



Our pilot project is documenting the country's historical markers in Wikidata and Wikimedia Commons, starting with those created by the National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP).



Unfortunately, the NHCP does not maintain a complete nor up-to-date database of its markers.

This means that no import to Wikidata can be done, and every marker is individually researched and confirmed.




To better publicize our historical markers project to the wider public, I developed the Panandâ¹ Android² mobile app and published it in May 2018.



Panandâ is a convenient trip down memory lane.

Aminin bes, you probably didn't know that May is National Heritage Month. To be honest, we didn't know either until we came across this new app called Panandâ. "Marker" in Filipino, the name is apt; it lets you revisit the past via commemorative plaques. You know, those engraved panels by the National Historical Commission of the Philippines at the entrance of landmarks. The ones you pretend to read (again, bes, let's be real) while having someone take a photo for you on IG? You can virtually visit different places in the country, and learn a little bit of history with just a swipe of your fingers. Cool, right?



The app's developer Eugene Alvin Villar created it after working on the [Cultural Heritage Mapping Project](#) and [Encyclopedia of Philippine Heritage](#). His work in these involved mapping historical markers and filling out information in Wikidata. This got him thinking, wouldn't it be great if people cared about those markers? Wouldn't the world be a better place if you included a bit of knowledge to your OOTD pics, and snazzy #ItsMoreFunInThePhilippines posts?

Of course, it doesn't beat being at these places in person. I mean the 37-year-old Villar hopes while you're out there doing just that, you can help improve on Panandâ. (Bes, *mas masaya ang life 'pag may purpose*. Try natin!) The developer is working on features that would allow you to contribute missing photos of markers, add links to Wikipedia articles as well as fiddle around with layout tools. Villar says he and his fellow volunteers also have a [map](#) of cultural and natural heritage sites of the Philippines on hand. Another app is on the way for that. They just need our help.

CORDOVA™

Panandâ is actually a hybrid app—basically just a web app packaged as a mobile app using Apache Cordova.

- ❖ reduces development time
- ❖ cross-platform
- ❖ allows code reuse from the Historical Markers Map

The app is also FOSS (MIT).

Tech challenge: The app's data is not live.

Querying the data live means:

- ❖ Pulling ~0.5MB of compressed JSON every time (which is not friendly for those using mobile data)
- ❖ Incurs too much delay in app startup
- ❖ Data errors in Wikidata may result in poor user experience





Instead, the app is updated every few months with fresh data compiled using a Perl script that queries WDQS.

This script also does some data validation to highlight consistency/schema errors allowing fixes before updates.
