1. The plant in question is Nippon Tanatsu Kogyo K.K., Plant #5, reparations installation, Air C 32-40.
2. The Sheet Metal Working Shop to where these reparations machinery are to be transferred, is of rigid construction with concrete floor and adequate space to insure safe preservation of these machines.
3. There are about 19 machines and equipment to be transferred.
4. 7 transformers and other electrical equipment not included in par 3, will not be moved.
5. The building where reparations machinery are to be stored will be isolated from rest of the building by a proposed fence, designated by red line on the attached plant layout sheet, to be erected for protection against possible theft or vagaries.
6. Attached petition has been investigated for feasibility and foregoing facts are reported for your information and decision.

1. Made inspection of subject plant for the purpose of determining if land and buildings indicated on the enclosed diagram by red lines, can be released without causing any harm to the maintenance and custody of reparations machines.

2. The subject buildings to be released does not contain any reparations items, and there is of no use to the reparations program.

3. As soon as this petition is approved, the company will build a strong partition in the large building to separate the reparation machines from the rest of the building. Reparations machines are located only in the buildings marked with green lines.

4. Recommend this petition be approved, as buildings and ~~land~~ in question is of no further use to the reparation program. With the reparations machines centralized in two buildings only, the custody and maintenance can be accomplished with better results. Entrance to the reparations area will be separate from the released area, as indicated on attached diagram.

1. Attached herewith is a petition submitted by Nippon Tanatsu Kogyo K.K. No. 5 Plant (32-40) upon the above subject.
2. The Textile Department of the subject plant had been called Nankai Jinken Kogyo K.K. (Nankai Rayon Manufacturing Co.) and had been engaging in manufacturing rayon and silk textile at the subject plant until the plant was forced to offer all the weaving machines amounting to 1916 sets as scrap in compliance with the Enterprise Readjustment Law in 1943.
3. But, the company has lately been authorized by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry to rehabilitate eighty (80) sets of silk and rayon looms, so that the company desires to resume its operation at the subject plant as they did in former times.
4. The subject plant requests to be authorized to move all the reparations machines located in the building enclosed by duplicate red lines in the attached diagram to the section marked by green oblique lines, and to use those sections marked by red oblique lines for the planned operation, and a strong partition reaching to the ceiling will be established between the section marked with green oblique lines and the section marked with red oblique lines in order that no harm may be effected upon those reparations machines.
5. As being the case, and moreover, it is desirable that the rehabilitation of silk and rayon textile industry be accomplished as soon as possible, your favorable consideration for the petition is requested.
6. Besides, it is considered that the portion of buildings marked by red oblique lines and the land thereof are no more necessary for the maintenance and custody of those reparations machines so long as those machines are centralized in the portion of the building marked with green oblique lines and are completely segregated from the other part of the plant, being properly maintained therein, therefore, we entreat you will kindly consider to release those portion of buildings marked with red oblique lines and the land thereof from the reparations control and custody.



A. The necessity of setting up silk & rayon weaving operation

The textile department of Nippon Tanetsu Kogyo K.K., under the formerly name of "The Nankai Rayon Manufacturing Co.," had been well appreciated as worthy of one of the five topnotch manufacturers of the silk & rayon textiles during the war, having 1916 sets of the weaving machines which had been forced to be discarded or looted by the governmental order due to the enactment of Enterprise Reconstruction & Readjustment Law in 1943.

By the recent instruction received from the Ministry of Commerce & Industry 80 sets of silk & rayon looms are being qualified to be restored for the replacement of those had duly been discarded or looted by the aforesaid order, hence the new operation to resume production for silk & rayon textiles has accordingly been authorized to the subject firm.

The summary of set-up thereof is clarified as under specified illustrations, but the buildings to be used for this purpose are circumscribed only to two buildings in Plant No.5 &, moreover, one of which is to be sectionary used for equipping 80 sets of looms together with supplemental preparatory machines & the other of which will be available for arranging materials used for the weaving operations.

