PLANNING THE FLOWER GARDEN

Make a plan for final or lasting results. Unsightly places, as back yards, fences and house foundations should be screened from view—all other views left unobstructed except by low-growing plants. Plan to show off the home as a pleasing sight. Don't jump in and patch up your place for immediate results. Plan to add to the beauty of your home each year.

There is nothing mysterious about success with flowers. They require care and common sense. The work cannot be left to a farm hand. It must receive careful personal attention. By observing the following rules you will have little cause for failure.

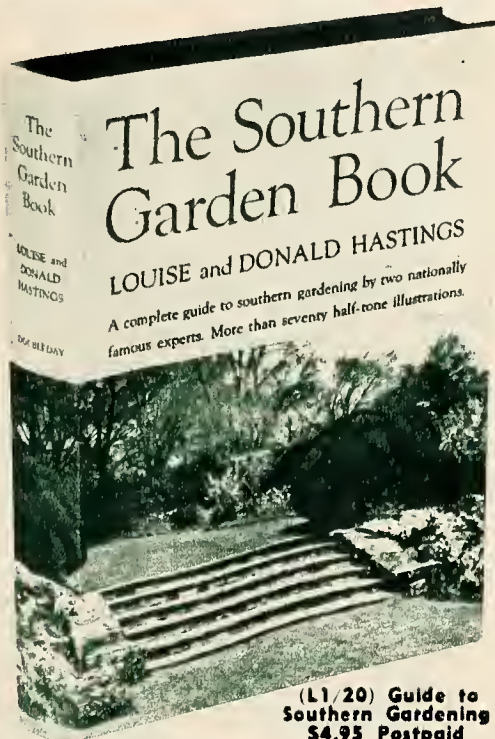
Remember, that with the best plants and flowers your garden can well be the show place of the community.

THE SOIL FOR YOUR FLOWERS

A mellow loam, which is a medium soil between the extremes of clay and sand, enriched by a compost of old manure and leaf mold, peat moss, vermiculite or peat humus, is adapted to the generality of flowering plants. Previous to planting flower beds or borders care must be taken that they are so arranged that the ground is a little elevated in the middle, allowing the water to run off; this also shows off the plants to better advantage.

DRAINAGE FOR FLOWER BEDS

Almost all flowers thrive best in well drained beds that do not hold excess moisture to sour the plant roots. Dig out the beds 18 to 30 inches deep to penetrate the subsoil so water can pass quickly through after heavy rains. Fill in with rich mellow loamy soil, manure, vermiculite and peat moss as this retains the right amount of moisture for the plants' needs; even during drought.



DIRECTIONS ON PACKAGES

Planting directions are on each packet of seeds we send you. Most flowers are easy to grow if these simple directions are used.

PLANTING FLOWER SEED

Make the surface as fine and smooth as possible. Cover each kind of seed to a depth proportionate to its size; very small seeds, like petunias, should be merely sprinkled on the surface of the ground, and barely covered with Peat Moss or vermiculite; press the soil down firmly over the seeds with a brick or a short piece of board. For larger seeds the depth should be regulated according to the size of the seeds, those the size of a pinhead $\frac{1}{4}$ inch deep, and those the size of a pea, $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch or more. Get a piece of lath (an ordinary household yardstick works fine) about 2-3 feet long,

press the edge down into the soil evenly, so as to make a groove as deep as the seed is to be planted, scatter the seed along this, allowing 4 or 5 of the larger to 15 or 20 of the smaller seeds to the space one plant is to occupy when grown. Cover the seeds by pressing; turn your lath flat-wise and press the soil down firmly. On light, sandy soils flower seeds should be covered twice the depth that they should be in stiff or heavy clay soils. Cover all seed beds lightly with vermiculite to get good results.

