


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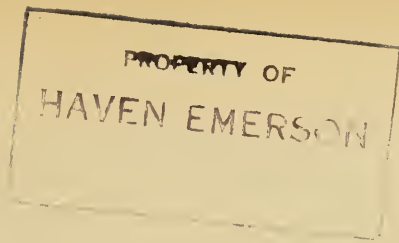

Zymotic Diseases.—The most fatal diseases of this interesting group, with their mortality, are as follows : Small-pox, 315 ; measles, 362 ; scarlatina, 891 ; diphtheria, 1,750 ; croup, 527 ; whooping cough, 406 ; dysentery, diarrhœa, cholera morbus, and entero-colitis, 3,782 ; typhoid fever, 283 ; remittent, intermittent, typho-malarial, and congestive malignant malarial fever, 229. There was a single death from an imported case of yellow fever. There was a death from glanders,

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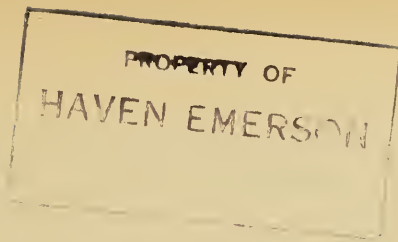
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REPORT ON VITAL STATISTICS.

EMMONS CLARK,

Secretary of the Board of Health :

SIR—I have the honor to submit herewith a report of the Vital Statistics of New York City for the year 1876.

The total mortality from all causes whatsoever reached 29,152, of which number 14,210 deaths occurred in children under five years of age.

This mortality was distributed among the five classes of diseases established by the Royal College of Physicians of London, as follows, viz. :

Zymotic diseases, 9,616 ; constitutional diseases, 6,075 ; local diseases, 10,658 ; developmental diseases, 1,695 ; and deaths from violence, 1,108.

Zymotic Diseases.—The most fatal diseases of this interesting group, with their mortality, are as follows : Small-pox, 315 ; measles, 362 ; scarlatina, 891 ; diphtheria, 1,750 ; croup, 527 ; whooping cough, 406 ; dysentery, diarrhœa, cholera morbus, and entero-colitis, 3,782 ; typhoid fever, 283 ; remittent, intermittent, typho-malarial, and congestive malignant malarial fever, 229. There was a single death from an imported case of yellow fever. There was a death from glanders,

one from malignant pustule, five from hydrophobia, and 123 from syphilis. Of the 515 deaths attributed to dietic causes, 367 were due to inanition, including privation, and 126 to alcoholism.

Of the diathetic diseases, cancer is credited with 459 deaths, the organs chiefly suffering being, as usual, the breast, the liver, the stomach, the rectum, and the uterus; while, of the 5,421 deaths from tubercular diseases, phthisis pulmonalis is responsible for 4,194, the most fatal period being between 20 and 50 years, with the maximum at the 30th year.

Under the head of local diseases we have prominently apoplexy, furnishing 383 deaths, with its maximum at 60 years; convulsions, with a total of 685; all, with two exceptions, occurring in children under 5 years of age; congestion of the brain, 132, chiefly among young children; sun-stroke, causing 206 deaths; meningitis, with 697 cases, mostly among the young; paralysis and softening of the brain, 218 together.

Of the 1,078 deaths attributed to diseases of the organs of circulation, 992 fall to the heart, 498 going to valvular disease.

Of a total mortality of 4,121 deaths from diseases of the respiratory organs, 1,214 are put down to bronchitis, and 2,542 to pneumonia.

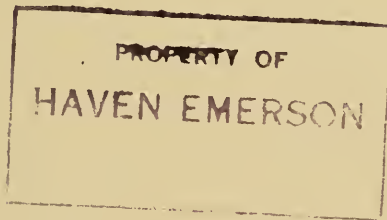
Diseases of the digestive organs resulted in 1,175 deaths, of which 204 are credited to cirrhosis of the liver, 148 to enteritis, 198 to gastritis, and 144 to gastro-enteritis.

Diseases of the urinary organs occasioned 1,289 deaths, 955 of which number died of Bright's disease, and 177 of nephritis.

Developmental diseases of children occasioned 896 deaths, of

which 159 are charged to atelectasis pulmonum, and 548 to premature birth, while of the 286 deaths among women, 132 are due to puerperal metritis and metro-peritonitis.

Under Class V., deaths by violence, the mortality reaches 1,108. There were 902 deaths from accident and negligence, 55 from homicide, 150 from suicide, and one by the executioner.

