1. Reference is made to:

a. Letter, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 387.6(7 Jul 49)GD, 7 July 1949, subject, "Accountability of Reparations Equipment Loaned to Occupation Forces."

b. Letter, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 387.6(7 Jul 49)GPC/AD, 15 Dec 1949, subject, "Accountability of Reparations Equipment Loaned to Occupation Forces."

2. Procedures and criteria for the use of reparations equipment by the Occupation Forces are as follows:

a. Occupation Forces having a justifiable requirement for equipment located in reparations plants may conduct such inspections of the equipment as are deemed necessary by competent authority. Arrangements for inspection of reparations items will be made with the local Regional Civil Affairs Team. No inspection of reparations plants will be conducted without clearance from the Regional Civil Affairs Team.

b. Requests for the use of reparations items by Occupation Forces will be submitted through normal military channels to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Requests will fully identify the item requested by complete inventory number and nomenclature.

c. Accountability records of reparations equipment approved for use will be maintained as directed in reference 1a and 1b above.

Subj: Authorized Use of Reparations Equipment by Occupation Forces

d. Occupation Forces using reparations equipment will provide necessary maintenance and security for such equipment.

e. All expenses incidental to placing reparations equipment in authorized use by the Occupation Forces will be charged to Termination of War Funds.

3. Return of reparations equipment no longer required for use by Occupation Forces will be accomplished as follows:

a. Equipment to be returned will be cleaned and protective lubricants applied for dead storage by the Using Occupation Force Unit.

b. Name and location of the plant or arsenal to which the equipment is to be returned will be obtained from the appropriate Regional Civil Affairs Team. The equipment will be returned to the designated plant by the Using Occupation Force Unit. Expenses incurred in the return of reparations equipment from an authorized use status will be charged to Termination of War Funds.

c. Return of equipment will be reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, showing the complete inventory number and description for each machine or piece of equipment, Occupation Force Organization from which equipment was returned, and the code number, name and address of plant to which equipment was returned for storage. This information will be furnished by the Using Occupation Force Unit.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Use of Property at Maisuru by Occupation Forces

1. Mr. Nakagawa of the Kinki Finance Bureau, Reparations Section, reported to me today on his trip to Maisuru January 5th, 6th and 7th.

2. Of the 19 buildings which we informed him JLG wants to use, only 3 contain reparations equipment, 337, 361 and 381. Total weight is 10 tons 700 kgs. Mr. Nakagawa talked to a colored Captain who is the senior officer representing Col Cosper, and informed him that Kinki Civil Affairs had stated that movement of reparations equipment would be accomplished by the occupation forces. The Captain stated that he understood what Mr. Nakagawa said, but did not commit himself as to whether or not he would move the equipment. The Captain is sharing an office with a representative of the Maisuru Branch of the Kyoto Finance Office, so if he does start to move the equipment, there is no danger that it will not be properly coordinated. The plan is to move the equipment to 2 nearby buildings, 52 and 121.

3. The Captain mentioned that he also wants to use 3 additional buildings which do not contain any reparations equipment, 226, 238 and 225. Mr. Nakagawa told him that Kinki Civil Affairs Region must be contacted in regard to this, but to date we have had no request for these buildings. Mr. Nakagawa is to inform us if these buildings are used.

4. Mr. Nakagawa also talked to a First Lieutenant who has a small detachment from Camp Otsu in Maisuru. The Lt indicated that he will need a considerable area, pretty well scattered through the arsenal. Mr. Nakagawa also informed him that he would have to contact Kinki Civil Affairs Region. One area the Lt is interested in is apparently the consolidation point for tools and accessory items, as Mr. Nakagawa says there are about 250,000 items which will have to be moved. In addition, there are 3 boilers, and Mr. Nakagawa estimates that it would take a month to move them.

5. I believe that the course we should follow is to do nothing until we are contacted by the units which want property at Maisuru.
