

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: W 99002 re Capt. Giddings Report of Alleged Illegal Disposal Govt Property in P.I.

- 1. By direction of C/S action on this msg was transferred from PMO to G-4. This accounts for REVISED msg.
- 2. G-4 Duty Officer 29 Jan 50 (Col. Rash) contacted PMO (Lt. Col. Read) who stated PMO had no records in this case and that he had dispatched a radio query thru FEAF channels to PHILCOM (AF) INVESTIGATING Section as to whether these records were on hand. It was believed that all such records had been turned over to PHILCOM (AF). Col. Rash advised Lt. Col. Read to cancel this message.
 - 3. A search was made in G-4 and AG files without result.
 - 4. IG (Col. Martin) reported he had searched his files without result.
- 5. Engr (Gen Christiansen) who was reported to have knowledge of the report was contacted by Gen. Eberle; Gen. Christiansen could not assist.
- 6. G-4 (Gen Eberle) personally prepared C/N to C/S proposing dispatch of a radio to DA and another to PHILCOM (AF) stating to the former that no records were filed in Tokyo and to the latter to search for and comply with DA radio.
- 7. C/S personally replied to W 99002 by dispatching C-54671 to DA. No message was sent to PHILCOM (AF).
 - 8. This completed the action and nothing further is required by G-4.
- 9. Journal numbers 1110 and 1106 both refer to this same action. Action complete on 1106.

WINDING UP UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT DISPOSAL OF WAR SURPLUS
PROPERTY IN THE PHILIPPINES SAID TODAY THAT THEFT OF \$2,000,000,000(\$)
WORTH OF SURPLUS GOODS WOULD HAVE BEEN IMPOSSIBLE BECAUSE THE
TOTAL VALUE WAS ONLY LITTE MORE THAN HALF THAT FIGURE.

JAMESM A. MCCONNELL, AREA DIRECTOR OF THE UNITED STATES
SURPLUS PROPERTY DIVISION, SAID THE TOTAL PROCUREMENT COST OF
SUCH GOODS TURNED OVER TO THE PHILIPPINE GOVERNMENT SINCE THE
END OF THE WAR WAS ONLY \$1,112,000,000(8).

MACCONNELL WADE THIS STATEMENT TO THE UNITED PRESS IN COMMENTING ON PRESS DISPATCHES FROM THE UNITED STATES QUOTING GOVERNMENT SOURCES DENYING THAT \$2,000,000,000 WORTH OF PROPERTY HAD BEEN STOLEN IN THE PHILIPPINES.

OF SUCH THEFTS BUT ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THERE HAD BEEN WIDESPREAD
STEALING OF AMERICAN GOODS HERE. HE SAID, HOWEVER, REPORTS
OF SURPLUS GOODS ROBBERIES MAY HAVE INCLUDED PROPERTY OTHER
THAN SURPLUS.

NCCONNEL SAID, "THERE WERE PLENTY GOODS STOLEN HERE THAT NEVER WERE INTENDED AS SURPLUS."

PHOLIPPINE CONGRESSMAN ARSENIC LACSON, MEMBER OF THE MINORITY PARTY, SAID HE BELIEVED THE \$2,000,000,000(B) FIGURE WAS "SUBSTANTIALLY CORRECT."

AID SURPLUS PROPERTY MANILA X X X CORRECT

HE SAID, "THAT AMOUNT COULD HAVE BEEN REALIZED AND THE ESTINATE OF LOS IS REASONABLE. THERE IS NO DOUBT THAT DEPOTS WERE LOOTED BY GI'S WHEN THE FOREIGN LIQUIDATION COMMISSION OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT WAS TAKING CARE OF THE EQUIPMENT AND EVEN WHEN THE PHILIPPINE GOVERNMENT HAD TAKEN OVER WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE SURPLUS PROPERTY COMMISSION."

LACSON, WHO IS A MEMBER OF THE MACIONALISTA PARTY,
SAID SEVERAL UNITED STATES ARMY MEN AND A FEW FILIPINOS MADE
"MILLIONS" IN SURPLUS PROPERTY.

ABOUT MARCH OR APRIL OF 1946 ALTHOUGH THE BULK BALE AGREEMENT WAS NOT SIGNED UNTIL SEPTEMBER 11 1946.

THE DISPOSITION OF SUCH PROPERTY REMANDE WAS OFFICIALLY ENDED SEPTEMBER 30 1949 WHEN THE QUALITY AND VALUE OF THE REMAINING GOODS MADE THE COST OF HANDLING RIGHM THEM PROHIBITIVE.

SPECIAL ITEMS ARE STILL BEING TURNED OVER UNDER SPECIAL AGREEMENT.

WASHINGTON, JAN.29- (UP)- THE WASHINGTON FOST CALLED FOR CONGRESSIONAL INVESTIGATION OF THE "SCANDALOUS LOSS" OF \$2,000,000,000 (8) WORTH OF UNITED STATES MILITARY EQUIPMENT IN THE PHILIPPINES.

