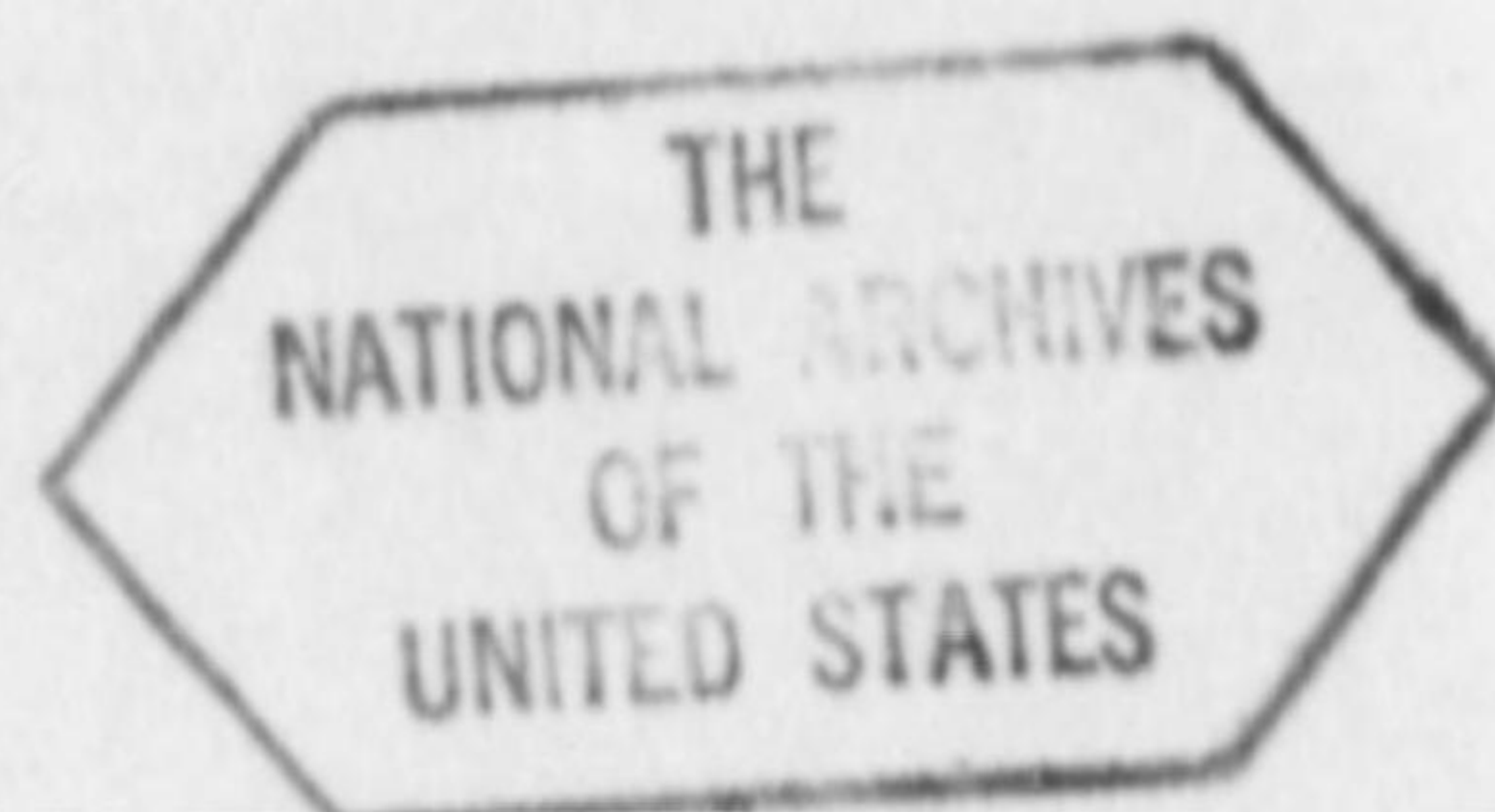

1. 1. Inclosed is Fifth Phase Master Training Program for National Police Reserve, Japan.
2. The fifth phase of National Police Reserve training will begin on 4 February 1952 and continue until 7 June 1952.
3. During this phase of training, all individual and crew-served weapons will be fired for record, with the exception of the rocket launcher 2.36", machine gun cal .50 HB M2, rifle grenade and hand grenade. These weapons will be fired for familiarization during the next phase of training.
4. The infiltration and close combat courses have been included among the lists of common subjects for the first time. The infiltration course will be participated in by all NPRJ personnel, and the close combat course will be undertaken by all combat and combat supporting units (except medical).
5. The major emphasis for this training cycle is on unit training. Small units are to be integrated into coordinated teams of companies and battalions to perfect their tactics, operating procedures, and use of individual weapons and equipment. The ultimate objective is to develop and maintain units capable of operating effectively in the field.
6. The scope and references of the master program, and the detailed unit training programs are being prepared separately.
7. Recommend approval of Master Training Program.

Memorandum For Record:

Lt. Col. Landrum, G-3, GHQ, called at 1015 hours this date and stated that he had previously called Col. Kowalski and was told he was in conference. 2. The Naval Training Area "Dog" is reestablished in area bounded by the following geographical coordinates:

a.  $34^{\circ} 58' 30''$  N -  $139^{\circ} 16'$  E

b.  $34^{\circ} 58' 30''$  N -  $139^{\circ} 23' 15''$  E

c.  $34^{\circ} 48'$  N -  $139^{\circ} 20'$  E

d.  $34^{\circ} 43'$  N -  $139^{\circ} 20'$  E

e.  $34^{\circ} 43'$  N -  $139^{\circ} 13'$  E

f.  $34^{\circ} 54' 15''$  N -  $139^{\circ} 16'$  E

3. Firing in this area will be limited to surface firing only and will be conducted in accordance with existing Navy safety regulations. The conduct of firing will be subject to the following restrictions:

a. This naval training area is established as a controlled firing area.

b. Radar and/or visual surveillance of the controlled firing area will be employed during firing.

c. Cessation of fire if the missile will pass through cloud formations and/or enter an overcast.

