

What is Wikimedia Commons?

It's a free online repository of media used in Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects that have been shared by volunteers. Commons only allows images and other media files that are not subject to copyright restrictions which would prevent them being used by anyone, anytime, for any purpose.

Pictures, video and audio files are popular, as are documents, maps and information graphics.


FINDING FREE MEDIA




What content is allowed on Wikimedia Commons?



PUBLIC DOMAIN


YES. Media in the public domain with no copyright or an expired copyright can be uploaded to Commons. This includes old pre-1923 content and many US government works.






FREELY LICENSED

YES. Works released under Creative Commons Attribution and Sharealike licenses, or any that allow free reproduction (commercial and noncommercial use) are allowed on Commons. Most works you create or photograph yourself qualify.





TRADITIONAL COPYRIGHT

No. Media under traditional copyright that do not allow for free reporduction cannot be on Commons. Recent work you did not create yourself likely falls under this category.

What can you do?

to see if they will release
their work
under
a free
license.
