TO THE TRADE:

We present herewith our Annual Wholesale Price List of **Vegetable, Field, Flower Seeds, Etc.** Our seeds have been **carefully grown, thoroughly cleaned,** and tested as to germination. We promise that every order, large or small, shall receive the most **scrupulous care.**

We endeavor to fix our prices as low as good seeds can be sold for under present conditions and allow a reasonable margin of profit. Should they however in any instance appear high, send us your memorandum of requirements to figure on and we will advise promptly if possible to shade, and in every instance when larger quantities are wanted than those noted, it will be advisable to write us before placing your order.

In some instances prices are higher than last year on account of failure in crops. This applies principally to Beans, both Wax and Green Podded varieties, supplies of which are extremely scarce. On the other hand many varieties, notably Sweet Corn and some of the Vine Seeds that were in short supply last season, have yielded better and prices are correspondingly lower. We trust that as the season advances we may be favored with your orders, and suggest in your own interest that you arrange for your requirements early.

TERMS OF PAYMENT.

Vegetable Seeds, Flower Seeds, Packet Seeds. Accounts for these are due June 1st, 1905, without regard to date of purchase. A discount of one per cent. a month for unexpired time will be allowed on payments made before June 1st. Accounts made after June 1st are due in 30 days from date of purchase.

Grass Seeds, Clover Seeds, Bird Seeds, Seed Corn, Field Seeds, Onion Sets, Potatoes, Fertilizers, Baskets, Etc. These are net cash goods, and subject to draft without notice.

SHIPPING.

In the absence of special instructions as to routes, packing, etc., we will use our best judgment.

PACKING.

Bags, Boxes, Barrels, etc., are charged for at value. No charge made for bags containing our Sterling Grades that are always branded with our trade mark and sealed with a leaden seal. (None other are genuine.)

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

Vegetable and Flower Seeds sold from this catalogue are warranted to prove of strong growth and of satisfactory quality and purity, **in so far:**—that, should the contrary prove the case, through any defect in the seed, we will refill the order for such defective seeds free of charge, or refund the money paid us for it.

Grass and Field Seeds—With our improved machinery we are able to clean these seeds so thoroughly that we sell our "Sterling" and best grades on the following conditions: if upon arrival and prompt test they do not develop a high percentage of growth, or fail upon examination to prove of satisfactory purity, **they are to be returned at our expense.** Beyond these plainly expressed conditions we give no warrant whatever, as the outcome of a crop is beyond human control; but as these are the strongest warrants made by any Seed House, they should satisfy the most careful purchaser of the confidence we have in our ability to supply good seeds.

If you do not receive regularly our **grass and field seed** quotations issued during the Spring months, write us, so that your name may be added to our list.

PACKET SEEDS.

Vegetable Seeds. Of the size usually retailed at 5 cents., we put up in boxes containing 500 packets handsomely lithographed in colors, which give a correct illustration of the vegetable, also an accurate description and directions for culture. **Our packets contain full quantity of seeds.** These we sell outright **not on commission.** The low price at which they are sold makes it much more profitable to handle them than seeds on the commission plan.

These boxes contain an assortment of the varieties best adapted for the section in which they are to be sold, but if customers prefer they may make their own selection.

The retail price is 5 cents a packet, although many of the packets contain varieties, which, in many catalogues and other seed boxes, sell for 10, 15 and 20 cents. 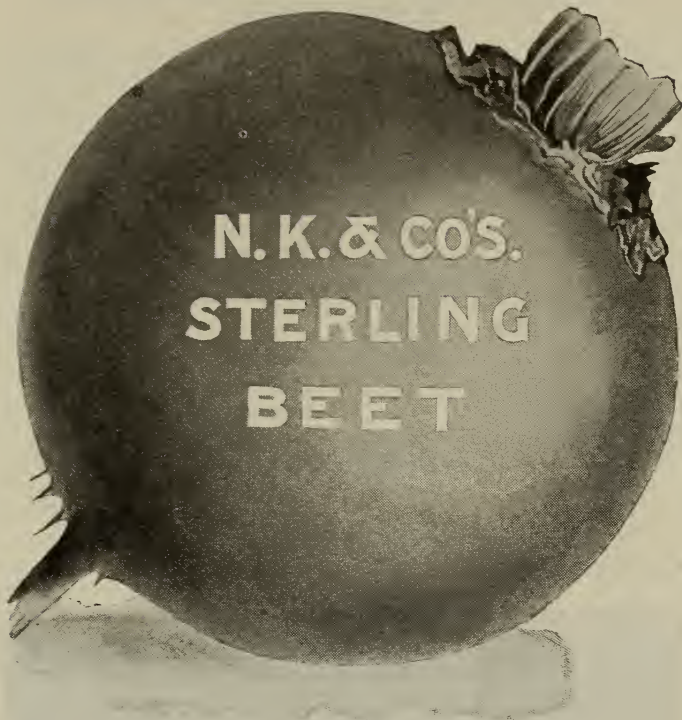

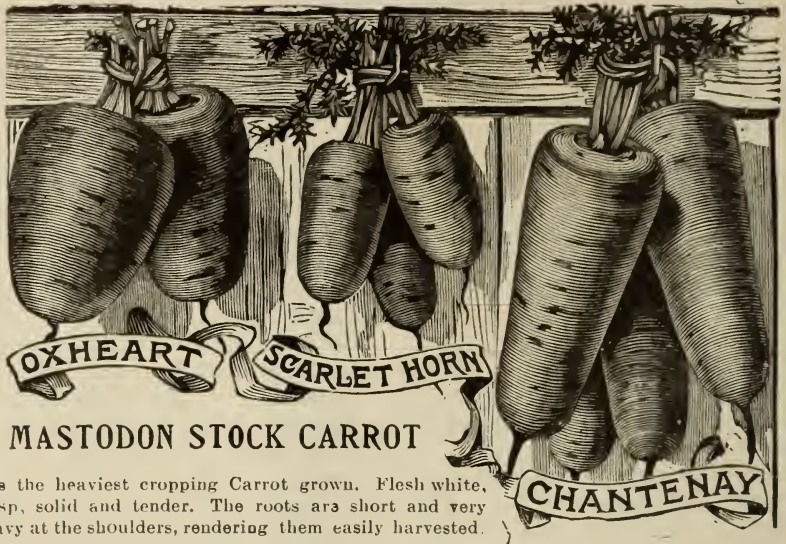

The uniform retail selling price for Peep O'Day Sweet Corn is 15 cents per packet, 25 cents per pint carton, and 40 cents per quart. Discounts to the trade: packets in less than 100, 50 per cent, 100 to 300, 55 per cent, pints and quarts in less than case lots 50 per cent, 1 to 5 case lots, 60 per cent.
