1. Conference was called for the purpose of resolving questions of policy on reimbursement for the use of reparations equipment and/or Japanese buildings and facilities used by the U.S. Forces not wholly in direct support of the Occupation.

2. Col Bradshaw reiterated the basic policy decision that costs above normal TOW operations should be charged to U. S. funds. He emphasized that unavoidable initial expenditures of TOW funds not in support of the Occupation should be held to an absolute minimum inasmuch as TOW funds, once expended, could never be recovered for that fund even though technically offset reimbursement in dollars was subsequently made. Such inability to recoup TOW funds is due to fiscal regulations stemming from the Japanese Constitution.

3. For policy relating to the question at hand, reference was made to paragraph 4 of Real Estate Conference Notes (31 Aug 50) which stated:

a. All categories of real estate (i.e., Japanese Government owned; enemy seized; privately owned enemy seized, etc.) acquired to support the Korean effort, must be paid for from U. S. appropriated dollars.

b. Real estate which was on procurement demand and other real estate under control of the Occupation Forces prior to 25 June 1950, is

considered to be an occupational force requirement notwithstanding additional use thereof.

c. Each parcel of real estate acquired since 25 June 1950 will have to be considered on its merits based on the intended use thereof.

4. It was agreed that unless and until a directive may be received from an appropriately high body, such as the Joint Chiefs of Staff or the Far East Commission, no reimbursement would be made to compensate for the use in Japan of items which had been earmarked for reparations, regardless of whether such items are Japanese Government owned or privately owned, and further regardless of the degree to which such items may be used in support of the Occupation.

5. Mr. Hutchinson raised the question of dollar reimbursement to the Japanese Government for the use of items (non-reparation) which were originally obtained under the TOW program for exclusive use in support of the Occupation but which are presently used partially in support of other than Occupation activities. It was agreed that such reimbursement should be on a proportionate use basis but that the methods of computing such proportionate costs, which was a point of particular interest to Mr. Hutchinson, was the responsibility of JLCOM in coordination with appropriate GHQ staff sections and was not a matter for decision by the conferees.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

1 Sept. 1950

SUBJECT: Occupation Forces Use of Reparations Equipment

1. A meeting was called today by Lt. Col. Aiken, G-4, and attended by representatives of CPC, ESS, Engineers, CAS, and G-4. Discussion covered current procedures and policies governing Occupation Forces use of reparations equipment. Present procedures and policies as stated by G-4 are contained in the following paragraphs.

2. No procurement demand will be issued to cover Occupation Force use of either arsenal or private reparations equipment. This does not necessarily mean however, Lt. Col. Aiken stated, that some other method of payment may not be made at some future date for use in Japan of such equipment in support at Korean operations or for normal occupation duties.

3. Any reparations equipment which is shipped to Korea, whether it be arsenal or private equipment, will be paid for in dollars by the United States Government before the equipment leaves Japan. ESS will coordinate with other agencies to establish a fair price to be paid to the Japanese Government for such equipment.

4. The Occupation Forces recognize the fact that the Japanese economy is being committed more and more heavily to the assistance of our efforts in Korea. Thus, in order to avoid serious damage which might accrue to the economy if reparations machines already in use by the Japanese were taken for use by the Occupation Forces, ESS and CPC will coordinate to check the current use status of all reparations equipment desired for use by the Occupation Forces. That equipment which is in present Japanese use and whose removal from such use would cause undue impact on the Japanese economy, may possibly not be approved for use by the Occupation Forces. ESS will determine the seriousness of the impact. G-4 will continue to review and recommend approval or disapproval for all Occupation Forces requests for use of reparations items. Final approval for use will continue to be given by CPC.

5. Lt. Col. Aiken recognized the difficulty of determining in all cases whether or not requested equipment was to be used by the occupation forces in support of Korean operations. He expressed the thought that it would be desirable for a unit to indicate this fact clearly when making its original approval request for authorized use. ~~He would~~ However no definite decision was reached as to who would inform units that in the future they would be required to state whether equipment was to be used in support of Korean operations or merely for normal occupation duties.

6. The question of what to do about procurement demands which have already been issued to cover Occupation Forces use of private reparations equipment, was discussed. Lt. Col. Aiken said that G-4 would take no action on this problem until it was brought officially to its attention.

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7. Lt. Col. Aiken stated that it was not the desire of GHQ to give wide publicity to the availability of reparations equipment for Occupation Forces field units, since G-4 itself will know which items are most urgently needed and can check with CPC to find where such items under custody for reparations can be found. Field units will be advised, however, that they must clear with Civil Affairs Regions before entering a reparations plant to search for or identify a needed item.
