TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALE.

TERMS.—To customers of approved credit, 60 days' credit will be given, unless otherwise agreed upon, or 3% discount for cash within 15 days from date of invoice, or 5% discount where cash is remitted with order. This applies to everything except Potatoes, Onion Sets, Grass and Clover Seed, Fertilizers, Lawn Mowers, and all Greenhouse and Garden Supplies, which are net cash.

All accounts remaining unpaid when due are subject to sight draft without further notice. New customers desirous of opening accounts with us must give satisfactory references as to their responsibility.

Prices subject to change without notice.

We make no charge for boxes, packing or cartage, except where Peas, Beans, Corn, or Grass Seed are ordered in large quantities; when 20c. extra must be added for every two bushels to cover cost of bags.

Our prices include charges of all kinds, and are f. o. b. cars or boat.

How to have goods sent.—Seeds in small quantities, especially to distant points, should be forwarded by mail, postage being added at the rate of 8c. per pound; double that amount for Canada. Seeds in larger quantities, and all growing tender Plants, should be forwarded by express. We guarantee the safe arrival of all goods shipped by express.

Seeds in large quantities, Fertilizers, Lawn-mowers, and other heavy goods, Trees, Shrubs, Evergreens, dormant Roses, hardy Plants, and Bulbs should always be sent by freight, as they will go by freight as safely as by express, and at a large saving in expense. Palms, Azaleas, etc., can also go as well by freight as by express when there is no danger of their freezing.

We can ship from New York City by any route desired. Where boat-lines reach, they should always be availed of. Always designate route by which you wish goods shipped. When no route is designated, we use our best judgment, but in no case do we assume any responsibility for freight shipments after goods are delivered to Transportation Companies in good order. Should any loss occur by reason of accidents or delays, claim should be made upon Transportation Company at once.

Our seeds are tested seeds of the very best quality obtainable, and our prices are fixed at the very lowest rates consistent with high quality. While we exercise the greatest care to have all Seeds, Bulbs, etc., pure and reliable, we do not give any warranty expressed or implied, and will, in no way, be responsible for the crop. If the purchaser does not accept our goods on these conditions, they must be returned at once.

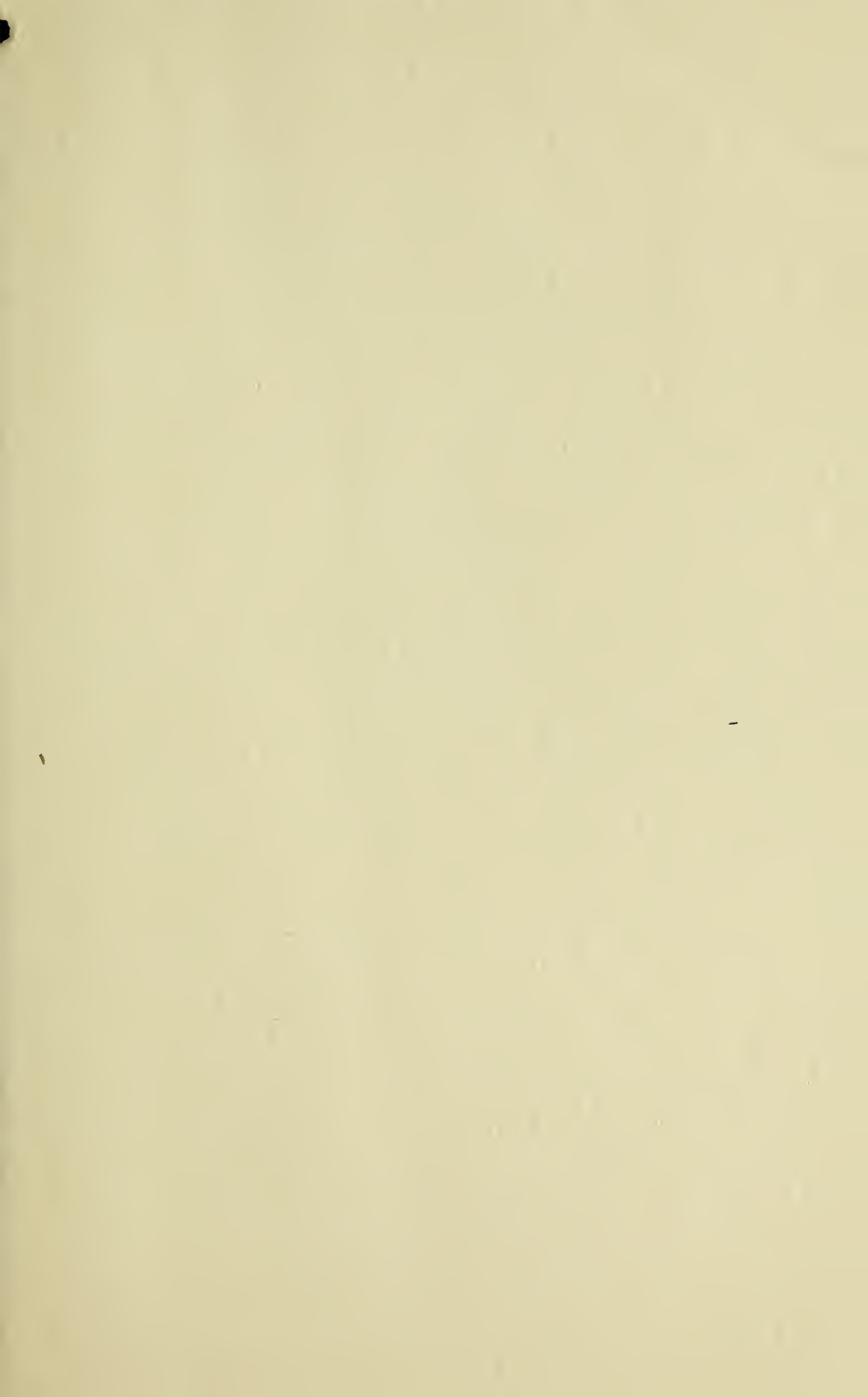
