SUBJECT: Movement of Economic Cooperation Administration Cargo
For Use by the Army

1. CG 8th Army Msg EX 39415, 28 Jul 50, requested Deputy Commander, Military Sea Transportation Service, Western Pacific to assign shipping to move following amounts of coal from Japan to Pusan at rate of approximately 11,000 tons weekly:

From Wakamatsu	25,000 tons
From Karatsu	13,000 tons
From Kushiro	6,500 tons

2. Deputy Commander, Military Sea Transportation Service, Western Pacific Msg DTG 0105372 in reply to above cited msg stated that no specific authority had been received to transport cargoes for any government agency other than Department of Defense and suggested Economic Cooperation Administration be advised to ship coal via commercial facilities.

3. CG 8th Army's request for movement of cited cargo was based on the fact that CG EUSAK requested shipment and that CINCPAC considers these shipments as asked for by CG EUSAK to be a military necessity.

4. Mr. Jone, Director ECA Mission to Korea Tokyo Field Office, states that ECA will reimburse for cost of transportation.

5. Action is letter to Deputy Commander, Military Sea Transportation Service, Western Pacific which is self explanatory.

6. Clarifies policy.

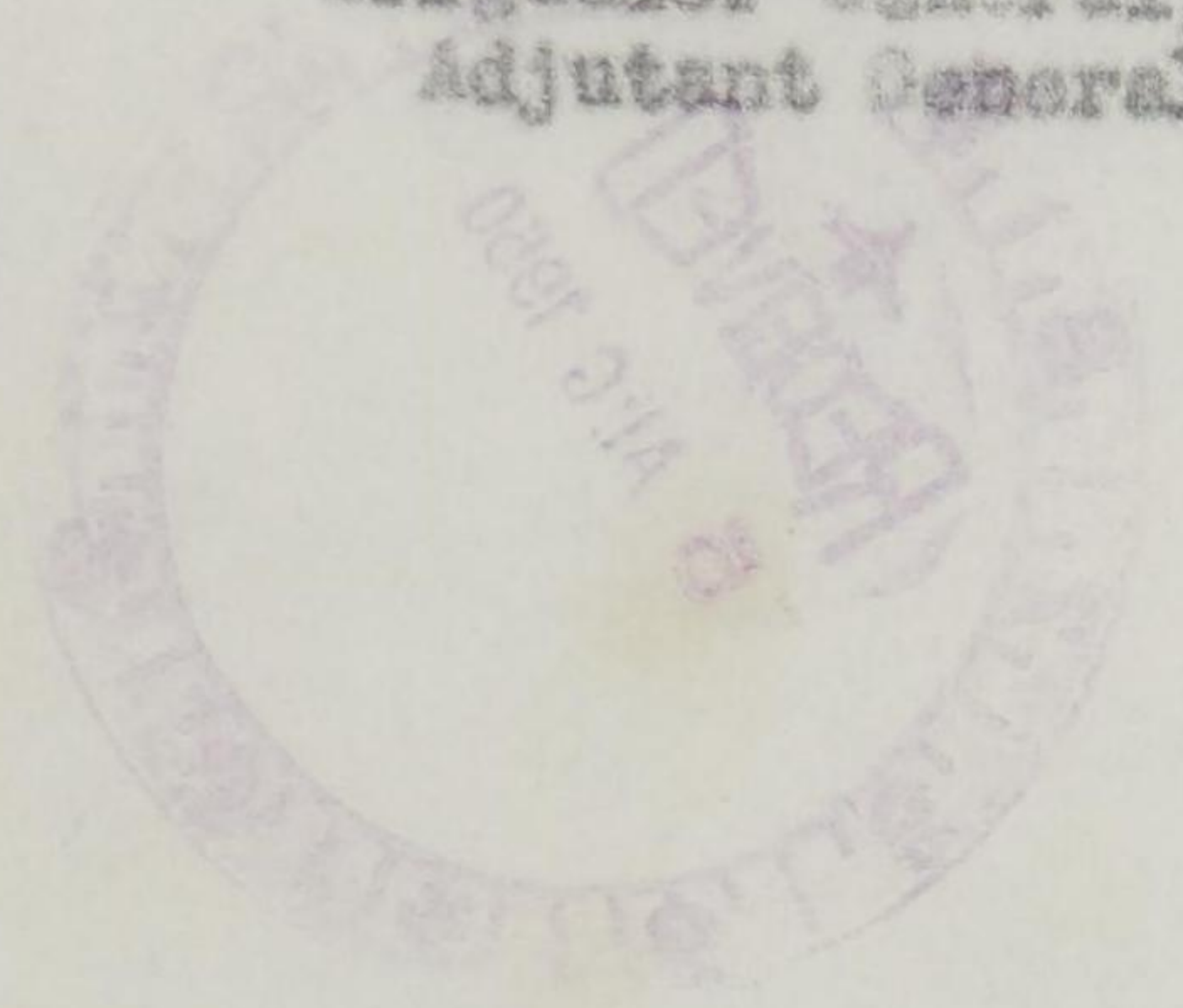

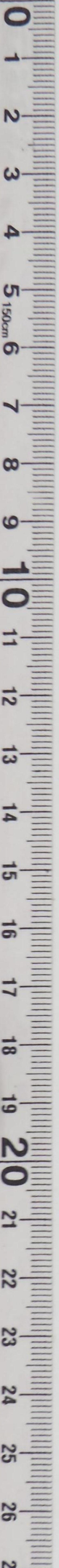

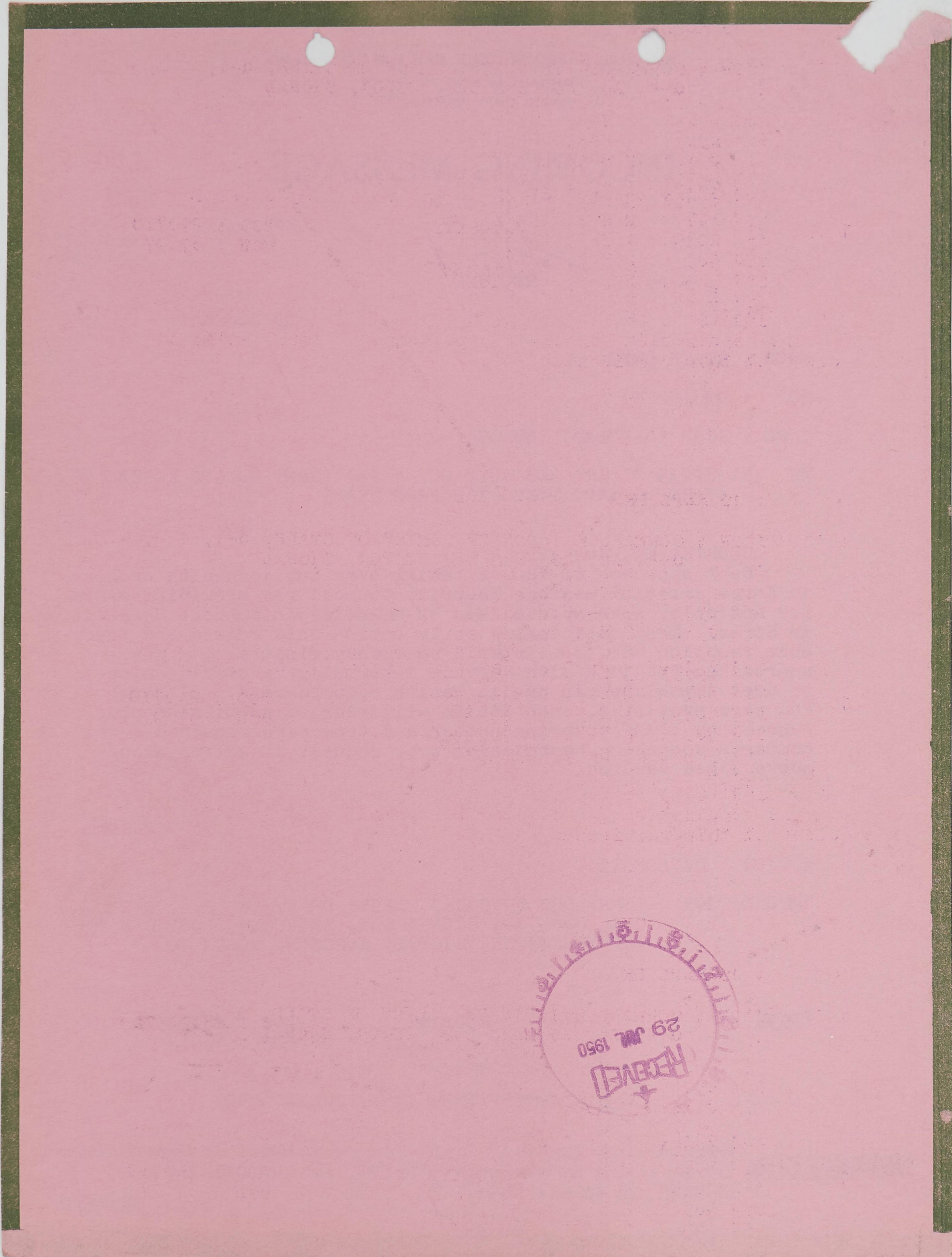

1. Problem: Procurement from ECA Funds of Food, Supplies and Material Required to Prevent Conditions Prejudicial to Success of Military Operations in Korea.

2. Correspondence references: a. CINCFE msg CX 57513, 9 July 50 (to be rescinded).

b. M/R to ref 2(a).

