


Accomplished - how?



plan what we'll do: w/ costs, risks, a relative priority, and coherent groupings of proposals


proposals what we might do to advance our goals given what we know right now



Who uses Thanks?

- Across all projects, only **5**% of the editors have sent or received Thanks.
- Active editors use Thanks more frequently.
- Less experienced editors Thank more experienced editors more often (with exceptions such as Norwegian Wikipedia)

Disparity in Thanks

- More experienced editors are Thanked more often.
- The top 20% of the editors in a project can receive 260 times more Thanks than the bottom 20%.

Thanks usage over time

- The usage of Thanks feature has increased over time
- The upward trend exists even for projects in which the total number of editors has decreased.

Thanks and edit activity

Thanked editors consistently have higher edit counts the day after receiving a Thank when compared to their unThanked peers.

Consider ...

- making the feature more easily discoverable by editors.
- giving Thanks. They increase short term edit activity and can act as motivators.


