6. The local prefectural authorities (paragraph 5c of reference 1) makes the following estimate of prefectural stocks:

- a. Scrap Iron 8,122.28 tons
- b. Scrap steel 16,325.5 tons

7. In the Operational Directive 27 inventories made in April scrap reported was:

- a. Scrap iron 3,640 tons
- b. Scrap steel 16,132 tons

8. Inasmuch as stocks of scrap less the five tons were not reportable under the Operational Directive 27 inventory it is assumed that many small lots were not accounted for. Further, the prefectural figures (6.a, 6.b.) are derived from reports of various kumiai and also include stocks formerly under custody of the Arms Disposal Commission.

9. It is the opinion of this Headquarters that the estimate of the local prefectural government (paragraph 6) is more accurate than the survey report (paragraph 5).

2. Mr. Irving W. Snyder, CAF-15, Petroleum Advisory Board, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, has been authorized to inspect property of the Standard Vacuum Oil Company in Shizuoka City on 12 July 1948. He will be accompanied by Mr. Michael Apar, CAF-11, Civil Property Custodian Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and Mr. Erick Fessel, United States Reparations and Restitution Delegation.

3. It is desired that a representative of the Shizuoka Military Government Team accompany the individuals named in paragraph 2 above during these inspections and that rations, billets, and transportation be furnished. Mr. Snyder will notify the Shizuoka Military Government Team prior to the time of arrival of the estimated time of arrival, communications permitting.

4. If inspections disclose that the Japanese Government is failing to perform minimum maintenance necessary to prevent deterioration of property inspected, action will be taken under the operational directives listed in paragraph 1 above to direct the local Japanese prefectural government to properly discharge its responsibilities.

1. References:

a. Operational Directive 48/2 for 1947, this Headquarters, 31 March 1948, subject: "Surveillance of Preservation and Protection of Property of United Nations Nationals."

b. Paragraph f, Annex D-1 to Military Government Activities Report (Reports Control Symbol MG-11 (E-1)) from your headquarters for the period ending 31 March 1948.

2. It is noted from reference 1b above that the Japanese prefectural government has not made the necessary repairs to United Nations nationals' property under the provisions of SCAPIN 1370 because of their inability to secure sufficient materials.

3. Reference 1a above requires that where full allotment of material required by prefectural governments is not available, priority be given to properties of United Nations nationals which require urgent preservation and maintenance attention.

4. It is desired that continued surveillance of this program under provisions of Operational Directive 48, 9 June 1947, and Operational Directive 48/2 for 1947, 31 March 1948, be maintained to assure that the Japanese Government discharges its responsibility and that materials allotted by the Economic Stabilization Board for maintenance of United Nations Nationals' property are utilized for the purpose for which they are allotted.

