Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto and Quebec, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in Canada.

Moon's PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the two meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0°, 90°, 180° and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, i. e., the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 45°. When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar, or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45°.

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

Thus for latitude 43° 20'...1st correction = - 4' 5" 2nd correction + 2.0 × 20 = + 40"
 " 47° 40'... " + 4' 32" " + 2.5 × 40 = 1' 40"
 " 45° 10'... " + 0' 0" " + 2.2 × 10 = 0' 22"

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of Toronto.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual civil day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

The times of the SUN'S RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction both for Toronto and Quebec.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto and Quebec.

The Moon's MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for Toronto. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column SUN ON MERIDIAN gives the time that a watch should shew when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

Moon's AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of Toronto, when in the column headed Moon's rising or setting or Moon on meridian the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The column, UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR shews for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of Toronto. It passes in the morning from April 9 to October 8, and in the afternoon for the rest of the year, excepting on October 9, when it does not cross the meridian.

The four last columns, although computed for Toronto, will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

Star Table.

From the times of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of culmination, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude.

To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole-star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite to it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the setting of a star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places to and to the north of latitude 45°.

Eclipses

In the year 1865 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I.—A partial eclipse of the Moon. April 10, 1865, visible in Canada.

The first contact with the shadow occurs at 43° from the northermost point of the Moon's limb towards the east, and the last contact at 10° towards the west. Magnitude of the eclipse (Moon's diameter = 1) 0.192.

The following table shows, for certain stations, the local astronomical mean time at which the different phases occur.

II.—A total eclipse of the Sun, April 25, 1865, invisible in Canada.

III.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, October 4, 1865, partly visible at the stations in the annexed table, which gives the local astronomical time at which the different phases that are visible take place. The occurrence of a star ♦ indicates that the Moon will not have risen at the time of the corresponding phase.

The first contact with the shadow occurs at 128° from the northernmost point of the Moon's limb towards the east, and the last contact at 102° towards the west. Magnitude of the eclipse (Moon's diameter = 1) 0.342.

From a point in or near Quebec, in latitude 46° 29' 2" N., and longitude 4h 44m 48s W., a partial eclipse is visible.

First contact occurs October 10, 9h 16m A.M.
Greatest obscuration, October 10, 10h 45.4m A.M. } Mean civil time at Quebec.

Last contact, October 10, 10h 20.2m P.M.
Magnitude of the eclipse (Sun's diameter = 1) 0.60.

The mean temperature of the year 1863 was $0^{\circ}.45$ in excess of the average annual temperature of twenty-two years. The oscillations of the monthly means, above or below their respective average monthly means, had an average amplitude of $1^{\circ}.81$, which, though slightly greater than the corresponding number ($1^{\circ}.42$) for the year 1862, was considerably less than the average amplitude of the monthly oscillations ($2^{\circ}.44$) in twenty-two years.

The mean deviations of temperature in the four seasons, with their proper signs, and regarding the winter as including December, 1862, were $+2^{\circ}.23$ in winter, $-0^{\circ}.11$ in spring, $+0^{\circ}.02$ in summer, and $+0^{\circ}.28$ in autumn. Hence as regards its temperature, the year, though beginning with a mild winter, was regular in the other seasons.

There was a deficiency in the rain and snow, amounting to 3.75 inches of water. A deficiency occurred in the spring, summer, and autumn; but an excess in the winter, commencing December, 1862, as well as an excess in December, 1863. The deviations in the amount of precipitation, with their proper signs, in the four seasons, were $+1.87$ inches in winter, -0.765 inches in spring, -2.263 inches in summer, and -2.559 inches in autumn.

Number of nights possible to see Aurora during the year was 182, and number of Auroras observed 44—distributed over the year as follows, in January, 3; February, 4; March, 5; April, 6; May, 0; June, 4; July, 6; August, 6; September, 8; October, 8; November, 1; December, 0.