d. Firing will be limited to a maximum ordinate of 4,000 feet.

e. Cessation of fire which may endanger aircraft.

f. Firing will be conducted between the hours 0700 - 1700 local time, Monday through Saturday, inclusive.

g. The senior naval officer conducting the firing will be responsible for determining that the range is clear prior to and during all firing.

4. Warning notices of firing will be submitted to the headquarters listed below fifteen (15) days prior to the firing. When the training area is used for periods in excess of fifteen (15) days, warning reminder notices will be submitted for each additional fifteen (15) day period:

a. Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, APO 500 (Attention: Government Section).

b. Commanding General, XVI Corps, APO 14

c. Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command, APO 343.

d. Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, APO 925.

e. Commanding Officer, 187th Airborne Regimental Combat Team, APO 51.

1. Inclosed National Police Reserve Training Program, Fourth Phase, is submitted for approval.
2. The fourth phase of National Police Reserve Training will begin on 8 October 1951 and continue until 19 January 1952. Concurrently, training of approximately 8,000 new recruits will be conducted under a separate program. Upon completion of these programs, the recruits will be integrated into existing units.
3. Prior to the effective date of this program, all weapons now issued to the NPRJ will have been fired for record. These weapons will include the recently issued Rifle M1, BAR, Grenades, Grenade Launcher and the 81mm Mortar.
4. The primary policy for this phase of training will be the continuation of weapons training to include familiarization with all weapons issued, and the combat practice firing of primary weapons during unit training.
5. Training in land mines, demolitions and obstacles has been included in the list of common subjects for all units, except medical. Provisions for more specialized training in these operations will be included in the unit training programs of the Region Patrol Companies, Engineer Units and of the Ordinary and Special Regiments. Special demolition squads will be designated and trained in each line company of these units.
6. The scope and references of the master program and the detailed unit training programs are being prepared separately.

