KATHRYNE HAYES and GEORGIA DUNCAN, the new janitors at B.H.S. have signed a contract to clean up the gym after the reunion.

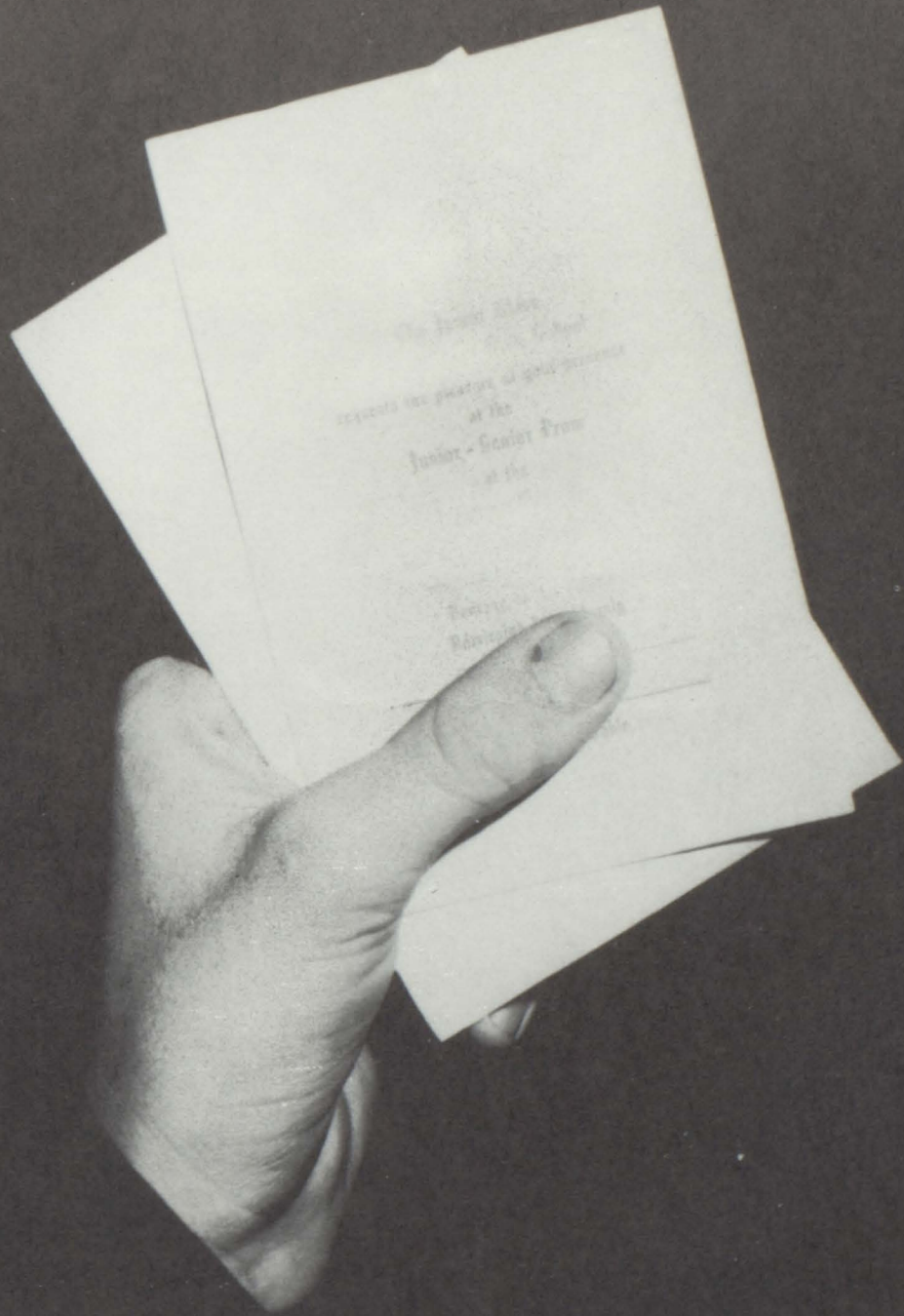