E. The preservation way of reparation machines

The not-operating machines in custody belonging to Plant No.5 & 6 & 7 have been perfectly maintained at the one section of the applying building & this time the more precausouse means come to necessary to work out these preservation. The appropriate means come out to be slated for further good maintenance as the under described ways:

1. The perfect cut-off from the weaving operations

In order to fulfull an ample protection of custodial reparation machines from those of dusts,moisture,etc.,the internal of applying building should be manifestory partitioned by setting up wooden wall up to the height of ceiling.

By this partition any troubles will be worked out in any means & both sections will be thoughtly cut-off.

2. To keep the more clear arrangement for gathering each reparation machines

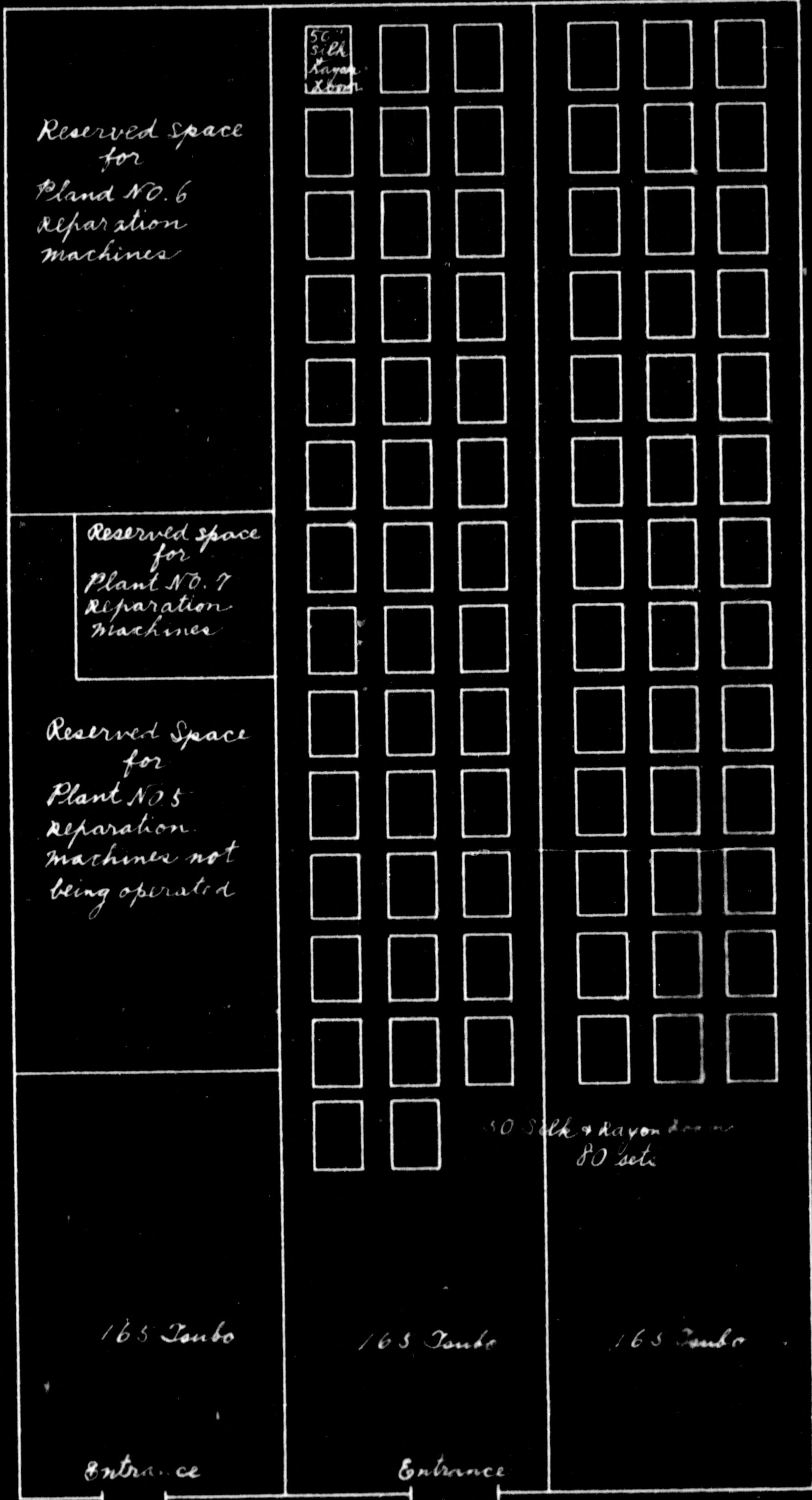
For this purpose the renovation of present occupied spaces is necessary & the new arrangement for spaces to gather reparation machines in one bloc is preparing to cover the more distinctive accomodation as revealed in the appended map.