Section I

General

1. Authority. This training program is issued under authority contained in National Police Reserve Rule Number 4, dated 12 February 1951.

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2. Training Objectives.

a. To develop and maintain the maximum proficiency in the individual as a member of the National Police Reserve.

b. To maintain proficiency of individuals in subjects in which they were trained in previous phases.

c. To integrate the individual into and to perfect the functional performance of battalions and smaller units.

d. To perfect the skill and technique of individuals and teams in the use of all weapons issued to the NPR.

3. Allocation of Time. Training prescribed in this program is based on a 44-hour training week covering a period of 13 training weeks, a total of 572 hours. Subjects are divided into three general groups and time is allocated as follows:

## a. Weapons Training:

(1) 132 hours for all units except medical. This will include familiarization firing of all weapons not previously fired for record.

## b. Common Subjects:

(1) 156 hours for service group and service type units, except medical.

(2) 194 hours for patrol companies, ordinary regiments and special regiments, except medical units.

(3) 136 hours for all medical units.

## c. Unit Training:

(1) 276 hours unit and technical training for all service group and service type units, except medical.

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(2) 238 hours unit training for patrol companies, ordinary regiments and special regiments, except medical.

(3) 428 hours unit training (including technical training) for medical units.

d. Eight hours "open time" have been allowed for make-up training required by loss of training time due to unprogrammed activities.

4. Holiday Period. The period between 24 December 1951 and 5 January 1952 will be a holiday period, and a maximum of one-half of the personnel at any one time during this period can be expected to be absent. The remaining personnel will be utilized in camp administration, guard, police, and security. Minimum training during this period should include physical training, dismounted drill, organized athletics, and such subjects for review as desired by unit commander.

5. Special Instructions.

a. Operating headquarters, units, and detachments or elements thereof which are actively engaged in administrative and logistical operations will accomplish at least one-third of the weapons training scheduled in paragraph 3a above. In addition, personnel of such units will be training to perform their primary duties and to maintain and protect themselves under such conditions as might conceivably exist for such personnel. Insofar as the urgency of performance of their primary missions permit, personnel of such units will be given a minimum of four hours weekly training in such subjects as are applicable to them and are not practiced in their daily performance of duty. The remainder of their training will be accomplished "on-the-job."

b. Training in technical and specialist subjects will be conducted as a part of the unit training. Separate programs cover these subjects for each type unit.

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c. For service group units, approximately one-half of the unit training time will be devoted to "on-the-job" training in the performance of normal service functions.

6. Continuity of Training.

a. In scheduling training, arbitrary boundaries between phases are to be avoided. Subjects must be integrated and identified with the unit mission. This may entail concurrent basic, individual, specialist, and small unit training. The objective is to attain, through logical progression, the maximum teamwork and effectiveness for the time expended.

b. Hours of instruction prescribed herein have been reduced to a minimum but are considered adequate to include the review of previous instruction and to introduce new material. Proficiency is attained through subsequent application provided by integrated training. Once a subject is introduced, it should be reviewed and applied at every opportunity.

7. Conduct of Training.

a. Training within the unit will be conducted in accordance with current doctrines and procedures. Commanders must supervise and conduct instruction to insure that material is carefully prepared and presented in an understandable, interesting, and enthusiastic manner.

b. The quality and thoroughness of training is directly proportional to the amount of active and personal supervision on the part of commanders and their staffs. First priority must be given to the primary mission of training; administrative work must not interfere with this mission.

c. Emphasis will be placed on practical work rather than on theoretical instruction. Lectures and conferences will be kept to a minimum to bring

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out briefly the points to be demonstrated and applied or to show the relation between the subject introduced and other subjects.

d. Throughout the entire program, suitable and timely training will be given to selected personnel in order to prepare them to instruct others. Schools for instructors will include theoretical instruction in tactics and techniques of units and weapons, in order better to prepare instructors for the actual conduct of training. Commanders may take advantage of the availability of specially qualified instructors to conduct group instructions of several units. Normally, however, because of considerations of the principles of leadership, unit commanders must conduct and supervise the training of their own units.

e. Every effort will be made during this phase of training to maintain the maximum physical condition of personnel. This program includes only a minimum number of hours to be devoted to physical training. Full use will be made of marches between training areas, and movements during operational problems to condition men for speed, cross-country, and distance marching.

