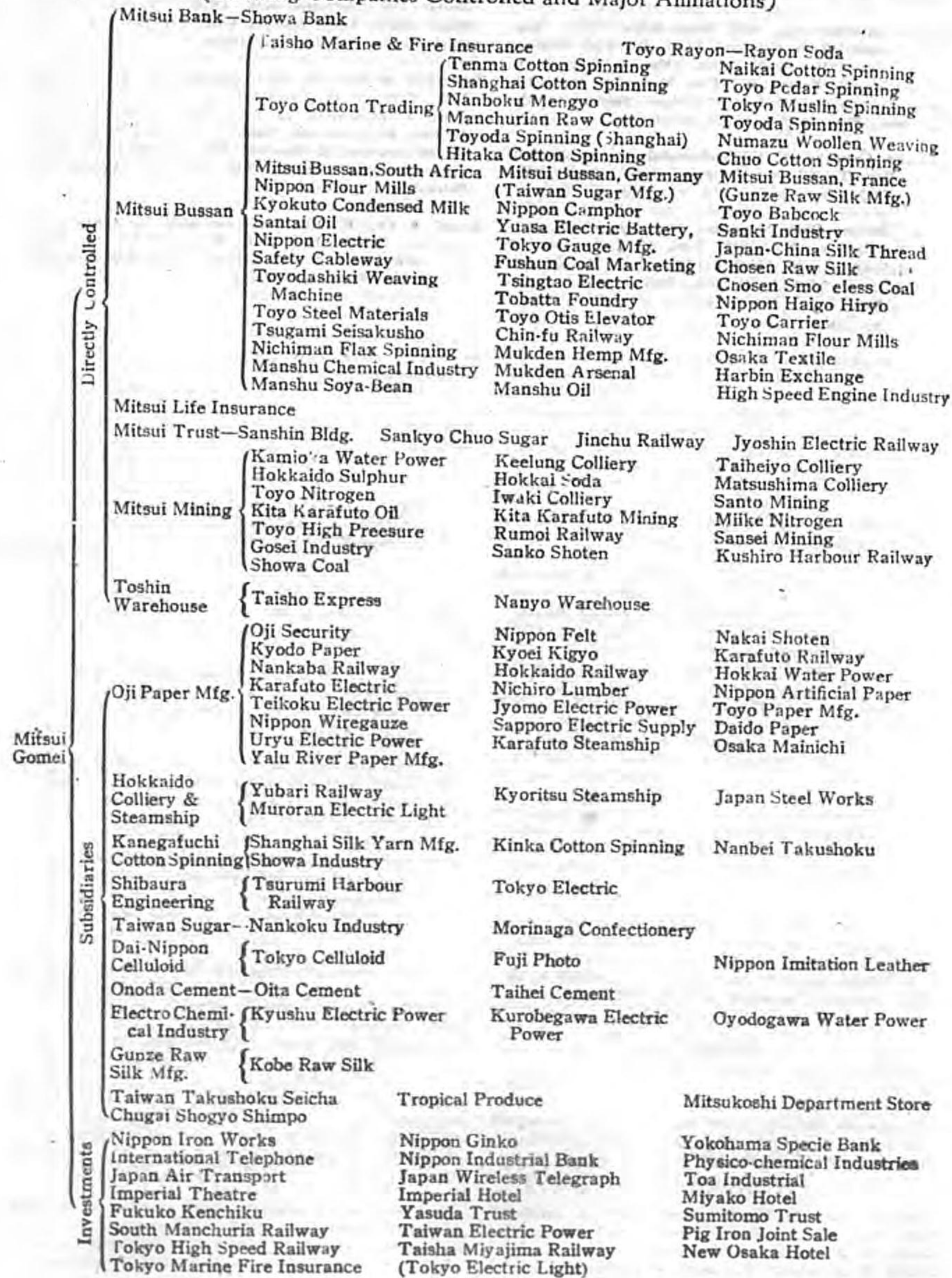

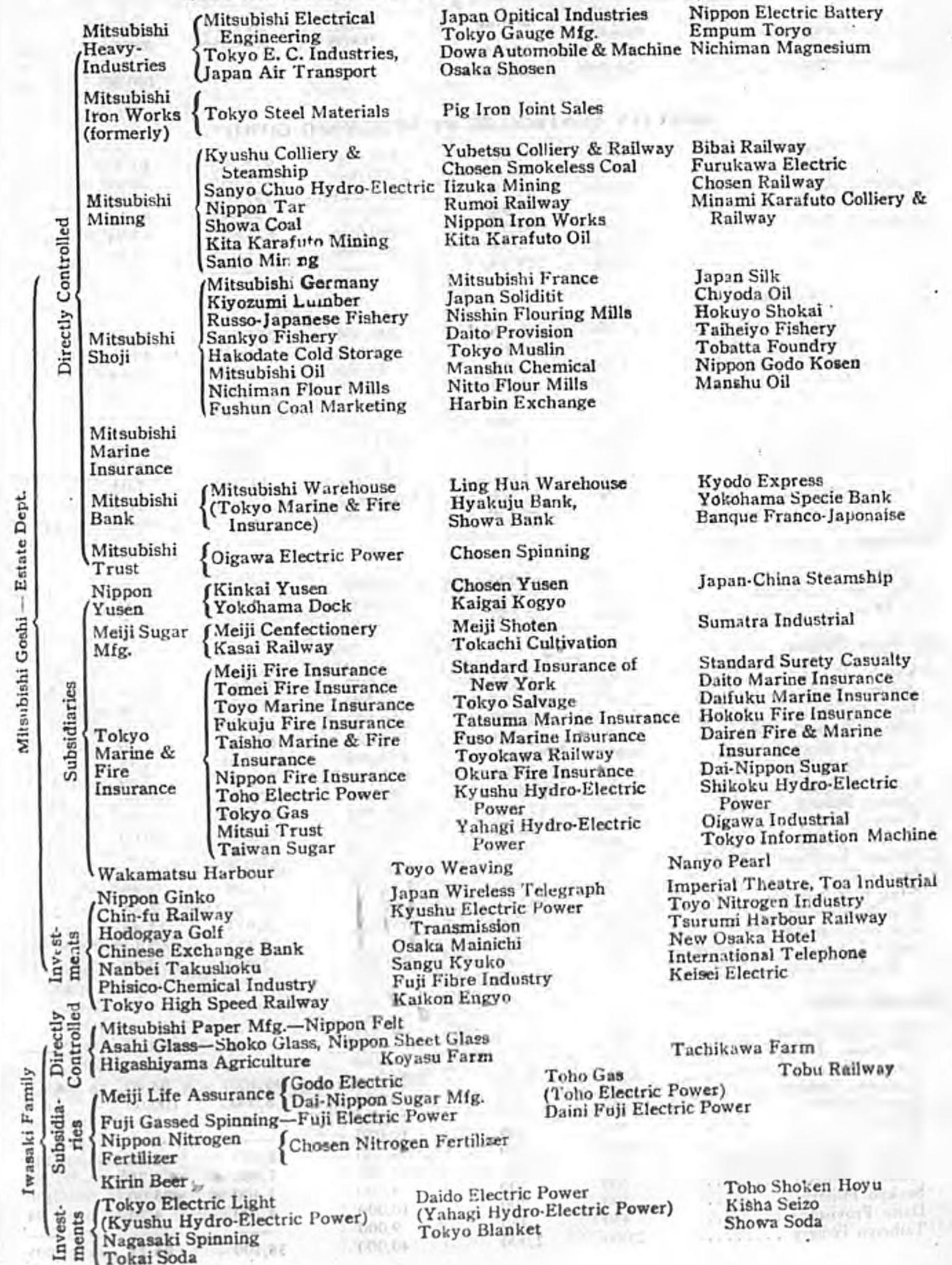

