MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

THROUGH: Central Liaison Office, Tokyo

SUBJECT: Amendment to SCAPIN 1716, 3 June 1947

1. Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 410.2 (3 Jun 47) CPC/GP, SCAPIN 1716, 3 June 1947, subject, "Allocation of Gold, Silver and Platinum for Domestic Consumption," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is hereby amended as follows:

- a.
- (1) Paragraph 2s (3) is deleted and the following substituted therefor: "6.4 grams of platinum (to be released from the Eighth Army Vaults of the Bank of Japan, Tokyo)."
 - (2) Paragraph 2v (3) is deleted and the following substituted therefor: "37 grams of platinum (to be released from the Eighth Army Vaults of the Bank of Japan, Tokyo)."
 - (3) Paragraph 2y (1) is deleted and the following substituted therefor: "6 grams of platinum (to be released from the Eighth Army Vaults of the Bank of Japan, Tokyo)."
 - (4) Paragraph 2z (1) is deleted and the following substituted therefor: "57 grams of platinum (to be released from the Eighth Army Vaults of the Bank of Japan, Tokyo)."
- b. An additional paragraph will be added as follows:
- "5. At the time the releases authorized by paragraph 2 above are accomplished, the Japanese Government will deposit with the Eighth Army Custodian, Eighth Army Vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo:
- "a. 64.9 grams of platinum (from the Tokyo Institute of Technology, Chemical Research Laboratory for Natural Resources):
 - "b. 217 grams of gold (from the Tokyo Imperial University, Institute of Science and Technology):

"c. 384,924.4 grams of silver (3751.7 grams from the Tokyo Imperial University, Institute of Science and Technology and 381,172.7 grams in substitution for 4,398.745 grams of platinum released)."
