Dear Mr. Berger:

I received your letter of August 7.

Captain Luke Lee, Jr., advises me that he was authorized by the Embassy to bring the three volumes of correspondence to Tokyo in order that portions therefrom might be photostated for introduction in evidence in the trial here. One of these volumes - Volume 9 - is the only one that is being used in the trial before the International Military Tribunal for the Far East here. It is at this time filed with the Secretary of the International Military Tribunal for the Far East pursuant to an order of the Court entered 30 July 1946. I enclose herein a certified copy of the receipt from the Tribunal for this volume.

It is anticipated that the excerpts from Volume 9 will be offered in evidence next week, and as soon as this is done an application will be filed with the Court for authority to withdraw the original volume and return it to the American Embassy at Nanking.

We are transmitting herewith by courier Volumes Nos. 4 and 8, being the other two volumes which were delivered to Captain Luke Lee. Please acknowledge receipt.
