

1. Festival of Hibita Shrine, Sannomiya, Hibita-mura, Nakagun, was held on 22 April 1949. Approximately 130 stalls were temporarily installed on the occasion and lot charge (basho-dai) ranging from 20 to 50 yen for each stall was collected by promoters.
2. The lot charge totalled ¥4,800 which was disposed of:

¥ 1,000	donated to the Shrine
¥ 900	rent of 30 "toita" plank used for stalls
¥ 800	cleaning and mowing of the premises
¥ 500	tea and cakes
¥ 1,600	put into the Association's fund.

There was no opposition or altercation for such disposition of money.

3. Investigation conducted as to whether part of the above money was donated to the police officer reveals that policeman Omiya, assigned to local police box having jurisdiction over the area was absent attending the Tokyo Area Police Training School and that his wife never accepted donation of any kind in connection with the festival.
4. The above facts were ascertained by questioning 17 witnesses who took part in the stall business on the occasion.

Excuse my impoliteness of writing to you.

After reading an article of "Counter measures of Minato Ward's Women Policemen for Exiling Street Girls" in Jan. 16th Tokyo Newspaper, as I felt that there is no other mean than to ask MGT's help for this matter, I took a pen for all the extreme impoliteness of writing to you.

I am a wife of a labourer who lives at 545 Fujisawa, Fujisawa City. Here in a tea-house live some 100 night women whose uneducational conducts are a great annoyance to mothers. However I want to move to other places, in such an age of house shortages, it is impossible to find a living quarter in anywhere. More than once I asked the police station to help worrying mothers along that line, because of its powerless situation to control over such things or not, I don't know, I could not have any response from that source.

There are six eating and drinking shops within the block, where until 2 or 3 a.m. in the midnight staple foods and wine are being sold openly, and there are much quarrels and singings followed drinking. As for a phonograph records from 9 a.m. in the morning until past 12 in the midnight are singing at their highest pitch. Naturally we who live near cannot have single hour of rest all day long.

We have sometimes visitors in evenings such as my husband's friends or some school students of my relative's. They have to pass through the tea-houses, because of my house is located in such a way, before coming to my door, and consequently they have to be suffered by those night girls being taken off their hats or suit cases. (You must know all men, regardless who they are become the objects of those ladies). Therefore usually my visitors stand before my doors after having a narrow escape. I am always at my wit's end how to apologize to them.

Most of the public bath houses in this neighbourhood charge extra fares to them in allowing them to take bath first before common customers. So I and my children take bath with the feeling of treading on the their ice.

My husband, who must go out to work early has become nervous of late, due to the lack of sound sleep because of the noise continued until midnight. If I try to negotiate directly with proprietors of the tea-houses, I must be ready for the revenge by some wicked youths and bosses or Koreans who have a great influence in the community of this kind. Usually these kind revenges are known terrible. That is why everyone hesitates to take some actions to improve the situation.

There is no washing room in this neighbourhood. Therefore passages and streets are used for that purpose. Every morning I and other housewives are having a great pain in cleaning up the streets.

I cannot stand for it anymore, especially when I think of my children and their education. Will you please make an actual investigation and take some measures to improve the situation? I want to give children proper environment in which children can grow properly and to my husband, I want to give some rest after a day's hard labour and an hour of reading books in the quietness of an evening.

Recently on control of selling staple foods sometimes MPs came to the tea-houses. But immediately after they left the place, everything come back again to former places and no improvement nor changes recognized.

The buildings used now for night women's headquarters are a big house, with many probabilities of being remodeled into homes for repatriates and air-raiders.

Translation of the local news of the Asahi Press dated 8 April, 1949.

Subject: How to handle the fishing right in dispute?
The Komekami Fisheries Association requested Trial Board to re-investigate the case.

Translated by T. Horiye on April 8, 1949.

The Komekami Fisheries Association of Katauramura, Shimogun in dispute with the Sokhai Fisheries Management Association of Odawara for long years about fixed fishing right. In September 1947 filed a suit at the Yokohama District Procurator's Office against several persons including Director-General Jiroku Suzuki of the Sokhai Fisheries Association on the grounds of several items including embezzlement on business and violation of Price Control Law.

However the procurators suspended the case from prosecution in last September, with which the accuser was dissatisfied. Therefore he on 7th requested the Yokohama Trial Board to re-investigate the case.

The summary of the statement reads as follows:

Prosecutors Tomita and Miyazaki took the charge of investigation about prosecution at that time. But they decided that the prosecution should be suspended in spite of suspicion.

He also points out that the disposal was made too generously according to the political tactics taken by the accused. The Odawara Fisheries Development Company who got a lease for fixed fishing right from the Komekami Fisheries Association on a lease basis is going to sublease it to the Sokai Fishing Company and monopolize the important fishing grounds in the Sagami bay through joint management, which, he stresses, is violation of Price Control Law and also tax evasion.

The result of the re-investigation is watched with keen interest because it is the first case which appeared before the Board since the start in last year.
