A brief histroy of the control association was sketched by Mr. KETO; the Kensetsudan (control association) was composed of three formely competing bodies, (1) the Army Construction Cooperative Ass'n. (2) the Navy Equipment Cooperative Ass'n. (3) Japan Civil Engineer and Building Control Ass'n. The Kensetsudan was disbanded 1 October 1945 and a new organization is to be formed 1 November.

There were about 20,000 contractors in Japan as of 1938, and of these 48 had an annual turnover of 10,000,000 or more. Of 12,000 or 13,000 civil engineers and other construction specialists available before the war, about one-third were taken by military conscription. Of the labor pool available during the war, about 1000,000 were fixed and skilled laborers, and about 700,000 were temporary, of these 700,000,350,000 were Koreans.

This contract promises to be fruitful, although statistics are only approximate, most of the associations records having been destroyed in the war.
