




## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- (S) MAG-12 flew 2,686 sorties for 3,518.8 flight hours. Of these 2,494 sorties were combat. MAG-12 expended 1,804.3 tons of ordnance, an average of 58.2 tons per day.
- (S) On 5 December LtCol R. A. MORRIS assumed command of VMA-311 relieving LtCol P. G. McMAHON. LtCol AcMAHON relieved LtCol MORRIS as CO of H&MS-12.
- (S) On 7 Dec MAG-12's C117D EuNo 17122 was involved in an accident while landing at DaNang. The aircraft received Bravo damage however there were no injuries
- (S) On 1 December LtCol R. D. WALLACE relieved Major W. W. CAMPBELL as CO of MABS-12. On the same day Major R. E. HEMMINGWAY relieved LtCol WALLACE as CO of VMA-214.





## PERSONNEL

(S) During the month of December 1966 MAG-12 joined 16 USMC Officers and 491 USMC Enlisted. Rotated during the month of December 1966 were 13 USMC Officers and 98 USMC Enlisted. Projected losses for January are 3 USMC Officers and 94 USMC Enlisted.

- (S) During the month of December 1966 the  $\Delta$ ir Freight Section handled the following traffic.



- (S) Construction continues at a slow pace due to shortages in materials and personnel. Our generator situation is still critical. At the present time we have 17 generators in Rehab: 75KW (6), 30KW (7), 20KW (4), in addition 100KW (1) generator alternator down for rewinding.
- (S) The water point pumped 2,781,500 gallons of water for a total of 27,387,905 gallons of water since deployment to Chu Lai.