SOWING FLOWER SEED IN BOXES

Many flowers will stand transplanting. Many of them grow better for having been transplanted. In sections liable to late spring frosts or where drought comes in spring, it is advisable to sow seeds in shallow boxes which can be placed in a warm, sunny window or on a porch. This is always advisable with the expensive seeds and those of a tropical nature, such as coleus, salvia, etc. These need a warm soil to start the seeds. Sow the same as in open ground, and keep the soil moist, but not soaking wet. If surface of soil shows tendency to cake or crust sprinkle sifted peat moss, or sphagnum moss lightly over the surface. Small seeds cannot force their way through a crusted surface. As soon as plants reach a height of 2 to 3 inches they may be transplanted, taking as much earth as possible with each plant, so as not to disturb the roots more than necessary.

FLOWER VARIETIES

Most kinds of flowers are represented by several varieties. They may not only be different in color but may also be of different types, shapes or heights. Note these differences, in our descriptions, so to order varieties best suited to your garden. STRAINS are frequently mentioned. After a new variety is introduced, good seed growers select ideal plants for seed stocks. These develop ideal or improved strains. Each year should show some further improvement; more true, more ideal, stronger, healthier plants and more or better flowers. Extra care, pulling out all off-type plants, experienced help in every seed growing operation, make the finest strains much more beautiful and satisfactory than common field-run seeds. Abbreviations and Symbols

The lettering following variety names relates to the type and size. The first letter—A means large size over 8 inches in diameter. B—Medium, 4 to 8 in. M—Small, miniatures, under 4 in. BB—4 to 6 inches.

The next letters refer to type: Ba—ball. FD—Formal Decorative. IC—Incurved cactus. ID—Informal decorative. STC—Straight cactus. SC—Semi-cactus, etc.

DAHLIA CULTURE—Plant Dahlias only in fairly rich but exceptionally well drained soil so there will be no excess moisture accumulation to sour the tubers. Cover the tubers 6 inches and space them from 2 to 4 feet apart according to the type growth of the variety. Keep growing steadily with good garden fertilizer (high in Potash). Force largest exhibition blooms with lots of water when buds form. Early plantings make best bedding effects. Plant very late for prize blooms to come in autumn. Cut tops at ground level, after frost, and mulch heavily to protect clumps from winter freezing. Lift in late spring to divide and replant.

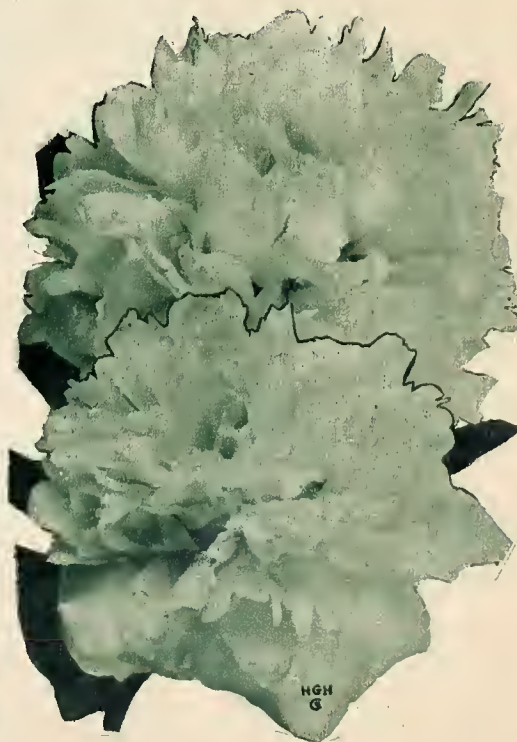

PLANTING DIRECTIONS

WHEN TO PLANT YOUR LAWN

As soon as the soil can be prepared in spring is time to sow seeds of the cool season grasses (Kentucky Blue, Merion Blue, Poa Trivialis, Fescues and the mixtures). Bermuda Grass grows best when seeded after weather warms up in the spring and may be planted from May to August in the mid-South—earlier or later in the lower and upper South. Lawns from sod or sprigs can be planted at any time when soil conditions are reasonably good except possibly mid-winter.