Mean elasticity of aqueous vapour was for the year 266 —average for the past seven years being 259 .

In the following summary, several of the results for the year 1863 are compared with the averages derived from a series of years, as well as with the extreme values of analogous results that have occurred during the same series.

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THE ROYAL FAMILY.

HER MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY (ALEXANDRA) VICTORIA,—By the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith. Her Majesty, the only daughter and heir of the late Prince Edward, Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III., and of Victoria-Maria-Louisa (Princess-a Dowager of Leiningen), Duchess of Kent, and sister of the King of the Belgians. Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, on the 24th of May, 1819; baptised on the 24th of June, 1819, ascended the throne on the demise of her uncle, King William IV., 20th June, 1837; and was crowned at Westminster, on the 28th June, 1838. Her Majesty was married at St. James's Palace, on the 10th of February, 1840, to his late Royal Highness Francis-Albert-Augustus-Charles-Emmanuel, Duke of Saxe, Prince of Coburg and Gotha, who died 14th December, 1861.

All importations for the public uses of the Province.

All dutiable goods imported by and for the use of the Governor General, to be free by order in Council.

Arms, for Army or Navy, and Indian Nations—provided the duty otherwise payable be defrayed by the Treasury of the Un. Kingdom or of this Province.

All importations for the use of H. M. Army and Navy serving in Canada, when the duty otherwise payable thereon would be paid or borne by the Treasury of the United Kingdom or of this Province.

Silver and Plated Ware, Glassware, Table Linen and Cigars, imported specially for the use of any Regimental Mess of Officers of H. M. Army serving in Canada, under such regulations as may be determined by order in Council.

Books, Maps and Charts, imported not as Merchandise, but as the personal effects of persons arriving in Canada to become bona fide residents of the Province.

Household effects, that have been in actual use for one month or more, of persons coming to settle in the Province and under the charge of the owner.

Clothing—when donations for gratuitous distribution by charitable societies, or for the Army, Navy, or Indian Nations.

Models or Patterns of all kinds of Invention, Machinery, or Improvements in the Arts—provided the same be not put to actual use.

Military Clothing for H. M. Troops or Militia.

Military Stores, &c., for Provincial Militia, under such restriction and regulations as may be passed by the Governor in Council.

All dutiable goods imported by and for the use of Foreign Consuls are free.

Packages containing Free Goods, and of the description in which such Goods are usually imported, shall be free.

The following packages shall be free, viz.: Boxes: Trusses: Cases covering Casks of Wine or Brandy in Wood; Cases and Casks containing Dry Goods, Hardware & Cutlery: Crates or Casks containing Glassware or Earthenware; Cases containing Bottled Wine or Bottled Spirits, and other Packages in which Goods of the kind contained in them are usually imported, and which do not necessarily or generally accompany such Goods when sold in this Province.

All other Packages containing Goods paying ad valorem duties shall be chargeable with the same duty as the Goods they contain, unless such duty exceeds 30 per cent., in which case the duty on the packages containing them shall be 30 per cent. ad valorem: and Packages containing Goods paying specific duties shall be chargeable with a duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem.

Tools (ths) and Implements of Trade of persons arriving in Canada, when accompanied into the Province by the actual settler, for his own use, and not for sale.

The following Articles are prohibited to be imported, under a penalty of Fifty Pounds, together with the forfeiture of the Pared or Package of Goods in which the same may be found:—

Books and Drawings of an immoral or indecent character.

HEIR AND DEVISES COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. *Clark of Commissioners*: W. B. Howard.

COURT COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, crim-

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con., or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to Chancery.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts. *Surrogate Clerk*, C. Fitzgibbon, Toronto.

COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year for trials by jury in cases of felony and maledemeanor, but treason and capital felonies are exempted from their jurisdiction.