3. Discussion: a. Ref 2a instructed CG USAFIK (later EUSAK) on plans for coordination of ECA purchases. The provisions of reference 2a are not considered adequate to provide for the scope of ECA activities now planned. Therefore the current instruction is provided for distribution to all parties concerned in or affected by, ECA purchase program. The program is considered in two major categories - first requirements for the civilian population only and secondly requirements for ROK which are for ROK economy and support of military (ROK) supplementally or concurrently. No provision is included or intended for expenditure of ECA funds for military supplies, as such, i.e., munitions, weapons etc.

b. The current plan provides for determination of requirements in Korea by CG EUSAK, ECA representatives, and US Diplomatic Service. Requirements will be channeled to ECA Tokyo, where after coordination with ESS procurement will be made and arrangements completed for movement of supplies to Korea. Requirements of civilian military type will be channeled to G-4 GHQ for necessary staff action. Requirements will be passed to ECA for determination re eligibility for ECA financing and ESS for availability.

4. G-4 initiates above plan to provide for complete coordination.

1. ESS concurs in the proposed procedure for handling procurement from ECA funds except as indicated below:

a. Re paragraph 5 of proposed procedure, the intent of the statement "conflicts as to availabilities in Japan over items defined in 2a and 2b (2) will be referred to G-4, General Headquarters for resolution" is not clear. Headquarters surveillance over the ability of Japan to produce or supply items of any nature is a matter of primary interest to ESS and any resolution of such issues by G-4 is a duplication of authority and not within G-4 assigned authority.

b. If this reference is to conflicts over whether military supplies should be made from procurement in the U.S.A. or in Japan the matter is within the area of responsibility of G-4 but the reference should so state.

c. It is recommended that the proposed document be issued excluding the penultimate sentence in para 5 or that the sentence be reworded to clarify the intent of the statement.

1. In Secy Pace's interim reply to rqst of Acting ECA Administrator Foster rept in our W 85236, ECA was informed that determination of ECA dependents permitted to remain in Japan was SCAP responsibility.

2. REUR decision that ECA employees retained for AMIK duties may have their dependents remain in Japan provided housing is obtained by pvt rental. During Magruder's recent visit members of your staff press him to take measures to encourage tourists to visit Japan so as to enable Japanese economy to earn dollars thereby. Korean devs have prevented assistance and encouragement to tourists. It is assumed therefore that adequate accommodations of hotel type are avail on dollar basis for all ECA dependents you may permit to remain although they may not be conveniently located.

3. In view of the above and the additional considerations of possible west bound shipping difficulties for competent pers that ECA in conjunction with defense might have to assign to the Far East to replace those which under the present views might be evacuated immediately to the ZI, earnestly rqst you give consideration to permit so far as pvt space avail and to the extent of ability to pay in dollars all those AMIK including ECA pers and dependents that the Ambassador or the ECA Mission Chief independently, or advice from Wash, rqst to remain in Japan. Rqst reply.

DA rad W 85236 dtd 8 July 50. It is considered that the role of AMIK with respect to Korea does not justify furnishing dep hsg in Japan to that group. Housing facilities in Japan were requisitioned as a mil nec sanctioned by the law of belligerent occupation which limits use of such facilities to those consistent with mil nec. Extension of such use to purposes not clearly within the requirements of the occupation would be legally questionable. Furthermore, it is anticipated that war destruction of facilities in Korea will preclude return there of depts for an indefinite period. Therefore, the following will apply concerning the disposition of depts of AMIK and ECA contractor employees:

1. Employees surplus to requirements of AMIK absorbed in assimilated or actual DAC or DAFC status by Dept of Defense installations into existing vacancies, either on a temp reimbursible or nonreimbursible loan basis or on a permanent hire basis, may retain their depts in Japan and occupy public quarters, provided the rating of such employees prior to their departure from Korea was equivalent GS-12 or higher. Maximum utilization of AMIK employees including contractor personnel will be made on this basis consistent with existence of vacancies and possession by individuals of required qualifications.
2. Employees, including contract personnel, not absorbed in Dept of Defense positions and not essential to reestablishment of AMIK in Korea, will be returned with their depts to the US as expeditiously as possible.
3. Employees retained for AMIK duties may have their depts remain in Japan provided hsg is obtained by private rental.
4. Depts of AMIK and ECA contractor personnel returned to Korea may not elect to remain in Japan in any status and will be evacuated to the US.

Determination of which depts of AMIK personnel will be permitted to remain in Japan is distinctly a SCAP responsibility and is not subject to ECA/Washington approval. Dr. Bunce has been so informed here. Rqst you notify appropriate agencies in Washington.

In cases where you have no such need, ECA proposes that as ECA pers rqmts develop in gen Asiatic area, and before return to Korea becomes possible, ECA may direct certain employees to Formosa and to ECA missions now being organized for Southeast Asia countries.

For above reasons, Mr Foster indicates ECA is hopeful that you will not find it necessary return to ZI ECA employees (and their deps) whose availability ECA wishes to retain in the theater.