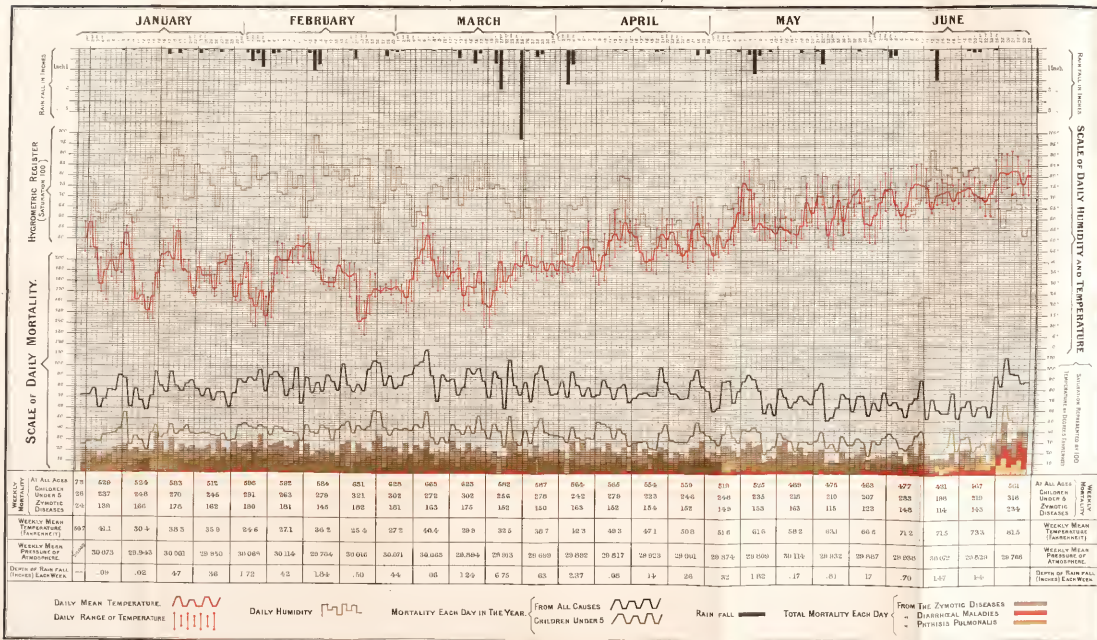

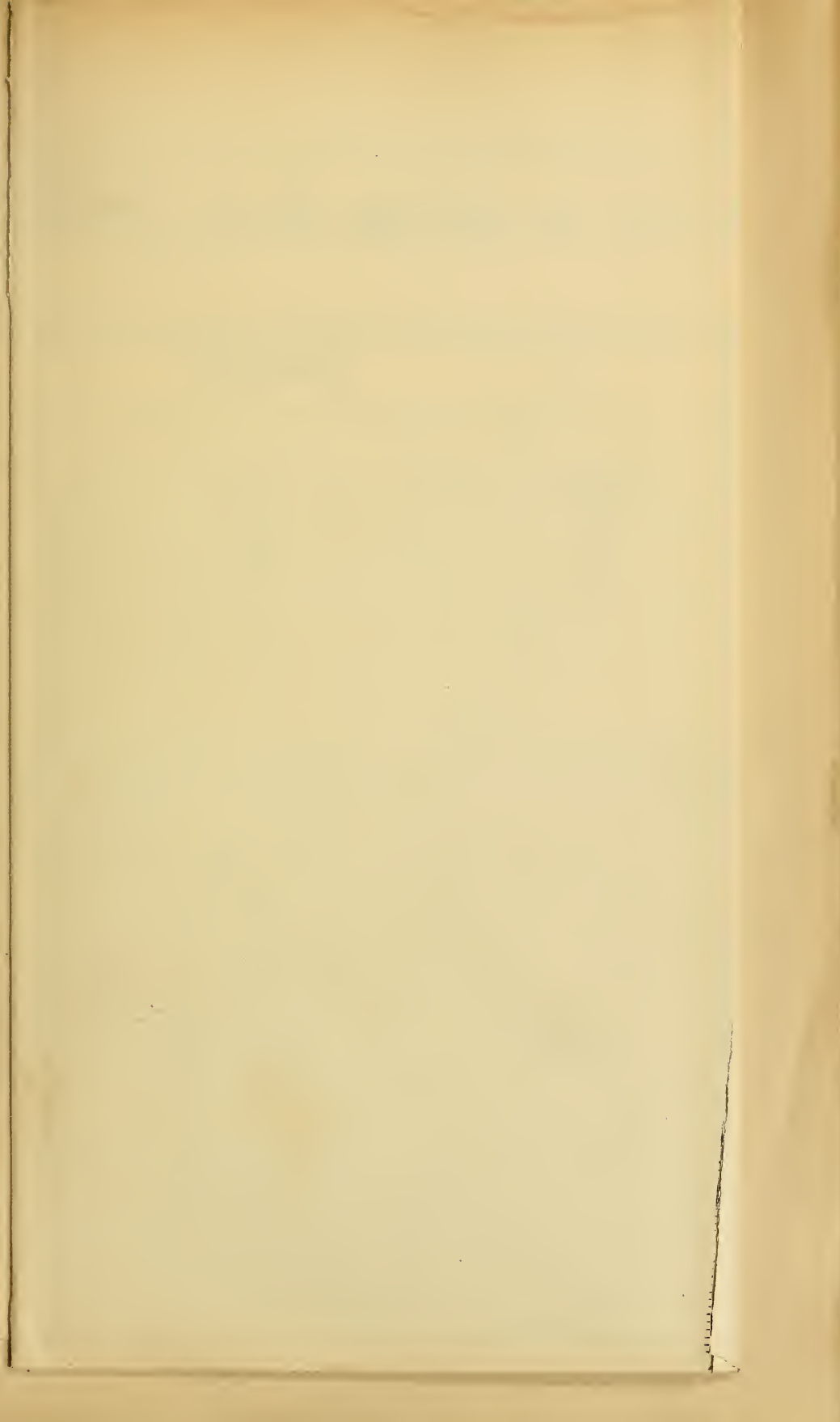

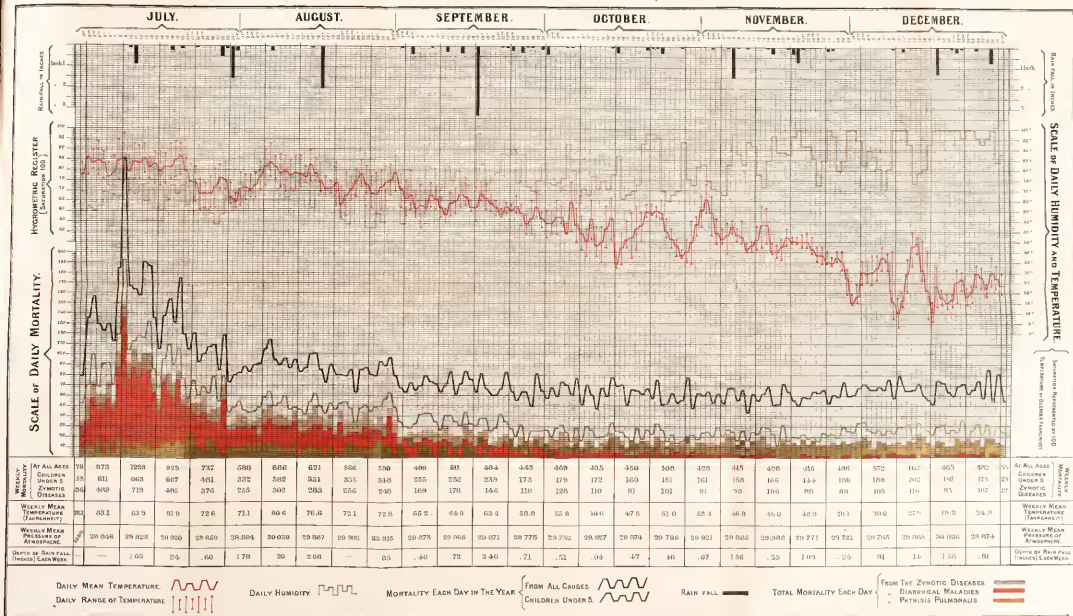

The following tables show the deaths during the different quarters of the year from Zymotic and all other diseases, with their distribution among the twenty-four wards of the city, and the percentage of mortality in each thousand of the population. The deaths from Zymotic diseases were 2,188 in the first quarter, 1,999 in the second, 4,035 in the third, and only 1,338 in the fourth, the bad prominence in the third quarter being due to Diarrhœal diseases :

The abstract of the Monthly Death Record from Phthisis Pulmonalis shows that while the mortality was pretty evenly distributed among the other months there was a decided increase in March. We notice also that out of a total mortality of 4,194 there were 190 more deaths among men than among women. As to nativity, the deaths among the Irish numbered 1,404 against 1,652 of the native population. The heaviest mortality occurred between the ages of 20 and 40 years, and the percentage of deaths by Phthisis on the total mortality was 14.38. The Nineteenth Ward had 698 deaths from this cause alone, although 390 of this number occurred in the various Hospitals and Charitable Institutions. The table showing the distribution of the mortality among the various trades is interesting, but would be more valuable, of course, if we could know the actual number engaged in the different branches of industry.

ABSTRACT OF THE RECORD OF DEATHS BY PHTHISIS PULMONALIS, IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK,

An analysis of the deaths from Bright's disease of the kidneys gives us a total of 955, or 3.28 per cent. on the mortality from all causes. Of this number 402 had no complications certified. The most usual complications are seen to have been apoplexy and convulsions, cardiac diseases, intemperance, œdema of the lungs, pleurisy, pneumonia, and dropsy. It will be seen, too, that as usual the males suffered more than the females. As regards the nativity of the decedents, 148 were German, 312 were native born, and 382 were Irish.

The deaths from typhoid fever in 1876 are seen by the accompanying table to be less, with two exceptions, than in any year since 1861. The distribution of the mortality among the different wards is on the whole so even, when their population is taken into account, that we are not led to suspect any local causes in particular. The total deaths from typhus fever were but 20, a less number than is found in any year since 1853, if we except 1874 :

Of the 298 deaths certified as due directly or indirectly to intemperance the usual causes preponderate in the accompanying tables, while as regards nativity 39 were Germans, 59 were natives of the United States, and 162 were from Ireland. The small mortality reported from alcoholism is due to the reluctance of the family physician to wound the feelings of the friends and family of the deceased.

