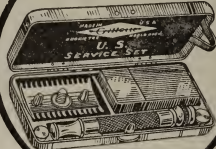

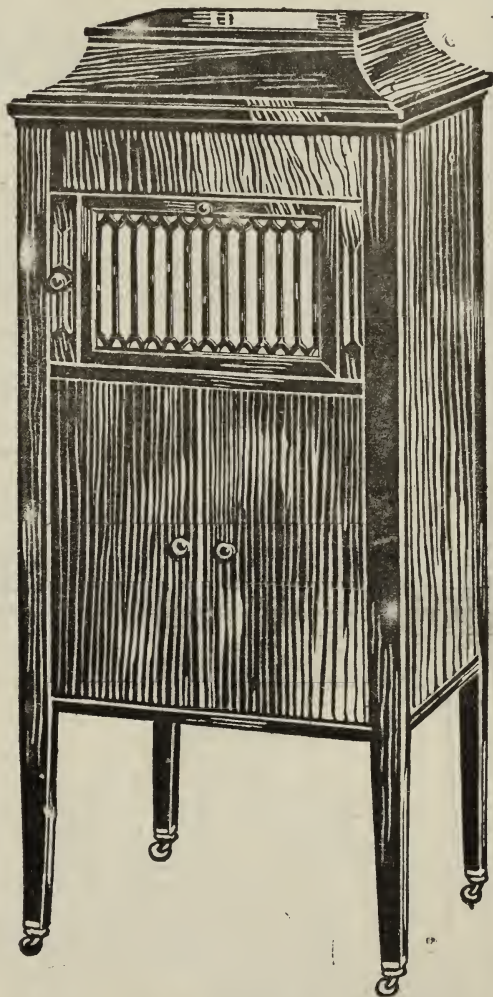
But “The Better ’Ole” is, above all, a rollicking comedy with music running through it and replete with humorous lines, witty songs and pretty women.
