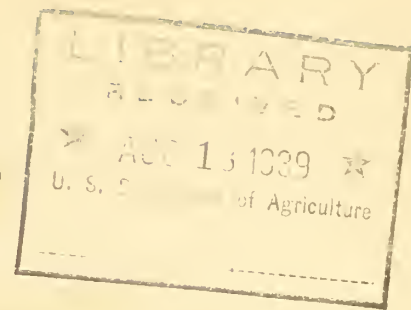

STOCKS OF LEAF TOBACCO OWNED BY DEALERS AND MANUFACTURERS

JULY 1, 1939.

Stocks of leaf tobacco owned by dealers and manufacturers in the United States and Puerto Rico on July 1, 1939, amounted to 2,135,856,000 pounds compared with 2,178,500,000 pounds on July 1, 1938, and 2,367,193,000 pounds on April 1, 1939. Total stocks decreased a little over 231 million pounds in the period between April 1 and July 1 of 1939 compared with a decrease of 255 million pounds in the corresponding period of 1938.

Stocks of flue-cured tobacco were reported as 799,552,000 pounds on July 1, 1939, about 110 million pounds lower than on April 1, 1939, and about 13 million pounds lower than on July 1, 1938. The stocks of Type 11 on July 1, 1939 were reported as 334,966,000 pounds; Type 12 as 244,441,000 pounds; Type 13 as 148,896,000 pounds; and Type 14 as 71,249,000 pounds.

Stocks of fire-cured tobacco of all types were reported as 147,900,000 pounds on July 1, 1939, compared with 179,385,000 pounds on July 1, 1938, a decrease of about 31½ million pounds. Virginia Fire-cured, Type 21, stocks were reported as 23,711,000 pounds; Type 22 as 93,139,000 pounds; Type 23 as 30,134,000 pounds; and Type 24 as 916,000 pounds.

Burley stocks were nearly 23½ million pounds higher on July 1, 1939, than they were a year ago. The July 1, 1939, report shows 669,077,000 pounds of Burley owned by dealers and manufacturers. Maryland tobacco, Type 32, stocks were reported as 29,865,000 pounds, about 2 million pounds lower than a year ago.

One Sucker stocks on July 1, 1939, were 30,168,000 pounds; Green River stocks were 23,139,000 pounds; Virginia Sun-cured, 2,916,000 pounds; Eastern Ohio, 929,000 pounds; Perique, 720,000 pounds; Other Miscellaneous Domestic, 581,000 pounds; and Foreign-grown cigarette tobacco (Turkish and other), 101,530,000 pounds.

JULY 1 CIGAR LEAF TOBACCO STOCKS

Stocks of American-grown cigar-filler types amounted to 189,240,000 pounds on July 1, 1939, a decrease of more than 20½ million pounds from the stocks of July 1 a year ago. Type 41, Pennsylvania Seedleaf stocks, were reported as 98,193,000 pounds on July 1, 1939; Type 42, Gebhardt, 14,589,000 pounds; Type 43, Zimmer, 14,845,000 pounds; Type 44, Dutch, 11,791,000 pounds; Type 45, Georgia and Florida Sun-grown, 1,769,000 pounds; and Type 46, Puerto Rican, 25,873,000 pounds in Continental United States and 22,180,000 pounds on the Island.

The cigar-binder type stocks were about 19½ million pounds lower on July 1, 1939, than they were a year ago. Total binder type stocks were reported as 120,245,000 pounds on July 1, 1939. Type 51, Connecticut Broadleaf, stocks were 29,002,000 pounds; Type 52, Connecticut Havana Seed, 23,522,000 pounds; Type 53, New York and Pennsylvania Havana Seed, 2,640,000 pounds; Type 54, Southern Wisconsin, 35,150,000 pounds; and Type 55, Northern Wisconsin, 29,931,000 pounds.

Shade-grown wrapper type stocks were reported on July 1, 1939, as 8,670,000 pounds. Connecticut Shade stocks were 6,011,000 pounds, and Georgia and Florida Shade 2,659,000 pounds. The Foreign-grown cigar leaf tobacco stocks in the United States on July 1, 1939, consisted of 6,394,000 pounds of Cuba (Havana) tobacco, 2,494,000 pounds of Java and Sumatra, and 2,278,000 pounds of Philippine Island (Manila) tobacco.

The figures quoted for type totals are the sums of unstemmed and stemmed leaf as reported. A table is included showing American-grown types on a farm-sales weight basis with stemmed leaf converted to unstemmed equivalent, and also a table showing separately stocks owned by manufacturers and stocks owned by dealers. The detailed report shows all stocks subdivided according to groups recognized in the trade.

This report is now issued by the Agricultural Marketing Service to which the service and regulatory activities, formerly in the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, were transferred July 1, 1939 by authority in the Agricultural Appropriation Act.
