1. Attention is invited to letter from Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Plans Command, to Director of Intelligence, General Staff, United States Army, Washington 25, D. C., Attention: Chief, Security Group, dated 16 September 1947, subject: "Transmittal of Intelligence File--GRADANZEV, Andrew J., War Department Civilian Employee." The following new development in subject's case is forwarded for your information.

2. On 2 April 1948 subject, now apparently residing at 3119 76th Street, Jackson Heights, New York, New York (who claims that he has legally changed his name from GRADANZEV to GRAD), addressed a letter to Lt. Col. Timothy J. RYAN, formerly of the Military Government Team in Satsuma-ken, when subject states he met while making a study of Japanese agriculture in Fukaya village. Subject wrote to Col. RYAN that he was continuing this research project and desired to open correspondence with some of the residents in Fukaya for the purpose of securing additional information on agricultural conditions. Subject stated that he expected such correspondence to go through "censorship," but nevertheless sought Col. RYAN's concurrence in his projected correspondence. As a collateral point, subject could, of course, get the information through Natural Resources Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

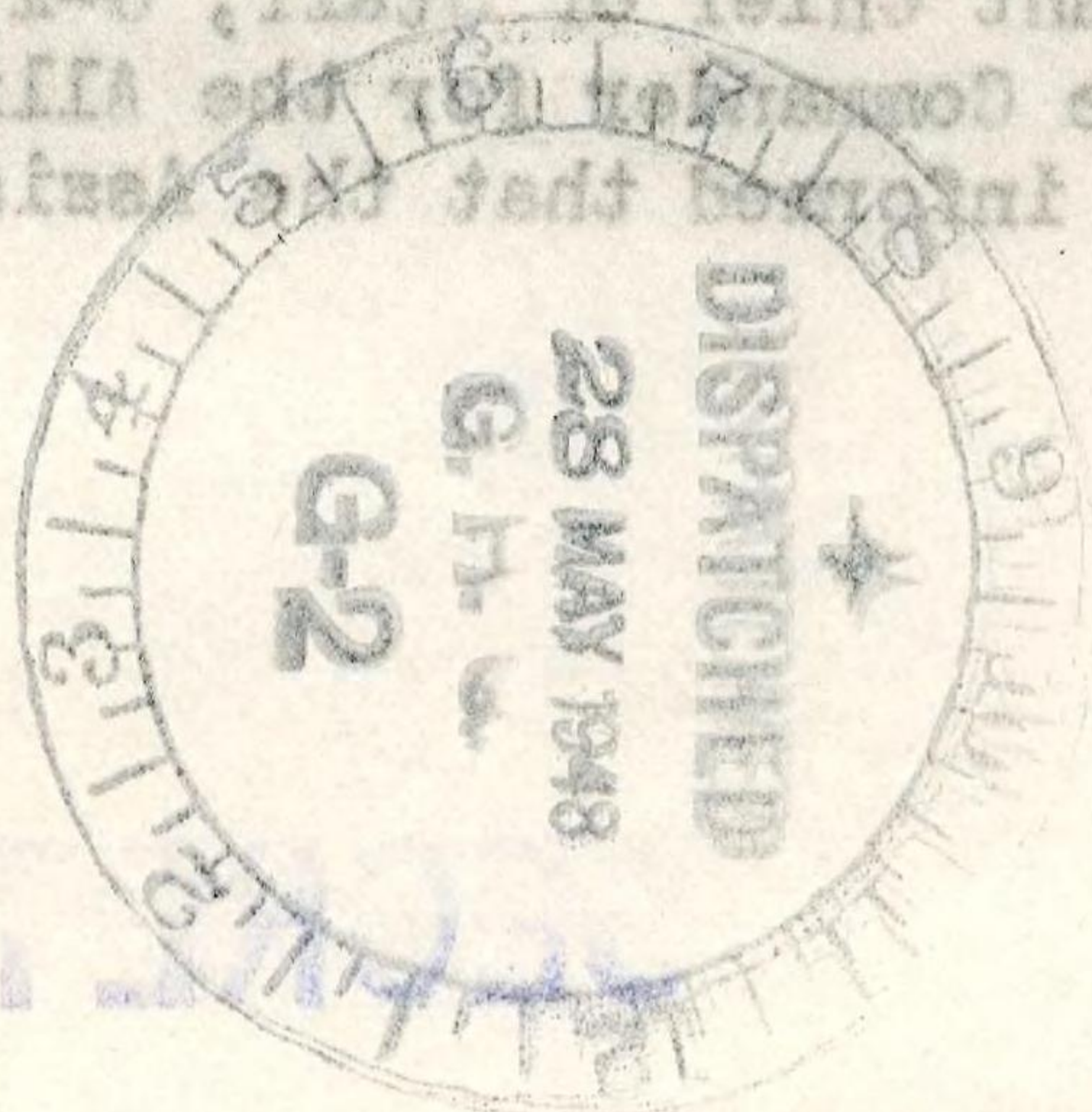
3. Col. RYAN is no longer with Military Government in Satsuma-ken. The present senior Military Government officer, Lt. Col. Charles P. HAYWARD, informed Counter Intelligence Corps that persons unknown to him had placed subject's letter to Col. RYAN on his desk and that on about 29 April 1948 a Captain BROWN (identified as Captain Richard G. BROWN, O6271A) of Government Section, General Headquarters, had called to ask Col. HAYWARD what he "intended to do about subject's letter."

4. Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Eighth Army and the Government Section, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, have been advised of this matter and informed that the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Supreme

1. Subject was formerly a Department of the Army civilian employee in Government Section, Supreme Commander For the Allied Powers. Subject was extensively investigated while in this theater because of derogatory information concerning his leftist background received from Director of Intelligence and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Investigation in this theater also disclosed that subject was closely associated with other leftist personnel under investigation, with Japanese leftist and Communists, and was engaged in blackmarket activities. On 20 July 1947 subject was apprehended by Military Police in Fukaya village, Saitama-ken and excessive United States army and Post exchange supplies were found in his room at the time. Further investigation and interrogation revealed that subject was dealing with KITaura Hachigo, then leader of a blackmarket ring operating in the Ginza area, Tokyo. Subject made signed confession of his blackmarket activities, was disqualified from further employment and returned to the United States on 13 August 1947.

2. On 2 April 1948 subject (who claims that he has legally changed his name from GRAJDANZEV to GRAD) addressed a letter to Lt. Col. Timothy J. RYAN, formerly of the Military Government Team in Saitama-ken, whom subject states he met while making a study of Japanese agriculture in Fukaya village. Subject wrote to Col. RYAN that he was continuing this research project and desired to open correspondence with some of the residents in Fukaya for the purpose of securing additional information on agricultural conditions. Subject stated that he expected such correspondence to go through "censorship," but nevertheless sought Col. RYAN's concurrence in his projected correspondence. As a collateral point, subject could, of course, get the information through Natural Resources Section.

3. Col. RYAN is no longer with Military Government in Saitama-ken. The present senior Military Government officer, Lt. Col. Charles P. HAYWARD, informed Counter Intelligence Corps that persons unknown to him had placed subject's letter to Col. RYAN on his desk [and that on or about 29 April 1948 a Captain BROWN (identified as Captain Richard G. BROWN, 0627149) of Government Section, General Headquarters, had called to ask Col. HAYWARD what he "intended to do about subject's letter."]

SUBJECT: HIGA Ryotoku

Summary of Information:

On 18 September 1948, Agent #4848 from Tokyo Area CIC interviewed HIGA at Subject's residence, Minato-ku, Akasaka, Aoyama-Minami-cho, 5-chome, No. 49. Subject stated in substance:

It has become almost a matter of routine with Subject during 1947 to answer many queries pertaining to his anticipated return to Okinawa in September 1948 with the funds belonging to the Okinawa Foundation. Subject based this approximate date of return, initially, on the possibility that a Peace Treaty would have been concluded between the Allied Powers and Japan sometime in 1948. However, as time passed and no signs were noted to indicate an early conclusion of a Peace Treaty, HIGA gave up hope of returning in 1948.