PREPARE SOIL WELL

Prepare soil 8 inches or deeper. Remove rocks, roots and litter. For most soils, additional amounts of humus will be needed to make them mellow and more moisture absorbent. Add at least 1 bale of peatmoss per 1,000 sq. ft. to sandy or clay soils. Work in well before applying fertilizers. Apply 200 lbs. ground limestone, 100 lbs. of Pulverized Sheep Manure and 25 lbs. Hastings' Lawn Fertilizer or 50 lbs. Vigoro to each 1,000 sq. ft. (50x20). Rake in thoroughly, mixing fertilizer with soil and working the surface smooth and level. Soak ground thoroughly. Let soil settle a few days to a week before planting.

SEEDING THE LAWN

Most grasses, except Hulled Bermuda, Merion Blue Grass and Ryegrass, are seeded at the rate of 5 lbs. per 1,000 sq. ft. Double the amount for Ryegrass. For special seeding rates of individual grasses, see lists on page 10. Broadcast seeds evenly by hand or with the use of a seeder. For hand application, divide amount for a given area in half. Broadcast first half as you work across lawn in a lengthwise direction. Broadcast other half in a crosswise direction. Firm with roller or drag lightly and smoothly with back of rake, and water thoroughly. Do not cover over one fourth inch.

LAWN MAINTENANCE IS VERY IMPORTANT

Always keep newly seeded lawns well watered to insure good germination and quick rooting. Make first mowing when new grass is 3 inches high. Subsequent mowings are made as growth conditions permit. Set mower to cut at 2 inches high. On established lawns, keep down weeds by spraying with a 2, 4-D weed killer, and Crabgrass with Dupont Crabgrass Killer. SPRAYING AND PRUNING

PLANT, PRUNE, SPRAY RIGHT FOR FINE FRUITS AND FLOWERS.

APPLES. Pruning. Plant young trees with strong terminal buds. Select 3 buds or small branches a foot apart around trunk, lowest bud at height desired for lowest limb. Other buds are cut out with sharp knife. If other branches develop, cut them off the following spring. As desired branches develop after the first year, select buds to retain as on the whip, pointing in different directions for balance. Keep other branches off by pruning close to limb or trunk. Besides, prune out all dead, diseased, weak branches and any which would interfere with more desirable branches each spring.

Spraying. For home orchards 4 or 5 sprays are needed each year to prevent fungous and insect infestations as follows. 1. Dormant spray. This delayed spray is made when fruit buds become silvery colored and before young leaves develop. Use Lime-Sulphur with addition of Black-Leaf 40, (nicotine sulphate), as directed on packages, against scales, scab, red mite and aphids. 2. Pink bud spray. Use when fruit buds show pink color, Pan Apple Spray (p. 70) against scab, curculio, worms and caterpillars. 3. Calyx spray. Use when petals drop and before calyx closes. Pan Apple Spray (p. 70) as on package directions. 4. Use same spray 10 days later. 5. Same spray 15 days later. If only 2 sprayings are made a year, use numbers 1 and 3 as most important.

PEACHES. Pruning. Plant small trees and prune to 3 or 4 chosen buds or branches 8 to 12 inches apart on trunk and pointing in different directions to make balanced tree. Prune back the main stem above chosen top bud or branch. The second year, before buds swell, cut off all shoots not needed for the tree's framework, keeping tree rather low and open in center. After bearing begins, cut back new shoots in mid-winter at least half way.

Spraying. The general program is 4 sprayings. 1. In winter use a strong Lime-Sulphur spray according to package instructions against leaf-curl and San Jose scale. 2. After petals drop and husks split from young fruits, use Pan Peach Spray against scab, brown rot and curculio. 3. Repeat this spray 15 days later. 4. Use Pan Peach Spray 15 to 20 days later against scab and brown rot. Borers may infest trunks at or beneath the soil surface. Examine for injury in June and September. Dig borers out with knife and wire. Use Para-Scalecide around trunks of older trees about October 1st, as directed on package.

Keep peach tree cultivated, pruned, sprayed and well fertilized and your rewards will be abundant.

THE BEST PRUNING SHEARS

Only the strongest, heaviest, well-tempered steel is worth having in pruning shears. Shears that "cut" instead of "chew" are necessary for a good job. We have such shears to last for years, which will not pinch your hand.