RECONINGS' COURTS.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston, and Ottawa, the Recorder's Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counter having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held first Monday in March, June and September, and third Monday in December. *Recorders*—George Duggan, Jun., Toronto; James O'Reilly, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—By the "Insolvent Act of 1864," 27 & 28 Vic. cap. 57, passed on the 30th June, 1864, provision is at length made "for the settlement of the estates of insolvent debtors, for giving effect to arrangements between them and their creditors, and for the punishment of fraud." In Lower Canada, this enactment applies to traders only. In Upper Canada, to all persons whether traders or non-traders. In these courts, the county court judge in each county presides—the only appointments made in pursuance of this statute being those of "official assignees" who are to be nominated "by the Board of Trade at any place, or the council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade." This important statute is likely to prove a great boon to the community, but having so recently gone into operation (September 1, 1864) its working and efficiency are not yet tested.

DIVISION COURTS—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquor drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, calumny, seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Courts are held twice in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

CLERK OF THE PROCESSION.—For sealing and issuing Writs of Summons and other Writs in the Queen's Bench and Common Pleas (alternately)—Rohr, Stanton. The Deputy Clerks of the Crown in the several Counties are supplied with writs from Toronto, and re-issue the same in their respective counties.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the fourth Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins third Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Trinity begins Monday next after 21st August, and ends on the Saturday of the ensuing week; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long vacation from the 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in Jan., April, July and Oct., and end the following Saturday.

LETTER RATES.

Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province itself, if prepaid, for 6 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 7 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

On Letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 6 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., with optional prepayment.

The rate of Letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet,

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. 12 cents.
Exceeding " and not exceeding 1 oz. 25 "

" 1 oz. and not " 2 oz. 50 "
and so on, increasing two rates of postage for each additional ounce.

And by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., &c.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on letters for the U. States, is 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.;
" to Cuba 20 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

The Postage rate to British Columbia is,

Letters 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.
Newspapers 2 cents each.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every Thursday, via Derry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 8d. stg. per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada, alternately to Boston and New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 8d. stg. per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"By Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated. "By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any Mail for Canada is a "Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz.:

On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America 2 cents.

On Letters for the United States 5 "

On Letters for the United Kingdom 12½ "

On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England 25 "

On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via France an amount equal to the postage rate.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the

casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Province, is 25 cts. per lb. (with 3 cts. additional if Registered.)

One cent per oz., payable in advance by Postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelopes, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to letter postage). Price Current, Hand Bills, and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound, when posted at a Canadian Post Office addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States.

The postage upon Price Current addressed to the United Kingdom is two cents each, which must be prepaid by postage stamps, or they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office to be returned to the senders.

BOOK POST WITH ENGLAND.

The charge on Books, &c., by Book Post to England, is 7 cents on packets not exceeding 4 oz. in weight, 12½ cents on $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. packets, and 12½ cents additional for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. These charges must be prepaid. Photographs, provided they are not upon glass or in cases containing glass, may be forwarded to England at the Book rate of postage.

BOOK POST WITH FRANCE.

For a Packet of Printed matter, or single Newspaper, Book, &c., not over 2 oz. 4 cents.
Do. exceeding 2 oz. and " 4 oz. 8 "
Do. " 4 oz. and " 8 oz. 17 "
Do. " 8 oz. and " 1 lb. 34 "

And so on, increasing 17 cents for each additional $\frac{1}{2}$ lb.

The Book Post regulations between Canada and England apply to matter between Canada and France.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, if paid quarterly in advance by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

For a paper published 6 times a week, 40 cents per quarter.
" 3 " 20 "
" 2 " 13 "
" 1 " 4 "

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 1 cent each, by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS.

The rate on all Periodicals, other than Newspapers, passing by mail in Canada, save such as may be addressed to or received from the United Kingdom, and such as are exempted from postage by Statute, will henceforth be one cent per 4 oz. weight of package containing periodical matter, whether the package contain one or more numbers.

Any fraction of 4 oz. to be charged as a full rate.