THE EDITORIAL SAID THIS MIGHT ENCOURAGE PHILIPPINE GOVERNMENT RESISTANCE TO CORRUPTION IN THE ISLANDS' OWN AFFAIRS.

IT SAID: "LOOSE MANAGEMENTER OF UNITED STATES PROPERTY
IN THE PHILIPPINES, AS ELSEWHERE IN THE PACIFIC, HAS
UNDOUBTEDLY CONTRIBUTED TO THE WAVE OF POST-WAR CORRUPTION THAT
HAS BEEN EXPERIENCED IN THE ISLANDS.

"NISMANAGEMENT OF SUCH A VAST STOCKPILE OF MATERIAL IN A COUNTRY THAT IS JUST GETTING ITS POLITICAL INSTITUTIONS ESTABLISHED IS INEVITABLY A DEMORALIZING INFLUENCE. IT INVITES CORRUPTION."

THE POST SAID CONGRESSIONAL INQUIRY WAS THE "MOST DIRECT WAY OF GETTING TO THE BOTTOM OF THE SCANDALOUS LOSS."

PEDROSA TOLD THE MUNITED PRESS THAT HE WOULD WELCOME UNITED

STATES INVESTIGATION OF ALLIEB SURPLUS PROPERTY SCANDALS "TO

PUT AN END ONCE AND FOR ALL TO A TROUBLESOME RECURRENT

GOVERNMENT HEADACHE."

PEDROSA SAID, "I CAN ASSURE YOU THAT PRESIDENT QUIRING WILL BE ONLY TOO HAPPY TO PROSECUTE ANY GUILTY FILIPINOS TURNED UP BY AN INVESTIGATION." BUT HE SAID THAT HE THOUGHT THAT VARIOUS RECENT VERSIONS IN THE PRESS OR OTHERWISE ABOUT \$2,000,000,000 (B) WORTH OF PROPERTY BEING STOLEN OR GOING ASTRAY IN THE PHILIPPINES WERE "EXAGGERATED."

HE CONFIRMED, HOWEVER, THAT THE PHILIPPINES REALIZED ONLY
ABOUT \$45,000,000 (M) IN DISPOSING OF SURPLUS PROPERTY ASSIGNED
BY THE UNITED STATES TO THE PHILIPPINES WITH A GUARANTEED RESALE.
VALUE OF \$100,000,000 (M).

PEDROSA WAS REACHED AT BALTIMORE WM BY PHONE ON THIS SUBJECT.
HE IS WITH PRESIDENT ELPIDIO QUIRING THERE.

WHEN ASKED ABOUT REPORTS THAT THE UNITED STATES SENATE AND THE ARMY INTELLIGENCE DIVISION OF THE DEFENSE DEPARTMENT ARE CONSIDERING INVESTIGATION OF THE MATTER, PEDROSA SAID HE HAD BEEN TOLD NOTHING ABOUT IT IF IT WAS TRUE.

ADD PEDROSA WASHINGTON XXX TRUE

"IT IS NONE OF OUR BUSINESS IF THE UNITED STATES WANTS TO
INVESTIGATE ITS NATIONALS IN SURPLUS IRREGULARITIES," HE COMMENTED.
"BUT I THINK IT WOULD CERTAINLY BE WORTH WHILE FOR IT TO CONDUCT
AN INVESTIGATION FROM ITS OWN END."

HE SUGGESTED THAT THE INVESTIGATION, HOWEVER, MIGHT BE CONDUCTED THROUGH A JOINT PHILIPPINE-UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT AGREEMENT.

Asked about surplus scandal allegations circulated from
New York during the past two days, Army Undersecretary Tracy
Voorhees acknowledged that the Army had long been aware that there
were certain irregularities but he offered the explanation that they
resulted from the army's responding to public demands by moving its
troops too quickly out of the Philippines.

COPY WAS AVAILABLE IN WASHINGTON.

HE SAID THAT THE REPORT WAS AT LEAST THREE YEARS OLD AND THAT THE ONLY COPIES EXTANT TO HIS KNOWLEDGE ARE IN TOKYO, MANILA AND THE ARMY RECORDS GRAVEYARD IN ST. LOUIS.

THIS REPORT DIFFERED FROM THE STORY TOLD THE UNITED PRESS BY
SENATE EXPENDITURES COMMITTEE STAFF MEMBERS. THEY SAID THAT ARMY
INTELLIGENCE TALKED TO THEM ABOUT THE MATTER AND BAVE EVERY INDICATION IT HAD THE REPORT AT ITS FINGER TIPS.

THIRD PEDROSA WASHINGTON XXX FINGER TIPS

THEY SAID THAT BE AS FAR AS THEY WERE CONCERNED, THEY HAD SO FAR STARTED AN INQUIRY, NOT AN INVESTIGATION. THEY SAID THAT THE INQUIRY HAS TWO GOALS:

- 1) To DETERMINE IF THE COMMITTEE WOULD HAVE JURISDICTION TO INVESTIGATE IN THE PHILIPPINES;
 - 2) IF SUCH AN INVESTIGATION WOULD BE JUSTIFIED.
