Illustrated told us how bored we were with our streak of successes, we've all searched for some sort of diversion to revitalize our appreciation of the Bruins' cage conquests.

But SI did pose a quite legitimate and relevant problem regarding the Bruin dynasty when it stated:

"Wooden understands only too well that his basketball program has reached a point where any season in which he brings home something less than a national title will be considered a total washout. Such an awareness would seem a terrible burden to carry, but as always his sense of values sustains him." Pressure. No one should know better than John Wooden what that word is all about. He hopefully averts any submission to the pressure inferred by SI by applying the following rationale:

① There are two kinds of pressure—self-

The wait at Nellie, his wife; the two-handed pats on the knee and shoulder of his assistant; the tug at his socks; the folding and pounding of his program; the tap on the floor; the crossing of his legs; the donning of his eyeglasses—and now the center-jump may proceed. For John Wooden's pre-game ritual—that mystifying, rapid-fire, undeviating succession of twitches—has been completed. One of the least publicized characteristics of UCLA's courtmaster-supreme has been this inconspicuous, yet remarkable, little ceremony. But don't call it "superstition"—that, says the coach, is only for those who are afraid. John Wooden, let it be said, is not afraid when his teams take to the court.

The ritual helps the coach relax—it's just a nervous reflex which relieves his pre-game tension (or call it pressure) and helps him to enjoy his show. This is understandable: after all, ever since Sports





imposed (or internal), and outside (or external).

- ② The latter, such as that contained in SI's proposition, must be dismissed as a force which sets objectives which are only peripheral to the individual's primary goal of attaining success. Which is to say, Wooden only recognizes that others would feel deprived or become disenchanted with a non-title-winner; he himself sets other goals for his players, goals which are absolute and which bear little relation to the relative potentials of his teams' various talents.
- ③ Only the former type of pressures — those which the individual has imposed upon himself in striving to attain success — are legitimate.

And what is success? For John Wooden, it is a peace of mind, a self-satisfaction, acquired in knowing that you have done your best to become the best that you are capable of becoming. Thus it really is possible that

a man fortunate enough to have attained the kind of success (i.e., winning) to which most people give primacy is able to say without reservation, "Some of my most successful teams have been the ones that didn't win."

While insisting that succumbing to pressure is not to be equated with responding to reason, Wooden confesses that external pressure can be most difficult to shun. After Lew's sophomore year, they mounted heavily, diluting the coach's sense of a successful accomplishment as he and the team became more interested in merely not-losing than in doing their best.

In the final analysis, only each individual himself can correctly evaluate his success. He might be able to fool others, but he can never truly deceive himself, except, perhaps, for a short time.

Among the athletes who labor in relative anonymity at UCLA's track stadium perhaps none is so undeserving of such a lack of recognition as one Russell A. Hodge. For while it has become almost a cliché to deem decathlon competitors to be the world's finest athletes, it has not become quite so commonly obvious that Russ Hodge is himself one of these supermen of athletic endeavor.

Hodge competed for the Bruins in '68 and '69, primarily in that popular trackman's double of the shot put and the 100 (with UCLA bests of 60-11 and 9.4 respectively). Though he graduated with a B.A. in political science, he continues to make UCLA his athletic home and training ground, for his goal remains, at 31 yrs. of age, to win the Olympic decathlon.

Only chroniclers of the remote can inform you that Russ Hodge is the former world record-holder in the decathlon having accumulated 823 pts. in one two-day stint.

Bill Toomey's current record, set at UCLA two years ago, is 8417 pts.). Similarly, only such attentive fans can relate to you UCLA's unparalleled legacy in the annals of the decathlon: among the world-class competitors in this event who have represented the Bruins are Rafer Johnson (second in the '56 Olympics at Melbourne; first in the '60 Games at Rome, setting an Olympic Record and bearing the American flag in the opening ceremony); C.K. Yang (second in '60 and fifth in '64 at Tokyo); and Rick Sloan (seventh in Mexico City in '68).

And Russ Hodge. Though he was a member of the '64 American Olympic contingent, the former world record-holder sustained a thigh muscle injury during the Trials in '68, and was thus precluded from competing in Mexico. Now there is Munich, or else he'll be '6 when Montreal rolls around.

If you say that Russ Hodge might have been, or was, the world's greatest athlete, you could still be wrong.






The scene was not without spectators - especially since they all had money riding on the outcome.