PEARS. Pruning. Prune pears as directed for apples except that more secondary branches are left to use for others in case of fire blight, the worst enemy. If blight occurs, with leaves turning black, cut off all blighted parts, disinfecting tools after each cut. Orient and Baldwin are blight resistant.

Spraying. If leaf-spot diseases occur to defoliate use Pan Apple Spray (p. 70). Lime-Sulphur is also used as a winter spray against scale on the bark.

CHERRIES. Pruning. On planting, prune to 3 to 5 of best placed buds or branches around trunk but don't cut back tips of branches. Otherwise leave alone except for interfering branches until bearing. Then interior shaded branches may be removed to admit air and sunlight.

Spraying. 1. Use Pan Peach Spray when bud scales separate and show green. Add a teaspoonful of Black-Leaf 40 per gallon for sweet cherries. 2. Use Pan Peach Spray as husks split from the young fruit. 3. Use same spray 10 days later. 4. In years when leaf-spot is bad, use Lime-Sulphur after harvesting.

PLUMS. Prune as for young apples. Spray for brown rot as for peaches. If leaf-blight or black-spot diseases should attack leaves, use the Cherry spray schedule. Aphids are controlled by using Black-Leaf 40. For plum curculio, crescent-like markings in the fruit, use Pan Peach Spray right after flower petals fall and again 10 days later.

BERRIES. Blackberries and Dewberries should be pruned. Pinch off tips when about 3 feet tall or long to develop low branches. After fruiting, cut out old stems as they are through bearing and will die anyway. Pull up between-row suckers to prevent spreading out of control. If underside of leaves develop a bright orange rust, pull up plants and burn them. Burn any canes infested with borers. Spray with Black-Leaf 40 for leaf miners in summer and with Bordeaux Mixture in winter as rust preventive.

Raspberries are pruned as for Blackberries. In early

spring remove dead and weak canes and shorten long new canes, leaving 3 to 5 strong canes per plant to fruit each year. Main diseases, as with Blackberries, are yellows, anthracnose, orange-rust and cane-blight. Remove and burn diseased plants, as also for cane and root borers. Spray as above.

GRAPES. (Vine and Bunch types.) Pruning. Never cut in summer. Only prune while dormant, preferably in December. Very long, overgrown canes are usually sterile so cut them off at their bases. Reduce length and number of normal shoots, thickness of a pencil which will bear the next summer. Start training after second year, selecting 2, 4 or 6 canes from main stem in pairs to train horizontally, each cane restricted to bear 6 to 10 buds, according to its strength. Each bud should average 2 grape clusters.

Spraying. Black-rot is the worst disease and spraying for that usually controls most other diseases and insects. Plow under rotted fruit in early spring. Spray 4 or 5 times with Bordeaux Mixture—first when new growth is starting, second when new growth is about 10 inches long, third after blossoms drop, fourth 10 days later, and fifth 15 days later. Second and third sprayings should have added a heaping tablespoonful of Arsenate of Lead to each gallon of spray to control insects.

GARDENIAS-CAMELIAS and other broadleaf evergreens. Pruning may be done generally after blooming or as needed to keep desired size and shape. Spraying. Florida Volck sprayed as needed for white fly and scale using care never to apply in very hot or very cold weather.

FLOWERING SHRUBS, FLOWERS. Pruning. After blooming is proper time to prune except disbudding when desired for improved flowering habits. Spraying. Spray or dust with Dupont Floral Dust to control pests when necessary.

BOXWOOD. Prune as necessary to retain correct size and shape.

Spraying. Use 25% DDT in oil in spring to control box leaf minor. Dust with sulphur in cool weather in summer or spray with MALATHION to control red spider (mites).

ROSES. Pruning. When buds swell noticeably in spring, bush roses are cut back 1/3 to 2/3 normal growth and all dead and diseased canes entirely. Later pruning is for training to desired size. Spring flowering climbers (HW) are pruned only after blooming is over, cutting back 1/3-1/2 normal growth or train to desired area and all dead and diseased canes. C.I.H.T. roses are pruned with bush roses.

