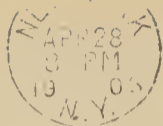

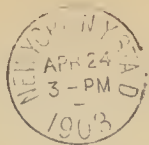

Dear Sir :

The New York Historical Society announces that, to commemorate the one hundredth Anniversary of the Society, a medal has been struck, showing on the obverse its first president, Egbert Benson, and its founder, John Pintard ; on the reverse, the first home of the Society, Federal Hall, and our future building. It is 25 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter, to correspond to the medal struck on the fifty-seventh Anniversary.

The medal will be issued to members only, in silver and bronze. The issue is limited to 550 copies in bronze, but the committee reserves the right to increase the number should the subscriptions warrant the same. Medals in silver will be struck in addition to the above if ordered before the subscription list closes. Subscriptions will be received up to



November 10th, and members only can subscribe for one copy in bronze at \$3.00. Additional copies can be subscribed for at the same time at \$5.00 each. Medals in silver can be ordered at \$10.00 each.

No subscription will be entered unless accompanied by a check to the order of The New York Historical Society. The number of medals issued will be strictly limited to those ordered by members before the subscription closes, together with 100 copies additional for distribution by the Society.

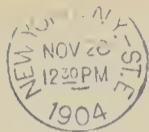

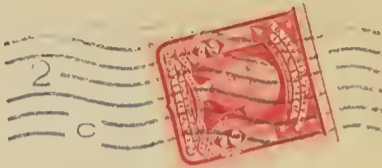