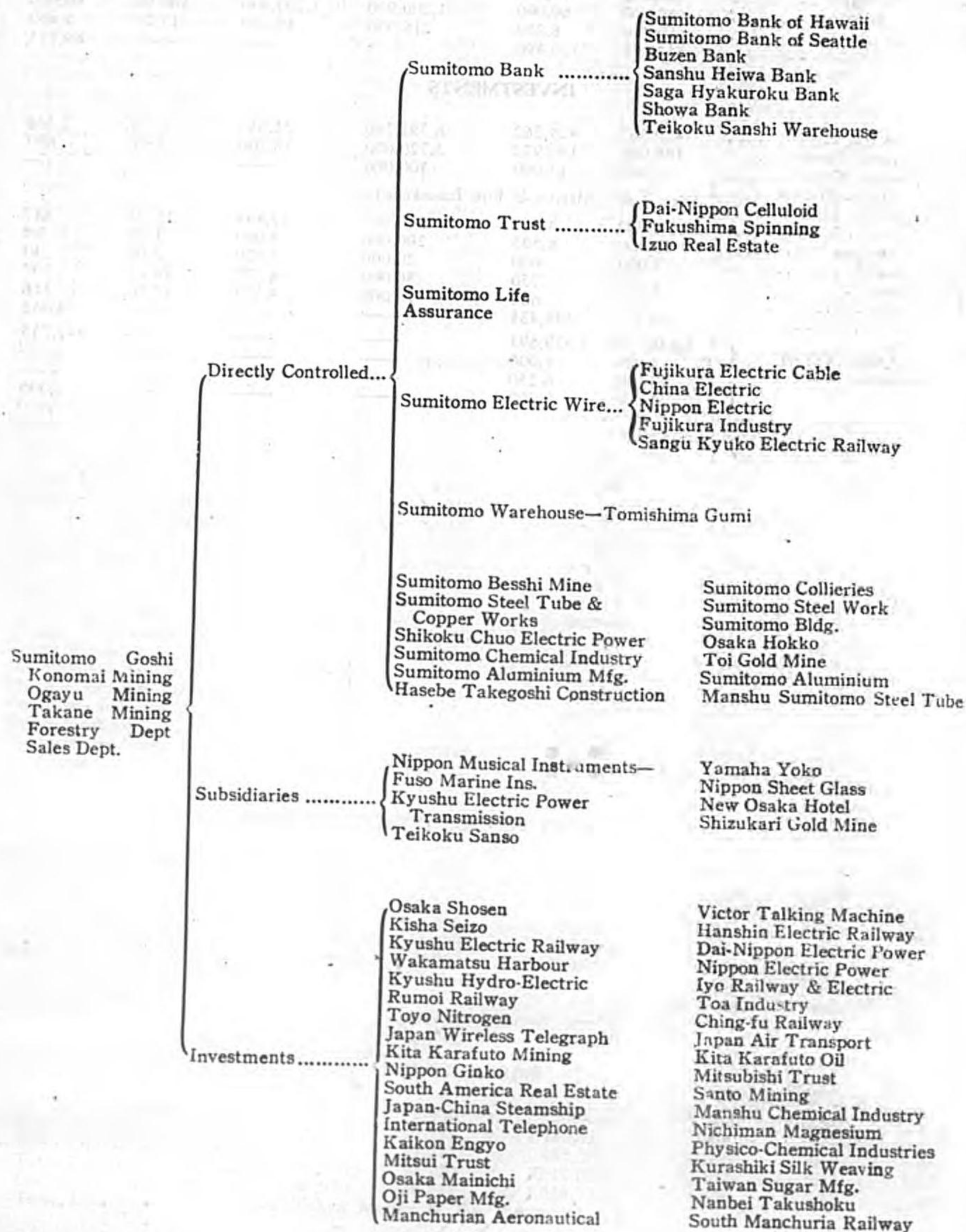

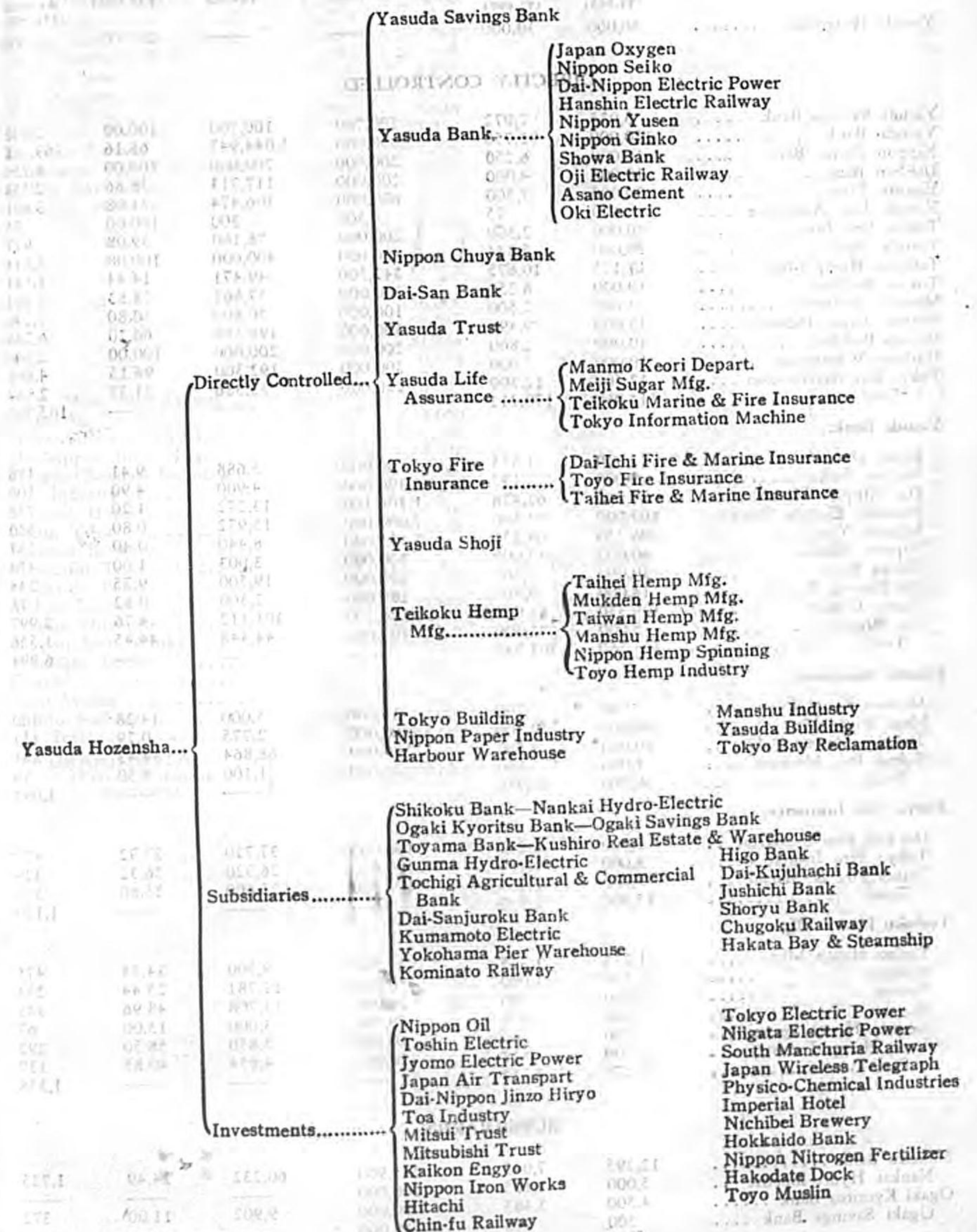

(Showing Companies Controlled and Major Affiliation)

