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## Preface.

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THE following monumental inscriptions were copied by the Editor, during his visit to Barbados, in the winter of 1913-14.

They comprise all those in the churches and churchyards, but not those in dissenting chapels or modern cemeteries.

About 100 of the oldest Jewish inscriptions have been also included.

A few notes have been given, but the addition of many more would have delayed publication.

Every facility was afforded him by the Bishop and clergy, the former of whom, during a very long residence in the West Indies, has made an extensive collection of notes on the ecclesiastical history of his diocese, which his Lordship hopes, when he has leisure, to sort and print.

The Editor therefore, not wishing to encroach on Bishop Swaby's research work, confined his attention to the church memorials.

A collection of these, down to the year 1750, with a selection of those of a later period, was made by Capt. Lawrence Archer, when quartered in the Island, as he tells us, for a short period in 1857-8, and this appeared in his well-known quarto volume published in 1875.

Several of those inscriptions recorded by him are no longer to be seen, so that his collection is still invaluable, and in no way depreciated by the appearance of this present volume.

His MS., which he presented in 1860 to the British Museum (Add. MS. 23,608), should be consulted, as it contains many notes not in his book.

The churches throughout the Island are scrupulously clean and better attended to than most in England, the absence of glass windows and free current of wind keeping them very fresh and sweet. The churchyards are all walled in and well looked after.

The absence of frost has tended to preserve the marble slabs in the burial-grounds, but the prevalence of hurricanes and earthquakes has, on the other hand, helped to crack and destroy the tablets and slabs inside the buildings.

The well-executed armorial work on so many of the old blue marble slabs is evidence of English origin, but a certain number of the later plain marble tablets were cut locally.

Barbados, first settled about Feb. 1626-7, is the only island in the Caribbean Sea which has remained uninterruptedly in English possession. Its position so far to windward: its distance from any French naval base: and the great number of its fighting men, all conducing to its freedom from attack. It still enjoys a free elective House of Assembly presided over by its Speaker.

James Town, now called Hole Town, was founded in 1626-7 by Sir William Courteen's men, and Bridgetown in 1628 by the Earl of Carlisle's settlers. In 1629 Gov. Sir William Tufton created six parishes: Christ Church, St. Michael, St. James, St. Thomas, St. Peter, and St. Lucy.

In a deed of 1639 in the local Record Office I saw the signatures of the Council and Assembly, and it has been stated that there were then (as now) eleven parishes. In a deed of 25 Feb. 1640 Governour Henry Huncks "ordered y<sup>e</sup> church of St. George to pay 10,000 lbs. in May next 1641 to the parish of St. Michael, otherwise St. George to belong as formerly to St. Michael." In Lygon's "History," of which the first edition was issued in 1657 and the second in 1673, is an ancient map, probably by Captain John Swanne, who signed as surveyor in 1639 and several years later, on which are given the names of the settlers and four churches drawn, viz.: St. Peter's, St. James, St. Michael and Christ Church. Lygon describes how he himself superintended the cutting of "Church wayes" through the woods, using a compass in places. In 1645 many Royalists arrived after the battle of Naseby, and took a prominent part in affairs, until the colony submitted on good terms to Ayscue.

The first local Act is dated 1648, the earlier ones having been lost or burnt. The government continued to be proprietary under the Earls of Carlisle until the Restoration. By Act No. 18 of 1661 five precincts for courts were formed:—

1. Christ Church and St. Philip.
2. St. Michael, St. George and St. John.
3. St. Thomas and St. James.
4. St. Peter, All Saints and St. Lucy.
5. St. Andrew Overhills and St. Joseph.

By another Act of that year it was ordered that registers were to be kept by the Minister, who was to send a certificate of the entries into the Secretary's office in March yearly, there to remain a record.

Marriage licences were always issued by the Governor, but I have never seen any record of them in the W.I., and the Colonial Secretaries have always stated that they had none.

A few years ago the Legislature ordered Transcripts of all parish registers to be made and deposited in the local Record Office, where there is also a complete general Index for the whole of the parishes.

The Hurricane of 1831 destroyed seven parish churches, viz., those of Christ Church, St. Philip, St. John, St. Joseph, St. Lucy, St. Peter and St. Thomas, also six chapels of ease.

In view of the inevitable recurrence of such disastrous visitations, it is the more essential to copy and print church memorials, serving as they do to remind us of many past worthies who did their share in building up the British Empire. *Quorum animabus propicietur deus.*

The marriages from their commencement in 1648 down to about 1668 were printed in the Diocesan Magazine, but they were so incorrectly transcribed that they are of little value.

