  - c. Personnel without regard to time limitation para a above.
5. Direct coordination with COMNAV Marianas and CG 20th BOMB WING on provision of support to residual Army and Air Force elements is authorized in the fabrication of this plan.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

Subject: Placing MARBO on an Austerity Basis

1. On 12 Jul 50 CINCFE dispatched to Washington msg CX 57693 which requested units required from the ZI to support the activities of CINCFE. On 13 Jul 50 a supplemental list was sent in msg CX 57741. In the development of these lists it became apparent that within MARBO there were units and individuals that were in urgent demand elsewhere within the FEC. On 8 Jul 50, G-4 procured from the AG a MRU status report of the personnel and units within MARBO in a break-down by unit, by MOS, by grade spread. This status report indicated that on 31 May 1950 there were 336 officers and 3707 EM within MARBO. Placing MARBO on an austerity status would release a large number of these units and personnel for re-assignment elsewhere within the FEC.
2. CG FEAF (Col R. C. Heflebower) and Chiefs of all Technical Services GHQ concur in the opinion of G-4.
3. It was felt that successive steps in procuring the use of these personnel should be followed:
  - a. CG MARBO to place <sup>FOR</sup> his command on an austerity status.
  - b. CINCFE to review his plan and concurrently with review make determination as to the disposition of equipment, stocks, supplies, personnel, and units.
  - c. CINCFE upon achieving a firm plan to ask DA for approval of the action.
  - d. Upon receipt of DA approval, CINCFE to direct CG MARBO to place his command on an austerity status as approved by DA. This message is the first step required, that is, to require CG MARBO to prepare a plan for placing his command on an austerity status.
4. Instant C/N is self-explanatory.
5. Within established policy and is acceleration of ~~concurrent~~ directive.
6. Initiated action completed.

SUBJECT: Close Out of Army Forces on Guam

TO: Commanding General  
Marianas-Bonins Command  
APO 246

1. The Department of the Army has approved the recommendations of the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, that the Army garrison on Guam be eliminated not later than 31 December 1951. These recommendations were submitted to the Department of the Army by the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, in staff study, Requirements for Army Forces on Guam, Inclosure No. 1. The Department of the Army's directive governing preparation of a detailed plan for the elimination of the Army garrison on Guam is contained in Department of the Army letter, AGAO-S 323.31 (15 May 50)G4, subject, Reduction of Army Activities - Guam, 18 May 1950 (Inclosure 2).

2. It is desired that the Commanding General, Marianas-Bonins Command, in collaboration with the Commanding General, 19th Bomb Wing prepare the required plan, coordinating it with Commander, Naval Forces, Marianas, where applicable. The Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, and Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, are advising the Commanding General, 19th Bomb Wing, and Commander, Naval Forces, Marianas, by separate communication in the matter. The plan will be submitted to reach the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, with copy to Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, by 15 July 1950. Necessary coordination with the Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, will be accomplished by General Headquarters.

3. In the preparation of the plan, prior to final approval by the Commanding General, Marianas-Bonins Command, contact by staff officer and technical sections, Marianas-Bonins Command, with corresponding personnel in General Headquarters is authorized in connection with development of framework of the plan and to assure that all needed information is contained therein. If desired by the Commanding General, Marianas-Bonins Command, a conference in Tokyo will be arranged.

4. Disposition of excess supplies in connection with the plan is currently underway and will be continued, subject to adjustment of retention levels to reduce levels of supply for the Army garrison to that amount which will be consumed by 31 December 1951. Stocks excess to Army requirements may be transferred to the Air Force and Navy under provision of paragraph 26a, Special Regulations 755-60-5.

5. Limiting dates governing preparation of the close out plan are as follows:

- a. 1 July 1951 - except for stocks required in support of residual Army units, disposition of depot stocks will be completed.
- b. 31 December 1951 - final close out of Army Forces on Guam.

6. Data contained in staff study forwarded herewith are furnished for appropriate use in development of the plan. Two copies of Operations Instructions No. 8, General Headquarters, used to close out Army Forces in the Philippines are inclosed for information as to type of data required in the plan.

7. The disposition of Army Troop Basis spaces, as well as individuals, rendered surplus by the close out of Army activities on Guam, will be the subject of subsequent directive, based upon instructions issued by the Department of the Army.

8. With the close out of the Marianas-Bonins Command, no joint Army-Air Force command in the Marianas will exist. The Air Force commander will be under the Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, for all matters except that the Commander, Naval Forces, Marianas, will continue to exercise joint command in event of local attack as set forth in Operations Instructions No. 6, General Headquarters.