Of the 150 suicides in the following tables 28 were natives of the United States, 21 were Irish, and 69 were German. Of this whole number 114 were males, 31 were single, 85 were married, and 16 were widowed. Of these unfortunates 26 employed some form of arsenic, 21 used opium, laudanum or morphine, 45 died from fire-arms, 10 from some cutting instrument, 17 by hanging, and 9 by drowning. It is a fact of some significance that the largest percentage fell upon clerks :

Of the total mortality for the year 1876, 1,108, or 1 in every 26.30 persons that died, met with a violent death, and of this class fractures and contusions caused 93; wounds, 22; killed by vehicles and railroad cars, 72; falls, 252; burns, 59; scalds, 46; poisoning, 15; suffocation, 31; drowning, 183; immersion, 4; surgical operations, 114; neglect and exposure, 10; judicial hanging, 1; homicides, 55; and suicides, 150. The accompanying table will give a more detailed statement as to how these causes were produced.

By reference to the Meteorological tables on page 202, it will be seen that the appalling mortality of 4,164 in the month of July, of which number 2,708 occurred in children under five years old, coincided with intensely and continuously hot weather, the mean temperature for the entire month being 79.44. From July 8 to the 15th the weather was "dry and hot," and it is marked by Professor Draper as the "hottest week of the year."

UNUSUAL DEATHS.

A CASE OF ACUTE GLANDERS.—BY R. J. M'KAY, M. D.

I was called, February 11, 1876, to see Geo. June, at his residence, 410 West Twenty-fourth street, New York City. Learned he was forty-seven years old, born in this State, and had not been sick since boyhood until this illness, which began several weeks ago with the symptoms of a slight cold, affecting his nose and pharynx, and a feeling of weariness. In a few days he felt better, and began to attend to his business, which was that of a carman, employing men to drive his trucks in hauling, mostly hogs. He never drove, himself.

Ascertained he had a chill about noon on the 10th inst., after which he began to have slight pain about his left mammary region. There still existed slight tenderness on pressure at point named, and an

occasional stitch-pain was felt there when he moved, or drew a long, deep breath. His pulse was about 80, respirations normal, and temperature 100.5.

On the 12th inst. he said he felt better ; his pulse and temperature were lower. On the 13th inst. he was not so comfortable, had more pain in left side, with but little change in other respects.

Was called to him at 4 A. M. of 14th inst., and found him suffering with severe pain during every respiratory act. It began at 2 A. M. Also he complained of a collection of wind in his stomach, and whenever he belched up ever so little of it he experienced more or less relief ; his fever was higher. About 11 A. M. I found him much more comfortable, but with well-marked symptoms of diaphragmatic pleurisy ; he could not lie down.

On the 15th and 16th inst. he became quite comfortable, and remained so until the 18th inst., although his fever ranged from 102° to 103° Fahr.

Dr. Wm. B. Eager, Jr., saw him on the 18th inst. (I did not), when he recognized the first manifestations of blood poisoning, not unlike erysipelas, there being flushed spots upon right knee and forearm ; no pustules discovered. At 3 P. M., of 19th inst., I next saw him and was surprised to find him so ill after an absence of two days ; his pulse was over 120 and temperature 103.5°. There were marked symptoms of malignant blood poisoning ; there were bullæ and pustules upon his upper lip, hands, forearms, feet, and legs, surrounded by larger or smaller inflamed surfaces, generally round in shape ; also there were numerous round, red, subcutaneous spots, without bullæ or pustules upon them, which were tender and varied in size from that of a silver three-cent piece to that of a silver dollar, which felt like descriptions of "farcy buttons" when pressed between the fingers. There existed, also, areas of angioleucitis extending up his

arms and legs attended by swelling and œdema. His face was red and slightly swollen. Bronchial respiration was discovered at various points in lower lobes of both lungs.

I was at a loss to fix upon a cause for my patient's condition, and called again to see him at 9 P. M., when I met two young men who were employees of Mr. June, with whom I conversed after leaving the house and learned that Mr. J. had a sick horse which an employee had been taking care of for two months. The next day (the 20th inst.) I ascertained the horse had been sick four months before he came into Mr. J.'s possession with symptoms of "lung fever," "water farcy," dropsy, etc. (the history obtained about the horse not being very satisfactory). Was told Mr. J. would examine the horse and lead him around in a stable-yard to exercise him, but that he never groomed or attended to the horse. Mr. J.'s symptoms grew worse, pulse and respiration higher, and temperature to 104°, 104.5°, and 107° Fahr. With the stethoscope isolated points of inflammation of lungs, distinctive of metastatic abscesses, were observed.

Dr. E. M. Cameron saw him with me, in consultation, on the 20th and 21st inst., and concurred with me as to symptoms of blood poisoning and condition of the lungs. We were disposed to consider the disease due to some animal poison contracted in some unknown manner to us. The probable point of inoculation was found upon the palmar surface of the second phalanx of the right index finger. The right forearm was very much swollen, and it extended up the arm to the right shoulder. The patient several times expressed the opinion to members of his family that he contracted his disease from his sick horse. New points of inflammation formed from day to day, and the old ones subsided somewhat, but not entirely. The bullæ became pustules, but very few of them broke, hence no ulcers were noticed. The patient's mind was wandering more or less during the last three

or four days, although he would generally answer questions correctly. He recognized friends when they called, whom he was allowed to see. The abscesses of his lungs multiplied and extended until both lungs became more or less disorganized, and caused his death, February 22, 1876.

While our comparatively high death-rate is well calculated to stimulate the sanitarian and the philanthropist to exhaust all efforts for its diminution, it may well be borne in mind that it is partly due to circumstances which, strictly speaking, are not altogether dependent on its sanitary condition, and which are also somewhat peculiar to New York.

From the configuration of the island, and indeed of the city at large, its death returns are probably more accurately reported than those of other cities.

A most important factor in our mortality is furnished by immigration. The immigrants who reach our port are not usually the best specimens of their respective races; the circumstances which drive them here not being usually favorable to health or longevity, and it is often the least intelligent and industrious of these that remain in the city to become the children of poverty, disease, and vice; to fill its hospitals, asylums, and almshouse, and to swell its bills of mortality. It is to be remembered, too, that all such charitable institutions are within the city* limits, and that their deaths go on our records.

Our public and private hospitals indeed, which attract patients from all parts of the country and which contribute their quota to the death-rate are sufficiently numerous to constitute a distinctive element in our mortality.

* "The county of New York shall contain the islands called Manhattan Island, Great Barn Island, Little Barn Island, Manning's Island, Nutten Island, Bedloe's Island, Bucking Island, and the Oyster Islands, and all the land under water within the following bounds: Beginning at Spuyten Duyvil creek, where the same empties itself into the Hudson river, on the Westchester side thereof, at low-water mark, and running thence along the said creek, at low-water mark, on the Westchester side thereof, to the East river or sound; then to cross over to Nassau or Long Island to low-water mark there, including Great Barn Island, Little Barn Island, and Manning's Island; then along Nassau or Long Island shore, at low-water mark, to the south side of the Red Hook; then across the North river, so as to include Nutten Island, Bedloe's Island, Bucking Island, and the Oyster Islands, to the west bounds of the State; then along the west bounds of the State until it comes directly opposite to the first mentioned creek, and then to the place where the said boundaries began." (Revised Statutes of the State of New York, chapter 2, title 1, 5.)

By title 5, Revised Statutes, the southerly bounds of the First Ward of the city are made to include "Nutten Island, Bedloe's Island, Bucking Island, and the Oyster Islands, and all the waters of this State in the bay of New York, and to the southward thereof, and which are not comprehended in any other county."

The annexed district extends on the east half-way across the Bronx river, and on the west to low-water mark on the New Jersey shore.

During many hours of the day the industries of the city draw to it thousands from adjoining towns and cities who add to its mortality, through accidents or sudden deaths from any cause, although they are not credited to its population.

The water limits of New York are very extensive and offer a wide field for casualties of various kinds, and many deaths from collisions or defective boilers or other accidents on the two rivers are annually credited to New York, though the decedents may be non-residents.

SIR—I have the honor to submit the following report of the births, marriages and still-births received by this Bureau during the year 1876:

BIRTHS.