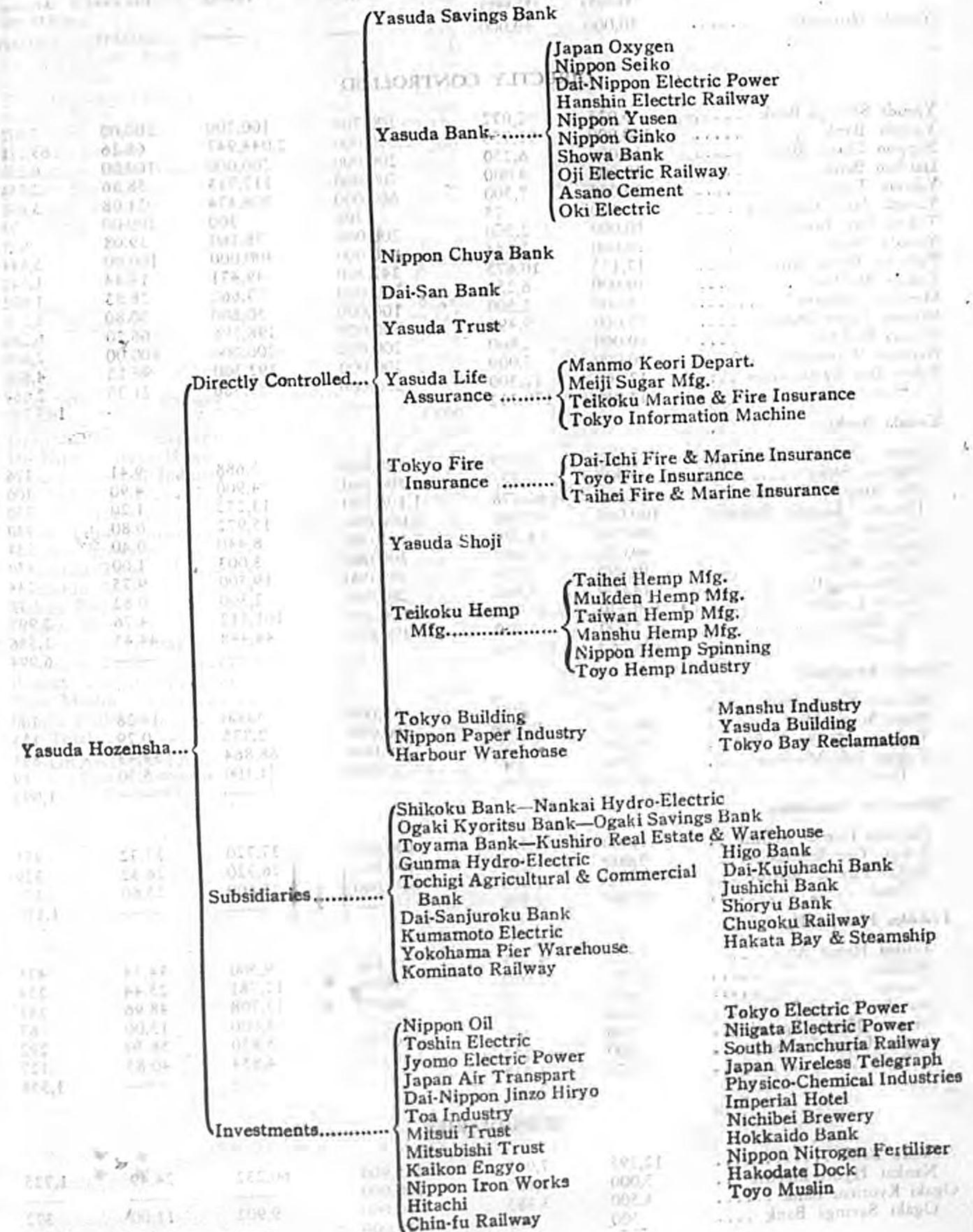

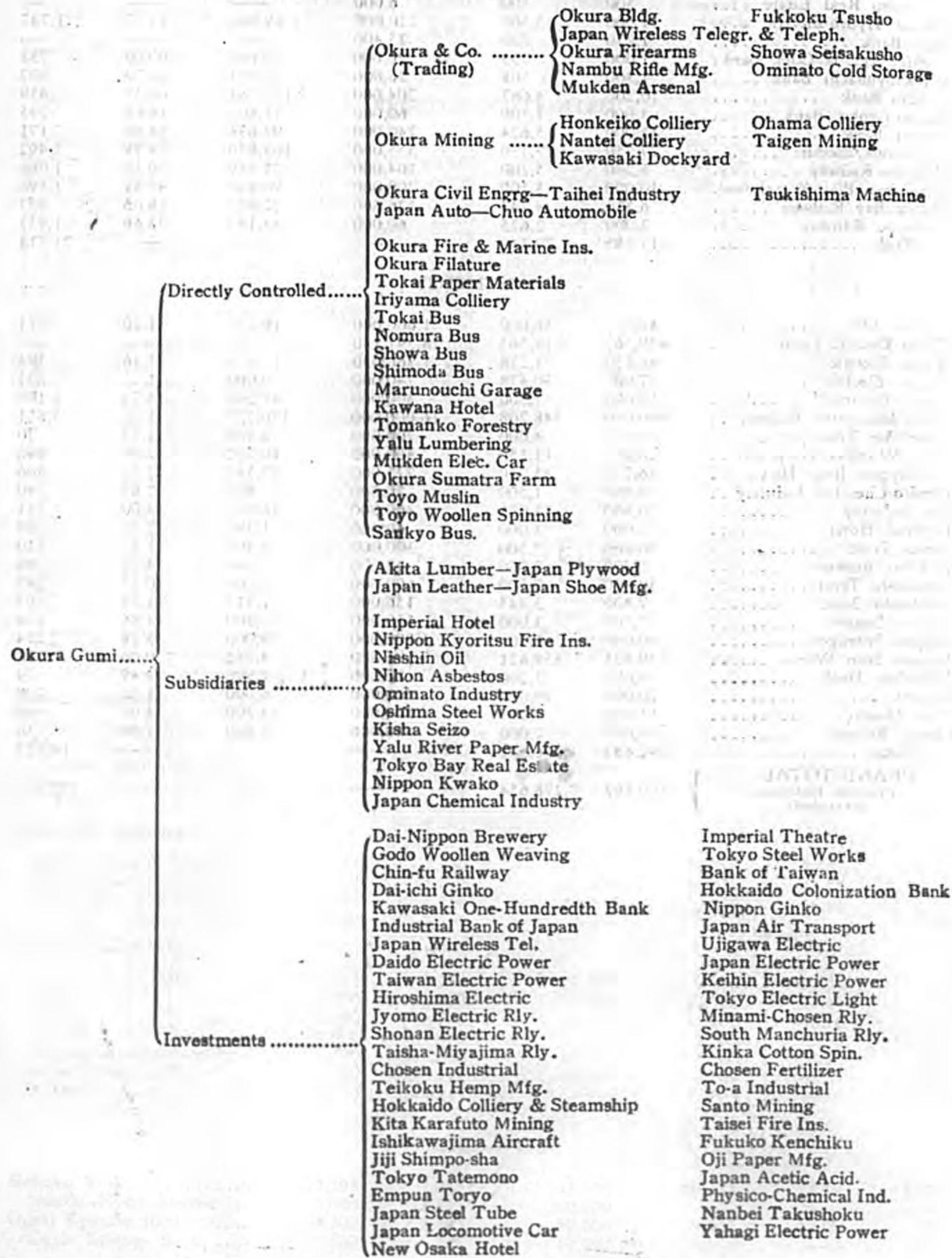

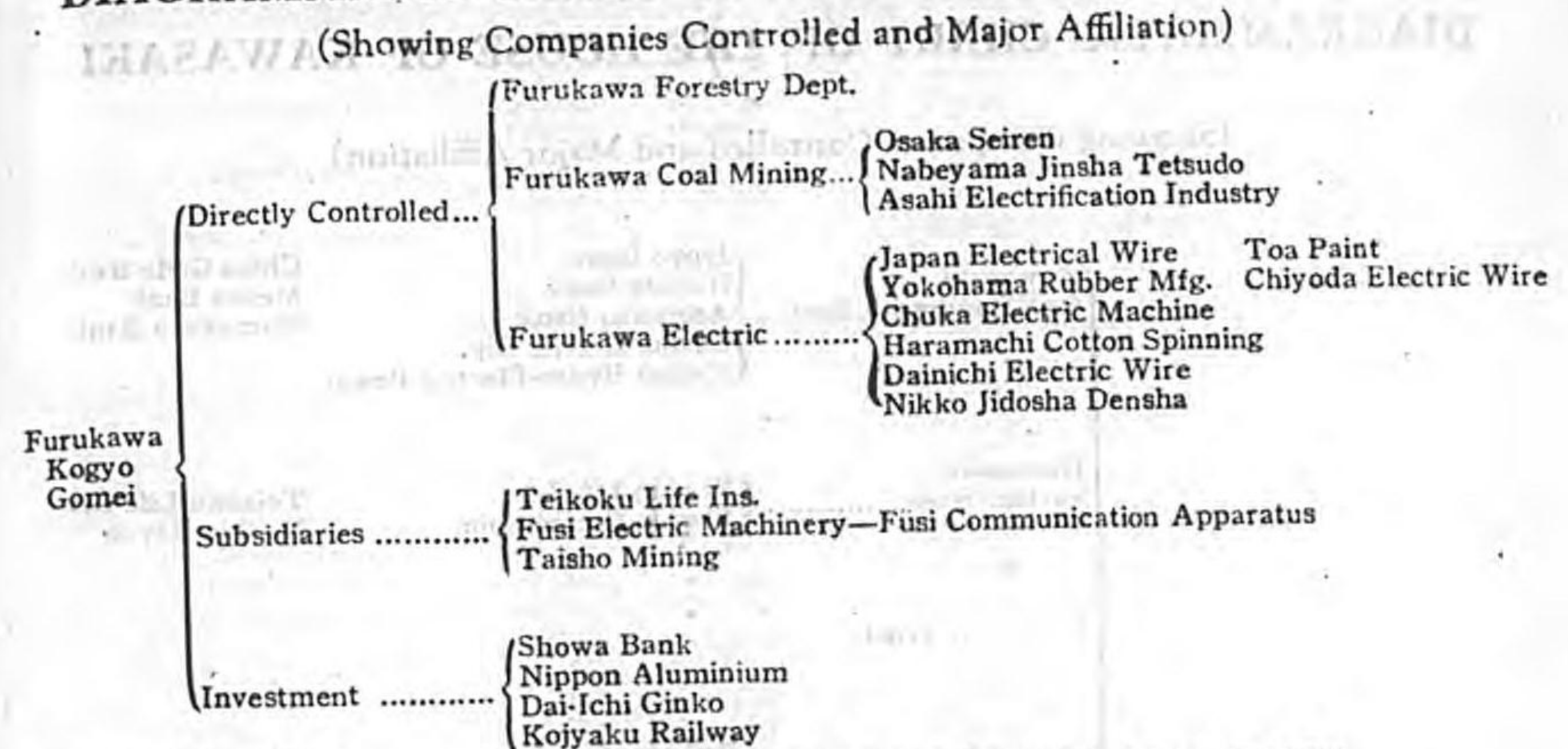

DIAGRAMMATIC CHART OF THE HOUSE OF FURUKAWA



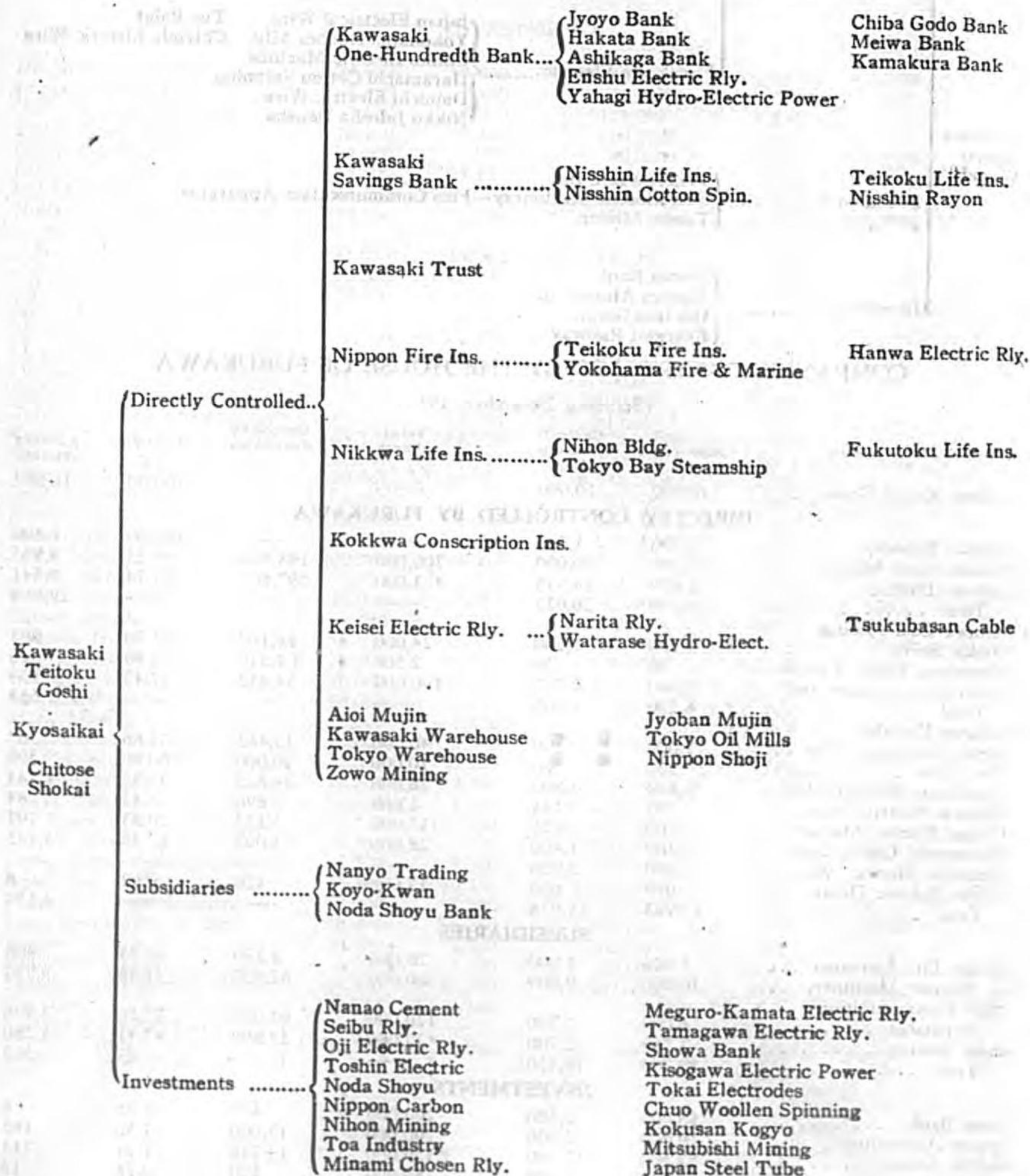

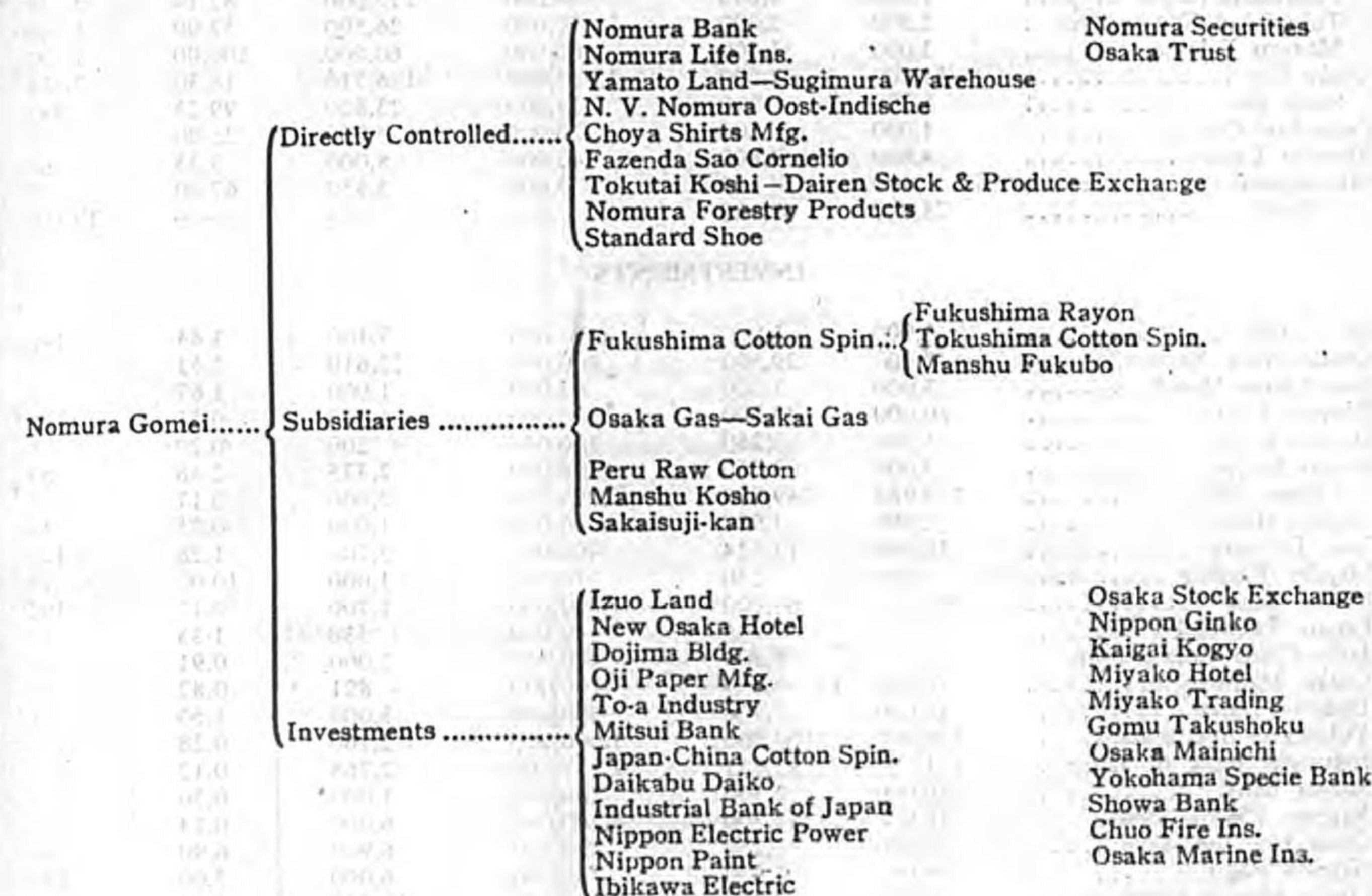

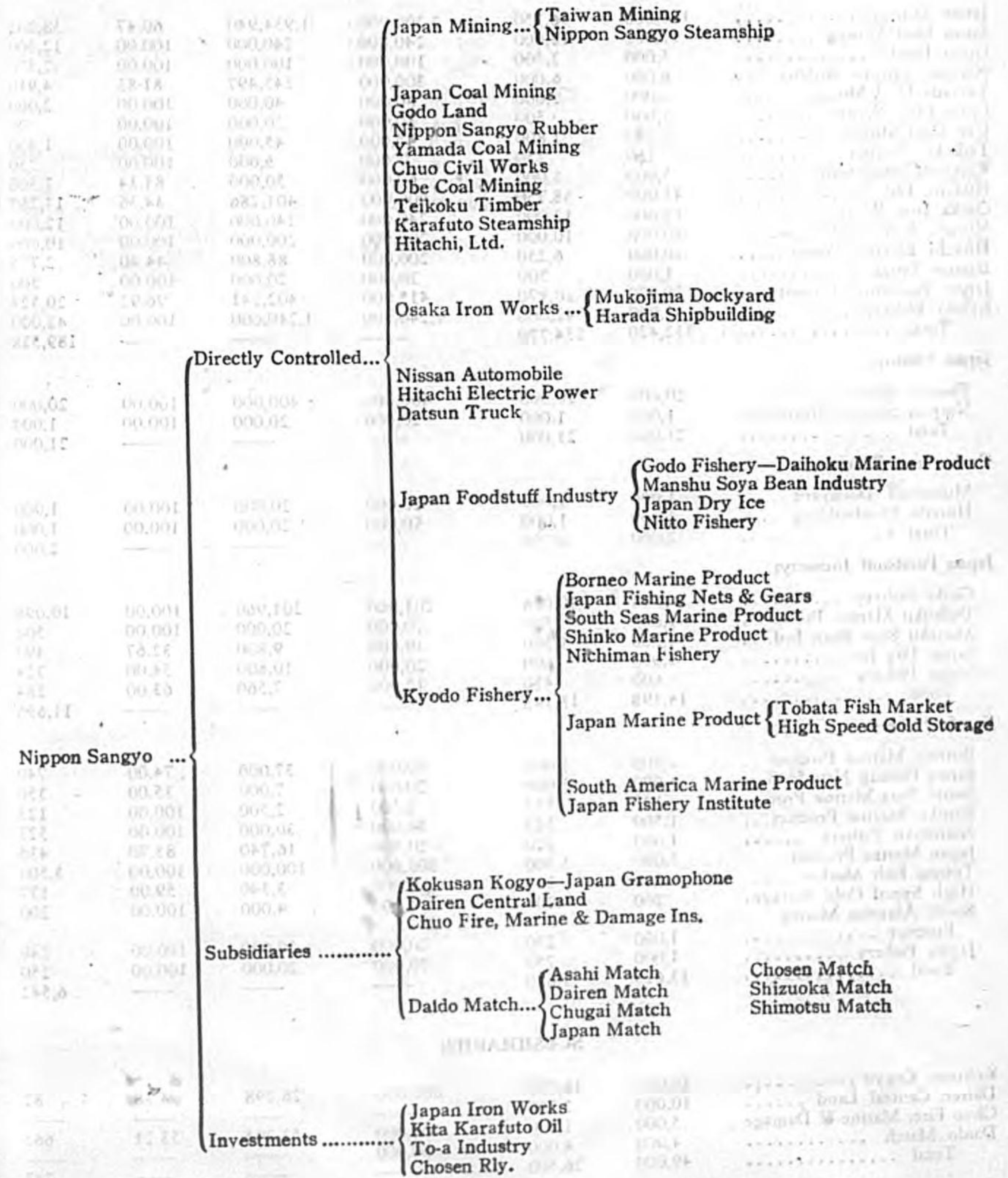

TENRIKYO

A NEW RELIGIOUS MOVEMENT

Anyone who has been studying with an impartial eye the religious movement in Japan in recent years has doubtless already marvelled at the intense activity and rapid growth of Tenrikyo. The growth of this faith has been so phenomenal that even the layman wonders "just what these people have" that makes their zeal so consuming.

