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PETITION FOR EXEMPTION FROM REPARATION PLANTS

Feb. 18, 1948.

We received your orders under the date of August 13th of 1946 that ~~K~~oyoto Jujo Plant and Kyoto Kujo Plant of Kotobuki Industry Co., Ltd. should be administrated as reparation factories. Immediately after receiving your orders, we presented you a petition for exemption of our factories from reparative administration to the Chief of the Adjustment Bureau of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry (under the date of October 19th of 1946). Because we trust that our Kotobuki Industry Co., Ltd. ranked the highest among the makers of fibre and lumbering machineries, having left a great mark on the industrial world of this country during the pre-war time, so it was our most ardent desire that these splendid achievements in the past and the long history left by us should be allowed to remain in the future for the reconstruction of our industry.

Since immediately after we were granted permission of conversion to civil industry by the headquarters of the allied forces, we have been making all possible efforts in producing of the following machineries, thus contributing to the revival of the peace nation.

1. Various machinery for spinning and rayon-manufacturing, and weaving machinery.
2. Various machinery for lumbering and wood working.
3. Small oil engines for farming and fishery, and threshing machine.

In the mean time, with the permission of commencement of foreign trade, national plans are being carried out steadily for reviving spinners and rayon manufacturers, and it is quite natural that, with gradual activity in the spinning field, the rush of orders for fibre machineries have come in in rapid succession from all directions to our company which had left a great mark on this industrial field during the pre-war time.

To raise the production of textile goods for the purpose of exportation is the only way of existing left to Japan, and it is at the same time the final key to the construction of the peace nation. Now the time has come when the textile goods of our country bear the test in the markets abroad, and so it is quite natural that the highest efficiency and the greatest accuracy should be required to the machineries, which are, as they were, the lifespring of the textile manufacturers.

Confronted with this situation we consider it very desirable that you would kindly allow such factories as ours, which have a long history as a manufacturer of textile machineries and also have excellent technique and complete equipments, to continue the operation and to carry out our important task, and thus to contribute also to rise of the spinning industry in the neighbouring countries by direct importation of fibre machinery. We should be greatly grateful if you would consider these circumstances and kindly exempt our machineries from your administration.

(2) Reason of Presenting Petition for Exemption

As we stated in the Petition which we presented you on October 19th of 1946 to the Chief of the Adjustment Bureau of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, our factories were, in the pre-war time, engaging in manufacturing a great deal of the patent machinery of high efficiency, such as the Kotobuki superior power loom for the weaving machine, the Casabranças high-draft apparatus for the spinning machine, and the Asahi dialyser for the rayon machine, and thus contributed much to the industrial world of this country. On the other hand, in the field of manufacturing wood making and working machineries, as we had thirty years experience in which we acquired the most excellent skills and technique we make good use of our experience to contribute the reconstruction of the dwelling houses, and the plants on the burnt area just after the war.

With commencement of the foreign trade permitted lately, the textile manufacture has become the most important exporting article, which is really a thing to the existence of our country. In order to increase its production, the national plan to revive spinners and rayon manufacturers began to be carried out. With this, there naturally came into our company the rush of orders for machines in rapid succession, for we had left a remarkable footprint in the industrial world during the past time.

First, Kawashima Weaving Co., Ltd. at Nishijin in Kyoto gave an order for twenty silk weaving machines of fifty seven inches,

and then, Asahi Silk Industrial Co., Ltd., Kyoritsu Weaving Co., Ltd., Iwako Weaving Industry Union, etc. in Kirifu district gave orders in succession, while Mr. Asha and Mr. Bani of India gave orders for exporting machines through the trade Office, and thus the number of the ordered machines amounted to several hundreds. As for the cotton weaving machine, Senshu Retired Weavers Reviving Association in Senshu gave orders in a large quantity, and as for the rayon machine, too, first Asahi Chemical Company Limited gave an order for the construction of spinning frames on the spot and also the reconstruction of the Irich Crusher and Vacuum Kneader on the spot, and then Kurashiki Silk Weaving Company Ltd. gave an order for Alkali Absorber, filter presses, etc. in a large quantity. At present the number of silk weaving and cotton weaving machines under negotiation amount to several thousands, for instance, with reference of Toyo Spinning Company for the rayon machines, we are planning both 3 ton and 5 ton daily production, while we have 10 ton plan for the exporting goods for India, and these plans are making their steady progress. Omi Silk-thread Co., Ltd. and Wakabayashi Industrial Co., Ltd. are also to give order for 20,000 fine spinning frames. Besides these, Asahi Chemical Industrial Co., Ltd. is earnestly requiring our general co-operation in technique and operation for the sake of their revival.

Recently, for the purpose of reviving the former spinning industry of Nishijin, they are planning the construction of New Nishijin Village, and it is decided that 1,000 spinning frames

could be equipped there, and for carrying out this plan, they eagerly wish for the assistance of our factories.

Thus even the sum in contract at present excellent exceeds 600 million Yen, and this is a clear proof to show how excellent machineries we produced in the past. It may be said that our achievements in the past time have now borne fruits once more.

It has been now universally demanded that our factories which have both excellent skills and adequate equipments should devote themselves to the manufacture of fibre machineries and also other superior machineries as a lifespring of fibre manufactures, or as the pick of exporting machineries. Industry Bureau recommended our factory as "The Appointed Factory" as soon as "The Appointed Fibre Machine Factory System" was put in practice.

now that we have lost majority of the fibre machine factories by the fire, if such an excellent factory as ours which is the most powerful among the surviving factories should be confiscated as reparation, there would be a serious hindrance in the reconstruction of fibre industry and also in the revival of foreign trade in this country.

We should be very grateful if you consider these circumstances and kindly exempt our factories from your reparative administration.