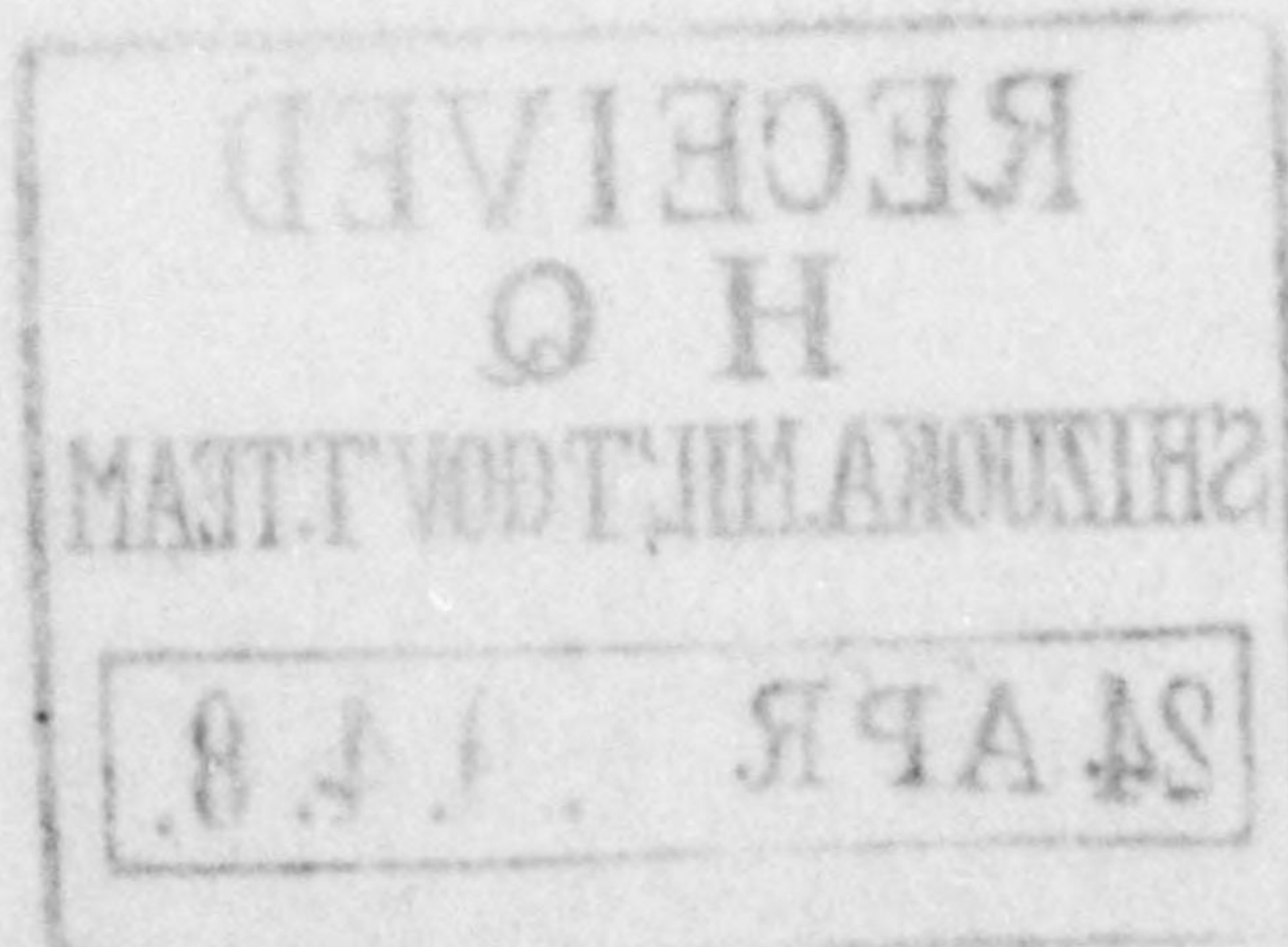
SUBJECT: Wind Tunnels

1. Reference is made to sub-paragraph 9e of Operational Directive 21, dated 30 March 1948.
2. All wind tunnels in Japan having a Mach number of .75 or more and a throat diameter of 48 inches or more or those with a Mach number greater than 1.0 irrespective of throat diameter are hereby declared to be special purpose equipment, functionally limited to use in connection with combat equipment products and are to be destroyed in accordance with instructions contained in paragraph 9, Operational Directive 21, except that destruction need not be completed by 21 April 1948, but will be accomplished without delay and with reasonable facility.
3. The Mach number of a wind tunnel is the ratio of the wind velocity in the tunnel to the velocity of sound in the tunnel under the same conditions of temperature, pressure and air density. A Mach number of one (1) means that the maximum wind speed in the tunnel is approximately 1170 feet per second.
4. Disposition of wind tunnels not meeting criteria established in paragraph 2 above will be the subject of instructions which will be issued in the near future.

2. Paragraph 1 is amended to read:

"Pending revision of Operational Directive 5, as amended, arsenals, laboratories, aircraft factories and privately-owned munitions plants under custody for reparations will be inspected to identify specific items of machinery and equipment authorized for use by proper authority and currently necessary to support permitted operations. Items in use only for custody and maintenance purposes are not considered to be in the above category. Items which are impractical to mark will be listed for record. This list may include such items as furniture, hand tools, accessories and expendable supplies not subject to release as raw materials (cutting tools, grinding wheels, etc.)."


## 1. References:

2. As a general policy, anchor bolts and similar anchoring devices imbedded in concrete or other foundation material will not be removed where destruction of foundation is necessary for their removal. Base plates and levelling wedges will, however, be removed for shipment.

3. If, in the implementation of the policy expressed in paragraph 2 above, an objection on the part of the recipient nation's engineer arises, it is emphasized that the recipient nation's engineer is not vested with any operating authority and that the latter's objection must be channeled through the local representative of the Commanding General, Eighth Army, for decision and not direct to the Japanese Government or its representatives.