23,744 infants who were born alive in this city were registered in this Bureau during the year, which shows a decrease of 69 as compared with the number received during the preceding year, and represents an annual birth-rate of 22.49 per 1,000 of the population, which was estimated at 1,055,535 in the middle of the year. The number of births received in this Bureau during the year, however, represents but about 65 per cent. of the total that took place in this city. This is verified by the New York State census, which was taken in June, 1875, which showed that 27,261 white children under one year old, born in the United States, and 315 colored children were living when the census was taken (nearly all of these children were born in this city), and the number of deaths of children under one year old in this city during the years 1875 and 1876 was 16,710, or an average of 8,355 deaths for each year (nearly all of these children who died were also natives of this city). If the average annual number of deaths of children under 1 year old (8,355) for the years 1875 and 1876 be added to the number of children living who were under 1 year of age when the census of 1875 was taken, it would show that there were 35,931 children born alive during the year, nearly all of them being natives of this city. There would, therefore, be about 12,187 births that took place in this city during the year unreported to this Bureau for registration, and that, if reported, the birth-rate would be 34.04 per 1,000 of the estimated population, instead of 22.49. As no penalties have been imposed upon delinquents in this branch of statistics during the year, the returns received may be regarded as voluntary contributions.

Of the total births reported 23,403 were white, 341 colored; 12,114 males, 11,550 females, and the sex of 80 was not stated. The full name of the children was stated in 16,017 returns, and in 7,727 the name was not determined on when the returns were forwarded to this Bureau. Four mothers, between the ages of 12 and 15 years,

gave birth to children ; between 15 and 20 years, 1,080 ; between 20 and 25 years, 5,629 ; between 25 and 30 years, 6,564 ; between 30 and 35 years, 4,593 ; between 35 and 40 years, 2,520 ; between 40 and 45 years, 805 ; between 45 and 50 years, 94, and 4 women over 50 years were reported to have given birth to children ; while on 2,451 of the certificates received the age of the mother was not stated. The ages of 70 of the fathers of children born during the year were reported to be between 15 and 20 years ; of 2,320 between 20 and 25 ; of 5,485 between 25 and 30 ; of 5,464 between 30 and 35 ; of 3,876 between 35 and 40 ; of 2,228 between 40 and 45 ; of 952 between 45 and 50. 363 were over 50 years of age, and the ages of 2,986 of the fathers were not stated on the returns. The largest number of births were received during the first quarter, and the lowest during the second quarter of the year. The largest monthly number of certificates were received during the month of August—2,188, and the lowest during the month of April—1,708. 2,389 native mothers gave birth to their first child, 1,619 their second, 1,155 their third, 722 their fourth, 463 their fifth, 285 their sixth, 197 their seventh, 111 their eighth, 59 their ninth, 48 their tenth, 22 their eleventh, 19 their twelfth, 4 their thirteenth, 3 their fourteenth, and 1 her fifteenth. 2,876 foreign-born mothers gave birth to their first child, 2,596 their second, 2,201 their third, 1,743 their fourth, 1,342 their fifth, 993 their sixth, 698 their seventh, 473 their eighth, 389 their ninth, 212 their tenth, 119 their eleventh, 70 their twelfth, 38 their thirteenth, 26 their fourteenth, 11 their fifteenth, 3 their sixteenth, 2 their seventeenth, and 1 each their eighteenth and nineteenth.

The number of children borne by 637 native and 2,181 foreign-born mothers was not stated. Of the total births registered 7,694 mothers and 5,881 fathers were born in the United States ; 8,382 mothers and 9,534 fathers were born in Germany ; 4,896 mothers and 4,832 fathers were born in Ireland, and the balance, with the exception of 31 mothers and 199 fathers whose nativity was unknown or not stated, and 4 mothers and 1 father who were born at sea were natives of other foreign countries.

The accompanying tables will show the admixture of the natives of the different countries in New York City during the year ; one of these tables shows that 7,694 mothers and 5,881 fathers of the children whose births were registered in this Bureau were born in the

United States, and that the mothers born in the United States exceeded the fathers by 1,813.

2,973 of the children who had mothers born in the United States had fathers born in the following countries, viz. : Austria, 29; Africa, 1; Belgium, 5; British America, 61; Bohemia, 2; Denmark, 10; England, 254; France, 50; Germany, 1,521; Holland, 3; Ireland, 778; Italy, 20; Lapland, 2; Norway, 3; Poland, 19; Portugal, 1; Russia, 11; Scotland, 59; Sweden, 12; Switzerland, 17; Spain, 12; South America, 1; Turkey, 1; Wales, 8; West Indies, 32; Europe, not stated, 1; at sea, 1, and unknown, 59; while, on the other hand, 1,160 of the children who had fathers that were born in the United States had mothers who were natives of the following countries: Austria, 2; Australia, 2; British America, 31; Bohemia, 1; England, 160; East Indies, 1; France, 15; Germany, 310; Holland, 2; Ireland, 575; Italy, 3; Poland, 1; Scotland, 38; Sweden, 5; Switzerland, 2; Wales, 3; West Indies, 2; 1 at sea, and 5 whose nativity was not stated.

MARRIAGES.

The number of marriage certificates received in this Bureau and registered during the year was 7,099, being 466 less than the number received during the year 1875, and represents an annual marriage-rate of 6.73 to every 1,000 of the estimated population. Of the total number of marriages received 6,919 males and 6,926 females were white, and 180 males and 173 females were colored, showing that 7 colored males married white females, 4,211 males and 3,487 females were foreign-born and 2,712 males and 3,435 females were natives of the United States, 3 males and 3 females were born at sea, and the nativity of 173 males and 174 females was unknown or not stated, 5,656 males and 5,810 females were married for the first time, 1,013 males and 807 females the second, 73 males and 33 females the third, and 3 males entered upon their fourth marriage. The number of times 354 males and 449 females were married was not stated. The highest number of marriages was reported in October and the least in July. The ages of 157 males and 1,794 females were stated to be under 20 years, 2,410 males and 2,914 females between 20 and 25 years, 2,207 males and 1,325 females between 25 and 30 years, 1,104 males and 484 females between 30 and 35, 530 males and 270 females between 35 and 40 years, 287 males and 135 females between 40 and

45 years, 177 males and 67 females between 45 and 50, and 94 males and 25 females between 50 and 55 years, 51 males and 11 females between 55 and 60 years, 18 males and 3 females between 60 and 65 years, 15 males and 1 female between 65 and 70 years, 7 males between 70 and 80 years, and 1 male between 80 and 90 years. The number of times 41 males and 68 females were married was not stated. Of the nationalities of the foreign-born 2,275 grooms and 1,748 brides were born in Germany, 711 grooms and 827 brides were born in Ireland, 290 grooms and 244 brides were born in England, 179 grooms and 139 brides were born in Austria, 139 grooms and 102 brides were born in France, 98 grooms and 68 brides were born in Scotland, 72 brides and 65 grooms were born in Switzerland. The marriage registration, like that of birth, is incomplete, but about 80 per cent. of the marriages which take place in this city are returned to this Bureau.

The comparative ages of persons married will prove of interest in showing the relative age between brides and grooms, between persons who were married the first time, between grooms who were married the first time to widows, between widowers and women married the first time, and widowers and widows. In analyzing the first table it will be seen that one bride who was not 20 years of age married a man between 55 and 60 years of age, that 3 women between 20 and 25 years of age married men between 60 and 65 years, that 1 groom under 20 years married a bride between 30 and 35, that 4 grooms under 20 married brides between 25 and 30 years, that 3 grooms between 20 and 25 years married brides between 40 and 45 years and 1 groom between 25 and 30 years married a bride between 50 and 55 years of age.

