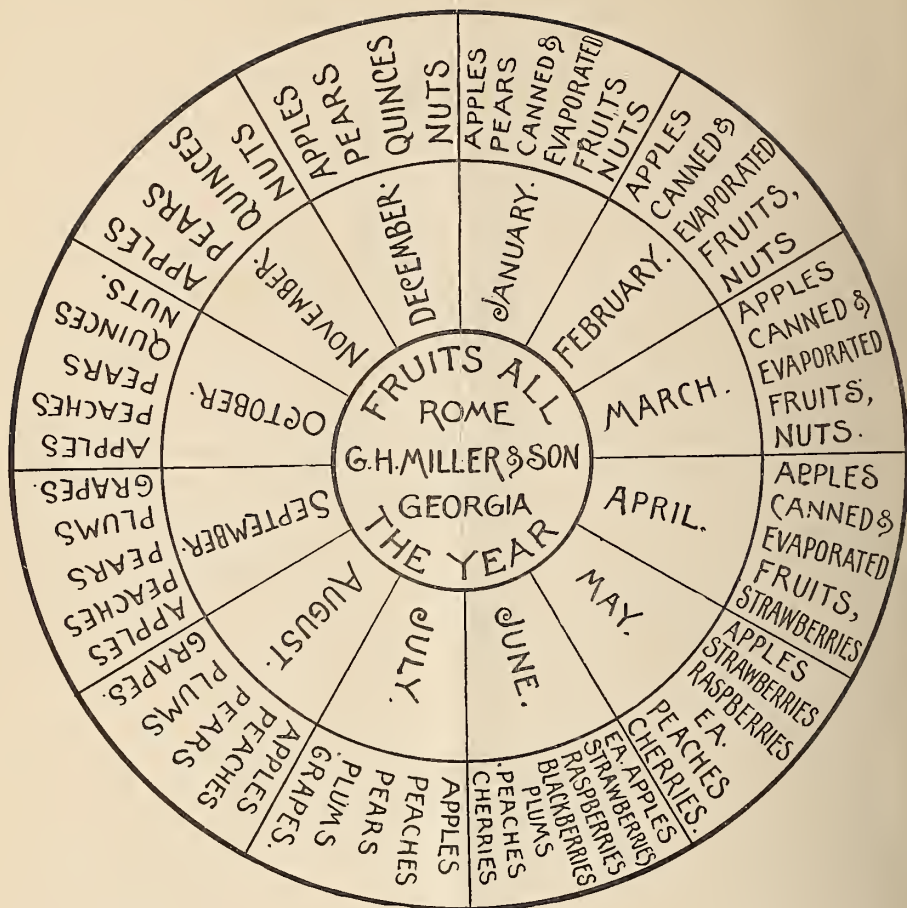