Reagent chemicals, laboratory glassware, and scrap laboratory apparatus, not suitable for reparations claims, but presently held in custody in Army and Navy arsenals and research laboratories listed for reparations claims, but excluding those in authorized use, are deteriorating rapidly while simultaneously there exists an extreme shortage of such materials available to the Japanese for essential research and technical instruction.

3. Headquarters Eighth Army has advised this headquarters that release of all reagent chemicals, laboratory glassware, and scrap laboratory apparatus, in Army and Naval arsenals and research laboratories, listed for reparations claims, will be made upon receipt of application from Japanese government. The release will be made to the Construction Board (Kensetsu-In) of the Japanese government.



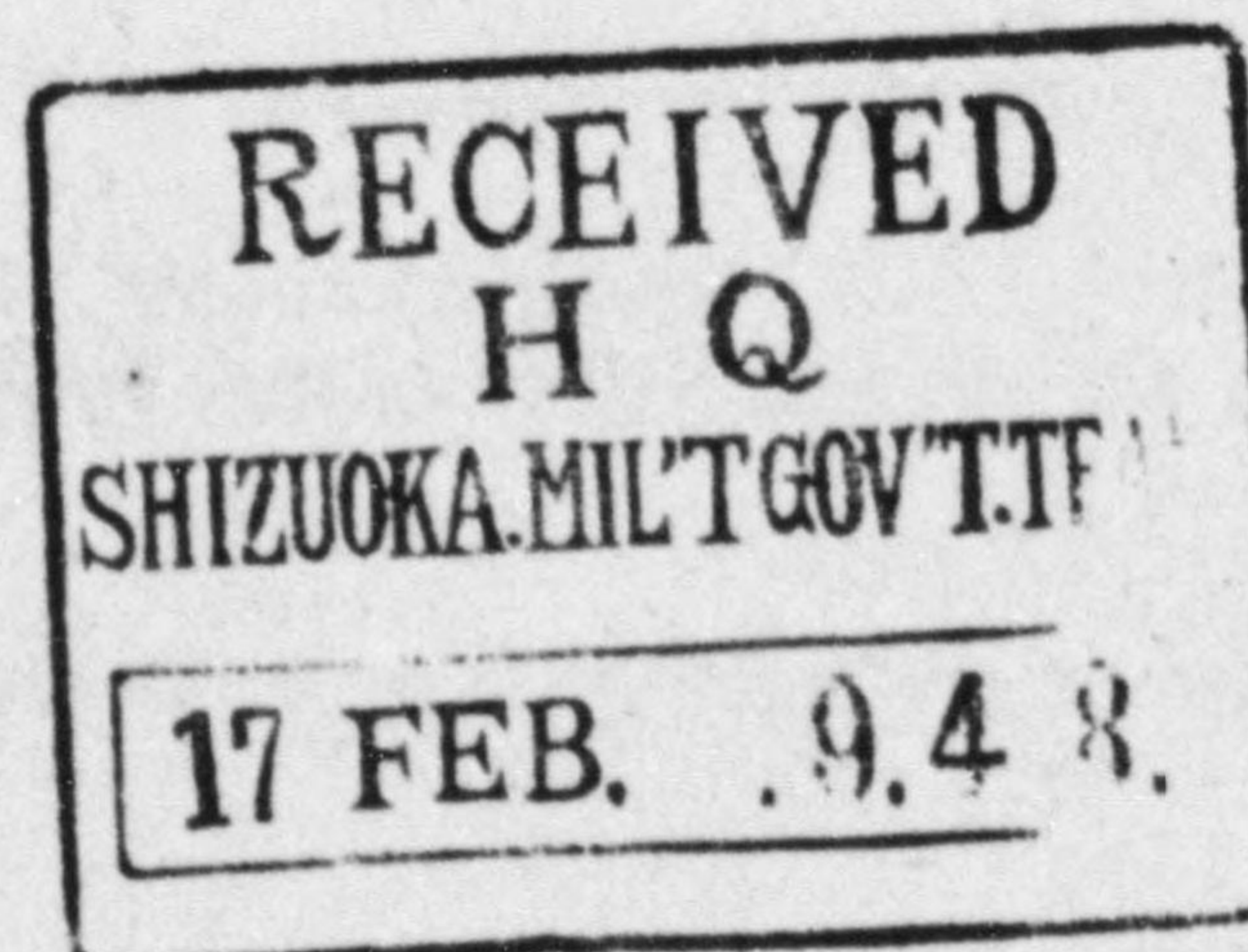

The Central Liaison Office is directed to conduct a thorough search in each of the 403 plants listed in the inclosures and submit a complete report on the looted machinery and United Nations machinery located therein. The Central Liaison Office will obtain permission from the appropriate Military Government Teams to enter the plants concerned.