STILL-BIRTHS.

2,290 still-births were registered in this Bureau during the year, which is an increase of 16 compared with the number registered during the year 1875, and represents an annual still-birth rate of 2.17 to every 1,000 of the estimated population; 1,274 of the total number reported were males, 986 females, and the sex of 30 was unknown or not stated. 568 had native fathers, 1,576 foreign-born fathers, and 146 children had fathers whose nativity was unknown or not stated; 665 had native mothers, 1,504 had foreign-born mothers, and the nativity of 121 mothers was unknown or not stated. 2 of the births were reported to have taken place in the 1st month of utero-gestation, 4 in the 2d, 35 in the 3d, 76 in the 4th, 113 in the 5th, 250 in

the 6th, 299 in the 7th, 323 in the 8th, 1,136 in the 9th, 17 in the 10th, and 35 certificates were received without the foetal age having been stated. 598 of the mothers and 657 fathers of the still-born children were natives of Germany, 630 mothers and 605 fathers were natives of Ireland, 68 mothers and 82 fathers were natives of England, 34 mothers and 32 fathers were natives of Italy, 32 mothers and 40 fathers were natives of Poland, 21 mothers and 22 fathers were natives of France, 29 mothers and 33 fathers were natives of Austria. The father and mother of 462 still born infants were both natives of the United States, 41 children had native fathers and Irish mothers, 29 had native fathers and German mothers, 13 had native fathers and English mothers, 7 had native fathers and Scotch mothers, 85 had native mothers and German fathers, 55 had native mothers and Irish fathers, 26 had native mothers and English fathers, 8 had native mothers and West Indian fathers.

The registry of still-births is also incomplete, but about 95 per cent. being received in this Bureau; the returns at the advanced periods of utero-gestation are accurate, as it is necessary to obtain permits to bury or dispose of them; the still-births at the earlier periods of utero-gestation often escape registration when they are so small that they are not buried in cemeteries.

The admixture of other nationalities and additional facts relating to the births, marriages, and still-births, will be found in the accompanying tables.

The daily record for the year shows that 29,211 deaths, and 2,290 still-birth certificates were received in this Bureau; of the total, 2,961 were certified by the Coroners. 1,196 applications for transit and 137 for disinterment permits were made, and 1,252 searches for births, marriages, and deaths, and 154 transcripts of the record of births, 165 of marriage, and 1,252 of death were issued. During the same period 672 indefinite certificates of death were returned for revision or correction. The places of interment designated on the certificates of still-births and deaths in this city showed that Calvary Cemetery received the largest number of burials, 11,941; Lutheran following in numerical order with 4,387; City Cemetery (pauper burial ground), 3,816; Greenwood, 2,547; Evergreen, 1,672; and Cypress Hills, 1,234.

REPORT OF THE REGISTER OF VITAL STATISTICS.

JANUARY 1, 1878.

EMMONS CLARK, *Secretary* :

SIR—I beg leave to submit the following report upon the Vital Statistics of the City of New York for the year 1877. That portion of the report pertaining to births and marriages will be presented by Dr. John T. Nagle, the Deputy Register.

I shall confine myself to the mortality of the year, and shall be contented with calling attention to the more noticeable points under the various classes of diseases. The headings of the different tables are sufficient to easily direct the student of Sanitary Statistics in his study of the manifold ways in which the City has suffered in its mortality during the year which has past. The accuracy of such statistics, which are valuable to none more than to the Medical Practitioner, depends mainly on his skill in diagnosis, and his care in making out the certificate of death. A gratifying improvement in these respects is observable from year to year, and the medical profession, as a rule, evince a desire to make these mortuary records as perfect as possible.

The total mortality for the year was 26,203, on an estimated population of 1,069,362, showing a death-rate of 24.50. This mortality was divided among the five classes as follows, viz. :

Class 1. *Zymotic* diseases, 8,042 ; being a percentage of 30.69 on the total mortality. Class 2. *Constitutional* diseases, 5,800 ; a percentage of 22.18 on the total mortality. Class 3. *Local* diseases, 9,720 ;

a percentage of 37.09. Class 4. *Developmental* diseases, 1,615; a percentage of 6.16. Class 5. *Violent deaths*, 1,026; a percentage of 3.92.

The deaths from zymotic diseases have not been excessive, and indeed, as compared with other years, when allowance is made for our increase in population, the report for 1877 shows very favorably.

We had 14 deaths from small-pox. There were 983 deaths from scarlatina, and 951 from diphtheria. Croup is responsible for 472 deaths, while whooping cough, a disease but little dreaded, took off 440. The deaths from measles were 155; those from typhus and typhoid fever were 292. There were 3,557 deaths from diarrhœal diseases, and 4 from hydrophobia.

The City has been fortunate in the absence of continuous high temperature during the summer months, as well as in the comparatively small death-rate from contagious diseases during the winter months, when the city is crowded and the conditions are favorable for the propagation of contagion.

Of the 5,800 deaths from *Constitutional* diseases, 495 were from cancer of the various organs, and of these decedents from Carcinoma 153 were men and 342 were women. There were 142 deaths from rheumatism. The tubercular diseases were responsible for 5,134 deaths, out of which number 4,044 were from phthisis pulmonalis.

The great class of *Local* diseases gave a mortality of 9,720, of which number 2,378 were due to diseases of the nervous system. The circulatory diseases gave 996 deaths, of which number 880 deaths were from cardiac diseases. The respiratory system suffered in 3,508 deaths, of which 2,148 were from pneumonia alone. There were 1,191 diseases of the digestive organs which terminated fatally, of which 185 were from cirrhosis of the liver, 155 each from enteritis and gastritis, 163 from peritonitis, and there was a single death from

over-distension of the stomach. There were 1,299 deaths from diseases of the urinary organs, of which number 920 were due to Bright's disease of the kidneys.

The *Developmental* class of diseases gave a mortality of 1,615, out of which there were 500 deaths from premature births, while there were 373 persons who died of senile debility.

The fifth class, *Deaths from Violence*, gave 1,026 deaths, the burden falling most heavily on the male sex, 795 of this number having been men, and 231 having been women. Of this total 244 sustained fatal injuries by falls, 70 were killed by vehicles, 32 died from surgical operations, and 148 took their own lives.