Spraying. Weekly spraying or dusting with Dupont Floral Dust gives ample protection against black spot, mildew anthracnose, etc.

S. postage stamps in good condition (one, two and three-cent stamps preferred) the same as cash, but we would ask those remitting stamps to wrap them in oiled paper, if possible, to prevent their sticking together or to the order.

C. O. D. NOTICE Absolutely no plants or other perishable goods will be sent C. O. D. We advise against C. O. D. orders because of delays and high collection charges which are unsatisfactory to the customer and expensive to us if uncalled for and returned at our expense. We accept C. O. D. orders for seeds in exceptional cases when 25% of the order amount is paid in advance.

ABOUT WARRANTY H. G. HASTINGS CO. warrants to the extent of the purchase price that seeds, bulbs or plants sold are as described on the container within recognized tolerances. Seller gives no further warranty express or implied. If purchaser does not accept the goods on these terms, they are at once to be returned, and any money that may have been paid for them will be refunded. Crops are dependent for success or failure on so many things that it is impossible for us to give further warranty or guarantee. This does not mean that we lack confidence in the products we sell, but we have no control over them after they leave our house, especially so as to the methods of planting, cultivating and fertilizing and seasonal conditions, all of which are important factors in the success of any crop. If we should warrant or guarantee productiveness in anyway, we could be held responsible for the failure of the crop, regardless of cause, and this is a responsibility we cannot and will not accept.

FOREIGN SHIPMENTS We cannot accept orders for plants, bulbs or garden accessories for shipment outside the United States because of many rules and regulations that are so costly. We sometimes accept orders for seeds only but to countries having postal arrangements with this country. All postage or shipping and packing charges on foreign shipments are in addition to the prices of any and all seeds quoted.

YOU PAY THE POSTAGE When you order any kind of seeds at "Not Prepaid" or "F. O. B." prices stated in the catalog, you pay the postage, express or freight. The same applies to quantity lots of bulbs and to plants listed at "Not Prepaid" or F. O. B. prices.

When you order seeds in 10 to 100-pound lots or over at "Not Prepaid" prices you can have the seeds sent to you by parcel post, express or freight but you must pay the transportation charges. 70 pounds is parcel post limit.

Large F. O. B. trees cannot be sent by mail. They are too large and the P. O. will not accept them. They must be sent by Express, or by motor freight. Rail freight is generally too slow.

When you order your seeds to come by express or freight we can send them "collect" so you may pay the transportation charges on delivery. If you want F. O. B. orders (those not too large) to be sent by parcel post the postage must be paid IN ADVANCE and you must send us the amount of postage in addition to the cost of the order.

Your Postmaster and generally your R. F. D. Carrier can tell you what zone you are in from Atlanta.

HOW TO FIGURE POSTAGE First figure up the weight in pounds on "Not Prepaid" items you are ordering. Then find what zone you are in from Atlanta. Take the number of pounds you are ordering in the first column and read straight across to your zone column and the amount shown is the postage to send us in addition to the cost of the seed, so we can prepay the postage.

As an example we will suppose that you want to order 15 pounds, a peck of corn with bag containing it. If you lived in either the 1st or 2nd postal zones from Atlanta the amount to be sent us in addition to the price of the corn would be 79c; for the 3rd zone 96c; for the 4th zone \$1.21 and so on. With the table shown it's very easy to figure it exactly, once you know what your zone number is.

If at all in doubt as to your zone be sure and send enough to cover necessary postage. If you send too much, the surplus will be returned to you.

Seventy pounds is the Postal weight limit. If larger quantities are wanted it will have to be split into two or more shipments.

WE PAY THE POSTAGE (Within U.S.A. only.) On all seeds in this catalog listed in packet, half ounce, ounce, quarter pound, half pound, pound, 2-pound, 5-pound and 10-pound quantities, we pay the postage when so indicated (otherwise please add postage) and guarantee safe delivery by mail. We pay the postage on plants and bulbs except in larger sizes or quantities where a "Not Prepaid" or F. O. B. price is named. F. O. B. (free on board) means that we turn the package over to the freight or express company and that customer accepts full responsibility for transportation charges, usually collected at the time of delivery.

