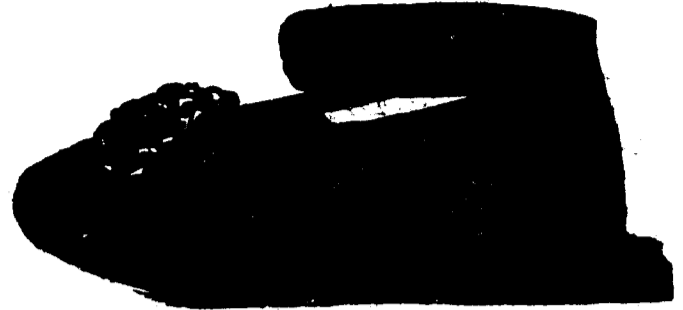

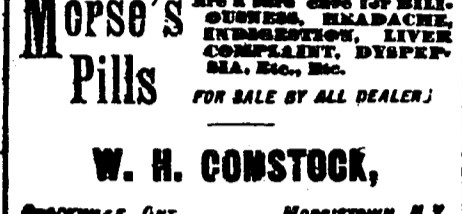

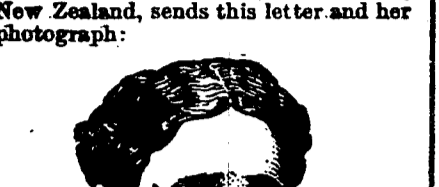

The Charge of Embracery.

In the Resident Magistrate's Court at Port Maria on Wednesday, E. T. Beckford was charged with embracery.

The first witness called was Herbert Theodore Thomas, who said: I am inpector of Police for the parish of St. Mary. As such it was my duty to cause all jurors to be warned for the Circuit Court for the parish. The document now shown to me is the "panel" which reached me by post in a day in October.

Mr. Pickwick objected to the witness saying "This is a panel."

Continuing, witness said: It was then blank, only filled up in the first three columns.

Mr. Pickwick again objected. Witness: I did not see these columns filled up. After reading the paper in my office, I signed and issued a notice to Walter Webster at Oracabessa. It was a summons to attend to serve as a juror.

Mr. Pickwick objected, saying the document spoke for itself. Witness continued: It was posted to the corporal in charge of Oracabessa police station. The first document purports to be a list of names of persons whom I directed should be warned to attend at the Circuit Court. On this list the name of Walter Webster was written. I know the de- fendant's writing is familiar. It was in his writing in my opinion, and his signature, which I have seen him write. I know Walter Webster. I saw him on the 5th November. I heard him swear in open court as a juror. He sat on the jury in the Annotto Bay poisoning case. I know Edgar Arthur Abolom. He was tried in the same sitting of the Circuit Court charged with forging and uttering forged documents. He was convicted. Arthur Webster was called on his jury, and went in the box and took his place, but when he came to the book to be sworn he was challenged by the counsel for the defence, and he stood aside and left the box.

Cross examined by Mr. Pickwick: I have seen defendant write in my office after his arrest. I think was the 31st October. He wrote letters to two friends of his.

Horatio Packer said: I am a corporal stationed at Oracabessa. I know Walter Webster. I served him with a notice on the 5th October.

Walter Joseph Webster said: I am commonly known as Walter Webster. I received a summons on a Friday from Corporal Packer.

The Resident Magistrate asked Mr. Pickwick: What do you say to this?

Mr. Pickwick replied: I say nothing. Witness: I first gave this document to Herbert Theodore Thomas in his office at Port Maria on the 31st October. I attended the Circuit Court on 5th November. I served as a juror up to the 7th instant. I was about to take the oath in Abolom's case. I was challenged and stood down. The letter marked "C" was received by me on 12th October, after I got this document "B" received the letter through the post at Oracabessa, along with other letters. The writing and signature is that of defendant. I was acquainted with him before, and have seen him write in my office on occasion. I read the letter and kept it until the 13th October, when the Sergeant Major and the assistant Clerk of the Court came to me. I had a talk with him, and handed the letter to the assistant clerk of the court in the presence of the Sergeant Major. I received another letter from the defendant.

By the Court: The visit of the Sergeant Major happened before the receipt of the second letter. After the receipt of this letter I mentioned to my brother Hubert Webster that I received a letter from a person in Port Maria.

Herbert Theodore Thomas, recalled, said: The document now shown me bears the signature of O'Connor de Cordova, Registrar of the Supreme Court of Jamaica.

Mr. D. A. Tucker, questioned by the Resident Magistrate, said: I was clerk of the Circuit Court held at Port Maria on the 5th day of November, and I produce documents received by me on the 5th of November, under the name of O'Connor de Cordova, Registrar of the Supreme Court at Port Maria. One purports to be signed by O'Connor de Cordova, Registrar, and on each is signed by Inspector General, E. F. Wright.

Cross examined: I have never seen Mr. de Cordova. I have never seen Mr. Wright.

Mr. Pickwick objected to the re- ception of a certain document tendered by the Clerk of the Court on the ground that there was no evidence to show that the names of people contained in the document were the same as those in the jury list.

The Resident Magistrate ruled that document must be admitted.

Mr. D. A. Tucker testified: I produce the jury list for 1900. This I kept in my custody pursuant to law.

Cross-examined: This is a copy of the jury list with the seal of the Supreme Court on it.

The document was tendered in evidence.

Mr. Pickwick objected that it was only a copy and not the original. The Resident Magistrate admitted the document which was marked "E".

The case closed at 4 p.m.

Mr. Pickwick addressed the Court from 4 p.m. to 5:20 p.m. making an eloquent address and quoting several authorities. The Court adjourned to the 19th inst., when Mr. Pickwick will resume his arguments.

Army Reform Scheme.

REALISTIC FIELD FIRING PRACTICE. The nature of the work which the Regulations will be revised under the new scheme of Army reform has now been practically decided upon.

Of course, soldiers will still have to keep their barracks rooms and their personal belongings in order, but in future ex-soldiers will not see mess water, or their own mess, and perform other duties which are not necessary in the training of the modern soldier.

In regard to munitions training it is certain that the black cartridge will be less used than hitherto. It is also intended to carry out the order to give the new scheme recently acquired by the War Office.

Already the War Office has obtained powers to close any public roads or foot- paths on any part of the country, by giving notice to the owners, in order that field firing with ball cartridge may be carried out.