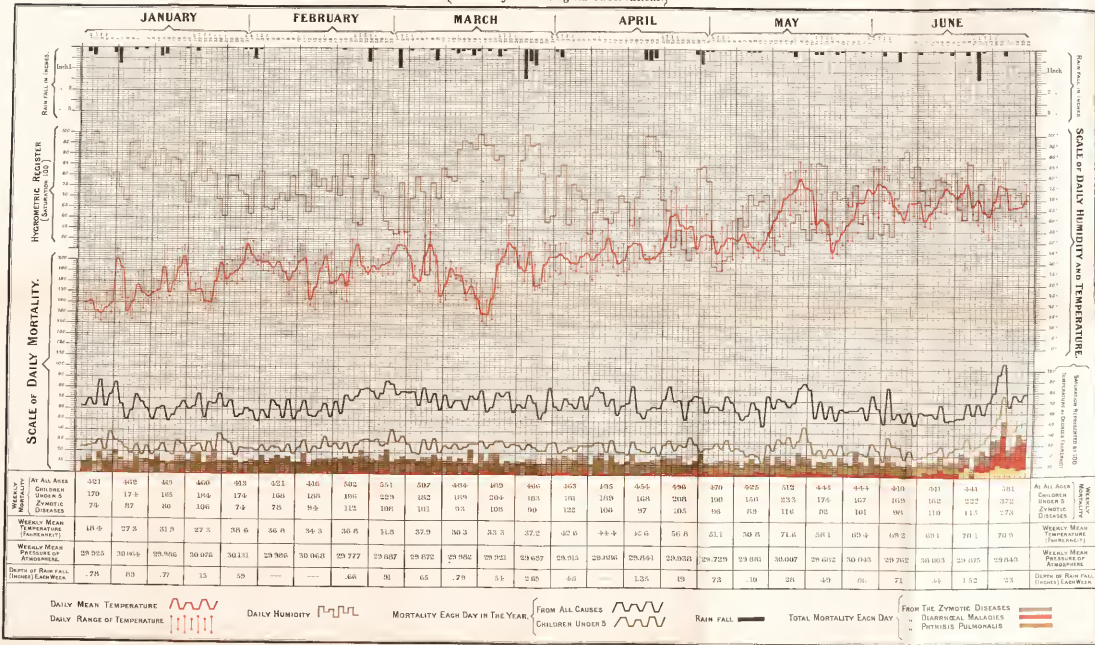

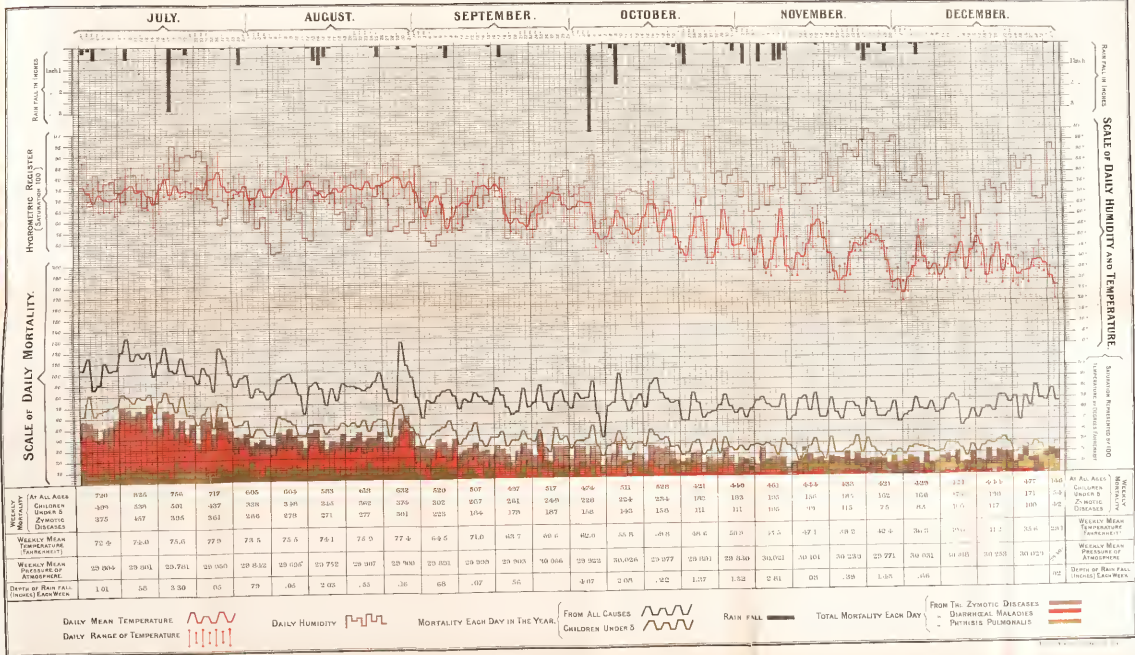

The following tables of mortality from phthisis pulmonalis for the year 1877 are interesting, though teaching no new lesson. During the year 4,044 deaths occurred, of which number 2,051 were males and 1,993 were females. Of this whole number 962 died in the hospitals and other institutions.

As regards the seasons : During the first quarter there were 1,054 deaths ; during the second quarter there were 996 deaths ; during the third quarter there were 979 deaths, and during the fourth quarter there were 1,015 deaths. The winter being mild, there was no especial difference between the seasons in their influence on the death-rate from this disease.

As regards the age of the decedents the highest mortality is seen to have occurred between the years of 15 and 45.

Out of this whole number 118 occurred among people of color.

The table of occupations of those dying of phthisis does not seem to teach us any particular lesson.

The most enthusiastic statistician must fail to see any sanitary reason to account for the death of seven Sisters of Charity from consumption, while not one prostitute died of it.

The following table of deaths due directly or remotely to intemperance during the year is compiled from the death certificates received from practitioners of medicine at this Bureau. No one will make the mistake of supposing the table to be exhaustive. Motives of delicacy and sympathy often impel the physician to hide the frailties of the unfortunate from the public gaze, and in very many cases the decedent has not enjoyed the advantages of regular or continuous medical attendance, and his previous history is not known. The table, however, has a certain interest. It shows that during the year 1877 there were 213 deaths which the medical profession attributes to the intemperate use of alcohol. Of this number 148 were males and 65 were females. Of this whole number, while the social relations of 30 were unknown, 106 were married, 42 were widows or widowers and 35 were single. As to their nationality, in 10 cases it was unknown, 55 deaths were among the native born, 96 were Irish, and 29 were German.

The prominent diseases which were responsible for this mortality were given in the medical certificates as follows, viz.: Bright's disease, 38; uræmia, 7; cirrhosis, 11; delirium tremens, 14; ebrietas, 20; falls, accidents, and suicides, 10; gastritis, 14; and degenerations of the heart, liver, and kidneys, 13.

A recapitulation of the returns from inquests by the coroner, in cases of violent deaths, shows that the total, 1,026, is mainly made up by fractures and contusions, 144; falls, 244; burns and scalds, 100; drowning, 184; suicide, 148.

Besides these principal causes, 70 lives were lost by casualties from vehicles, street-cars killing 20.

The grim record of suicides, with the choice of the means of death, does not differ materially nor compare unfavorably with that of former years.

This table shows a gain in the mortality of the first quarter of 1877 over the corresponding seasons in the preceding five years. The deaths from the great classes of zymotic, constitutional, local, and developmental diseases, and deaths from violence in this quarter are all slightly decreased, although we must believe that the city has steadily increased in population during these years. None of the contagious diseases are conspicuous. Small-pox fell to five deaths; measles, scarlatina, and diphtheria show no excesses; typhoid fever, seldom a feature in New York, is at a minimum; while phthisis, pneumonia, and bronchitis simply show the influence of the season of the year. The mortality in children under five years of age for the corresponding quarter in the years mentioned above is seen to be less by 358.

In this second quarter the deaths from the five great classes of disease continue to be less than in the corresponding quarter of the five previous years. The exanthemata, excepting scarlatina, are actually less, and even that disease shows nothing which deserves especial attention. Diarrhœal diseases begin to increase, while deaths from phthisis pulmonalis, pneumonia, and bronchitis are less frequent. There is a slight increase in the mortality of children under five years of age.

This table of the third or summer quarter shows a diminished death-rate in the five classes of diseases as compared with the corresponding quarter in the five previous years, and in this quarter for 1877 the deaths from contagious diseases fall off, as usual, when there are fewer children in town, and when open doors and windows weaken the intensity of "*contagium*." Phthisis, pneumonia, and bronchitis are in abeyance, but, on the other hand, diarrhoeal diseases increase, though for the corresponding season in the five previous years they are less numerous. The infant mortality is, of course, greater in the summer months, though less this year than in the five previous summers.

The fourth or autumnal quarter compares favorably as regards the five classes with the same quarter in the five previous years, especially in the mortality from contagious diseases. It is interesting to note that the deaths from phthisis in the winter and autumn quarters, *i. e.*, the first and fourth quarter, differ only by 54, while those from bronchitis and pneumonia differ during the same periods respectively by 620 and 232.

The mortality in children under five years is less than for the corresponding quarter in the five previous years, excepting the year 1876, the difference being 229.

