

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HISTORY OF THE U.S. NAVY IN CHICAGO

The U.S. Navy is proud to partner with the City of Chicago to host the 2017 DoD Warrior Games. Beyond the city's experience hosting large-scale events and extensive sports facilities, Chicago is rich with historic ties to the U.S. Navy dating back to World War I.

Navy Pier

Located along the Lake Michigan shoreline, Navy Pier was originally named Municipal Pier and designed to be a dock for freight and passenger traffic as well as a recreation space for the public. The pier was renamed Navy Pier in 1927 to honor the naval veterans who served in World War I. During World War II, the pier became a key training center for the U.S. Navy.

Throughout World War II, the U.S. Navy operated various training programs at Navy Pier. In 1942, pilot training began at Navy Pier and, eventually, 15,000 pilots were qualified for military service. By the time training ceased in 1946, approximately 60,000 people (including Sailors from Great Britain, Canada, Brazil and Peru) were trained at Navy Pier.

Lake Michigan Flight Training

A little-known chapter of World War II history also took place on Chicago's Lake Michigan. The lake was used to train pilots in taking off and landing on aircraft carriers. The location was ideal for secret training because it is the largest body of water within the contiguous United States. The U.S. Navy did not need to provide destroyer and submarine escorts to ships.

Naval Air Station (NAS) Glenview served as the largest primary training facility for the U.S. Navy during this time, hosting carrier qualification training, a crucial aspect of aviation. Nearly 9,000 aviation cadets received their primary flight training at NAS Glenview. An additional 17,000 pilots were qualified for carrier landings through the Carrier Qualification Training Units.

The U.S. Navy retrofitted two paddle steamers into aircraft carriers, allowing pilots to train for take-off and landing certification on Lake Michigan. By war's end, USS Sable and USS Wolverine had logged over 135,000 landings. Pilots who trained at NAS Glenview served in all theaters of World War II.

Naval Station Great Lakes

Founded in 1905, Naval Station Great Lakes is home to the U.S. Navy's only basic training facility. At the time, the idea was revolutionary, as it was unheard of to have naval training take place more than a thousand miles away from any ocean. Great Lakes opened its doors to the first class of recruits in 1911. Since then, the facility has been focused on its principal mission: supplying the fleet with top-quality, basically trained Sailors. Naval Station Great Lakes is the second largest military installation in Illinois and the largest training station in the U.S. Navy.

2017 DoD Warrior Games

2017 is the first year that the Warrior Games will be held entirely outside a military installation or a U.S. Olympic Committee facility, making the events much more accessible to the public. Hosting the Games in Chicago brings increased exposure and provides new opportunities to display the strength, resilience and dedication of wounded, ill and injured athletes to a wider audience.



STORYOF THE WARRIOR GAMES

Created in 2010, the Warrior Games are an annual Paralympic-style event designed to showcase the resilient spirit of our nation's wounded, ill and injured service members and veterans from all branches of the military. Athletes representing teams from the U.S. Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard and Special Operations Command, the United Kingdom Armed Forces and the Australian Defence Force will compete for gold, silver and bronze medals in eight sporting events. The Warrior Games are an opportunity to demonstrate support to those who sacrificed greatly on behalf of our nation, as well as their families and caregivers.

Teams include active-duty service members and veterans with upper-body, lower-body and spinal cord injuries; traumatic brain injuries; visual impairment; serious illnesses; and post-traumatic stress. They will compete in archery, cycling, field, shooting, sitting volleyball, swimming, track and wheelchair basketball, engaging in friendly competition and experiencing the healing power of sport.

Many of our wounded warriors use adaptive sports and other adaptive reconditioning activities to assist in their overall rehabilitation and overcome the challenges associated with their new condition. Adaptive sports and reconditioning activities enable healing through a holistic approach and provide physical and cognitive activities that inspire physical fitness and encourage new opportunities for growth and achievement. They are proven to have positive and lasting effects, including greater self-esteem, lower stress levels, decreased dependency on pain medication, fewer secondary medical conditions, greater pursuit of higher education, improved employment opportunities and increased independence.

MISSION STATEMENT


The Warrior Games exist to provide an opportunity for athletes to grow physically, mentally and spiritually from the sportsmanship and camaraderie gained by representing their respective service teams in a friendly and spirited competition. It is an opportunity for athletes to showcase their enduring warrior spirit in the presence of their families and a grateful nation.

