1. Reference to letter, Osaka Mil Govt Team, APO 25, subj: Petition for Exclusion from Reparations Listing, dated 14 March 1947, and 2d Ind. thereto from Commanding General, Eighth Army, APO 343 to Commanding General, I Corps, file no. AG 004 (MG-Em), dated 27 March 1947.
2. In paragraph 2 of referenced letter above, Commanding General, Eighth Army stated that officials of the Osaka University should resubmit their petition requesting the exclusion of machinery from reparations listing at the time that allocation of machinery is made to claimant nations. The attached petition from the president of the Osaka University requests the exclusion of arsenal machinery and equipment which is dispersed to his university. As has been stated in referenced letter above, the use to which this equipment is now being put is extremely important in the education of Japanese youth along scientific and technical grounds. Should these machinery and equipment be taken, it is virtually impossible to secure replacement equipment.
3. Code numbers of equipment to be released are 32-32(n)-1 through 60, 32-32-1 through 111, 32-31-5198, 5203 through 5207, 5210 through 5213, 5227 through 5230, and additional items of equipment which are not subject to inventory or which the 5250th Technical Intelligence Co. did not deem necessary to inventory.
4. It is again recommended that this equipment be released in order that it may be used in the education of Japanese students along scientific lines. It is further recommended that the machinery





- f. SCAPIN-1130, dated 13 August 1946, subject: "Reparations Selections Within the Iron & Steel Industry."

2. In compliance with paragraph 2 of reference 1(a) above, investigation was made of alleged violations by Nihon Seitetsu K.K., (Japan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd.) of pertinent regulations set forth by SCAPINS, references 1b, c and d above.

3. The Hirohata Works was constructed in 1937, and is considered one of the largest and most efficient iron and steel manufacturing plants in Japan. The total area occupied by subject plant is approximately 800 acres; the total number of employees is 4,000 even at present when the principal production activities are stagnant. Subject company has been placed on the schedule of restricted concerns by reference 1(e) and on the list of reparations plants by reference 1(f).

4. Inclosure 1 is the list of stocks on hand of principal items produced at subject plant. The explanation for depletion in stocks at different dates is given in detail in the accompanying notes. Inclosure 2 - 4 are data on the production and distribution of by-products; namely, coke, chemicals and "washed" or processed coal. Inclosures 5 and 6 are the lists of materials on hand for maintenance and repair.

5. In order to check all pertinent records on by-products from subject plant, this headquarters effected investigations of the following distribution control agencies in Osaka:

Japan Chemical Products Control K.K.
Tar Products Control K.K.
Japan Sulphuric & Nitric Acid Control K.K.
Fertilizer Distribution Control Board
Coal Distribution Control Board

Except in such a few instances as noted in Inclosure 3, where some slight discrepancies exist between data submitted by subject plant and records of Tar Products Control K.K., the by-products of the plant have been sold through authorized distribution channels at prices currently determined or approved by the Government Price Board.

6. After making a thorough investigation, this headquarters has not been able to confirm charges as laid down in inclosures in reference letter. Mr. Takeshi Mohri of Himeji, a publisher of a local weekly newspaper called "Kinki Shimbun" instead of "Chugoku Shimbun" as reported, categorically denies any business connection with subject plant. No single item in the capital assets of subject plant has been disposed of since March 1946; and the movement of all major items of machinery and equipment have been under surveillance of this headquarters since August 1946, in accordance with the reparations program.

7. In view of the facts enumerated in above paragraphs and also in the absence of any specific provision in reference 1 b, c and d, prohibiting subject company from conducting a normal business in compliance with the provision of all pertinent price and distribution control legislation, it is believed that the activities of subject plant in this area reveal no infringement on current directives.

Note:

- (a) Shortly before the end of war, pig iron production from two (2) blast furnaces began to decrease due to shortage of raw materials. The operation of one furnace was discontinued on 23 August 1945. During following four months the other furnace produced 13,970 tons of pig iron. Operation of this furnace ceased on 7 January 1946. From the end of war up to present a total of 24,750 tons was distributed as follows: 120 tons for the manufacture of steel ingots, 1,230 tons for maintenance of installations, 10,180 tons shipped to Yawata Works and 13,220 tons sold to outside users (Transportation Ministry 1,940 tons, Seibu Sentetsu 1,735 tons, Kansai Sentetsu 4,115 tons, steel manufacturers 3,350 tons and miscellaneous uses 2,080 tons). All sales before 31 March 1947, were consummated through control associations. Since April 1947 sales have been made directly to big operators such as Mitsui Bussan, Mitsubishi Shoji, Iwai, etc. in exchange for coupons allocated by the government.
- (b) Pursuant to instructions from the head office, pig iron which had previously been rejected because of its poor quality was crushed and processed into usable material.
- (c) Four (4) out of six (6) open hearth furnaces became inactive before the end of war and the remaining two (2) sets ceased to operate on 31 August 1945. Steel ingots and billets produced at Hirohata are comparatively too large in size to be suitable for use in ordinary plants, therefore no sales have been made to outside users. 290 tons remaining at the end of Mar 1946, were since then written off from the books as scraps unsuitable for rolling purposes.
- (d) The electric furnace has been in operation since May 1946.
- (e) About 7,200 tons of steel billets were shipped to Yawata Works. No sales were made to outside users.
- (f) Approximately 18,500 tons of steel plates were disposed of since August 1945 - for shipment to Yawata Works and the remainder sold through authorized government channels. Of the total 20,359 tons of plates (17,684 tons plus 2,675 tons produced since August 1945) 20,149 tons were distributed as follows: 136 tons for use in the plant, 2,598 tons for shipment to head office, 15,775 tons for sales to outside users and 1,640 tons sunk in transit.

NOTE:

- (a) The firing of coke ovens, numbering 50 sets, was discontinued on 26 July 1946. The production figures for August and September 1946 (see (7) and (8)) represent the amount of coke recovered from residue in the ovens.
- (b) "Special-grade" cokes are manufactured in most instances from low-grade coals. The Government Price Board determines its ceiling price. The company, however, is permitted to distribute "special-grade" cokes more freely in so far as coupons are not required for its deliveries. Other types of cokes are controlled and must be distributed through the proper government channels.
- (c) A total of about 10,800 tons of various types of coke were consumed at the plant during report period. Chief uses are for processing lime, salt, dolomite, etc. 3000 tons; for rations to employees - 3000 tons; for heating purposes during winter season, 1000 tons; and for manufacture of briquettes, 2000 tons.