During a visit by a Mr. VRUNE (correct spelling unknown), American Chief of Affairs in Okinawa, and Director of Economic Department in Okinawa, to Japan in April or May 1948, Subject consulted the former on the possibility of returning to Okinawa with the funds in his possession. He was informed by VRUNE that although he (VRUNE) was sympathetic toward the Okinawan situation, the existing Japanese law would not permit the transfer of funds outside of Japan. In short, HIGA, who has been planning to take the funds to Okinawa personally, was informed by VRUNE that there was no legal way to do so. HIGA then proposed that the Occupation authorities permit him to ship goods to Okinawa, equal in value to the amount of the funds. He was told that it was not advisable owing to the prevailing shortage of foods in Japan. The funds, now amounting to about sixteen million yen (¥16,000,000.00), have been deposited in various banks or have been on loan to Okinawans in Japan.

In anticipation of more favorable conditions which would permit his return to Okinawa with the funds, HIGA is presently adopting a policy of limiting all loans to a three (3) month period with possible three (3) month extensions thereafter. This will permit him to "wind-up" affairs of the Okinawa Foundation within a three-month period, should the opportunity arrive for him to return with the funds.

HIGA's present plans for his return to Okinawa include:

- a. Waiting for the conclusion of a Peace Treaty, or
- b. Receipt of special permission from SCAP.

1. Original letter, dated 14 August 1947, from Mr. James McI. Henderson, Administrator, Philippine Alien Property Administration of the United States, requested cooperation of this command in determining possible implication of former Major General UCHINOMIYA, Naotaka, in disappearance of Philippine coins and securities valued at P 800,000 (Incl 1).

2. UCHINOMIYA was interrogated at Central Interrogation Center, ATIS, without positive results. Copy of this interrogation was furnished Mr. Henderson with interim reply (Incl 2) from this Headquarters dated 22 September 1947, as approved by Chief of Staff. The interim reply stated that subsidiary investigations were under way for purpose of determining whether:

a. UCHINOMIYA's financial operations since returning to Japan justified suspicion he had received any of missing funds.

b. Any additional evidence implicating or clearing him could be obtained from his associates in Japanese occupation of Philippines.

3. As result of above commitments, Counter Intelligence Corps undertook confidential investigation of UCHINOMIYA's financial status since his return to Japan from Philippines in December 1946, and former Major General KIRA, Koichi, Chief of Finance Department, Japanese Occupation Forces in PI, was interrogated by Central Interrogation Center, ATIS.

4. Draft letter to Mr. Henderson transmits copy of ATIS interrogation of KIRA which was negative, and findings of CIC report on UCHINOMIYA's financial status, also negative.

5. This closes the case unless additional information is requested by Mr. Henderson.

6. Recommend approval of draft letter to Mr. Henderson forwarding copy of ATIS Interrogation of KIRA.

My dear General MacArthur:

In connection with the vesting of Japanese owned properties in the Philippine Islands, the question has arisen as to the disappearance of treasury certificates and gold and silver coins valued at approximately P800,000.00, which were held by the Japanese in Manila. Prior to your liberation of the City, a Japanese Brigadier General by the name of Utsunomiya, apparently in charge of the civil affairs of the Japanese Military Administration, was reported by His Excellency Manuel A. Roxas to have taken these notes and coins and departed for Baguio. It is believed that this property was buried somewhere in the vicinity of Baguio or perhaps transferred to Japan. It would be appreciated if Utsunomiya could be interviewed in an effort to ascertain the whereabouts and ownership of these certificates and coins inasmuch as their absence is a disturbing factor in the stabilization of Philippine economy.

Your cooperation is deeply appreciated.

Your letter to General MacArthur citing the disappearance of gold and silver coins and treasury certificates valued at ₱ 800,000.00 prior to the liberation of the city of Manila by U.S. Army Forces has been received.

Investigation of UCHINOMIYA, Naotaka, formerly Major General, Japanese Army, and Director of the General Affairs Section, Japanese Army Headquarters, Manila, from September 1942 to the end of the war, has been initiated as a result of the information supplied to you by His Excellency Manuel A. Roxas. Inclosed with this letter is a copy of the interrogation of UCHINOMIYA. The interrogation failed to implicate UCHINOMIYA in the disappearance of the wanted coins and securities. UCHINOMIYA's financial status is now under investigation, however, and those former Japanese Army officers whom he named as possibly having knowledge of the missing securities will be interrogated. You will be advised of the results of these subsidiary investigations.