While comparatively moderate, for New York, as compared with previous years, it will be seen to have been highest, as usual, in July and August, and to have kept up through September.

The influence of temperature, with its peculiar civic chances on those diseases which are especially fatal to children of a tender age, is abundantly shown by the table of mortality from diarrhoeal diseases and by the meteorological table.

In submitting this Report to the Board I take pleasure in testifying to the general efficiency of those whose duty it has been to chronicle the various circumstances connected with the births, marriages, and deaths, which have occurred during the year. This duty has been faithfully performed, and, as in previous years, has sometimes subjected the Department to the charge of being hypercritical. As statistics, however, are valuable only as they are correct, it has sometimes been necessary to ask for further information when the certificate of the attending physician has been obscure. He has been sometimes asked to make such explanations as would enable us to assign the death to its proper place under the accepted nomenclature, but the certificate of all reputable physicians has been always promptly honored with a burial permit.

The health of the city during the year has been remarkably good, and it should be recognized as such. None of the five great classes of disease have been unduly prominent. Both the Winter and Summer were benign, and there were no great epidemics.

SIR—I have the honor to submit the following report on the births, marriages, and still-births which were reported to this Bureau during the year 1877 :

The total number of births received was 25,569. Of this number 25,266 were white and 303 colored ; 13,074 were males and 12,495 were females ; the full name of the child was stated in 19,266 certificates, and on 6,303 the full name was not determined upon when the certificates reached this office. During the year 4 mothers between the ages of 12 and 15 years gave birth to children ; 1,228 mothers were between the ages of 15 and 20 years ; 6,156 were between 20 and 25 years ; 6,918 were between the ages of 25 and 30 years ; 5,007 were between the ages of 30 and 35 years ; 2,793 were between the ages of 35 and 40 years ; 892 were between the ages of 40 and 45 years ; 93 were between the ages of 45 and 50 years, and 1 was over 50 years of age. The age of 2,477 mothers was not stated. The ages of the fathers of the children, whose births were reported, are as follows, viz. : 64 were between the ages of 15 and 20 years ; 2,649 were between 20 and 25 years ; 5,889 were between 25 and 30 years ; 5,931 were between 30 and 35 years ; 4,402 were between 35 and 40 years ; 2,382 were between 40 and 45 years ; 1,009 were between 45 and 50 years ; 266 were over 50 years, and the age of 2,977 was not stated.

The mothers that gave birth to their first child, and who were natives of the United States, were 2,719 ; those that gave birth to their second were 1,918 ; those that gave birth to their third were 1,393 ; those that gave birth to their fourth were 879 ; those that gave birth to their fifth were 573 ; those that gave birth to their sixth were 381 ; those that gave birth to their seventh were 255 ; those that gave birth to their eighth were 130 ; those that gave birth to their ninth were 85 ; those that gave birth to their tenth were 66 ; those that gave birth to their eleventh were 31 ; those that gave birth to

their twelfth were 13 ; those that gave birth to their thirteenth were 11 ; those that gave birth to their fourteenth were 4, and those that gave birth to their fifteenth were 3. The number of foreign-born mothers that gave birth to their first child was 2,800 ; those that gave birth to their second were 2,497 ; those that gave birth to their third were 2,276 ; those that gave birth to their fourth were 1,941 ; those that gave birth to their fifth were 1,420 ; those that gave birth to their sixth were 1,135 ; those that gave birth to their seventh were 828 ; those that gave birth to their eighth were 561 ; those that gave birth to their ninth were 333 ; those that gave birth to their tenth were 259 ; those that gave birth to their eleventh were 124 ; those that gave birth to their twelfth were 74 ; those that gave birth to their thirteenth were 45 ; those that gave birth to their fourteenth were 25 ; those that gave birth to their fifteenth were 14 ; those that gave birth to their sixteenth were 5 ; those that gave birth to their seventeenth were 2, and those that gave birth to their eighteenth were 2. The nativity of three mothers who bore their first child was stated to be at sea ; and that of 14 who bore their first ; 10 who bore their second ; 9 who bore their third ; 4 who bore their fourth ; 3 each who bore their fifth, sixth, and seventh ; 1 each who bore her eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, and twelfth, and 1 her eighteenth child, was not stated. The number of children borne by 672 native, 2,037 foreign born mothers, and 3 whose nationality was unknown, was not stated. The number of twin children born during the year was 235, and the number of triplet children was 4. The nativity of the mothers of the twin children is as follows, viz. : Germany, 89 ; Ireland, 75 ; United States, 54 ; Bohemia, 6 ; England, 3 ; Austria and Scotland, 2 each, and Poland, Sweden, Wales, and West Indies, 1 each. The nativity of the fathers was as follows : Germany, 89 ; Ireland, 71 ; United States, 49 ; Bohemia, 7 ; England, 4 ; Austria, 3 ; British America, Poland, Scotland, and Sweden, 2 each, and Denmark, Holland, Norway, and Russia, 1 each. Two mothers of triplet children were born in the United States ; 1 each in Ireland and Poland ; the United States, England, Poland, and Ireland contributed 1 each to the fathers of the triplet children. Of the total births reported, 9,145 mothers were born in the United States, 8,023 had German mothers, 5,413 Irish, 691 English, 544 Bohemian, 346 Polish, 229 Austrian, 226 French, 182 Scotch, 129 Italian, 121 British

American, 91 Swiss, 80 Swedish, 84 Russian, 43 West Indian, 23 Welsh, 21 Norwegian, 59 Dutch, 37 Danish, 6 each Belgian and South American, 5 Mexican, 1 each Brazilian, Central American, East Indian, Greece, Malta, and New Zealand; 3 were born at sea and the nationality of 54 was not stated. The nativity of the fathers of the children born in this city and reported to this Bureau, is as follows, viz.: Austria, 283; Algiers, 2; Australia, 1; Bohemia, 524; Belgium, 11; British America, 154; China, 3; Canary Islands, 1; Denmark, 58; England, 792; East Indies, 2; France, 280; Germany, 9,426; Greece, 5; Holland, 89; Ireland, 5,264; Italy, 160; India, 1; Mexico, 4; Malta, 1; Norway, 32; Poland, 440; Portugal, 3; Russia, 138; Scotland, 230; Sweden, 108; Switzerland, 113; Spain, 23; Sicily, 1; South America, 10; at sea, 2; Turkey, 1; United States, 7,062; unknown, 231; Wales, 19; and West Indies, 95.

The number of children who had both their parents born in the United States was 5,751, and the number of children who had both their parents born in foreign countries was 14,976; there were, therefore, 20,727 children both of whose parents were either native or foreign born, and 4,819 additional who had one of their parents born in a foreign country and the other in the United States. The six countries which gave the highest number of the mothers who gave birth to children in this city are the following, viz.: United States 9,145, Germany 8,023, Ireland 5,413, England 691, Bohemia 544, and Poland 346. From the table showing the admixture of nationalities we learn that 35 American-born mothers had children by Austrian fathers, 1 by an Australian, 18 by Bohemian, 82 by British American, 1 by a Chinaman, 14 by Danes, 260 by English, 52 by French, 1,735 by German, 2 by Greeks, 14 by Dutch, 858 by Irish, 14 by Italian, 4 by Norwegian, 14 by Poles, 11 by Russian, 72 by Scotch, 16 by Swedes, 24 by Swiss, 12 by Spanish, 3 by South American, 4 by Welsh, 39 by West Indian, and 107 by fathers whose nationality was unknown (principally illegitimate); on the other hand 8 American-born fathers had children by Austrian mothers, 4 by Bohemian, 45 by British American, 1 by a Brazilian, 1 by a Central American, 1 by a Dane, 168 by English, 15 by French, 346 by German, 2 by Dutch, 638 by Irish, 2 by Mexican, 3 by Maltese, 2 by New Zealand, 2 by Russian, 1 by South American, 43 by Scotch, 4 by Swedes, 6 by Swiss, 4 by Welsh, and 7 by West Indian.

