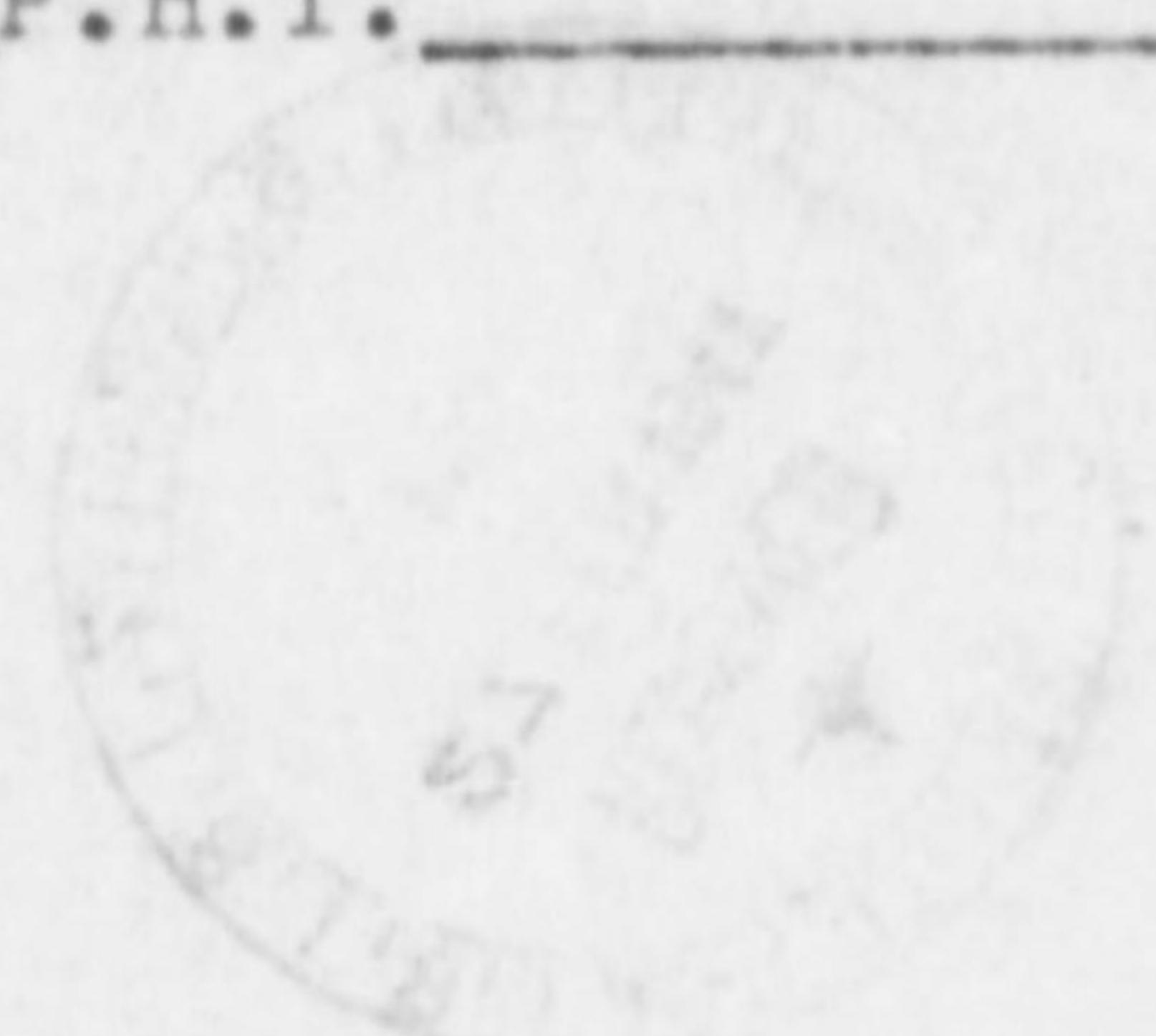
- 2. 1. Reference basic communication, it has not been the practice in the past to permit entry into homes of Japanese nationals for the purpose of inspecting property in these homes to determine whether or not such property is looted. It is therefore believed that the proper method of handling the request from the Philippine Delegation on Reparations and Restitutions would be to permit this delegation, in the first instance, to interrogate the persons named in their request.