On Periodicals posted from the office of publication or by News Agents or Booksellers, to regular subscribers within the Province, this rate may remain to be collected on delivery, and must in such cases be marked upon the packages and charged in the Letter Bills; but when mailed to go out of the Province such Periodical matter must be prepaid by Postage Stamp. British and United States Periodicals may be posted in Canada by News Agents and Booksellers to regular subscribers in the Province under this regulation.

Transient Periodical matter posted in Canada must in all cases be prepaid by Postage Stamp.

The above rate will be payable on delivery on all Periodical matter received from the United States, except that Canadian Editors may receive Exchange Periodicals from the United States free of Canadian Postage.

Periodicals printed and published in Canada, may be posted addressed to any place in the United Kingdom by Canadian Packet, on prepayment by Postage Stamp of two cents each number.

This rate will be applicable to all classes of Canadian Periodicals posted as above for the United Kingdom, the exemptions to which certain classes of Canadian Periodicals are entitled, extending to such numbers only, as are addressed from the Office of publication to places within the Province.

POSTAGE RATES ON MISCELLANEOUS MATTER.

Packages of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots and scions, or grafts, may be posted in Canada for delivery within the Province, or to an address within the United States, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of one cent per ounce; and when received from the United States addressed to any place in Canada, such packages may be delivered on payment, by the person addressed, of a like rate.

The limit of weight for such packages will be one pound. No communication, whether written or printed, may be enclosed in them; and they must be so put up as to be easy of examination, for the purpose of verifying the alleged contents. If put up in bags, the bags must be simply tied at the neck, so as to admit of inspection; and, in the case of such packages mailed in Canada, the nature of the contents, such as "seeds," "roots," &c., as the case may be, must be marked on the package by the sender, as a statement of the claim to pass at the reduced rate hereby made applicable to such matter.

Book manuscript, and printers' proof-sheets (whether corrected or not), maps, prints, drawings, engravings, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, and sheet music (whether printed or written), may pass in covers open at the ends or sides, and provided that no letter, or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter, be enclosed therein, on prepayment, when posted in Canada, by postage stamp of the ordinary printed matter rate of one cent, per ounce; or upon payment of that rate on delivery of such matter when received in the mails from the United States.

POSTAGE OF BOOKS, PATTERNS AND SAMPLES.

Patterns of merchandise, and samples, may be forwarded between Canada and the United Kingdom, by the Canadian Packet mails, at book post rates, and subject to the following conditions:

The patterns or samples must not be of any intrinsically valuable; and this rule excludes all articles of a saleable nature, and whatever may have a value of its own, apart from its mere use as a pattern; nor must the quantity of any material or article sent as a pattern or sample be so great that it could have on this ground an intrinsic value.

The patterns, &c., must be sent in covers, open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples, however, of seeds, drugs, and such like, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, simply tied at the neck; but bags closed against inspection, although transparent, must not be used for the purpose.

There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the manufacturer's or trade mark and number, and price of the article.

Any infringement of the above regulations will render the packet liable to be treated and charged as a letter.

The rule which forbids the transmission through the Post of any article likely to injure the contents of the mail

bags, will apply to patterns and samples; and any package transgressing this rule is to be sent to the Postmaster General.

The book post rates between Canada and the United Kingdom remains unaltered at 7 cents for a packet weighing not more than 4 ounces.

Packet exceeding 4 oz. and not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents.
" " $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. " 1 lb. 25 cents.
" " 1 lb. " $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. 37 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents.

And so on, adding 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents for each additional $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. or fraction of $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. weight.

No prints or printed matter will be allowed to pass by book post between the United Kingdom and Canada, unless printed on paper, parchment or vellum.

MONEY ORDERS ON CANADA.

