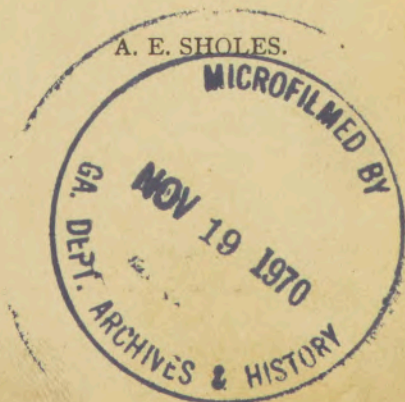
As usual, in connection with the canvass, a careful census was taken, which shows the present population to be **20,292**. (See page 4.)

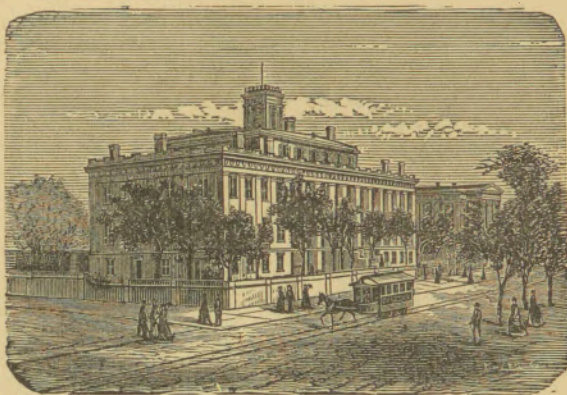

EXPLANATIONS.

Reference to the Key will show the streets and avenues in alphabetical order, with place of commencement, general direction and all *cross streets*, giving *corner numbers*.

The object has been to number all streets from *the river* out, and from *Seventh street* upwards, taking those two general directions for initial points, the odd numbers will be found on the *right* and even numbers on the *left*, or odd numbers on the *north* and *west* and even numbers on the *south* and *east* sides.

Every *twenty six* feet is allowed a number in the business or fire limit, and *fifty-two* feet out side.

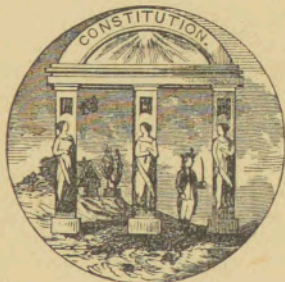

Absolute safety in sending money by mail is had by obtaining a money order on another money order office.

No single order issued for more than \$50. Parties desiring to remit larger sums must obtain additional orders. No applicant, however, can obtain, in one day, more than three orders payable at the same office and to the same payee. Money orders can also be obtained at this office upon post offices in all parts of Canada, German Empire, England, Ireland, Scotland, France, Switzland and Algiers. The fees or commissions to be charged for domestic money orders are as follows: On orders not exceeding \$15, ten cents; over \$15 and not exceeding \$30, fifteen cents; over \$30 and not exceeding \$40, twenty cents; over \$40 and not exceeding \$50, twenty-five cents.

In U. S. Currency, charged for issuing International Money Orders—payable in Great Britain or Ireland. On orders not exceeding \$10, twenty cents; over \$10 and not exceeding \$20, forty cents; over \$20 and not exceeding \$30, sixty cents; over \$30 and not exceeding \$40, eighty cents; over \$40 and not exceeding \$50, one dollar.

Payable in German Empire, or France or Algiers. On orders not exceeding \$10, fifteen cents; over \$10 and not exceeding \$20, thirty cents; over \$20 and not exceeding \$30, forty-five cents; over \$30 and not exceeding \$40, sixty cents; over \$40 and not exceeding \$50 seventy-five cents.

NOTE.—The applicant must in all cases write his own given name and surname in full; and when the given name of the payee is known, it should be stated; otherwise the initial letters of the given name may be used. The given names of married women must be stated, and not those of their husbands. Names of parties and places, and the sums, must be written in the *lainest possible mander*.

If put up in such a manner as to avoid a ready inspection, letter postage, (3 cents for each $\frac{1}{2}$ oz) will be charged on the entire package. Postage on samples or merchandize is 1 cent per ounce, and the same rule as to inspection applies to this class of mail matter also. (See stamps, 3d class).