2. It is believed that most of the persons named are at the present time imprisoned awaiting trial for various war crimes and, in line with a discussion on this matter with Major Johnson of your section, this matter is returned so that the necessary arrangements for the interrogation of these persons can be made by your section.

3. It is requested that copies of the interrogations held be furnished to CPC so that, should any restitutable property be found, necessary action can be taken by this section to take it into custody preparatory to its restitution.

SUBJECT: Availability of Finished Goods for Reparations

1. Reference your letter to Chief of Staff, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, dated 30 January 1947, subject: reparations.
2. No authority has been granted General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to make available current production goods as reparations.
3. No authority has been granted General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to permit claimant nations to supply raw materials to Japanese industry and receive the finished product, charging the cost of processing to reparations.
4. Changes in the present plan for reparations are policy matters which must be dealt with by the Far Eastern Commission in Washington.

2) (a) This request is initiated so that facilities would be available for warehousing or storing of looted property for those nations which do not have such facilities at the present time nor available space in their respective missions and in some instances no established mission in Japan.

(b) These looted properties are located in various districts in Japan and it would be advantageous to all concerned to establish one or more warehouses in strategic points, whereby sufficient storage may be concentrated to warrant each claimant nation to bring bottoms to Japan for removal of same.

3) It is requested that pending delivery of articles to ship side, protection and security be furnished by SCAP.

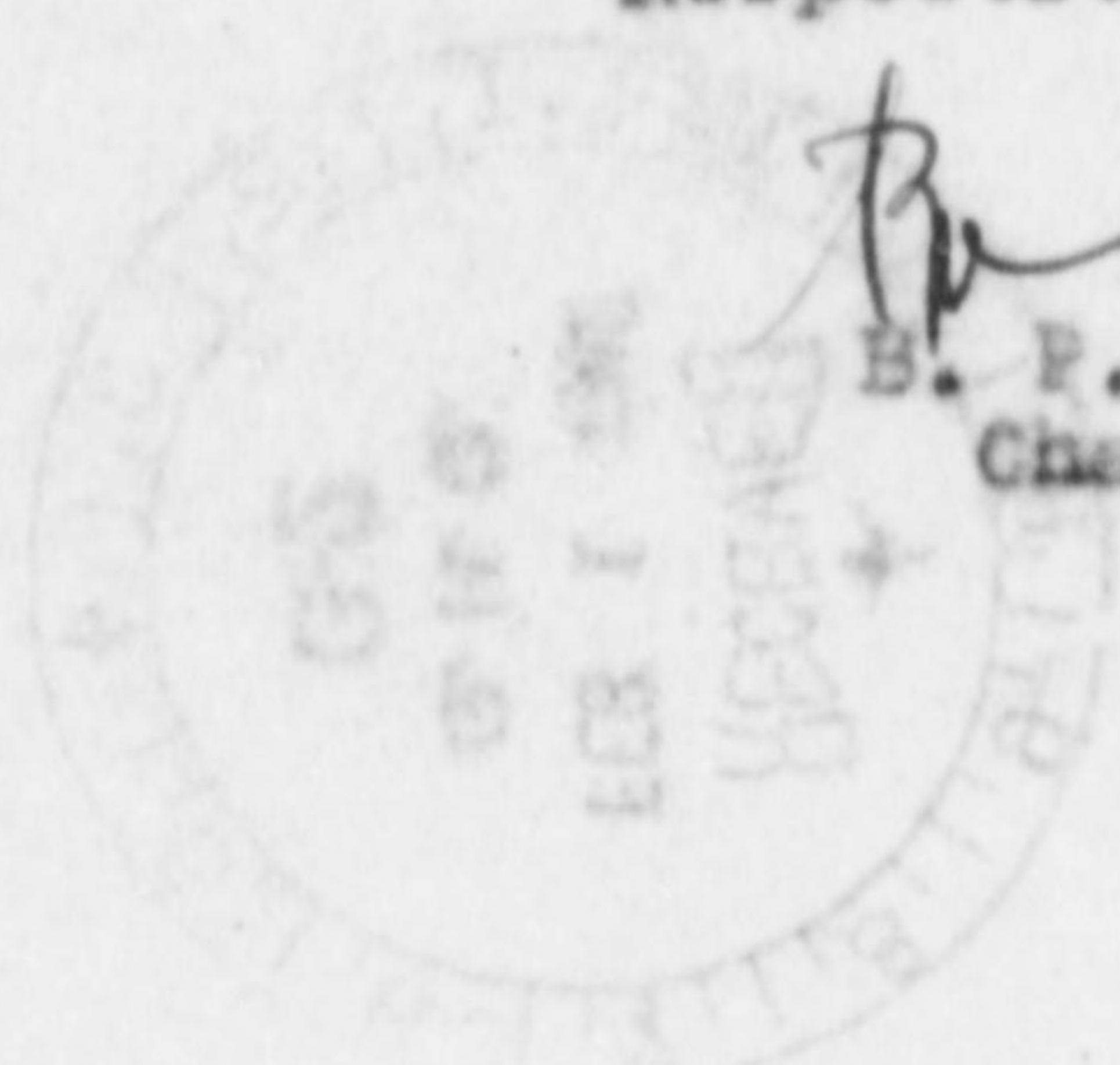
1.- The Philippine Delegation on Reparations and Restitution requests information concerning the availability of " finished goods " as reparations, at present or over a period of years.

