1. In accordance with reference (a), the following report is submitted.

PART III

2. Civic Action

a. Funds for the \$VN 500 per month General WALT Scholarships being given to ten local Vietnamese children were distributed on 2 February.

b. An additional sewing machine obtained from 1st MAW Civil Affairs was secured for use in the sewing classes. The sewing class made and distributed clothing to 50 children during the month of February.

c. During the period of 9-14 February, the MWFS-1 Motor Transport and Electrical Shops provided on-the-job training for eleven ARVN mechanics and ten ARVN electricians respectively under a GVN sponsored - U.S. military coordinated training program. The Vietnamese students received classroom instruction before receiving the latter "practical experience" training. The students were very enthusiastic and appeared to learn a great deal and the Marines enjoyed instructing them. Overall, the program was an outstanding success.

d. On 12 Feb, the Civic Action Officer attended a 1st MAW Civil Affairs meeting. Business discussed included progress of the animal husbandry projects throughout the Wing, civilian assistance programs, and the necessity for all Marines to attend the Personal Response class.

e. Sgt D.N. CAMPBELL, 1st MAW Personal Response NCO, taught the monthly Personal Response class at the invitation of the Group CAO on 18 February. Attendance: 37 Marines.

f. At approximately 1930H, 20 Feb, MWHG-1 Civic Action's only bear died. An autopsy performed on the animal the following day revealed that the swine had died of pneumonia. With consideration to the inexperience of the Civic Action team in raising swine, there was no previous indication that the deceased bear had had pneumonia. The five sows were also examined and found to be in good health.

g. On 21 Feb, the 15 week chicken raising project was completed with the sale of the few chickens remaining since chicken sales began on 29 Jan 70. The following is a complete statistical recapitulation of the project.

All money received from the chicken sales were accounted for and given to 1st MAW CAO, the office responsible for the entire financing of the chicken raising project. Funds will be used for future Civic Action projects, not to exclude additional chicken raising projects.

h. On 25 Feb, ARVN GySgt Nguyen Van Hoa's daughter was taken to the FLC Childrens' Hospital for an examination concerning additional remedial surgery for a cleft lip repaired approximately 3 years ago when the child was about 3 years old. Arrangements are being made to see if the child could possibly be taken aboard one of the American hospital ships for treatment.
