MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Amendment to SCAPIN 1875, 1 April 1948

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 410.2 (1 Apr 48)CPC/CD, SCAPIN 1875, 1 April 1948, subject, "Gold, Silver, and Platinum Family Metals for Domestic Consumption in the Second Quarter of 1948." from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Allocations of precious metals for use in maintaining transportation facilities are approved as detailed. The metals approved for release by this amendment will be allocated and used in implementing programs approved by the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. These metals are authorized for use from the date of publication of this memorandum to 30 September 1948.


