Law No. 120

National Public Service Law

Article 102. No person in the service shall solicit, or receive, or be in any manner concerned in soliciting or receiving any subscription or other benefit for any political party or political purpose.

No person in the service shall be a candidate for elective public office in cases provided by rules of the Commission.

No person in the service specified by law or rules of the Commission shall be an officer of any political party or political organization.

Law No. 100

Public Offices Election Law

Article 137. No educator (who is a school-master or a teacher as prescribed by the School Education Law (Law No. 26 of 1947) shall be engaged in the election campaign by utilizing his position toward the school children, pupils and students as an educator.

Article 6 of the Repealed H. of R. Election Law is identical with Article 11 of the New Public Office Election Law with a slight difference.

The following person has no election right nor the right of being elected:

1. A person who is serving a sentence.
2. A person who was convicted of election violation and whose sentence is suspended or who is on parole and is not discharged.

Next, the question of, "Does any omission of the fact of the Candidate's conviction in the questionnaire filed with Election Administration Commission constitute an offence?". I think it does not unless the crime committed has itself a grave bearing upon the Purge Ordinance. The omission of a conviction for theft, for instance, is not, if the theft has no bearing upon Purge Ordinance, and generally it has not, a violation of the Imperial Ordinance No 1 of 1947.

Reports have reached this Region that unions of government employees, specifically the Kagawa-ken Employees Union and the Kagawa-ken Teachers Union, are actively participating in the current governors election on behalf of the candidates. It is our desire to point out to the people of Kagawa and to the union members that appointed government officials are servants of all the people and are not the servants of one person, clique or political party. Therefore government officials, in their capacity as such, should be above partisan politics and personalities. That a union of public employees should be for this or that candidate is contrary to all democratic concepts regarding the rights and obligations of such a union. This Region further deplors the fact that the decision taken by the unions in regards to the election was taken not by a meeting of the whole membership but by the executive or central committees. Decisions on matters of importance should be the will of the majority of the members of the union no matter what the union is, be it a public employees union or a union of day laborers. The principles governing the extent ^{of} political activity of public servants is clearly stated in Art 102 of the National Public Service Law and Art 137 of the Public Offices Election Law. Teachers and ken employees should abide by those ^{principles} regulations. They should remain neutral and impartial. No one of course denies them the right to their own opinions or the right to express their opinions thru the ballot. But to utilize their position as public servants to promote one person, one clique or political party is a betrayal of the trust placed in them by the people of Kagawa-ken.

Possibility of Introducing Local Civil Service Law
and Importance of Governor's Election

Regarding the ban of the teacher's political activity, it is in an inevitable situation to introduce the Local Civil Service Law in the extraordinary session of the Diet, this autumn. If this pass the Diet, our political activities will be restricted to the use of just one vote.

Under these circumstances, no matter how eagerly we desire to improve our positions or to obtain more educational budget, such a campaign will be strictly restricted.

But fortunately, we are going to have the governor's election at this time when there is not any restriction on our election campaign.

As you know, the final decision on educational matters is almost under the governor's competence. When we consider about the domestic and foreign situation in the future, could we miss this chance which rarely happens? (Literally, meet once every thousand year) We ought to desperately support "AGA" who wholly recognized our desire in his pledge. By doing this we can anticipate a brightful future. Accordingly, when we consider that it has a direct interest with us, each of our 7,000 members has to keep in mind that this election will influence our lives more than that of the last House of Councillor's Election.

Fortunately, the present situation in this prefecture, especially that of the prefectural assemblymen and municipal mayors is in the more favourable situation than that of the last election. Both enemy and our camp are worn out this time due to the last election but we sincerely hope that you would

do a vigorous campaign for the future success of the prefectural education.

In Ehime prefecture located next to us, the Teacher's Union is always fighting hard under the governor who always trampled the union's demands. Therefore they do not receive any trip allowance when they attend the recognized lecture meetings.

If we win this time, we will be able to have a directors' board as well as the educational superintendent who support us and also in the next election more municipal mayors who hold progressive thoughts will be elected, effecting in favour of the future fighting.

We hope you would make up your mind to fight more bravely than last time in order to have "AGA" win in this election.

Enemy Camp Disturbance Underground Work

1. Disturb Kaneko's Camp

a. If we analyse the Kaneko's camp it will be classified into three groups: Namely, the Save-the-Nation-Youth League, Kato's faction and Onishi, Hirai's faction. Therefore drive in a wedge into each faction in order to let them confront internally.

For doing this, the following propaganda is suggested:

- (1) The Save-the-Nation-Youth League is boycotted (within the Save-the-Nation-Youth League's Territory).
- (2) Only the S.N.Y.L. and Kato's factions are campaigning (within the Hirai's Territory).
- (3) The Kato's faction has been boycotted and the Hirai's faction is leading the campaign.

b. Strongly alienate from the Okubo's faction: Propagandize saying that the Kaneko's camp is always calling bad names of the Okubo's faction. (Today, in Kozai-cho, some prefectural assemblyman explained to the effect that the Okubo's faction will surely come back to the Conservative Camp. He also desired that Okubo's faction would come back as quickly as possible requesting the cooperation of the spectators)

c. To the influential people in the localities (Municipal Mayors, Municipal Assemblymen, Agricultural Corp. Fishery Corp. & etc.) explain about lots of their evil deeds (Parties, political taxes, dishonest bits) and try to alienate them from the public, or by taking advantage of the locally vocational ill-feeling, boost up the Anti-Committee feeling by alienating

them from the public uncovering bosses.

2. Conflict with each other by connecting Nakaoka to Kaneko

a. Publicize to the effect that Nakaoka is a victim candidate recommended by the Kaneko's faction and obtain sympathy of the public by boosting up an anti-Kaneko feeling.

b. Publicize to the effect that the repatriate will vote for Nakaoka as Nakaoka is a repatriate and let them encroach into the enemy's camp (only to the Conservative repatriate belonging to the Yamashita, Kotaro's faction).