The Warrior Games represent the culmination of athletes' participation in structured adaptive sports and reconditioning activities throughout recovery and transition. Participation in the Warrior Games allows service members and veterans to build a supportive social network and develop relationships with other athletes with similar disabilities, giving them a sense of community and acceptance on their path to recovery. Additionally, the Games are an opportunity for wounded, ill and injured service members, veterans, families and caregivers to share common experiences and celebrate their accomplishments in overcoming adversity and thriving.

Previously overseen by the U.S. Olympic Committee, the DoD assumed the lead role for organizing the Warrior Games in 2015 to better align the event with the Games' core mission of playing a vital role in recovery for wounded, ill and injured service members and veterans. As the Warrior Games move into their eighth round of competition, the DoD has expanded athlete eligibility, re-emphasized family participation and allowed for greater involvement from the services and their communities.

Each military service hosts the Games on a rotating basis, with the U.S. Navy, in partnership with the City of Chicago, hosting the 2017 DoD Warrior Games for approximately 265 athletes and over 500 family members in Chicago, June 30 - July 8.

2017 marks the first year the Warrior Games will be held entirely outside a military installation or a U.S. Olympic Committee facility. Bringing the Warrior Games to Chicago increases public exposure of the event and provides new opportunities to showcase the strength, resilience and dedication of the participants. With downtown Chicago as the backdrop, the 2017 Games promise to be memorable for the wounded warrior athletes, enjoyable for their caregivers and family members, and inspirational and educational for spectators and other supporters.



THE SPORTS

Warrior Games athletes compete in eight Paralympic-style sports: archery, cycling, field, shooting, sitting volleyball, swimming, track and wheelchair basketball. The sports are adapted in various ways to accommodate a variety of conditions and abilities, from physical injuries, such as amputations and visual impairments, to psychological conditions, such as post-traumatic stress (PTS) and traumatic brain injury (TBI). Below are the disability categories supported by the DoD Warrior Games competition:

- Ataxia: Lack of muscle coordination due to problems with the parts of the central nervous system that control movement and balance. Typical of conditions such as TBI.
- Hypertonia: Abnormal increase in muscle tension with reduced ability of muscles to stretch, joint stiffness, slowness of movement and poor postural adaptation and balance, due to problems in the central nervous system. Typical of conditions such as TBI and stroke.
- Impaired muscle power: Muscles in the limbs or trunk are completely or partially paralyzed as a consequence of conditions such as spinal cord injury.

- Impaired passive range of movement:
 Range of movement in one or more joints is
 permanently reduced due to trauma or illness.
- Intellectual impairment: Limited intellectual functions and adaptive behavior, sometimes resulting from conditions such as PTS and TBI.
- **Limb deficiency:** A total or partial absence of bones or joints as a consequence of trauma or illness such as traumatic amputation.
- Visual impairment: Vision is impacted by either an impairment of the eye structure, optical nerve/pathways or the part of the brain controlling vision.

Wounded, ill and injured service members and veterans qualify for the 2017 DoD Warrior Games by enrolling in their respective Service's wounded warrior program and then participating in structured camps, clinics, trials and daily adaptive sports activities that are executed nationwide with support from the DoD Office of Warrior Care Policy Military Adaptive Sports Program.

Regardless of disability category, all of these first-class athletes will inspire their teammates and supporters as they go for the gold.



THE SPORTS

Warrior Games athletes compete in eight Paralympic-style sports: archery, cycling, field, shooting, sitting volleyball, swimming, track and wheelchair basketball. The following pages detail these events and the rules specific to competition at the Games.



ARCHERY

Archery competitions for those with physical impairments date back to 1948, becoming one of the original Paralympic sports at the Rome 1960 Paralympic Games. Archery is composed of five categories: Individual Compound Open, Individual Compound Visually Impaired (VI), Individual Recurve Open, Team Compound and Team Recurve.* Participants shoot compound and recurve bows from a standing or seated position.

Athletes compete in different classification categories based on functional abilities, including impaired muscle power/range of movement, limb deficiency and visual impairment. VI archers compete in a separate classification than sighted archers. All VI archers wear blindfolds and shoot with a tactile sight. Men and women are combined for all archery events.

*A recurve bow has a distinctive outward curve at the top. A compound bow features mechanical pulleys, telescopic sights and release aids to assist in accuracy. Depending on athlete classification, some competitors use customized release aids using their jaw, chin or teeth.

FUN FACT: Some competition arrows are made of carbon graphite with an inner tube of aluminum, while others are carbon only. These materials allow arrows to be light, stiff and durable during competition.




