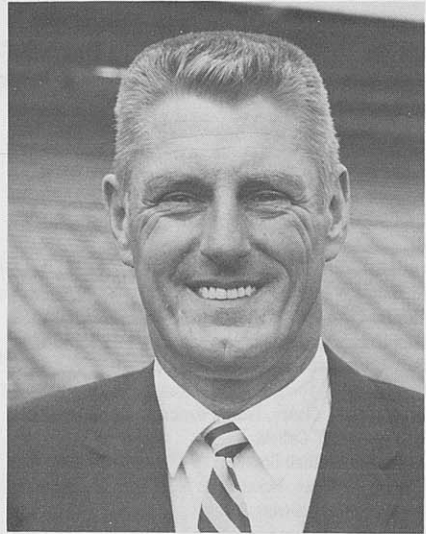
Hirsch Guides Wisconsin Athletic Program

Elroy Hirsch is in his eighth year as Wisconsin's Director of Athletics and he's the guiding force behind one of the finest athletic programs for men and women in the United States today.

He came back to Wisconsin—where he gained collegiate fame as a star sophomore running back in leading the Badgers to a No. 3 ranking during the 1942 football season—from the Los Angeles Rams on February 28, 1969, and his original appointment as athletic director—slated to end in 1979—was extended in 1974 by the school's athletic board through June 30, 1984.

He played at Michigan in 1943, as a Marine trainee, and he not only played football, but basketball, track and baseball. He won his "M" in each sport, the only athlete ever to accomplish such a feat at Michigan.

He had a successful professional football career, first as half-back with the Chicago Rockets of the post-war All-American

Conference, and later with the Los Angeles Rams for nine seasons as one of the all-time great ends.

He's been named to the Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame (1965), to professional football's Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio (1968), and to the National Football Hall of Fame in New York.

Meet Wisconsin's Coaching Staff

HEAD COACH BILL COFIELD

William L. "Bill" Cofield, a 36-year-old native of Carrier Mills, Ill., was named the head basketball coach at the University of Wisconsin last March 16.

Bill had been the assistant coach under Terry Holland at the University of Virginia for two years prior to accepting the position at Wisconsin. Last year Virginia was the Atlantic Coast Conference representative in the NCAA tournament.

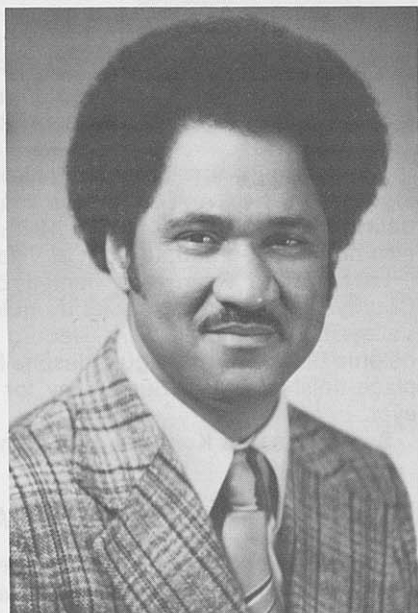
Cofield played his college basketball at Casper Junior College in Wyoming, and later at McKendree College in Lebanon, Ill. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in physical education from McKendree in 1963, and a master's degree, also in physical education from the University of Kentucky in 1967.

Bill began his coaching career at H.E. Davis Junior High School in Cleveland, O. in 1963. After two seasons there, he moved to the head coaching position at Cleveland East-Technical High School where his team posted a 20-1 record in 1965-66.

The following year **Cofield** entered the college ranks as an assistant coach at Kentucky State College. In 1967 he became the head coach at Lincoln University in Pennsylvania. His teams at Lincoln finished 19-3 and 19-9, winning conference championships and earning NAIA tournament berths in both 1967-68 and 1968-69. The '68-'69 squad placed second in the NAIA tournament.

The following season, **Bill** moved to Prairie View A & M, where he compiled a four-year record of 57-48. His 1972-73 team finished with a 19-8 record, good for second place in the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

In 1973 **Cofield** became the na-

tion's first black athletic director and head coach at a predominantly white institution of higher learning when he accepted both positions at the College of Racine. His team that year posted a 14-15 mark.

He left Racine after the 1974 season when the school went out of business, and joined the staff at Virginia.

Bill and his wife **Shirle** are the parents of four children.

ASSISTANT COACH

On the same day he accepted the head coaching position at Wisconsin, **Bill Cofield** made the announcement that **William "Bo" Ryan**, of Chester, Pa., would be one of his assistants.

The 28-year-old **Ryan**, who at the time was the basketball coach at Sun Valley (Pa.) High School, had previously worked as an assistant to **Cofield** at the College of Racine in 1973-74.

Bo was a high-scoring guard for Wilkes College in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., for four years, graduating from that institution in 1969. He has also done post-graduate work at Villanova.

Last season **Ryan** was named Delaware County Coach of the Year as he guided Sun Valley High School to a 14-7 record and a second-place finish in the Philadelphia Suburban 2 League, despite having no starter over 6-1. That second-place finish qualified Sun Valley for the state tournament for the first time ever.

Bo and his wife **Kelly** are the parents of an infant daughter.

ASSISTANT COACH LARRY REED

Larry Reed, former star player at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, also joined the Badger staff in March, from the front office of the Milwaukee Bucks of the NBA.