On p. 379 of the 1st volume of St. Michael's Parish Register is a list of the plate of 25 Oct. 1688. One large chalice and cover and pair of flagons were the gift of Edwyn Stede, Lieut.-Gov., and a bason of Mr. John Milles.

Peregrine Tho. Hopson, b. 5 June 1696; Col. of 29 Reg. and 40 Reg., Maj.-Gen., Gov. of Nova Scotia 1752-5; d. in command of the troops at Guadaloupe 27 Feb. 1759, and was buried in the chancel of St. Michael's, Barbados, Monday, 19 March 1759. Will proved P.C.C. ("Notes and Queries," 11 Ser., viii., 443.)

Richard Harris, d. 11 Feb. 1735-6, aged 62. He was a good portrait painter from Southstoke near Bath, had resided in B. 30 years, and was buried at the S.E. end of St. Michaels churchyard. (See the original "Caribbeana," vol. ii., pp. 124, 127, 128.)

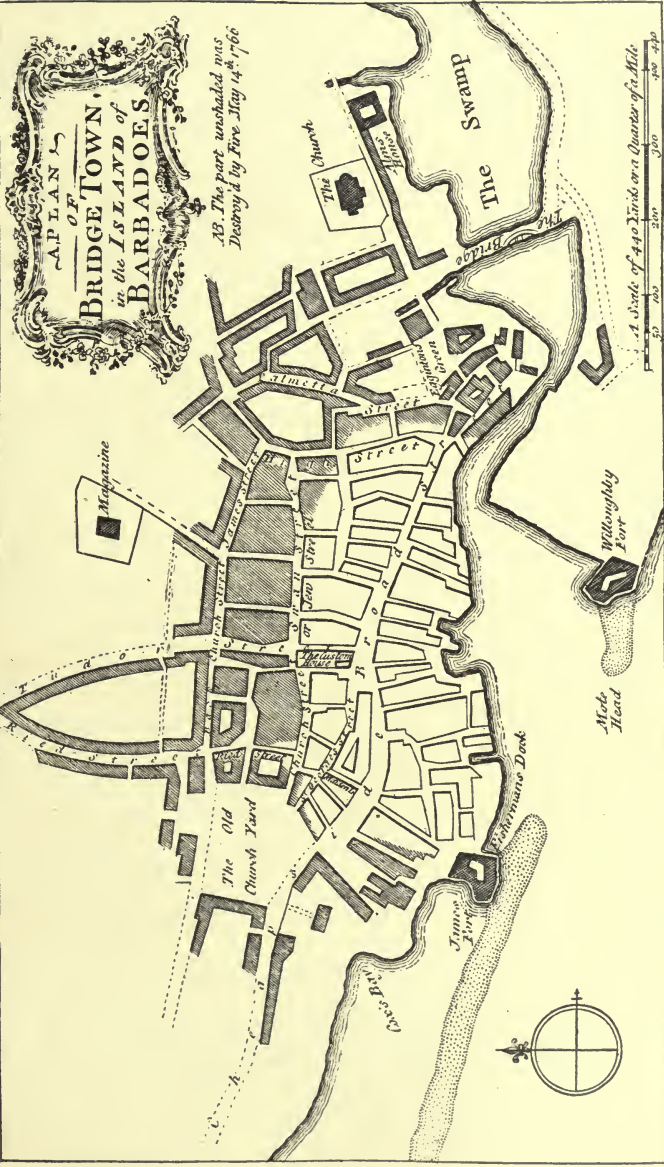

The earliest church in Bridgetown formerly stood in the "old churchyard," where St. Mary's was erected in 1825. This is shewn on the accompanying plan, which is a reduced copy of the one drawn by Mayo in 1712-21 and engraved by Senex in 1722.

A great fire in 1666, which destroyed the town, may have included the church. Most of the houses were of wood (Lygon, p. 40), but by an Act of 1667 stone and brick were to be used.

The present cathedral, dedicated to St. Michael, is stated to have been built in 1665 on a new site half a mile away to the east of the town.

It was destroyed by the Hurricane of 1780, when, of eleven churches and three chapels, only those of St. Peter, St. Andrew, and All Saints were left standing. The church was rebuilt on the same site, and reopened in 1786. The great Hurricane of 1831 broke the roof and flooded the vaults, cracking many of the floor slabs, but the main structure did not suffer.