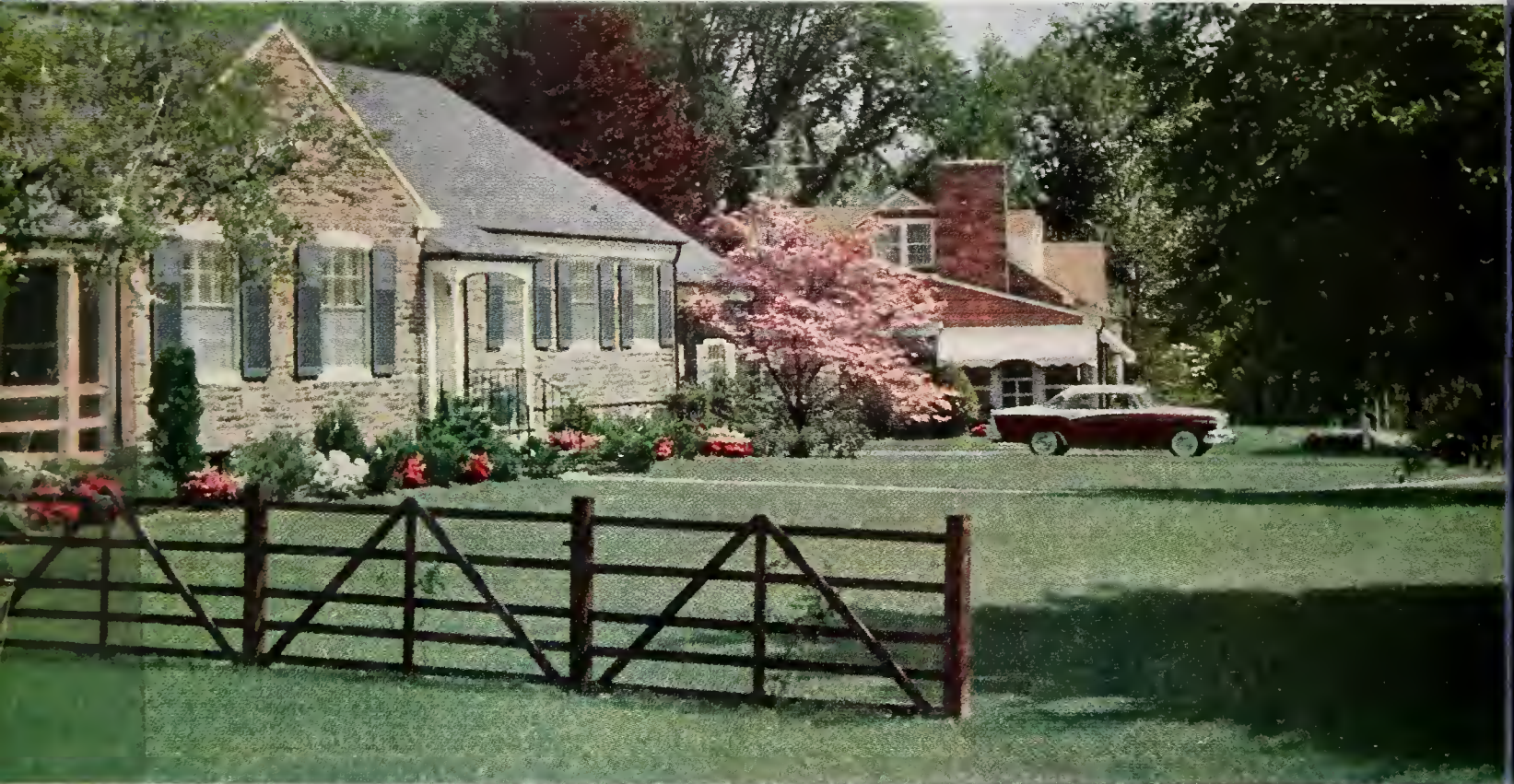