2.- We have been informed by the Foreign Trade Division ESS that schedules are being prepared for the manufacture of finished goods by the Japanese on an import and export monetary basis, however, our question deals with the possibility of obtaining such goods as reparations.

3.- Will it be possible for a claimant country to ship raw materials to Japan for process and manufacture of finished goods? Such raw materials might have to include raw materials (not available in Japan) over and above the basic material, but required in processing. On such a basis could the Japanese labor, etc. required in producing the finished goods be chargeable against reparations?

SUBJECT: Export Availability of Japanese Dyes

1. There are available for export from Japan 480,344 kilo-grams of synthetic dyestuffs. Particulars (name of the dye, net weight, unit value per kilogram) are listed on the enclosed sheet. All prices are f. o. b. Japanese port.

2. Because of the large number of different items, and the great variation in quantities available, no allocation among the prospective purchasers will be made until each prospective purchaser has indicated what dyes are desired. It is requested that this division be notified by 28 February 1947 of the interest of the Philippine Republic in the purchase of any or all of these dyes. Immediately after that date an allocation, based on the total demand from all markets, and a firm offer will be made.

3. In the event that the Philippine Republic requires samples of any of these dyes, it is requested that this division be advised by 10 February 1947 of the particular samples desired, listing the item number and the name of the dye for each sample desired.

Reference basic communication, it has not been the practice in the past to permit entry into homes of Japanese nationals for the purpose of inspecting property in these homes to determine whether or not such property is looted. It is therefore believed that the proper method of handling the request from the Philippine Delegation on Reparations and Restitutions would be to permit this delegation, in the first instance, to interrogate the persons named in their request.

2. It is believed that most of the persons named are at the present time imprisoned awaiting trial for various war crimes and, in line with a discussion on this matter with Major Johnson of your section, this matter is returned so that the necessary arrangements for the interrogation of these persons can be made by your section.

3. It is requested that copies of the interrogations held be furnished to CPC so that, should any restitutable property be found, necessary action can be taken by this section to take it into custody preparatory to its restitution.
