Lieutenant Colonel ANDERSON, Commanding Officer, led three PBJs of VMB-423 in a night low level bombing and strafing attack on target #4, Kahili, Bougainville. The strike was composed of a three plane section in Vee formation. The strike was planned to surprise the enemy using darkness, direction of approach and the speed of the planes to achieve this effect.

The raid was airborne by 1932 and after joining up proceeded down the east coast of Bougainville climbing to 6,000 feet to get over the scattered cumulus. 332B21 returning to base early due to operational difficulties. At Luluai Point the two planes flew south for four miles and then turned to a heading of 2630 magnetic. The flight proceeded on this course for three and one-half minutes when Colonel ANDERSON peeled off to make his bombing and strafing run at 2045 on a heading of 1650 magnetic and Lieutenant RIGDON continued on course an additional minute and then peeled off to make his run at 2047 on a heading of 1550 magnetic. On the approach to the target both planes lost altitude from 6,000 feet to 100 feet at which altitude the bombing and strafing was done at an indicated air speed of 200 knots.

Following the attack the planes broke away to the right and returned to base individually. The raid was safely on deck at Green by 2159.

Moderate inaccurate light anti-aircraft fire was encountered from unidentified positions east of Ebery's Lease and along the coast near Kahili Airdrome.