In the meantime, it is suggested that you endeavor to secure verification of UCHINOMIYA's reported trip to BAGUIO on 22 December 1944 with the Finance Minister of the then Japanese-sponsored Philippine Government. As you will note in the interrogation report, UCHINOMIYA states that this official was carrying securities, value unknown to UCHINOMIYA, which were still in that official's possession when the party separated after arrival in BAGUIO.

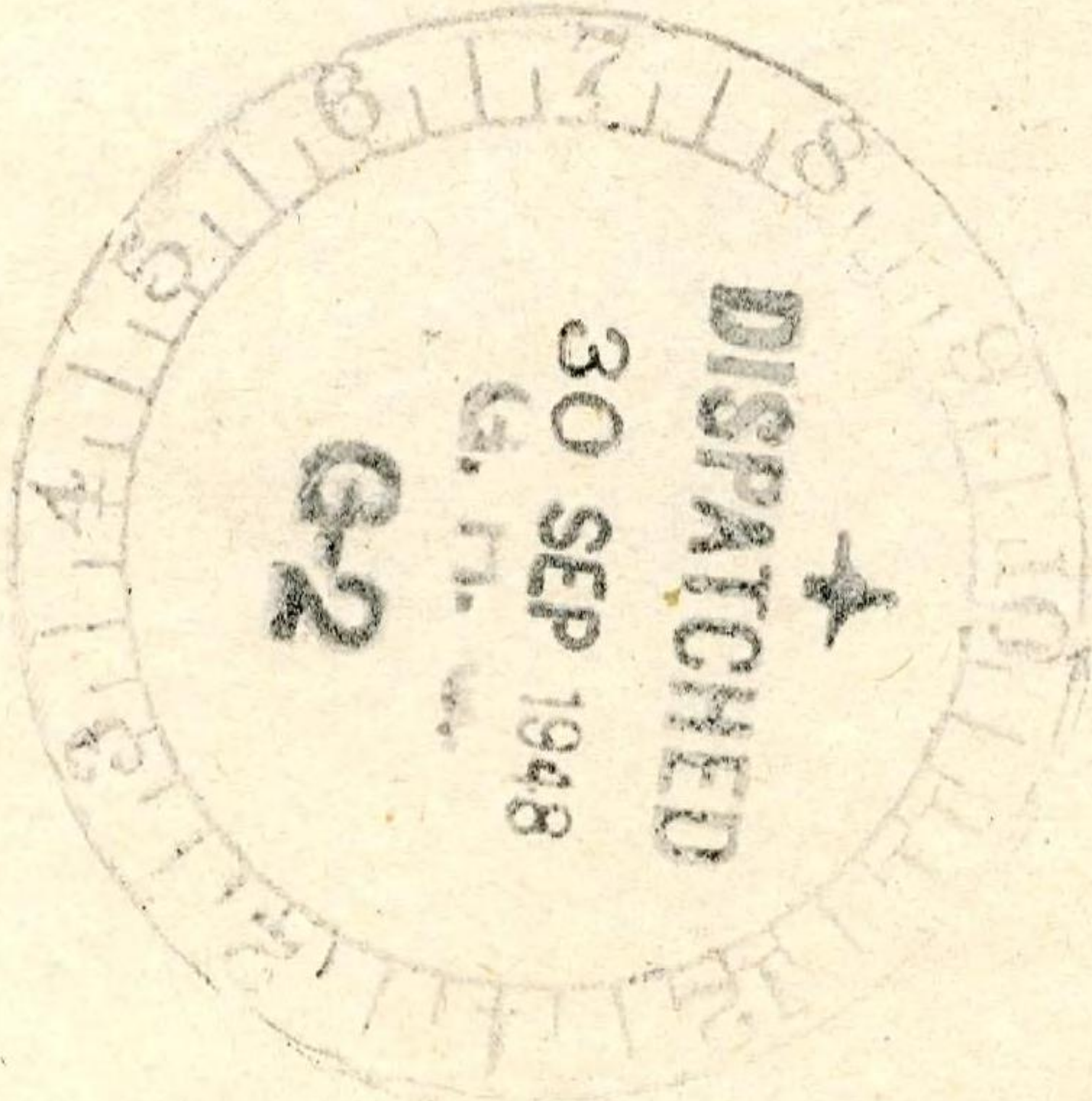

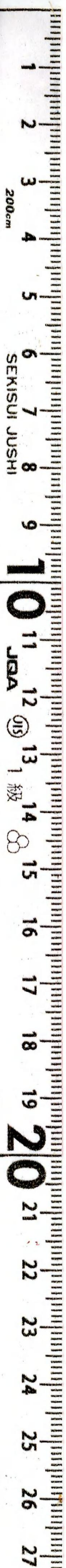

1. Subject, KRAPIVNITSKY Vladimir A., is an applicant for a visa to enter the United States. Background information available to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Far East Command, on Subject, is as follows:

a. Subject was born at Harbin, China, on December 7, 1907. He states that he immigrated to the Philippines from China in 1937, where he worked as mining engineer for Paracale Mining Development, Paracale, Camarines Norte; Masbate Goldfields, Incorporated, Masbate, Aroroy; and finally for Luzon Stevedoring Company, Mining Department on Palawan, until the mines were occupied by the Japanese in June 1942; that on September 9, 1942 he escaped and joined the guerillas and surrendered by order of Captain C. Amores in March 1943; and that in May 1944 he joined the 346 Harbor Craft Company, Transportation Corps, United States Army, Tacloban, Leyte, as Diesel Mechanic; that in July 1945 he was transferred to Manila as mechanical engineer with the Marine Maintenance Corps at Santa Mesa Shipyards; that on October 15, 1945 he again joined the United States Army Transportation, by whom he is still employed, having been stationed at Okinawa since November 4, 1946.

b. Subject's wife, Mrs. Lydia KRAPIVNITSKY, informed the American Consul, Yokohama, by letter dated July 1948, that the Counter Intelligence Corps, Manila, has information that her husband worked for the Japanese while they occupied the Philippine Islands; that he signed a petition for Soviet citizenship in the office of the Russian representative in Manila, Mr. Teplich. He is also alleged to have tried to secure Soviet citizenship for himself through Shanghai.

2. It is requested that investigation be initiated along the following lines in order to affirm or disprove charges against Subject:

a. Did Subject work for the Japanese while they occupied the Philippine Islands?

b. Did Subject, while in Manila, sign a petition for Soviet citizenship?