CYCLING

Visual Impairment cyclists using tandem bicycles led to the development of Paralympic cycling. It was debuted as an event at the 1988 Paralympic Games in Seoul, Korea.

The Warrior Games cycling competition includes handcycle, recumbent, upright and tandem upright bicycles. Competition distances include 10 kilometers, 20 kilometers and 30 kilometers. Distance is based on type of bicycle and athlete classification.

Athletes are assigned classification categories based on functional abilities, including impaired muscle power/range of movement, limb deficiency and visual impairment. Competition classifications are based on the type of bicycle used as well as an athlete's disability.

FUN FACT: Cyclists who have limited use of their lower body use handcycles. Handcycles allow athletes to use their arms to pedal, rather than their legs. Most handcycle athletes compete in a reclined position, while others kneel.





FIELD

Shot put and discus field events have been in the Paralympic program since the first Paralympic Games in Rome in 1960.

Field events include seated shot put, standing shot put, seated discus and standing discus. The weights of the shot put and discus vary for men and women in both the seated and standing events.

Athletes compete in different classification categories based on functional abilities, including impaired muscle power/range of movement, limb deficiency and visual impairment. Athletes with diminished functional ability and/or impaired balance use specialized equipment, such as the field throwing chair.

FUN FACT: For seated events, throwing chairs are staked down using stakes and ratcheted tie-downs.



SHOOTING

Shooting became a medal sport at the 1976 Paralympic Games in Toronto. Competitors use air pistols and air rifles to fire a series of shots at a stationary, electronic target. Shooting categories are air pistol, air rifle (standing) and air rifle (prone), all at a distance of 10 meters.

Athletes compete in different classification categories based on functional abilities, including impaired muscle power/range of movement, limb deficiency and visual impairment (VI). VI shooters compete in a separate classification than sighted shooters.

FUN FACT: The shooting term "flyer" refers to a shot that lands far outside of the target.



SITTING VOLLEYBALL

Sitting volleyball was introduced at the Arnhem Paralympic Games in 1980. A sitting volleyball court is smaller than a standing volleyball court. The dimensions measure 10 meters x 6 meters, and the net is lower to the ground.

Athletes are classified into one of three functional classification categories for team play. A minimum of one maximum disability athlete is required to play at all times. Only two open or minimum disability athletes may compete at any time.

Match winners are determined based on winning two out of three sets. In the first two sets, a team must earn 25 points and have a two-point advantage over its opponent. To win the third set, a team must earn 15 points and have a two-point advantage over its opponent.

FUN FACT: In sitting volleyball, a player must have some part of the upper body (bottom to shoulders) in contact with the floor at the moment of ball contact. A player does not have to be in contact with the floor at all times.



SWIMMING

Swimming has been one of the main sports since the first Paralympic Games in Rome in 1960. Swimming events include the 50-yard freestyle, 100-yard freestyle, 50-yard backstroke and 50-yard breaststroke in both men's and women's categories. There are also two combined 200-yard freestyle relays.

Athletes compete in different classification categories based on functional abilities, including impaired muscle power/range of movement, limb deficiency and visual impairment. The athlete's classification determines the way s/he will start the race: from a dive, seated on the platform or in the water.

FUN FACT: Athletes are "seeded" based on their previous race times, with the higher seeds (faster times) racing in the center lanes of the pool.





TRACK

Paralympic track events debuted during the 1960 Paralympic Games in Rome, Italy.

Track includes races in the standing and wheelchair categories at distances of 100 meters, 200 meters, 400 meters, 800 meters and 1500 meters. There are also mixed category, standing, 4x100-meter relays.

Athletes compete in different classification categories based on functional abilities, including impaired muscle power/range of movement, limb deficiency and visual impairment. Athletes with lower function and/or impaired balance use specialized equipment, such as a wheelchair racing chair.

FUN FACT: VI track athletes use assistance from a sighted guide during their events.



WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL

World War II veterans developed wheelchair basketball in the United States in 1945. The sport made its international debut at the Rome 1960 Paralympic Games. Wheelchair basketball retains most major rules and scoring of basketball, but some rules, such as traveling violations, have been modified with consideration for the wheelchair.

The tournament consists of six 10-player teams. There is a 24-point team limit, meaning that at no time in a game shall a team have players on the court and participating whose total assigned point value exceed the 24-point limit.

Players are assigned a point (classification) from one to six, based on their function in relation to the wheelchair. Players in each point group have different volumes of action; this is what determines the final point value. All women drop one point in combined play.

FUN FACT: To dribble, players must allow for one bounce of the ball for every two pushes of their wheelchair.
