

From the crossbow . . . to the public-key cipher

Technology Equals Freedom!

The invention of the man-portable crossbow may rank among history's classic triumphs of technology over tyranny. An untrained peasant could now reliably and lethally engage a target at distances out to a hundred meters--even if that target were a mounted, chain-mailed knight. Since about the only mounted knights likely to visit your average peasant would be government soldiers and tax collectors, the crossbow was not without appeal: With it, the common rabble might defend themselves not just against one another, but against their governmental masters! Kings and priests (the traditional meddlers with Alcohol, Tobacco and Crossbows) threatened death and excommunication, respectively, for unauthorized possession of this dangerous, anti-state weapon.

The public-key cipher (with a personal computer to run it) represents an equivalent quantum leap--in a defensive weapon. Not only can such an encryption technique be used to protect sensitive data in one's own possession, but it can also permit two strangers to exchange information over an insecure channel--a wiretapped phone line, for example (or skywriting, for that matter)--without ever having previously met to exchange cipher keys. With a thousand-dollar computer, you can create a cipher that a multi-megabuck CRAY X-MP can't crack in a year. Within a few years, it should be economically feasible to similarly encrypt voice communication. Technology will have made wiretapping useless!

To the denizens of Auschwitz (or Manzanar), adequate technology might have been as simple as a tungsten-carbide wire cutter; to the Soviet samizdat underground, an inexpensive, concealable mimeograph machine. The East German who would rather be a West German might benefit from studying the aerodynamics of hang-gliders; similarly, the thirsty Saudi Arabian could inquire into the technology of fermentation and distillation. And so it goes. Vis-a-vis contemporary society, you'd better learn how to beat your plowshares into swords before they outlaw plowshares too!

The purpose of The LiberTech Project is the acquisition and dissemination of liberty-enhancing technology. Some of this information may get a bit bouncy, so let us be clear that it is intended for educational and informational purposes only.

... and, lo! from the flery heart of the laser, a voice spake, saying, "Go forth and tell thy people that if they eschew liberty until 51% of their brethren are persuaded not to enslave them, then they will live and die in chains—but that technology can give them freedom in the here and now! Speak unto Objectivists, Libertarians, Discordians, survivalists and soldiers of fortune—and take special pains to reach computer hackers, electronics phreaks, and high-techies of all sorts. Speak even unto those who sail with Brother Timothy's Spaced Patrol and those who worship with G. Gordon at the Church of the Open Bolt, for while ye seek Galts and Celines, forget not that an Uncle Duke may make an invaluable contribution to your data base. And finally, give ye a free 3-month subscription to the Project newsletter to anyone who mentions FOFCON'85 in his/her inquiry . . ."

SPEAKERS



RAY BRADBURY, author of Farenheit 451, The Martian Chronicles, The Illustrated Man, and Something Wicked This Way Coames, has written 400 short stores and 15 nonvels. Movies and TV script writer, Bradbury has worked with film director John Huston, Alfred Hitchcock and Rod Serling of The Twilight Zone. Among his latest efforts are his first novel in 22 years, a murder-suspense thriller scheduled for publication this fall; a screenplay Omenemo, written for producer of The Empire Strikes Back; and an opera for the Seattle Opera Compmany.

KARL HESS was Sen. Barry Goldwater's speechwriter for his 1964 preisential campaign. Hess has also written for Presidents Nixon and Ford before becoming distlusioned with the Washington D.C. establishment. A former editor of Newsweek magazine, Hess has written and co-authored several books, Dear America, Community Technology, In A Cause That Will Triumph, End Of The Druft and Neighborhood Power. Hess lives in West Virginia in an underground bouse that he built himself.





BARRY REID is the founder of Eden Press in Fountain Valley, California, which is the most authoritative source of information relating to change of identity and indentification records. Reid's first book was The Paper Trip, a unique approach to personal privacy through a change of identity. His other books include The Paper Trip II and Privacy.

In 1976 he was interviewed by 60 Minutes on how to create alternative identities. In 1979, the U.S Justice Department, annoyed at his activities and books, wrote that Barry Reid is a "hero to the underworld." He graduated from UCLA with a B.A. in Political Science and later received an M.A. in Spanish Literature.

ROBERT LeFEVRE has been a fountainhead of the west coast libertarian movement almost since its inception. He is also one of the most controversial libertarians on the issues of justice and pacifism. LeFevre has had an extensive career in both broadcasting and journalism. In 1956 he founded the Freedom School in Colorado Springs, Colorado (later renamed Rampart College and moved to Santa Ana, California). He is the author of numerous books including This Bread is Mine, The Nature of Man and His Government, The Philosophy of Ownership, Lift Her Up Tenderly and the booklets Good Government: Hope or Illusion? and Does Government Protection Protect?



David Ramsay Steele was born in Scottland and lived in England until 1981. He was a leader in the Socialist Party of Great Britian, giving speeches to worker in support of Marxism. According to Steele, the writings of Prof. Ludwig von Mises had a profund effect on him. By the mid 1970's, Steele had renounced Marxism as "impractical."

A graduate at the University of Hull in northern England, Steele received his B.A. in sociology. His new book, Marx and Mises: Socialism and Economic Calculation," published by Open Court Publishing will soon be available to the public. A popular speaker in the mid-west, Steele has published in the Journal of Liberturian Studies and was a Fellow at the Institute of Humane Studies.





ROBERT R. SIMON, M.D., Assistant Director of Emergency Medicine Residency and Assistant Professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), was the first American doctor to enter Afghanistan since the Soviet invasion on December 26, 1979.

In May, 1984 Dr. Simon slipped through the rugged mountain passes into Afghanistan on foot, wearing native Afghan garb to successfuly avoid being spotted by Soviet helicopter gunships. Accompanied by the Mujahideen and Afghan doctors, he walked fifteen miles a day in extreme temperatures to treat the sick and wounded, and to train the Afghans to diagnose and treat wounds and diseases themselves.

After his return to the United States, Dr. Simon founded a non-profit organization called "The International Medical Corps (IMC). The IMC has developed into a group of 250 volunteer doctors, nurses and medical personnel who go to Afghanistan to give medical aid.

GEORGE H. SMITH has spoken frequently at the Future of Freedom Conferences and has proved to be one of our most popular speakers. Author of Atheism: The Case Against God, he studied philosophy at the University of Arizona. He is a research fellow for the Institute for Humane Studies, which is funding his new book on voluntary schooling vs. government schooling. Smith has lectured extensively for the CATO Institute.





ROBERT POOLE is president of the Reason Foundation and editor-in-chief of Reason magazine. Poole is the editor of three books: Instead of Regulation, Defending A Free Society and his latest Unnatural Monopolies (see story on page 7). Poole's monthly newspaper column, "Fiscal Watchdog" appears in over 175 newspapers across the country. He is a radio commentator on the series "Perspective on the Economy."

MARSHALL FRITZ, a former IBM computer salesman, is the founder of Self-Government Advocates, located in Fresno, California. Fritz was the Executive Director of the California Libertarian Party. He received his BA in Business Administration from the Cal State University, Fullerton.



LINDA ABRAMS, an attorney, is a member of the Rampart Institute Board. She has worked on several well-known court cases involving violations of the U.S. Constitution by government agencies.