Valuable letters or packages should be registered, the fee for same, to *all parts of the world*, being ten cents, in addition to the regular postage, to be paid in stamps, *i.e.*, stamps sufficient must be attached to letters before presenting for registration. The name and postoffice address of the sender must be endorsed on face of envelope. Merchandise, or any mailable matter, may be registered by payment of the ten cent. stamp in addition to the regular postage. After a registered letter has been transmitted, it cannot be recalled by the sender. No letter can be registered on Sunday. The Post Office Department, or its revenue, is not by law liable for the loss of any registered mail matter, but will vigorously prosecute the search for any registered package reported lost. Registered letters will not be delivered to any person but the one to whom they are addressed, or to a person the postmaster knows to be authorized to receive them.

POSTAGE.

FIRST-CLASS MATTER.—Matter which is in writing, or other matter containing a written inscription in the nature of personal correspondence, and matter which is sealed against in-

spection, are alone by their nature and the intent of the law first-class matter, and subject to the postage rate of *three cents* for each half ounce or fraction thereof.

On local or drop letters, at offices where free delivery by carriers is established, *two cents* for each half ounce or fraction thereof.

SECOND-CLASS MATTER.—This only applies to publishers, *two cents* per pound.

THIRD-CLASS MATTER.—Mail-matter of the third-class embraces books (printed and blank), transient newspapers and periodicals, circulars, and other matter wholly in print, proof-sheets and corrected proof sheets and manuscript copy accompanying the same, prices current with prices filled out in writing, printed commercial papers filled out with writing (provided such writing is not in the nature of personal correspondence, and the papers are not the expression of a monetary value), such as papers of legal procedure, unexecuted deeds of all kinds, way-bills, invoices, unexecuted insurance policies and the various documents of insurance companies, hand-bills, posters, chromo lithographs, engravings, envelopes with printing thereon, heliotypes, lithographs, photographic and stereoscopic views with title written thereon, printed blanks, printed cards; and postage shall be paid thereon at the rate of *one cent* for each two ounces or fractional part thereof

FOURTH-CLASS MATTER.—Mailable matter of the fourth-class embraces blank cards, card-board and other flexible material, flexible patterns, letter envelopes and letter-paper without printing thereon, merchandise, models, ornamented paper, sample cards, samples of ores, metals, minerals, seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots, scions, drawings, plans, designs, original paintings in oil or water colors, and any other matter not included in the first, second, or third classes, and which is not in its form or nature liable to destroy, deface, or otherwise damage the contents of the mail bag, or harm the person of any one en-

gaged in the postal service. Postage rate thereon, *one cent* for each ounce, or fractional part thereof.

To use, or attempt to use in payment of postage, a postage stamp or stamped envelope, or stamp cut from any such envelope which has been before used in payment of postage, is punishable with a *fine of fifty dollars*.

Postal cards may be sent either in print, pencil or ink, or partially in all. They are regarded by postmasters the same as sealed letters. In using postal cards, be careful not to write, or have anything printed on the side to be used for the address, except the address.

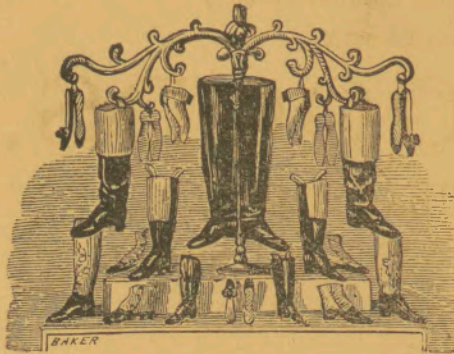

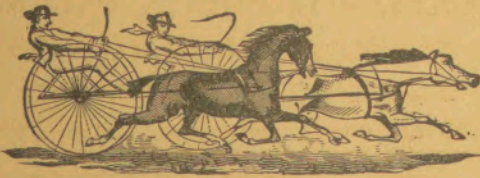

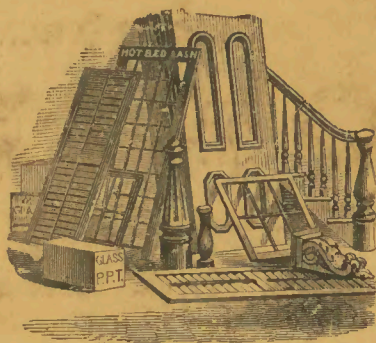
