Basic Conditions for Settlement of Sino-Japanese Peace
(As discussed in a conference with Directors of the Military Affairs Bureau and the Naval Affairs Bureau which was held at the Minister's Official Residence, from 2:00 p.m. on September 6, 1941).

The Chungking Government shall join in the Nanking Government, admitting that the Fundamental Treaty concluded between Japan and the Nanking Government, the agreement attached hereto, and the Japan-Manchukuo-China joint Declaration are based on the following principles.

- (1) Joining of the Chiang Regime with the Nanking Government.
- (2) Good neighborliness and intimate friendship.
- (3) Respect of sovereignty and territory.
- (4) Joint defense (cooperation in maintenance of public peace, protection of rights and interests and defense against common menace) For this purpose, Japanese troops shall be stationed especially in Amoy and Hainan Island, as well as in certain districts of Mongolia-Sinkiang Area and North China.
- (5) Evacuation of troops.
The Japanese troops despatched to China on account of the Incident shall evacuate according to the Sino-Japanese agreement upon settlement of the Incident.
- (6) Economic cooperation.
(Note) The economic activities of any third countries, as far as they are based on fairness and justice, shall not be restricted.
- (7) No annexation.
- (8) No reparations.
- (9) Recognition of Manchukuo.
