Upon completion of TGAAP over Okinawa at 1030 April 8 a division of 4 FM-2's of VG-94 was ordered to attack installations in caves in a hill along the beach on the south side of Ie Shima, 1200 yards to the northwest of Motobu peninsula, Okinawa. The pilots located the cave area but were unable to see emplacements or enemy activity. Rocket and strafing attacks were directed against an area 200 yards long and 50 yards deep. 3 attacks were made in column and from the sea. All rockets and m.g. ammo were placed in the target area; about 6 rockets were seen to enter the caves. Damage was not observable.