The burials of Bath Abbey for 1737 are defective. A Mr. John Gibbons was buried 21 Oct. 1742, but that would be too late, unless the body were temporarily buried in St. Michael's and then subsequently removed to England.

The pedigree in Burke and Betham commences with Wm., the 1st Bart., who was probably s. of Wm., the brother of testator. See several M.I. in previous volumes of "Caribbeana."

## JEWISH BURIAL-GROUND, BRIDGETOWN.

This is situated in a central though isolated part of the town around the  
 Synagogue. There are hardly any Jews now in the Island, and services, I believe,  
 are rarely if ever held, but the Synagogue is in good order, and there is a man  
 in charge of the place. Mr. Baeza, a Member of the Assembly, is of the  
 Portuguese Jewish faith and one of the Trustees. There were no memorials in the  
 Synagogue.

I commenced copying the inscriptions in the oldest ground, but had not time  
 to do more than 100, leaving off at the line of the caretaker's house. There were  
 about 160 more in that portion. In the S. and E. divisions, walled off and divided  
 by a path, there appeared to be quite another 100. In White's Alley is a later  
 ground, opened in the year 1828, which I did not visit. It was a matter of regret  
 having to leave the Island with this portion undone, but the various parish  
 churches and churchyards occupied most of my time, and it was only towards the  
 termination of my visit that I came across the Synagogue. The Secretary of  
 the American Jewish Historical Society in New York wrote me on 17 July 1914:  
 "There was a considerable migration from the British W.I. to this country, which  
 may explain why the Barbados community has dwindled away almost to the  
 vanishing point."

Mr. T. Colyer-Fergusson has kindly read my MS. and added some notes.

I have omitted "S<sup>a</sup>," which heads most of the inscriptions, and "SUA ALMA  
 GOZE DA GLORIA," the last line of many of them. Some of the stones have  
 Hebrew verses, but as a rule Portuguese is the language used.

Lousada, died at Cheltenham, and a sister, Mrs. Bacon, died June 1913, aged 102.

Aaron and Ester Baruh-Louzada. They are the progenitors of the Lousada family now settled in England. Francis Clifford Duke de Losada y Lousada, Comm. R.N., represents the senior branch. Ester Baruh Lousada was the daughter of Aaron Lamego (died 1747) of Jamaica, who late in life came to England, and lies buried in the old Portuguese Jewish Cemetery at Mile End behind the Beth Holim.

The Lousadas married into the principal families of the Sephardi community such as the Lopes, Ximenes, Francois, Aguilars, Lopes Pereiras, Barrows, Mocattas, Mendes da Costas, etc., and played a prominent part in communal affairs, but now there are very few of the family left in the community.

I cannot recall Barbados being mentioned on the stones at Mile End (I have only worked at the more modern burial-ground the Beth Haim, a short distance from the ancient ground at the Beth Holim), excepting one to Judith Montefiore, wife of Eleazar Montefiore. She is described as a "Native of Barbadoes," and died 13 May 1836. She was a dau. of Jacob Joseph Levi, he an uncle of Sir Moses Montefiore. She was a connection of the Barrows, another Barbados family. [T. C.-F.]

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#### ADDENDA.

##### BRIGHTON PLANTATION, ST. GEORGE'S.

Mr. W. H. Trollope writes that when last year (1914) in Barbadoes he was shewn an early tombstone with inscription and coat of arms to a Wiltshire in a summer-house on this estate, Mr. Lawrie Pile's.

The attention of the Editor was not drawn to this during his visit. According to the Report on Historic Sites the date 1652 is on a beam in this house, which was the seat of the Wiltshires, and a tomb near by probably belonged to them. It was not noted in the official list of tombs on plantations.

Ensign Henry Bradshaw of the parish of St. Peter, Barbadoes, gent. Will dated 29 March 1664. To my wife Jane 23½ acres. A silver boule of £5 for the communion table of St. Peter and a sermon to be preached on 10 April. My brother Lieut. Tho. Bradshaw of Rochdale, Lancashire. My father Col. John B. of the said county, Esq. My brother George. My friend Mr John B. of St. Philip 500 lbs. of sugar. Deposition of John Bradshaw, aged 50, 6 Nov. 1665. (Barbados Records, vol. i., 40.)

John Bradshaw, the regicide and former President, died 22 Nov. 1659 (Chester's "Registers of Westminster Abbey"). It has been stated that his son James removed his body to Jamaica, and buried it on a hill near Martha Brae. James had two patents for land of 250 acres and 650 acres surveyed in 1688, but this was 28 years later.





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