9. Data to be included in the close out plan, in addition to that required by the Department of the Army letter of 18 May (Inclosure 2) are contained in Inclosure 3 hereto.

Subject: Close-out of Saipan

1. CINCFE Msg C 56567, 10 Jun 50, directed that all Army close-out activities on Saipan including clearance of the Saipan ammunition area be completed not later than 1 Dec 50. MARBO Msg S 9900, 14 Jun 50, advised that Saipan close-out "may be possible" by 1 Dec 50 if explosives previously requested were received.

2. MARBO had previously requested 200 tons of demolitions. 50 tons of demolitions were shipped by 8th Army and MARBO advised that no more demolitions were available in the FEC and ~~the~~ requisition on San Francisco Port of Embarkation. San Francisco PE advised that USARPAC had reported surplus demolitions in Hawaii and suggested that MARBO request shipment from USARPAC.

3. CINCFE Msg C 56681, 17 Jun 50, advised MARBO of necessity to close-out Saipan by 1 Dec 50 and requested advice of action taken to obtain the additional demolitions required. Basic Msg S 9905, 20 Jun 50, from MARBO advises that close-out date of 1 Dec 50 is "noted"; and that USARPAC was requested on 19 Jun 50 to ship explosives to MARBO.

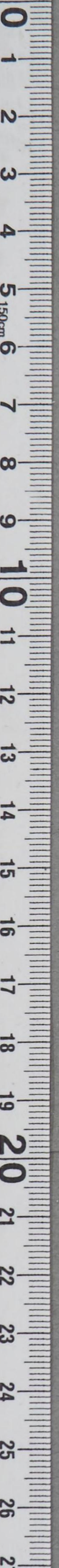

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. Basic msg from MARBO points out that closeout of Saipan "May be possible" by 1 Dec 50 if requested explosives received.
2. MARBO Msg C-23578, 10 Jun 50, requested 300 tons of block demolitions and 20 feet of prima cord. CINCEN Msg ZX-48133, 14 Jun 50, advised that 50 tons of demolition blocks and 20 feet of prima cord were shipped 31 May. Msg pointed out that additional quantities of demolitions requested not available within FEC and suggested MARBO requisition from ZI via telecon to SEPE. It appears that CINCEN Msg ZX-48133 was not received by MARBO prior to the dispatch of their message S-9900. SEPE by Msg TCSEF-7162-GO (S) ORD, referred to CINCEN Msg ZX-48133 and advised that USARPAC forecast shows excess demolitions on hand that command approximately 311 short tons, and suggests that MARBO contact USARPAC directly reference transfer of this stock to Guam.
3. Until CG, MARBO, investigates the possibility of getting required demolitions from USARPAC, no action is required by CINCEN. It is felt, however, that CG, MARBO, should be reminded that closeout by 1 Dec 50 as directed in CINCEN Msg C-56567, 10 Jun 50, is necessary.

1. The Department of the Army has approved the recommendations of the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, that the Army garrison on Guam be eliminated not later than 31 December 1951. These recommendations were submitted to the Department of the Army by the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, in staff study, Requirements for Army Forces on Guam, Inclosure No. 1. The Department of the Army's directive governing preparation of a detailed plan for the elimination of the Army garrison on Guam is contained in Department of the Army letter, AGAO-S 323.31 (15 May 50)G4, subject, Reduction of Army Activities - Guam, 18 May 1950 (Inclosure 2).

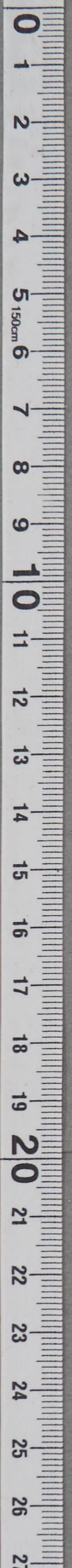
2. It is desired that the Commanding General, Marianas-Bonins Command, in collaboration with the Commanding General, 19th Bomb Wing prepare the required plan, coordinating it with Commander, Naval Forces, Marianas, where applicable. The Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, and Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, are advising the Commanding General, 19th Bomb Wing, and Commander, Naval Forces, Marianas, by separate communication in the matter. The plan will be submitted to reach the Commander-in-Chief, Far East, with copy to Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, by 15 July 1950. Necessary coordination with the Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, will be accomplished by General Headquarters.

