III. TACTICAL AND OPERATION DATA.

The strike groups from each ship were together on route to objective area but were given separate targets by Commander Support Air.

VG-93 plance executed attacks from N to S 3000 to 1000 feet, 25° glide and 200 knots maximum speed. Bombs were dropped melectively, one at a time, and rockets were expended 4 at a time.