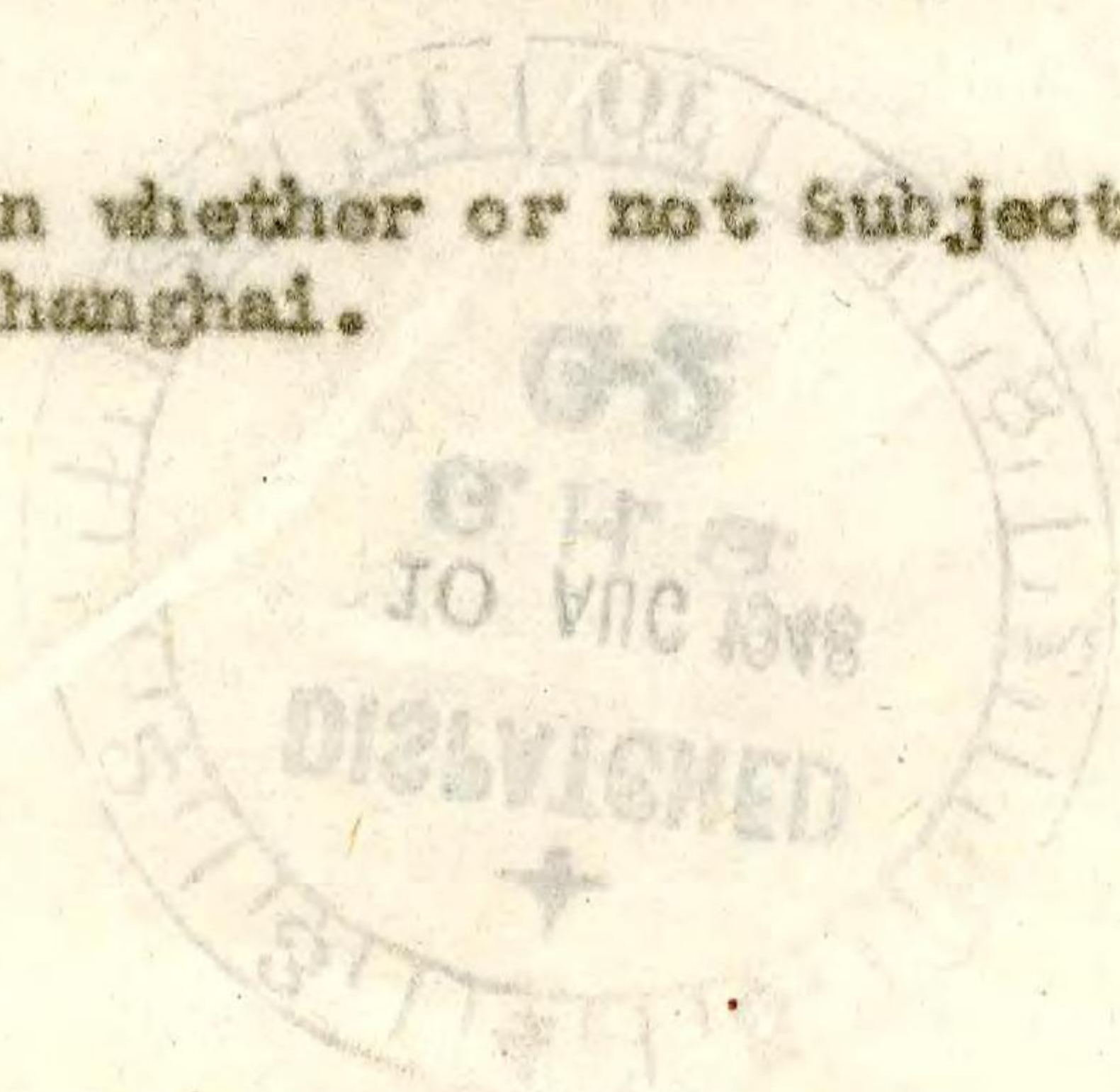

1. On 10 November 1948, an individual of Russian extraction, who identified himself as Gregory Krouchinin, called at General Whitehead's office, Meiji Building, and requested audience with the General or other staff officer of Headquarters, Far East Air Forces. Lt Sherrill, General Whitehead's Aide, conferred with Krouchinin and was told that the subject wanted to give the Air Forces an invention. An appointment was made for an interview with Major Andrew Ivanoff, A-2 Division, Far East Air Forces, on 11 November 1948.

2. On 11 November 1948, Major Ivanoff, who speaks Russian, interviewed subject and was told that subject had several inventions he desired to give to the Air Force for development, but that he desired to retain the civil patent rights. Subject indicated that he was anxious to go to the United States and assist in the development of his inventions at the Air Force "Technical Center." Major Ivanoff, discussed subject's inventions and concluded they were of little value to the Air Forces. Subject, in the course of this interview, produced a letter purportedly written by Dr. Rebold, Scientific Section, General Headquarters, in which he stated that he had viewed subject's inventions and believed they justified further investigation. Subject wanted to turn over six inventions in exchange for which he wanted a paper signed which stated the inventions were for the purposes of the United State Air Forces and reserved all civil rights for subject. Major Ivanoff declined his offer and suggested he make a notarized disclosure of his inventions before he turned them over to anyone. Copy of summary of interview is inclosed.

3. Subject again visited Major Ivanoff at the Meiji Building on 12 November 1948 and offered an invention pertaining to a rocket propelled projectile. Subject was informed he would be contacted if this headquarters was interested. Subject gave his address as 523 Sugita Machi, Yokohama.

1. It has been reported recently by an informed source that LO Ch'ien-pai, a Chinese, former leading figure in Chinese intelligence agencies in Shanghai, is now in South Korea.