4. In those plants where looted machinery or United Nations machinery is found, the report will contain a certifying statement, signed by a responsible official of the plant concerned and the Japanese Government official responsible for conducting the search of that plant, as follows:

"We certify as responsible officials of the (insert name of plant) and (insert name of Japanese Government agency conducting the search of that plant) that a thorough search has been made of the (insert name of plant) and the only property in the (insert name of plant) that can be considered looted or purchased by fraud or under duress from an area occupied by the former Japanese armed forces or within Japan from United Nations nationals, is as follows: (list each machine that can be considered looted or purchased by fraud or under duress, giving complete information on each machine as obtained from the reparations inventory sheets)."

5. In these plants where no looted machinery is found, the report will contain a certifying statement, signed by a responsible official of the plant concerned and the Japanese Government official responsible for conducting the search of that plant, as follows:

"We certify as responsible officials of the (insert name of plant) and (insert name of Japanese Government agency conducting the search of that plant) that a thorough search has been made of the (insert name of plant) and no property that can be considered looted or purchased by fraud or under duress from an area occupied by the former Japanese armed forces or within Japan from United Nations Nationals is located in the (insert name of plant)".

6. The required reports will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 15 March 1948.

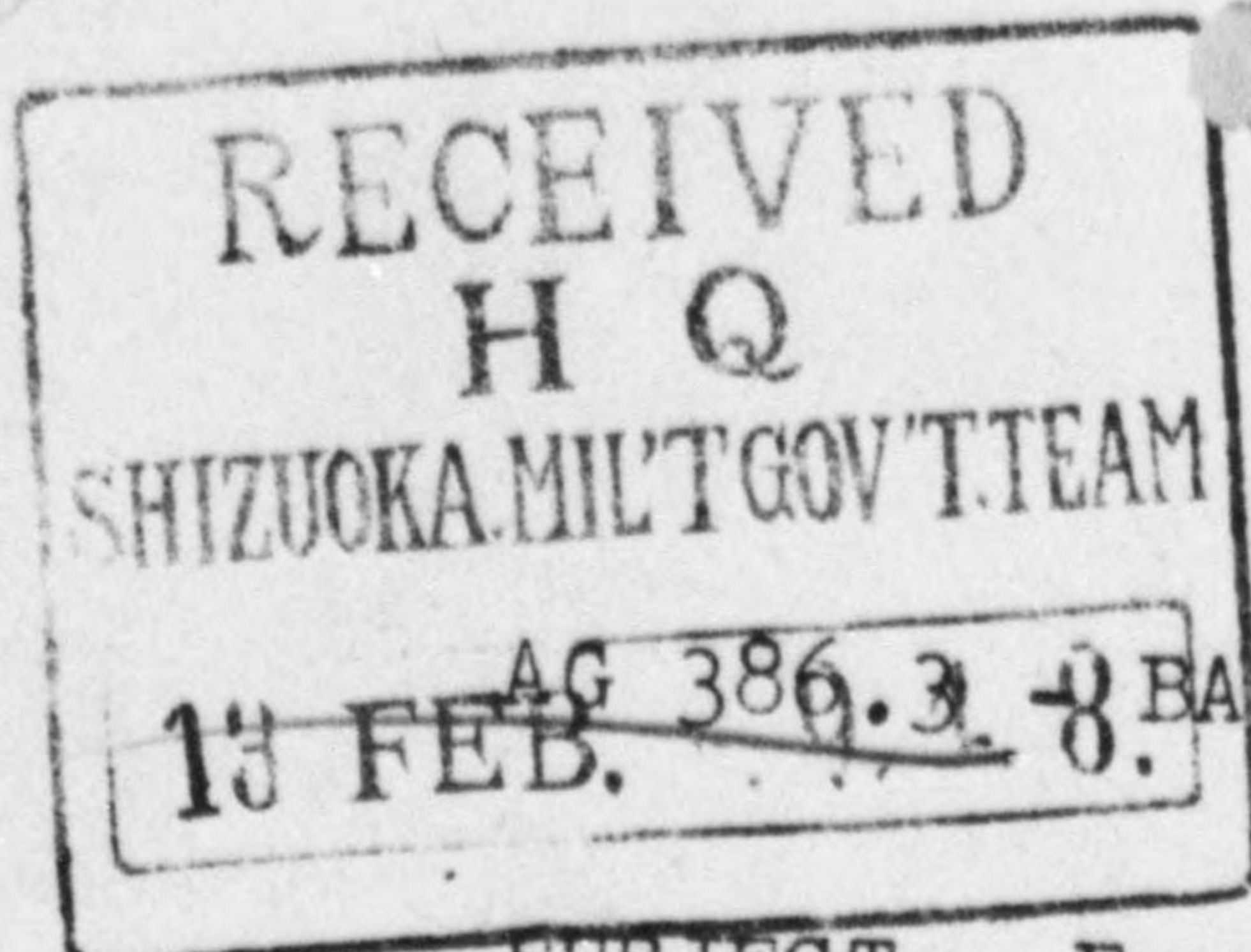

1. Pending revision of Operational Directive 5 as amended, arsenals, laboratories, aircraft factories and privately-owned munitions plants under custody for repairs will be inspected to identify specific items of machinery and equipment currently authorized for use by proper authority and necessary to support permitted operations. Items in use only for custody and maintenance purposes are not considered to be in the above category.

2. All items included in the above paragraph will be marked with paint with the symbol "U". The symbol will follow the code number if the item bears such a number.

Example, 50-25-100-U

3. Priority in this operation will be given to aircraft factories and privately-owned munitions plants on the corrected list. Distribution of this corrected list has been made direct to prefectural Military Government teams involved by Headquarters Eighth Army.

4. During the course of this inspection and marking, it will also be determined that items as described below are properly marked in accordance with current directives:

- a. Items designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as "looted."
- b. Items designated as "Special Purpose" to be destroyed.
- c. Items designated as "exempt".

5. Lists of the equipment in the categories described in paragraphs 1 and 4 above will be kept by military government teams exercising custody.



6. Telephonic report will be made to this headquarters (Attn: Military Government Section) each Tuesday, to include the name and code number of plants inspected and marked during the previous week.
7. Items that subsequently become unnecessary to support permitted operations will be reported, by identifying number or description, to Headquarters Eighth Army and the symbol "U" on the items will be crossed out.
8. No permits to use additional machinery will be granted without approval of Headquarters Eighth Army.
9. Evaluation teams of the Japanese Government are expected to re-evaluate plants specified in paragraph 3 beginning 1 March 1948. These teams will have no authority or responsibility to determine the category of equipment as described in paragraphs 1 and 4 above. Further information on evaluation procedure will be transmitted at a later date.

SUBJECT: Hoarded Goods and Excess Materials

TO: See Distribution

The following memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Director General, Economic Stabilization Board is quoted for your information and guidance:

- "1. The rehabilitation of the Japanese economy through full use of indigenous resources is impeded by the failure of the Japanese Government to take appropriate steps to discover and to make available hoarded goods and excess inventories. The Economic Stabilization Board is the agency of the Japanese Government charged with responsibility of correcting this situation. In addition, in the fall of 1946, the Temporary Demand and Supply Adjustment law was enacted for the purpose of giving the Economic Stabilization Board sufficient authority to take corrective action. The Board is in a position to discharge its responsibilities and with vigorous action can bring about a marked improvement in the location and redistribution of these goods.
- "2. It is desired, therefore, that the methods of redistributing goods and materials which have been discovered be improved materially. Towards this end, where necessary, ordinances, regulations and procedures should be revised as rapidly as possible along the following lines:
  - a. A clear specification of critical materials and all other goods subject to redistribution should be set forth.
  - b. A single clearly defined procedure should be established for all goods and materials which are to be redistributed.
  - c. The procedure should be applied along democratic non-discriminatory lines with full cooperation of the Ministry officials concerned.