3. In the preparation of the plan, prior to final approval by the Commanding General, Marianas-Bonins Command, contact by staff officer and technical sections, Marianas-Bonins Command, with corresponding personnel in General Headquarters is authorized in connection with development of framework of the plan and to assure that all needed information is contained therein. If desired by the Commanding General, Marianas-Bonins Command, a conference in Tokyo will be arranged.

4. Disposition of excess supplies in connection with the plan is currently underway and will be continued, subject to adjustment of retention levels to reduce levels of supply for the Army garrison to that amount which will be consumed by 31 December 1951. Stocks excess to Army requirements may be transferred to the Air Force and Navy under provision of paragraph 26a, Special Regulations 755-60-5.

5. Limiting dates governing preparation of the close out plan are as follows:

a. 1 July 1951 - except for stocks required in support of residual Army units, disposition of depot stocks will be completed.

b. 31 December 1951 - final close out of Army Forces on Guam.

6. Data contained in staff study forwarded herewith are furnished for appropriate use in development of the plan. Two copies of Operations Instructions No. 8, General Headquarters, used to close out Army Forces in the Philippines are inclosed for information as to type of data required in the plan.

7. The disposition of Army Troop Basis spaces, as well as individuals, rendered surplus by the close out of Army activities on Guam, will be the subject of subsequent directive, based upon instructions issued by the Department of the Army.

8. With the close out of the Marianas-Bonins Command, no joint Army-Air Force command in the Marianas will exist. The Air Force commander will be under the Commanding General, Far East Air Forces, for all matters except that the Commander, Naval Forces, Marianas, will continue to exercise joint command in event of local attack as set forth in Operations Instructions No. 6, General Headquarters.

9. Data to be included in the close out plan, in addition to that required by the Department of the Army letter of 18 May (Inclosure 2) are contained in Inclosure 3 hereto.

1. DA in ltr of 18 May, subject as above (Tab C) requests the preparation of a detailed plan for the elimination of the Army Garrison on Guam and asks that DA be advised as to probable transmittal date of such a plan. Ltr states that it is the ltr referred to in W-82664, 5 May 50 (Tab D) which msg transmitted DA approval of CINCFE recommendation that the Army garrison on Guam be closed out not later than 31 Dec 51. Ltr requires complete coordination by the Far East Command of the detailed plan with Navy and Air Force field commanders. The ltr incloses a list of data to be included in the plan. It should be noted that the ltr states that: "Disposition of Army Troop Basis spaces made surplus by this action, namely those not required for the establishment of the signal maintenance facility in RYCOM and for the above base level service support of the USAF and/or Navy, will be subject to forthcoming instructions by the Department of the Army."

2. Based on CINCFE staff study submitted to DA (Tab E) limiting dates governing the close out are 1 July 1951 for completion of supply roll-up and 31 Dec 51 as the latest date for final close out of Army forces on Guam. The current status of supply roll-up is such that 1 July 51 date should be met without difficulty. While part of the close out plan, the supply roll-up has been a current operation since September 1949, minor modification will be required to adjust retention levels to reduce stocks held for the Army garrison to that amount which will be consumed by 31 Dec 1951.

3. Advanced status of supply disposition is recognized by DA in that data required by DA is concerned with transfer of service support, disposition of installations and any problems of joint agreements and responsibilities.

4. Considering the detail required by DA, the geographical separation of the commands concerned, the necessity for CINCFE coordination with CINCPACFLT, and that final DA approval of plan by 1 Apr 51 will suffice to effect timely implementation, a proposed time schedule for preparation of the plan (Tab B) with scheduled date for submission to DA by 1 Sept 1950 and reported date of 15 September 50 has been developed.

5. Recommend that attached draft directive to CG MARBO for preparation of close out plan (Tab A), together with proposed planning schedule (Tab B) be approved as a basis for coordinating the matter with CINCPACFLT and CG FEAF during the forthcoming visit of Admiral Radford and staff to Tokyo.

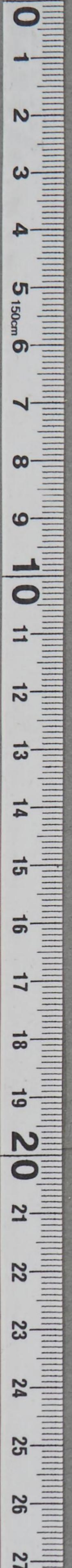

Reference is made to (1) your letter dated June 27, 1949, concerning the proposed transfer of administrative civil responsibility for Guam and requesting early determination of the total land requirements for the Department of the Army, and, (2) the Memorandum from the Acting Secretary of the Navy, dated August 6, 1949, which requests approval of the areas on Guam proposed for acquisition for the Department of the Army.