2. According to reports from varied sources, LO has long been associated with Chinese intelligence groups which have been especially concerned with economic and political intelligence concerning Japan and with the exploitation of Japanese as intelligence agents. In 1946 LO reportedly headed one of these groups in Shanghai which also functioned successfully as a counter-Soviet intelligence group. This was disbanded in 1947 in a move which coincided with sweeping changes in Chinese intelligence and propaganda bureaus and the formation of the high-level, government-subsidized East Asia Association (ATO KYOKAI) (or Institute of East Asian Relations). Early in 1948 LO was reported to be "a key figure in the Chinese Communications Police, probably interested in their intelligence functions". LO is said to be an "authority on Japan", probably having been educated here, and appears to have been deeply involved in Japanese affairs in Shanghai since the war. He was said to be on intimate terms with a Japanese, who was at one time engaged in large-scale smuggling deals. LO appears to have influential friends in high Chinese circles. Soon after the end of the war he was under fire from government authorities for alleged financial irregularities and unauthorized disclosure of information to the British Intelligence Service. He reportedly was cleared of these charges by the personal intervention of Lt. Gen. CHENG Chieh-min, then head of Chinese G-2. LO's brother, LO Kuo-tien (羅國典) (RA Koku Ten), a cripple, is described as a member of the Chinese Secret Service, Chief of the International Section of the Central Propaganda Bureau, and Chief Secretary of the People's Party. He is now believed to be in Formosa.

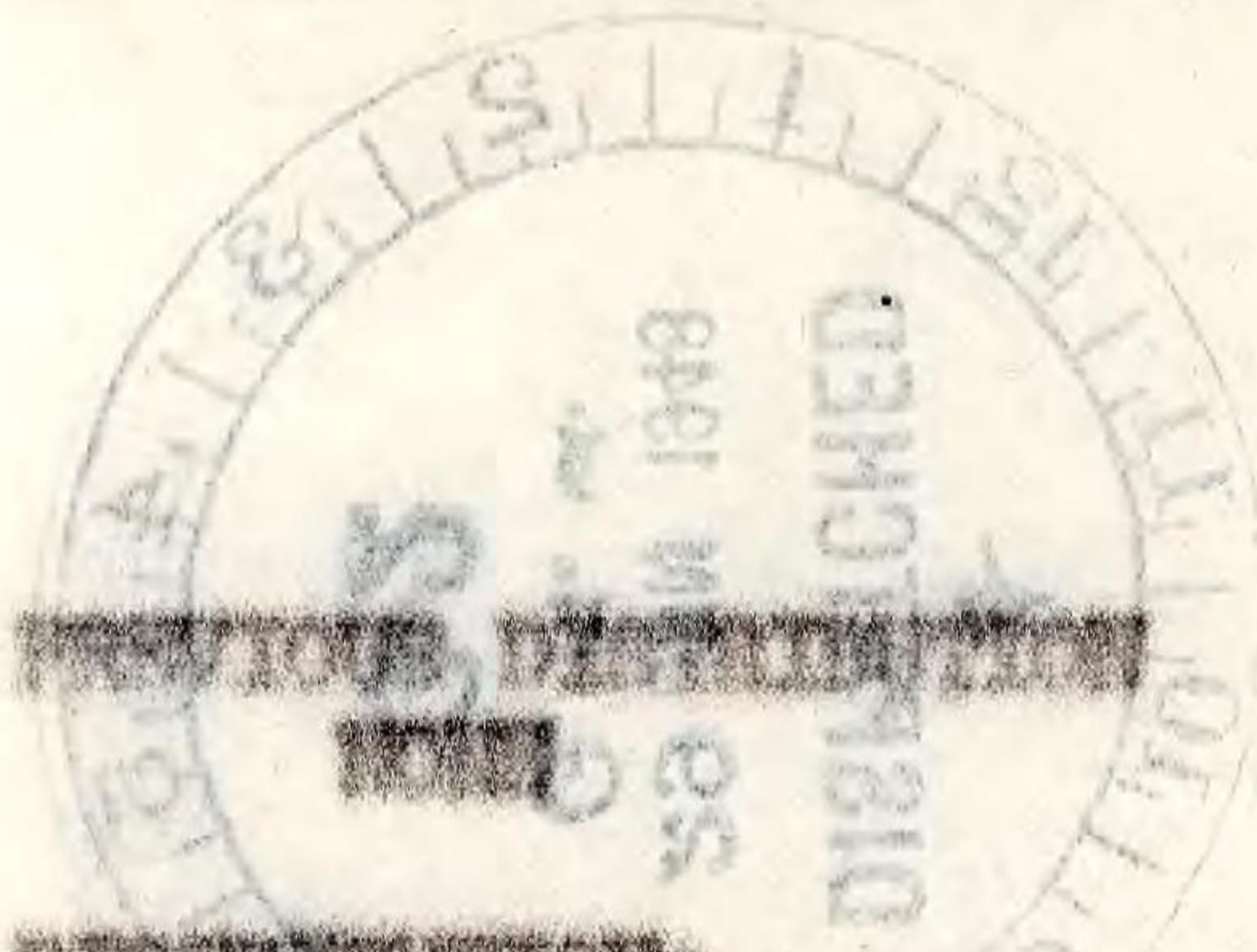
SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