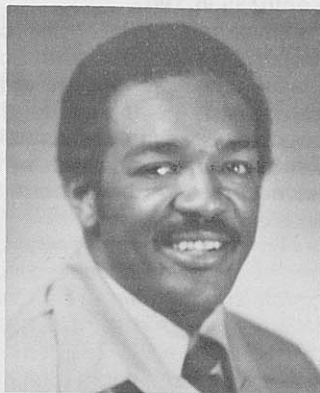
The 36-year-old **Reed** is a 1957 graduate of Milwaukee Lincoln High School where he starred in football, basketball and baseball, winning nine letters; and a graduate of UW-Milwaukee with a Bachelor of Science degree in Social Welfare in 1967. He received a Master of Science degree in Social Work in 1969 from UW-M.

Larry's collegiate career, which began in 1957, was interrupted by service in the U.S. Air Force, where he was three times named to the all-Air Force team. He returned to UW-M in 1964, and by the time his career ended in 1967, he had established himself as the school's all-time leading scorer and rebounder.

He served as an assistant coach at UW-M for two years following graduation, and joined the Bucks organization in 1970. That year **Reed** coached the Milwaukee Muskies, a Bucks farm team, to the Continental League title.

From 1971 until he joined the Badger staff, **Larry** was a front office administrative assistant for the Bucks; first to former president **Ray Patterson**, and more recently, to General Manager **Wayne Embry**.

Larry and his wife **Sharon** are the parents of three sons and a daughter.

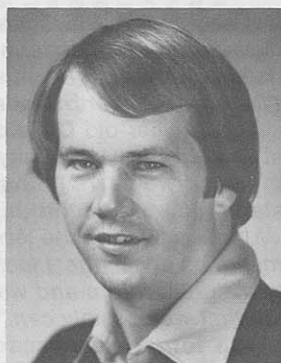
ASSISTANT COACH TODD LANDRUM

The newest addition to Coach **Cofield's** staff is **Todd Landrum**, a part-time assistant from Cuyahoga Falls, O. **Landrum**, 25, came to Wisconsin from the University of Delaware where he had been a graduate assistant.

Todd received his undergraduate degree in physical education from Ohio Northern University in Ada, O., in 1974; and a master's degree, also in physical education, from Delaware last year.

His primary responsibility at Wisconsin will be handling the Varsity Reserves program, but he will also do scouting and recruiting work for the Badgers.

Todd was recently married to the former **Brenda Emmelhainz** of Columbus, O.

1976-77 WISCONSIN BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

A new coach, **Bill Cofield**, a quartet of outstanding freshman recruits, a nucleus of returning lettermen, an entertaining schedule and a renovated fieldhouse are the ingredients which add up to an exciting 1976-77 University of Wisconsin basketball season.

The 36-year-old **Cofield** comes to Wisconsin after head coaching positions at Lincoln (Pa.) University, Prairie View A & M and the College of Racine; and the past two years he has served as an assistant coach on **Terry Holland's** staff which turned the University of Virginia basketball program around.

Upon accepting the job at Wisconsin, **Cofield** stated: *"I think that it is a tremendous challenge. I feel that the University of Wisconsin basketball program has a great future and we're certainly going to be striving to do the very best job that we possibly can."*

The foursome of incoming freshmen includes **Joe Chernelich**, a 6-7 "strong" forward from Milwaukee (Pius XI); **Bob Jenkins**, a 6-2 guard from Milwaukee (Washington); **James "Stretch" Gregory**, a 6-8 "small" forward from Washington, D.C. (Coolidge); and **Arnold "Clyde" Gaines**, a 6-4 "point" guard from Baltimore, Md. (Lake Clifton).

Chernelich, an all-state selection, averaged 19.8 points per game for Pius XI—winner of the Wisconsin Independent Schools Athletic Association (WISAA) title in 1976.

Jenkins displayed strength, speed, quickness and jumping ability; as well as scoring 33 points in Milwaukee Washington's WIAA state tournament game against eventual state champion South Milwaukee. He'll play as a strong guard in the Wisconsin system with defense his main responsibility.

Gregory was an all-metro player at Coolidge High School in Washington, D.C., averaging 20 points and 15 rebounds per game. He'll be the small forward to take advantage of his speed, quickness and jumping ability.

Gaines, an all-Maryland choice for two years and an all-America selection in 1975-76 will be the point guard—the ball handler—and serve as the quarterback of the Badger five.

Returning lettermen include forwards **Pete Brey** (4.1 points per game), **Bill Pearson** (6.1) and **Emir Hardy** (1.5); centers **Al Rudd** (8.6) and **Mark Newburg** (1.1); and guards **Brian Colbert** (8.6), **James Smith** (8.2), **Bob Falk** (7.2), **Bill Smith** (2.8) and **Dean Anderson** (3.9), and **Buddy Faurote** (0.3).

Rudd, 6-10, set a school field goal accuracy mark of .570 as a freshman pivot in 1975-76 and enjoyed a 28-point splurge against Michigan in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse.

Colbert averaged 8.6 points per game and finished strong by tallying in double figures—16 vs. Indiana, 17 at Ohio State and 21 at Michigan State—in the season's final three games.

The long-awaited renovation of the Wisconsin Fieldhouse started in early May, and the \$718,000 project, which will provide new seating, dressing and training rooms, and concession areas, is scheduled to be completed in time for the beginning of the 1976-77 season.

Wisconsin will play an ambitious 27-game schedule this year, including the 18-game double round robin Big Ten slate of games.

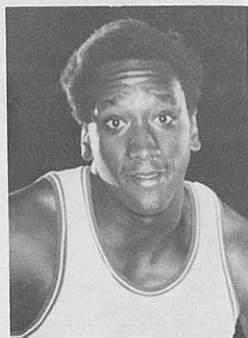