The registration of births in this city is still incomplete ; there are about 12,000 births which annually occur in this city that are not reported to this Bureau ; as no penalty has been imposed for delinquency, the returns may be regarded as voluntary, and, unless delinquents are prosecuted, it is doubtful whether any greater proportion can be obtained. The total births received during the past twelve years was 228,047, and during this period the greatest number of births received was in the month of August—21,010—and the least in May—16,779.

MARRIAGES.

7,129 marriages were reported to this Bureau during the year. Of this number 6,955 were white males, and 6,967 were white females ; and 174 males and 162 females were colored : 12 colored men having married white females. 4,015 males and 3,336 females were foreign born ; and 3,006 males and 3,673 females were natives of the United States. 5,616 males and 5,713 females were married the first time ; 1,025 males and 814 females were married the second time ; 75 males and 39 females were married the third time ; 5 males and 1 female were married the fourth time ; and 1 male celebrated his fifth marriage. 204 of the grooms and 1,740 of the brides were married before they reached their 20th year ; 2,440 grooms and 3,028 brides were between the ages of 20 and 25 years ; 2,145 males and 1,284 females were between the ages of 25 and 30 years : 1,047 males and 458 females were between the ages of 30 and 35 years ; 570 males and 293 females were between the ages of 35 and 40 years ; 311 grooms and 136 brides were between the ages of 40 and 45 years ; 190 grooms and 72 brides were between the ages of 45 and 50 years ; 95 grooms and 28 brides were between the ages of 50 and 55 years ; 52 grooms and 9 brides were between the ages of 55 and 60 years ; 29 grooms and 2 brides were between the ages of 60 and 65 years ; 6 grooms and 1 bride were between the ages of 65 and 70 years ; 4 grooms were between 70 and 80 ; and 1 groom was between 80 and 90 years of age. The six countries which furnished the highest number of brides were the following : United States, 3,673 ; Germany, 1,566 ; Ireland, 813 ; England, 214 ; Bohemia, 122, and Scotland, 63. The 3,673 brides that were born in the United States married grooms who were natives of the following countries, viz. : Africa, 1 ;

Australia, 1; Austria, 18; Belgium, 4; Bohemia, 5; British America, 35; Cape de Verde Islands, 1; China, 3; Denmark, 5; England, 123; France, 18; Germany, 628; Greece, 1; Holland, 9; Hungary, 2; Ireland, 143; Italy, 21; Luxemburg, 2; Norway, 3; Poland, 10; Russia, 8; Scotland, 35; South America, 3; South Sea Islands, 1; Spain, 6; Sweden, 7; Switzerland, 16; Turkey, 1; United States, 2,521; Wales, 7; and West Indies, 27; while the grooms that were born in the United States selected brides who were natives of the following foreign countries, viz.: Africa, 1; Australia, 1; Austria, 3; Bohemia, 2; Brazil, 1; British America, 28; Denmark, 3; England, 86; France, 12; Germany, 138; Holland, 2; Hungary, 1; Ireland, 144; Italy, 1; Norway, 3; Poland, 1; Scotland, 24; Sweden, 1; Switzerland, 4; Wales, 3, and West Indies, 7. From the returns of marriages received during the year it will be seen that 10,020 persons were married the first time, 436 bachelors married widows, 650 widowers married spinsters, 411 widowers married widows, and the number of the marriage of 1,244 persons was not stated. An interesting feature of the marriage table will be shown in the ages of the persons married: Two of the women under 20 years of age were married to men between 40 and 45 years, and 1 woman under 20 married a man between 45 and 50 years of age; both these persons were married for the first time; 1 widower between 50 and 55 years married a spinster under 20 years of age, and 1 between 60 and 65 years married a spinster between 20 and 25 years; 2 bachelors between 20 and 25 years married widows between 40 and 45 years, and 8 widows between 20 and 25 years married bachelors between 40 and 45 years; 1 widow between 60 and 65 years married a widower between 40 and 45 years, and 1 widow between 65 and 70 years married a widower between 65 and 70 years. The total number of marriages that has been reported to this Bureau during the past 12 years was 93,257. Of this number 60,833 males and 53,267 females were born in foreign countries, and 29,263 males and 36,759 females were natives of the United States. It will be perceived that the highest number of marriages of native males was received during the past year, and that last year was the first year during this period that the native-born females exceeded the foreign-born. November and October had the highest number of marriages—8,931 and 8,949 respectively—while the lowest was reported during the months of March and February—6,364 and 6,890 respectively.

The number of still-births reported to this Bureau during the year 1877 was 2,164: of this number 1,275 were males and 880 females; 578 had fathers and 720 had mothers born in the United States, and 1,473 had fathers and 1,354 had mothers born in foreign countries. The foetal age of 4 of the still-births was reported to be the 2d month, 31, to be the 3d; 62, to be the 4th; 120, to be the 5th; 259, to be the 6th; 293, to be the 7th; 309, to be the 8th; 1,061, to be the 9th, and 23 to be the 10th. The nativity of the mothers that gave birth to still-born children was stated to be as follows: Austria, 14; Bohemia, 16; British America, 15; Denmark, 3; England, 57; France, 16; Germany, 582; Holland, 2; Ireland, 561; Italy, 23; Norway, 2; Poland, 17; Russia, 10; Scotland, 19; Sweden, 5; Switzerland, 4; United States, 720; Wales, 5; West Indies, 2, and Mexico, 1.

The total number of still-births registered during the past 8 years was 18,169. Of this number 10,251 were males and 7,715 females; 3,901 had native fathers and 4,736 had native mothers; 13,040 had foreign fathers and 12,516 had foreign mothers. 8 were reported to have occurred in the 1st month of utero-gestation, 31 in the 2d, 195 in the 3d, 490 in the 4th, 927 in the 5th, 1,960 in the 6th, 2,494 in the 7th, 2,546 in the 8th, 8,878 in the 9th, and 95 in the 10th.

During the year there were 26,194 burial permits issued for deaths in this city; 1,214 were issued for bodies in transitu, 2,164 for still-births, and 135 for the removal of bodies from cemeteries within the city limits.

Of the permits that were granted for the burial of the dead and still-born infants of this city, Calvary (Roman Catholic) Cemetery received 10,081 death and 738 still-birth permits, Lutheran (undenominational) Cemetery received 3,585 death and 334 still-birth permits, City (pauper burial ground) received 2,846 death and 457 still-birth certificates, Greenwood (undenominational) received 2,048 death and 71 still-birth certificates, Evergreen (undenominational) received 1,436 death and 126 still-birth permits, and Cypress Hills (undenominational) received 1,008 death and 64 still-birth permits.

The table of cemeteries shows that there were 12,063 of the dead and 909 of the still-born of this city buried in denominational cemeteries in this vicinity as follows: Roman Catholic, 10,609 deaths and 750 still-births; Jewish, 752 deaths and 104 still-births; Methodist Episcopal, 146 deaths and 9 still-births; Protestant Episcopal, 335

deaths and 30 still-births ; Methodist Protestant, 221 deaths and 16 still-births. 2,846 deaths and 457 still-born infants were interred as paupers in City Cemetery, the friends or parents not having the means or desire to pay for their interment, while 91 deaths and 10 still-births were of immigrants, who were buried at Ward's Island at the expense of the Commissioners of Emigration. There were 586 deaths and 70 still-births placed in vaults, or buried in cemeteries in New York City and vicinity other than those specified, and 899 deaths and 16 still-births were removed to distant places for interment.