The Department of the Army desires acquisition and jurisdiction of the following areas of land on the Island of Guam, identified and delineated on the accompanying map entitled "Land Acquisition for the Armed Forces as of 1 May 1949", Y&D Dwg, 475714, and enumerated as follows: Plots Nos. 47 and 48, AVGAS Tank Farms; Plot No. 60, Wettengel Junction Area; Plot No. 66, Marbo Area; Plot No. 71, AGAFO GUMAS Housing Area; Plot No. 78, Tumon Bay Recreation Area (joint use, Army and Air Force); Plot No. 67, Mount Santa Rosa Radio Transmitter Site; and Plot No. 88, Sewage Disposal Plant Site. In addition, jurisdiction is desired for Plot No. 56, Tumon Bay Well Area, and Plot No. 82, Mount Santa Rosa Reservoir Area for which acquisition has heretofore been completed. These areas and certain rights-of-way are shown in detail on Inclosures B through H. In addition, certain rights-of-way for access roads, signal communications, and utilities may be required over private and public lands and along established highways, which should be determined by the Field Commander and need not be furnished to this Department for approval.

The Department of the Army desires to retain use of facilities presently located, through local agreement, on Naval lands in the port area and the Signal Corps portion of Plots Numbers 15 and 16, designated as joint areas under Naval jurisdiction. Additional portions of Naval lands may be required if, by decision of the Joint Chiefs of Staff or through local agreement, the Army is required to implement total land transportation responsibilities on Guam.

In the assignment of lands on Guam certain areas are designated for joint use and under Naval jurisdiction. It is requested that no material change be made in the extent of those joint areas without reference to the Department of the Army.

2 1. Subsequent to preparation of C/N 1 and while concurrences thereto were being obtained, the following pertinent actions were undertaken by G-4:

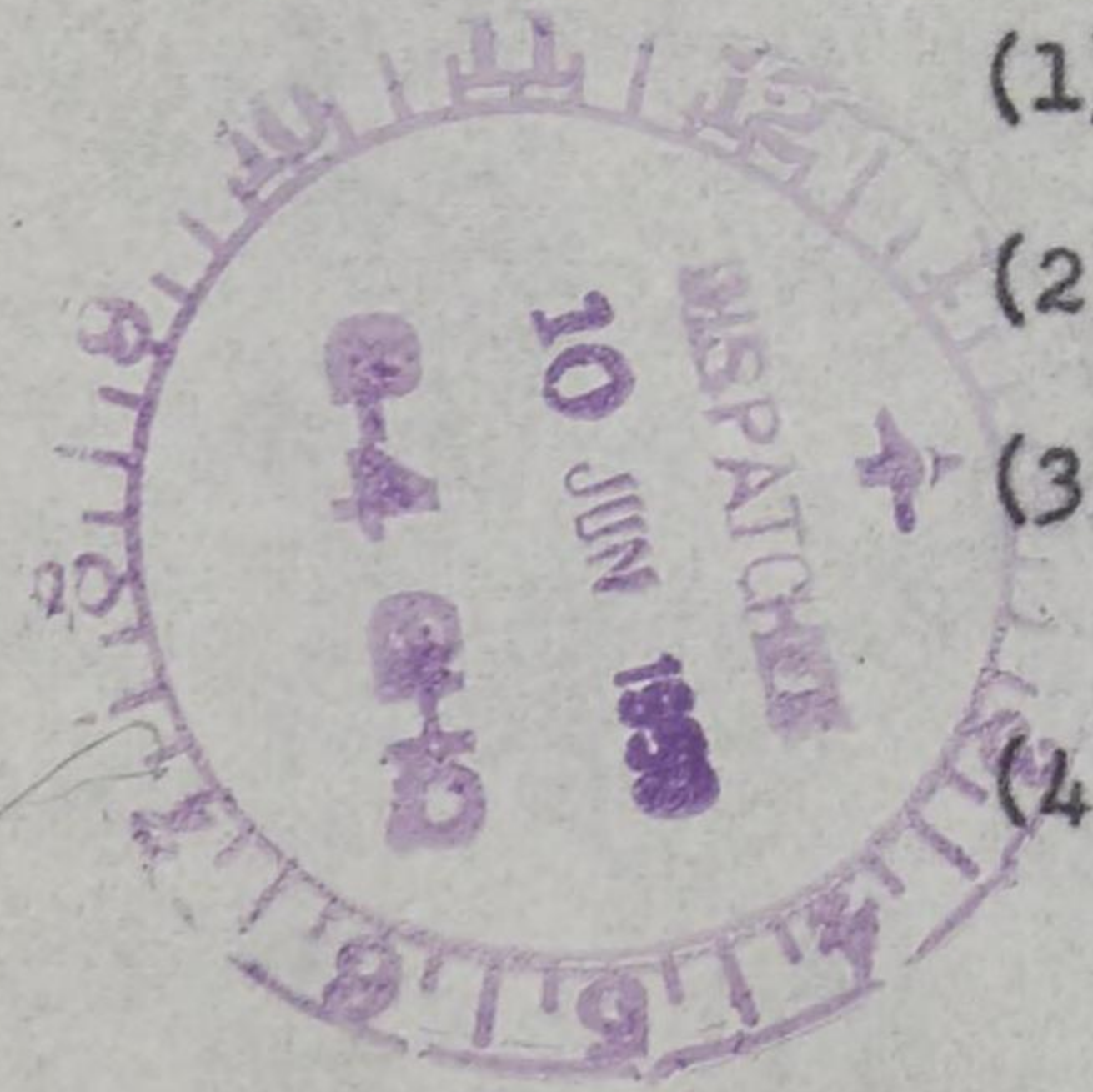

1. DA in ltr of 18 May, subject as above (Tab C) requests the preparation of a detailed plan for the elimination of the Army Garrison on Guam and asks that DA be advised as to probable transmittal date of such a plan. Ltr states that it is the ltr referred to in W-82664, 5 May 50 (Tab D) which msg transmitted DA approval of CINCFE recommendation that the Army garrison on Guam be closed out not later than 31 Dec 51. Ltr requires complete coordination by the Far East Command of the detailed plan with Navy and Air Force field commanders. The ltr incloses a list of data to be included in the plan. SUBJECT: Reduction of Army Activities - Guam

1. Reference is made to 1st Indorsement, GHQ FEC, dated 2 March 1950, subject as above, by which staff study, subject, "Requirements for Army Forces on Guam," was transmitted to the Department of the Army.

2. This is the letter referred to in DA radio WAR 82664, 5 May 1950.


3. The Chief of Staff, USA, has approved the recommendations contained in Section IV of the staff study referred to in paragraph 1 above. It is desired that a detailed plan for the elimination of the Army garrison on Guam be prepared as soon as practicable, and that this headquarters be advised of the probable transmittal date of the detailed plan. Data in this plan should include but not necessarily be limited to that described in Inclosure 1.

4. Formal coordination of the Army decision with the Air Force, Navy, and JCS will not be undertaken until the detailed plan is received, inasmuch as comprehensive data required for complete coordination with these agencies will not be available until the detailed plan is received. The Departments of the Navy and the Air Force, however, have been given information copies of this letter and the staff study referred to in paragraph 1 above. Complete coordination by the Far East Command of the detailed plan with Navy and Air Force field commanders should be effected.

5. Disposition of Army Troop Basis spaces made surplus by this action, namely those not required for the establishment of the signal maintenance facility in KYCQI and for the above base level service support of the USAF and/or the Navy, will be subject to forthcoming instructions by the Department of the Army.

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DATA TO BE INCLUDED IN DETAILED PLAN

1. The recommended phase down of officer, FMO, WO, and enlisted strengths for the periods: 1 July 1950-31 December 1950; 1 January 1951-30 June 1951; and 1 July 1951-31 December 1951.
2. A detailed analysis of the question of transferring responsibility for logistic support now furnished by the Army to the Navy and/or Air Force. This should include a general statement of the individual activities involved, recommendations as to whether the Navy or Air Force should perform these functions and a statement as to civilian and/or military spaces, together with their grades and ratings, which the Department of the Army is using for each such function.
3. A tabulation and discussion of specific signal communications functions and responsibilities now assigned to the Army by JCS agreements and which must be assumed by the Navy and/or Air Force.
4. Specific recommendations as to disposition of all existing Army controlled facilities. In this connection it should be noted that the Army continues to have a requirement for facilities needed to permit a rapid wartime expansion of Army staff and service support troops on Guam to approximately 3,000 (see FEOP 1-50). In addition it may be necessary to redeploy Army troops to Guam during peacetime. Therefore, it is desired that any facilities needed for the wartime deployment and which are required by the other Services for peacetime operations, be utilized by them on a revocable permit basis (revocable either in peacetime or wartime).

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