8. Equipment. Information on the availability of additional equipment will be published as it becomes known.

9. Modification. Commanders implementing this program may modify it to make the best use of existing facilities, to conform to conditions of the training situation, or to facilitate the attainment of objectives stated. The time allotted to subjects will be followed as closely as possible. Modification as authorized does not include the omission of subjects herein or the addition of other subjects.

10. Bivouac. Where suitable areas are available, two separate overnight bivouacs will be conducted during the last 4 weeks of the program. The field

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bivouac will be conducted as part of an assumed operational situation. Where possible, training in dispersion and concealment from observation will be stressed, and local security measures will be taken when these do not interfere with scheduled training.

11. Safety. Realism in training will be achieved without sacrifice of reasonable safety precautions. Common sense is a basic principle of safety in any training program. Most accidents attributed to training can be prevented by proper supervision and inspection of equipment and training aids.

12. Progress Records and Reports.

a. A record of the status of training will be kept by each battalion, separate company, and similar type unit, using NPR Form 100, modified as necessary.

b. During this phase of training, Chiefs of Regions and Service Group and Commanding Officer, Camp McKnight, will submit monthly training reports by camp, in duplicate, on NPR Form 101 to be issued.

13. Inspections and Tests. Attainment of prescribed standards must be judged through inspections and tests. Inspections determine the progress of training and indicate the subjects to be stressed to attain the training objective. These inspections and tests will be prepared and conducted as prescribed by Chiefs of Regions and Chief of Service Group.

14. Night Training. At least one-third of all operational training and training in movements will be conducted during hours of darkness, stressing individual and unit night discipline. Time off during daylight hours will be allowed to compensate for training conducted at night.

15. Recruit Training. Recruit training for newly enlisted members of the NPR will be conducted by separate basic training companies in each camp during

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the same period as the training provided herein. A separate program is published for this purpose.

16. Officer Schools. A program for locally conducted schools for the training of officers will be published as a separate training directive.

17. Maneuvers. During this phase the unit against unit maneuver method of tactical training will be featured during the unit training periods. Aggressor opponents will be developed and used.

18. Each numbered company in each ordinary and special regiment and each patrol company will select one squad which will receive additional training in mines and booby traps, obstacles and demolitions, and defense of obstacles and mine fields.

