10 tomorrow (Monday morning) do

I hope to summer here to arrange
for a good drive with you -

you to come here - consulting
your wishes and convenience
in all things - I saw Mr.
Bright this morning - and told
him you were here - I came
up from Cardiff by the Great
Western last Wednesday -
I am greatly annoyed by
