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## CONSTITUTION.



## ARTICLE I.-NAME.

'The name of this seremety shatl be the Neheraska Society of the sons of the Amertean Revolution.

## AKTICLE II. OB. ECTS.

The objocta of this Socicty shatl bo to perpetate the memory of the men who, hy their serviets or sacrifies during the war of the American Lesohtion, achieved the inderndene of the American people: te unite and promote fellowship amoner their descendants: to inspire them and the communty at lare with a more profeund reverene for the prituciplas of the government founded hy our forefathers: to encourage historical remearela in relation to the A Amertatn Rewolntion: to actuire and prosinve the meordo of the individual segiees of the patriots of the wat, ha well as doemments mad relics: to coletrate the amniversaries of the prominent events of the war: 10 foster true patriotism: to maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom; and to cary out the pmrpose expresoed in the I'ramble to the Comstitution of mer Country and the injunctions of Wa-hington in his farewell address to the American poople.

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Any man shatl be chirible to memhership in this socicty, who, Iming of the sere of twentyone yours or over, and at citizen of goond repute in the commonity, is the lineal deeendant of an ancestor, Who was at all timu matailing in his loyatty to and rendered actual merver in the cathe of dmeriban Indepmentene either as an oflicer, ondier, maman, marim, militianan or minute man, in the armed forces of the Contimental Congras or of any one of the several Colonice or Staters: or as a signor of the Declatation of Independenee: or as a mem-
ber of a Cummittee of Safety or Correspondence: or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a eivil officer, either of one of the Colonies or States or of the National Government; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain.

## ARTICLE IV.- OFFICERS.

The officers of the Society shall be a President, a Senior Vice-President, a Junior Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Registrar, a Historian and a Board of Managers consisting of the above mentioned officers and six other members, who shall be elected upon ballot by a majority of the members present at the annual meeting of the Society, and who shall hold office for one year, and until their successors shall be elected. Nominations for office shall be by informal ballot.

## ARTICLE V.--MEETINGS.

The annual meeting of the Society for the election of officers and the transaction of business shall be held in the City of Omaha on the twenty-second day of February in each year, except when that date falls on Sunday, in which ease the meeting shall be held on the following day.

Special meetings may be called by the President or Board of Manat gers at any time and place for the purpose of celebrating historical events of the Revolution, and for other patriotic purposes, and for the transaction of necessary business.

## ARTICLE VI.-Amendments.

This Constitution may be amended or repealed, provided written resolutions to that effcet are first presented to, and approved by, a majority of the Board of Managers present at any meeting of said Board; and provided, said amendments are subsequently approved by twothirds of the members present at any meeting of the Society; and provided further, that whenever this Constitution is to be amended, repealed or in any way changed, notice thereof, specifying said changes in full, shall be sent to each member of the Society at least thirty days before such action is to be taken.

10. Any member failing to pay his annual dues for two consecutive years shall forfeit his membership upon vote to that effect by the Board of Managers. A member so dropped may be re-instated by the Board of Managers upon payment of all arrears and all annual dues since the date of his loss of membership, provided there are no eharges unbecoming a gentleman recorded against him remaining undetermined or determined finally against him.
11. If for any reason a member demits, resigns, or is dropped from the rolls of this Society, the number of his insignia shall be cancelled, and his name shall no longer appear in the year book of the Soeiety as a member.
12. It shall be the duty of every member to inform the Secretary, by written communication, of his place of residenee, and of any change thereof, and of his post office address.

Service of any notice under the Constitution, or under these ByLaws upon any member of the Soeiety, addressed to him at the last reeorded plaee of residence or post office address, and forwarded by mail, shall be deemed sufficient service of sueh notice.
13. The President, or in his absence a Vice-President, or in his absence a Chairman, pro tempore, shall preside at all meetings of the Society and Board of Managers, and shall have a casting vote. He shall exercise the usual functions of a presiding officer, and shall enforee a strict observance of the Constitution, By-Laws, regulations and rules of the Soeiety and Board of Managers.
14. The Secretary shall conduet the general eorrespondence of the Society, and shall have charge of the seal, certificate of incorporation, By-Laws and records of meetings of the Society. He, together with the presiding officer, shall certify all acts of the Society. He shall under the direetion of the President or Vice-President, give due notice of the time and place of ail meetings of the Society, and attend the same. He shall keep fair and aceurate records of all the proceedings and orders of the Society. He shall colleet all moneys due the Society, giving proper receipts for the same, and shall promptly pay them over to the Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor. He shall keep a letter book of eopies of all offieial letters; a ledger to contain the aceounts of the Soeiety with its members; a cash book, and a receipt book, in which to take the Treasurer's receipts. He shall give notice to the several officers and members of all votes, orders, resolves and proceedings of the Soeiety, affecting them or appertaining to their respective duties, and he shall forward to the officers of the National Soeicty sueh reports and information as may be required by them. He shall keep a eorrect list of the names and addresses of all members in good standing. He shall report to the Society at the annual meeting.

