- I was NX29591 Trivate Campbell Weston Perry, A.A.S.C. when I was taken prisoner by the Japanese at Singapore on 15 February 1942 and imprisoned at Changi.
- Malayan and Chinese civilians by the Japanese. I was making my way down to the beach looking for Coccanuts when I heard machine gun fire. I continued on my way when a Japanese Guard stopped me and told me to wait where I was. Shortly after a party came past on a truck and took the Japanese Guard away. I went down to the beach and saw approximately 40 Chinese and Malayan civilians lying on the beach, dead. Two others had not been killed and were crawling away up the beach; they were badly wounded and I think they would have died. I went close enough to the bodies to see that they had been shot.
