JOHN B. FOWELL, being duly sworn, states as follows: His present address is Grosvenor Hotel, New York City, but he was a present of Shanghai, China, for a period 1917 until 1942. Affiant was taken prisoner by the Japanese military in Shanghai on 20 December 1941, and so mistreated that portions of his feet have since been amputated, and he is a permanent cripple.

Affiant states that he was in Shanghai a few days after the fighting that started between Chinese and Japanese 29 and 30 January 1932.

ifficient states that at time of his errival in Shanghai, a large fleet of Japanese warships and transports were at the port and reinforcements were being landed from these ships. Thousands and reinforcements were being landed from these ships. Thousands of Japanese marines, sailors, and soldiers, equipped with artillery of Japanese marines, sailors, and soldiers, equipped with artillery and supported by bombing planes composed the Japanese forces, and the Japanese planes bombed the outskirts of the International Settlement.

Affient says that the equipment, size, and conduct of the Japanese forces plainly indicated offensive and agressive operations were in progress. Operations ended with a truce. Affient further states he was in Shanghai in August 1937, when another further states he was in Shanghai by the Japanese army, navy and air attack was made upon Shanghai by the Japanese army, navy and air forces.

At this time, the army landed in force from transports, and the invading force consisted of many thousand men, tanks, artillery, airplanes, trucks, and all the equipment of a modern army. The army occupied Shanghai, and later with reinforcements advanced army occupied Shanghai, and later with reinforcements advanced through SUCHOW to Nanking. Affiant, as an observer, saw the path through SUCHOW to Nanking. Affiant, as an observer, saw the burnt of the invading army between Shanghai and Nanking, and the burnt dwellings, ravaged fields, and devastation in that territory.

The equipment, large number of Japanese soldiers and sailors, material, and manner of operation plainly indicated intention on the part of invading troops to penetrate China by a large scale invasion. Tanks, airplanes, cannon, warships, and trucks were used.

Afficient also witnessed the third invasion of Shanghai. This time the International Settlement was invaded 8 December 1941 about 4 /M, by Japanese forces which landed from warships and transports, and the warship PETREL, a British gunboat, was sunk by artillery fire from the shore and a Japanese destroyer.

Doc. No. 2210 Affiant states that the Japanese force this time consisted of werships, tanks, ertillery, airplanes, and thousands of soldiers, sailors and marines and occupied the entire International Settlement, taking over the government. banks, and public buildings, and all utilities.