In like manner he shall act as Secretary of the Board of Managers, reporting to them whenever called upon.

He shall give stath bond ats the Buad of Managers may rergure, rad on the clection of his suceesure he shall turn over to him, within wh days, all books, papres and property of the siociety in his possession.
15. Tha Treasurer shatl rewive frome the serpetary the funds athd securitites of the Society. 'They shatl lre deposited in some bank or
 the Sous of the Ameroban Revolntion, and shall bre drawn thence for the purgoses of the surioty only, by eheeks signod by the Presinent and combtersirned by the Sopetary and 'roasurer. The shatl keep atrue aceount of his roserpts and dishursemonts, athe at vate amonal meeting -hall render the same to the society. He shall repert when rexuired to the Buard of Manarers and shall grive such bond ats they may require.

His bouks shatl at all times be opron to the inspretion of the Presidont, Board of Mantirers and Auditing Committee.

1ti. The Reristrar shall reevive all applications for membership and proofs of eligibility, and shall assist in profecting and completing the same. Whern the applications are satisfactory to him he shath note his appewal thoreon and refer them to the Board of Managers for linal ateton. If the applicant is aceoptod, the Reristrar shatl forward one ropy to Kegistrar Grneral of the National Soriety, and file the wiginal with the atcompanying proof in his own ollice. He shall keep bopirs of such similar documents at the owners thereof may not be willing to leave promanently in the keeping of the society. He shall have the custorly of all the histurical, grographical and gronealogical papers, beoks, matuscripts, and relies of whirh the Soeioty may berome possesed, and shall keep an ollicial record of same. ISe shall issue cortifiustes of membership and insignia to members entitled thereto. He shall krep at registur of the names and dates of admission, transfer, resignat tion and death of members, and shall perform such other duties as may las assigned to him by the sorioty or Bobrel of Nantgers.
17. The Historian shatl keep a reeord of all the historical and commemorative celnbrations of the Socioty, and prepare and wdit the same for publeation mader direction of the Boatrd of Manarers. MI shall submit at rach annual meeting a list of the members who maty havedind during the year, aeompanied by biographieal momoirs, and once a year at such time as maty be determined upm hre shall deliber a historical address.

Is The Beatrd of Wanateres shall remommend plans for promoting the objecta of the soedoty and shall athorize the dishorsament and wxpenditure of unapropniatod money in the treastry for the patyent of emrrent expenses of the Serinty. [a gemmeal they shall wateh over the interests of the Siociety, surgesting from time to timn surls meas. urts at they domen conducive to its prosperity, athd shall report to the socirty at tha ammal monting.

IneomeHow Expended.

They shall have power to fill any vacancy occurring or existing in the Society or Board of Managers, and an officer so appointed shall act until the following annual election, or until his successor shall be chosen.
19. The Board of Managers shall judge of the eligibility of applicants for membership in the Society, and elect them if deemed worthy. Two negative votes shall reject any applicant. Each member of the Board shall be notified of all proposed elections to membership and may send his vote thereon in writing to the Secretary.

They shall be competent to consent to and to accept the resignation or voluntary withdrawal from membership or transfer of any enrolled member of the Society.

They shall have power to suspend or expel any member of the society for sufficient cause, by a vote of two-thirds of the members of the Board present at any regular or special meeting: provided, that at least two weeks' notice of sueh proposed action shall have been given to such member by notice mailed to him at his last known address. A member so suspended or expelled shall have the right of appeal to the Society from the action of the Board of Managers.
20. The Board of Managers shall meet as often as they desire, or at the call of the President, or upon the written request of any three members of the Board.

Five members of the Board shall be a quorum for the transaction of business.

They shall, through the Secretary, call special mectings of the Society at any time upon the written request of fifteen members of the Society, and at such other times and places as they themselves may see fit, and they may arrange for commemorative celebrations and for the annual meeting of the Society.

They shall, at least one month before the annual meeting of the society appoint an Auditing Committee of three, who shall examine and audit the books and accounts of the Treasurer and Secretary, and report thereon at said annual meeting.
21. The Board of Managers shall supervise all publications issucd in the name of the Society. They shall also perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Constitution or By-Laws, or required loy any resolve or standing regulation of the Socicty.
2.2. The receipts each year from admission fees and annual ducs shall be devoted by the Board of Managers to the following objects and no other. viz:

1. Payment of the annual dues to the National Society.
2. Payment of current expenses.
3. Publication of smeh documents as may be deemed advisable.
4. Payment of such special expenses as may be authorized by the Board of Manager's or Society.

All receipts from life membership shall be set aside and invested under the dircetion of the Board of Managers as a permanent fund, of which only the income may be used for payment of ordinary expenses.