Tenrikyo is the religion of salvation founded upon Divine Revelation. Its fundamental principle is to save all mankind. Its sole aim is to lead mankind from darkness into light, to realize a world of supreme bliss without any shadow of evils, and through these efforts to achieve the highest good for the world. Now, what the present world is eagerly looking for is the life of peace and happiness.

Human beings have been searching for it in vain for thousands of years through religion, philosophy and science. But, to our greatest joy, the perfect way along which all the people of the earth might enter paradise has at last been revealed. That way is Tenrikyo.

Tenrikyo was founded by a woman named Miki Nakayama (1798-1887), on the 26th of October, 1839, at a place called "Jiba," officially named Tambaichi (Tenri), a small town situated about 10 kilo-meters south of Nara, the famous ancient Capital of Japan. She had been a country wife and mother with no distinctions from other country dames until her forty-first year when she happened to receive the Heavenly Revelations. After that,

she started to practise and preach the gospel of salvation in spite of all the oppositions of her kindreds, poverty, persecutions and oppressions by men of other religions and officials till her ninety years of age when she disappeared from this world.

Soon after her demise the seeds of her earnestness and sincerities began to bud very rapidly; Tenrikyo became larger and larger. It was officially allowed to build churches in 1888, and after twenty years, Tenrikyo was recognized by the government authorities as an independent faith. A grand Centenary of the foundation of the religion was held in the autumn of 1937. The status of the rapid-growing Tenrikyo may be seen from the following figures:—

Teachers 84,000; Quasi-Teachers 300,000; Followers 6,000,000.

Tenrikyo has also been very active in its mission abroad. It has now about 200 churches in Manchoukuo, China, North and South America, Hawaii, the South Sea Islands, etc. Especially in Manchoukuo, Tenrikyo has, since the beginning of the 20th century, been in a fair way. In that country there are at present 85 churches of Tenrikyo and many other civil institutions including a large immigrant village.