Information received at this Headquarters indicates that SUBJECT has defended the Communist Party Line, and has friends and associates that are Communist Party Card Holders.

Fellow passengers, flying from Nichols Field, Hawaii to Narada Field, Japan, with SUBJECT, reported that MEMBER stated that the US Army is un-necessarily degrading Communism and is using malicious propaganda in the fight against Communism. During flight, SUBJECT stated that he sympathizes with the USSR form of economy, and dislikes the Capitalist form of government. MEMBER stated he has several friends who are Communist Party Card Holders and the impression was left by SUBJECT that he is friendly with a FATHER Leonard (US citizen) who may be very wealthy. SUBJECT is very familiar with the Communist Party Manifesto.

MEMBER stated that he does not like Harry WALLACE personally, but that he stands solidly behind his party. SUBJECT indicated that he was a member of a Radio Guild and made the remark that the Communists have never tried to dominate a labor union. On all items of discussion during the flight, MEMBER defended the Communist Party line.

SUBJECT is a Philco Technical Representative, and arrived in Japan on Flight 225, 1240 hours, 7 June 1948, from Guam. SUBJECT claimed to have studied at the University of Connecticut, and to have been an officer or a warrant officer in the US Army. SUBJECT departed Tokyo, on 8 June 1948, for Nagoya, to report to Headquarters 5th Air Force, Box 242, APO 710.

1. Forwarded for your information is this report, evaluated as E-5, concerning the activities of a South Korean rightist illegal entrant, RI Zai Kwa (李在華):

a. RI was born in 1922 in South Korea at Keisho-Hokudo, Zenzan-gun, Botsu-men, Shosando. While attending Togoku University in Seoul and majoring in philosophy, RI became highly interested in politics and the formation of a Korean Republic. Encountering many radical youths in the university who were pro-Russian and pro-Communist, RI, in order to put forth better argument for his rightist inclinations, began studying Russian and Communism.

b. In February 1948, RI obtained employment with the Korean Police in Fusan. Soon after the general elections in Korea of May of this year, the Fusan Police requested RI to go to Japan to gather information on subversive Korean elements in Japan which might tend to weaken the structure of the New Korean Government.

c. RI frequently called on executives of both rightist and leftist organizations in Japan, but met with little success, because the Koreans did not appear to trust him. The failure of his mission prompted him to turn himself over to the police at Osaka under the name of SAI Hitsu Taku (斎心澤). It was RI's intention that, if he should detect any subversive and radical individuals in the group of Koreans returning to Korea, he would turn them over to the police in Korea upon his return.

2. On 12 August RI was still interned at Harjo Repatriation Center. Date of his deportation to Korea has not been determined.

"We employed this agent at the outbreak of the war and gave him a military identity on Bataan. He became a prisoner-of-war and survived. Repatriated to the United States in 1945. Colonel Mellnick should be consulted, being available in Washington. Generally speaking, Sabin's references to Colonel Evans, Major Raymond, Major Lothrop, and Lt. Seater are correct."