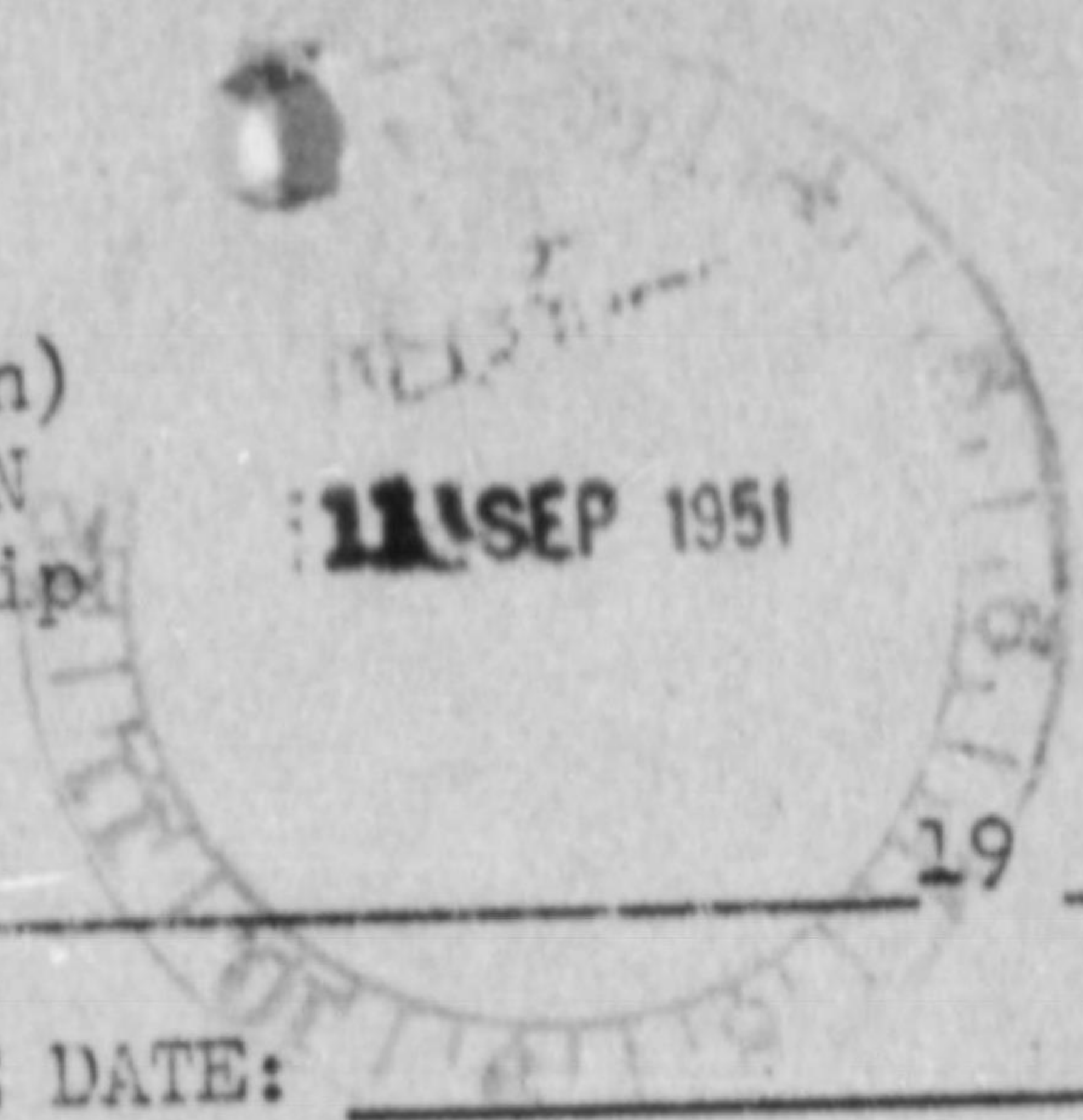

2. The Government Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, has assumed the responsibility of transmitting warning notices to the Japanese Government. The Japanese Government in turn will notify the local Japanese civil authorities of the practice firing or bombing.

3. Warning notices will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, attention Government Section, fifteen (15) days prior to practice firing or bombing. When practice firing or bombing continues for a period in excess of fifteen (15) days warning reminder notices will be submitted.

4. Warning notices are required for all practice firing in which maximum ordinate of projectile exceeds 500 feet.

5. Warning notices will specify the location of practice firing or bombing by name of area and in geographical coordinates. These notices will be forwarded or transmitted unclassified so that information may be transmitted to the Japanese Government for dissemination to the local Japanese civil authorities.

1 1. Inclosed National Police Reserve Training Program, Fourth Phase, is submitted for approval.

2. The fourth phase of National Police Reserve Training will begin on 8 October 1951 and continue until 19 January 1952. Concurrently, training of approximately 8,000 new recruits will be conducted under a separate program. Upon completion of these programs, the recruits will be integrated into existing units.

3. Prior to the effective date of this program, all weapons now issued to the NPRJ will have been fired for record. These weapons will include the recently issued Rifle M1, BAR, Grenades, Grenade Launcher and the 81mm Mortar.

4. The primary policy for this phase of training will be the continuation of weapons training to include familiarization with all weapons issued, and the combat practice firing of primary weapons during unit training.