In both ways it is presmable that the reparation machines will keep on better not less than they are.

F. Conclusion

In the foregoing reasons,we came to submit this application for using item B.area spaces in order to set up those allocated rehabilitate-silk & rayon looms for commencing a weaving operations & the installation of weaving machines will begin from 10th of January on the next year.

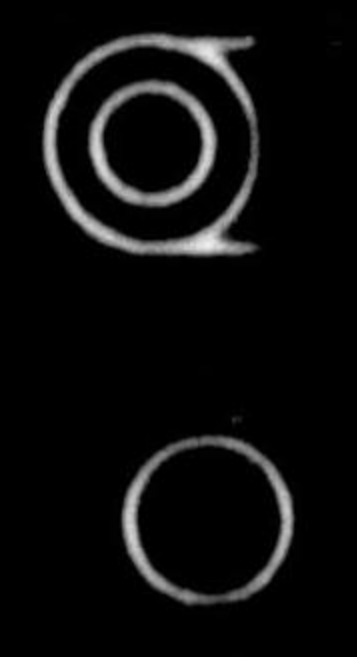
Map for the equipment of silk and rayon looms and for the presentation of reparation machines.

1. The Osaka Mil Govt Team has made a careful review of the history of subject plant and is of the opinion that this facility has been unjustly placed on the reparations list.

should be considered for removal from reparations listing.

2. Established in 1934, the plant was purchased by Nippon Tanatsu Kogyo K.K. in November of 1942 from the Nankai Rayon Textile Company. During the war Nippon Tanatsu Kogyo K.K. manufactured fuel tanks and seats for aircraft. In the opinion the Osaka Mil Govt Team, a fuel tank or a seat can in no way be classified as a piece of combat equipment, as a major fabricated component part, as a sub-accessory, or as a piece of equipment especially designed for use in the products of primary war facilities.

3. At the present time, the No. 5 Plant is engaged in the production of textile equipment and of household utensils; 35 to 40, of a total of 45 machines inventoried, are in use. Plant officials appear capable of utilizing the equipment to the best possible advantage. There are 137 employees who derive their living from the plant in the small town of Kishiwada. An unemployment problem would arise should this plant be removed to satisfy reparations claims,

4. It is recommended that the No. 5 Plant of Nippon Tanatsu Kogyo K.K. be removed from reparations listing without further delay.

1. During the war, Plant No. 2 was engaged in stamping small parts for aircraft. These small parts, consisting of joints, brackets, etc., cannot reasonably be classified as combat equipment, as major fabricated component parts, as sub-accessories, or as items of equipment especially designed for use in the products of primary war facilities.

2. Present production of the No. 2 plant consists of stamping small parts for bicycles, of manufacturing hand tools, and of producing towel weaving machines. There are a total of 30 machines at the plant of which 15 are Class 1, 12 are Class 2, and 3 are Class 3. All of these machines are fairly old.

3. Eighty-two (82) people are employed at the plant; while this is not a large amount of workers, there are very few factories in the town of Kishiwada to absorb the employees should the machines be removed to satisfy reparations claims. All but six (6) of the machines are in active operation; plant officials appear capable of utilizing these machines to the best possible advantage.

4. Recommend immediate release from reparations listing for the reasons given above.