All the Money Order Post Offices in Canada are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many Orders of \$100 each as the Applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz.:—

One Orders up to \$10.....	5 cents.
Over \$10 and up to \$20.....	10 do.
Do. 20 do. 40.....	20 do.
Do. 40 do. 60.....	30 do.
Do. 60 do. 80.....	40 do.
Do. 80 do. 100.....	50 do.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The Canadian Money Order Offices also draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland and Scotland, and the Channel Islands, for any sum up to £10 sterling, and grant as many Orders for £10 sterling each as may be needed to make up the amount to be remitted. The terms are as under:—

On Orders up to £2.....	25 cents.
" over £2 and up to £5.....	50 cents.
" over £5 " £7.....	75 cents.
" over £7 " £10.....	100 cents.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE LOWER PROVINCES.

The Canadian Money Order Offices draw also upon all Money Order Offices in Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. The Orders, like those of the United Kingdom are made payable in sterling money, and for sums up to £10 sterling. The terms are:—

For Orders up to £5.....	25 cents.
" over £5, and up to £10.....	50 cents.

The Money Order Post Offices are furnished with lists of all the Money Order Offices in Canada, the United Kingdom, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland; and the Postmasters are instructed to afford every information in their power, in respect of the places upon which they draw, together with any other information relating to such issues as the intending Remitters may desire.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are provided for sale of the respective values of 1 cent for Newspapers; 2 cents for Private Current and Periodicals for the United Kingdom; 5 cents for ordinary Provincial Letters; 10 cents for United States rate; 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents for Canadian Packet; and 17 cents for Cunard Packet.

Letter Envelopes are provided, impressed with medallion stamps, and equivalent to the prepayment of postage to the amount of 5 cents and 10 cents respectively.

The 5 cent envelopes will be sold to the public at the rate of \$5.50 per hundred, or 66 cents per dozen. The price of a single envelope is 6 cents.

The 10 cent envelopes will be sold at the rate of \$10.50 per hundred, or \$1.20 per dozen. Single envelopes 11 cts.

PENAL CLAUSES.

The Post Office Act contains the following penal clauses: To inclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a Parcel posted, for the Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor.

To inclose a letter or any writing, or to make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to inclose any other thing in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers, (except in the case of accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers,) shall be a misdemeanor.

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The College year commences with the Autumn Term.

The Autumn Term begins Sept. 10; Winter do., Nov. 20; Spring do., Feb. 15; Summer do., May 1. Reports of the progress and conduct of the pupils are sent to parents twice each Term, or oftener if desired. Deducting the Vacations the Terms are ten weeks each. The Tuition Fee is \$10 for one Pupil \$9 each for two (Brothers), \$8 each for three (Brothers); and the Fee for Boarders, inclusive of tuition, is \$45 per Term. The many improvements made in the arrangement of the College Boarding House have been found to add very materially to the comfort of the boarders. A large paved Ball Court and a Gymnasium, fitted up with the most approved modern appliances, and a spacious play-ground and cricket ground afford ample facilities for outdoor exercise and amusement within the College bounds. The Boarding House is conducted strictly as an integral part of the Institution, its disbursements paid out of, and its returns paid into, the general funds. Prizes of books and certificates of honor are given every year to those who distinguish themselves in any of the subjects taught in the College. His Excellency the Governor General offers annually a valuable Prize of Books for the best examinations in the higher departments of the College Curriculum. At the Annual Public Examination in July Exhibitions are competed for, varying in value from \$120 to \$40 per annum. Competition for them all is open to the Grammar Schools of the whole Province. More than 2,500 of the youth of the Province have received their education, in whole or in part, in Upper Canada College. The First Classical, and the Mathematical Masters, were pupils of the Institution; as were likewise the greater portion of the Medal-winners, Scholars, and Honor-men of our Universities.

session of the Legislature. A farm will be procured adjacent to the building, for the purpose of giving to the children of farmers a practical knowledge of agriculture. All communications should be addressed to Dr. Ryall, Hamilton.

THE BELLEVILLE SEMINARY.—Incorporated, 1837.—This Institution is the property of the Methodist Episcopal Church, but free to all denominations, no religious creed being taught in it, and students being required to attend such places of worship as their parents or guardians may direct. 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
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
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