5. Training in land mines, demolitions and obstacles has been included in the list of common subjects for all units, except medical. Provisions for more specialized training in these operations will be included in the unit training programs of the Region Patrol Companies, Engineer Units and of the Ordinary and Special Regiments. Special demolition squads will be designated and trained in each line company of these units.

6. The scope and references of the master program and the detailed unit training programs are being prepared separately.

It is expected that by June 30, 1951, 1660 2-1/2 ton trucks will have been delivered to NPR. This constitutes 66% of NPR requirements for this type vehicle.

3. National Police Reserve completed a basic training program of 18 weeks duration on 13 January 1951. This program consisted largely of physical training, marches, close order drill, and basic formations. The only weapons available were carbines. All personnel fired the carbine. The NPR will complete its ~~second~~ ~~sixteen-week~~ training phase, *lasting 18 wks,* on 2 June 1951. During this phase, training of small units, subject to limitations imposed by the lack of weapons, vehicles and other equipment, has been conducted. Mechanical training has been conducted with all available weapons and all except the Cal .50 machine gun and the 2.36 rocket launcher will be fired. The third 18-week training phase will begin on 4 June 1951. It is contemplated that 60mm mortars will be added to the weapons now available and that all weapons will be fired during the third training phase.

Dear General Milburn:

Since his arrival, General Ridgway has repeatedly emphasized to me the frontier nature of the duties of this command and the urgent necessity for imbuing our personnel with the habit of mind and way of living essential to troops situated in an area immediately susceptible to armed invasion without warning and at the decision of the enemy. The Commander-in-Chief takes immediate offense at any indication that members of this command are living a normal peace-time garrison existence. An added element of this basic concept is the urgency of time. Time wasted during the accomplishment of our mission here is time irretrievably lost. This fundamental approach to the accomplishment of our mission should be disseminated to your principal commanders by your own personal methods of leadership most adaptable to the situation of your command.

During such official visits as the Commander-in-Chief may make to you and to members of your command, I recommend these specific actions:

- a. Hold no formal ceremonies, unless they are of extremely short duration and carried out with a very high order of snap and precision.
- b. If it is desired to have the Commander-in-Chief inspect the troops of the command, have the troops engaged in their normal duties at the time of inspection.
- c. Hold no cocktail parties or other social or quasi-social functions.
- d. Exclude all long road drives. Travel should be by light aircraft when going beyond the range of normal air travel except for very short distances.

Prior to departure on an inspection visit, the Commander-in-Chief desires to have detailed information made available to the Chief of Staff regarding the program and the itinerary. Once he has been apprised of this program and has approved it, he does not desire to have it changed or unexpected events injected into it.

The principal mission of the Commander-in-Chief in visiting his subordinate units is to establish and to maintain a continuing and effective personal contact with his senior commanders. During such visits, he desires to have that commander immediately available to him, and to the extent possible exclusively available to him, so that each may speak to the other with the utmost frankness and completely without reservation. During the greater portion of his visit, the presence of third parties, who might serve to restrain this frank interchange of views, is not desired.

I relay these personal views of the Commander-in-Chief to you in the hope that they may be of some assistance.

1. United States citizens of both occupation and non-occupation status who have previously registered under the Selective Service Act of 1948, are now receiving instructions from their local Selective Service Boards (in the United States or one of its territories) to report for pre-induction examinations.
2. In order to obviate the necessity of registrants returning to the United States (or territory of residence) to undergo pre-induction examinations, individuals receiving notices to report for examinations may, if they so desire, be administered such examinations at the Recruiting Office, Headquarters and Service Command, General Headquarters, Far East Command (Room 109, Finance Building).
3. Selective Service Registrants requesting pre-induction examinations will be given the AFQT 1 or 2, and the final type medical examination under criteria established in AR 40-115.
4. The completed medical examination papers and the results of the mental examination will be forwarded through CINCPAC, to the Selective Service Board concerned, for final determination of the individual's eligibility for induction into the armed forces. Unless the individual is deferred, and provided that he is physically and mentally qualified, he may expect to be ordered to report immediately to his Selective Service Board for induction.
