a. If shipments are made 25 August and 30 August as currently planned, it is suggested that the figures shown under the dates above be used as a basis for shipment to the camps. Adjust figures in accordance with the total recruits in the training schools at the time (for instance 6900 to 7600).

2. As a general policy, insofar as practical, recruits should be sent to the camp nearest their domicile, unless they express a desire for assignment elsewhere.

3. Recruits for the Eta Jima School should be selected from all Regional Schools, in order to secure a representative group from all sections of the country.

a. Placing 9400 enlistees in camps in Hokkaido by 10 September (From this number subtract Eta Jima School quota and interpreters not to exceed 400).

b. Utilizing the fewest number of camps in order to give more time for getting other camps ready.

c. Using at the latest possible date and to the minimum, camps where rehabilitation must be carried out.

d. Conforming to ultimate camp occupancy by units in order to avoid later shifts from one camp to another.

e. Avoiding the necessity of sending enlistees to points distant from their homes (This will become more important later when the problems of hospitalization, leave and passes must be met.)
